- Board Member, Our Lady of Loreto Nursing Home, St Vincent de Paul Society, 1990-1998. Board Member, The Russian Nursing Home Strathfield (also known as Strathfield Home for the Aged), for 8 years; English tutor.
- English tutor, Lewisham Nursing Home, for one year.
- Patron, Strathfield Lantern Club (fundraising auxiliary of the Royal Institute for Deaf and Blind Children), 1997; Secretary, 2003; Publicity Officer, 2002.
- Supporter and volunteer with the Meriden School, since at least 1985.
- Teacher, School of Art and Design, TAFE New South Wales, ca1960s-1986.
- Head, Design Branch, Randwick Technology College, 1978-1986.
- Volunteer teacher, The Exodus Foundation.
- Assistant Treasurer, Attendance Recorder and fundraiser, Rotary Club of Strathfield, since 1999.
- Volunteer, Meals on Wheels, since 2000.
- Member, New South Wales Legal Services Tribunal, 1993-1996. Justice of the Peace for New South Wales, since 1973.

# 2. Mr Harry John PICKETT

For service to the community through a range of charitable and service organisations, particularly through the activities of Rotary International, and to the meat industry.

## 3. Dr Albert SHUN

For service to medicine as a paediatric surgeon, particularly in the areas of renal and liver transplantation.

- Chief Paediatric Liver Transplant Surgeon, Australian National Liver Transplantation Unit, The Children's Hospital at Westmead (formerly Royal Alexandra Hospital for Children), since 1987; performed the majority of the 170 paediatric liver transplants at the facility since its inception; involved in establishing and developing the Unit
- Staff Specialist Paediatric Surgeon, since 1987; other clinical roles include General Paediatric Surgeon, Burns Surgeon, and Liver and Renal Transplantation Surgeon.
- Head, Department of Surgery, 2001-2004.
- Provides paediatric surgery services to regional areas; travels to Orange every 3 months for 2 days of consultations and surgery.
- Designed laparoscopic surgery training device for teaching keyhole surgery techniques outside the operating theatre, 2001.
- Author, over 40 peer reviewed medical research papers published in medical journals and/or presented at meetings nationally and internationally.
- Heads a paediatric surgical team that spends 2 weeks annually providing surgical services and teaching local surgeons, for past 10 years; currently expanding to serve 4 major centres in PNG.
- Has developed more formal training scheme for paediatric surgery in PNG, since 2000.
  Assisted 2 PNG surgeons to come to Australia to train with him at The Children's Hospital and other centres.
- Fellow, Royal Australasian College of Surgeons (General Surgery and Paediatric Surgery),1984; current Member, Section of Transplant Surgery.
- Current Member, Australian Association of Paediatric Surgeons.
- Current Member, Transplantation Society of Australia and New Zealand.
- Current Member, Pacific Association of Paediatric Surgeons.
- Member, International Paediatric Transplantation Association.
