Camarillo Library Dedication / Grand Opening March 31, 2007

On December 2, 2002, the City of Camarillo received news that it was among a handful of California cities selected to receive a grant from the State for a new Library. Camarillo's grant was a significant \$15.6 million, which was approximately 65% of the \$24.5 million cost to build the new Library.

On Friday, April 22, 2005, the City broke ground for the new Camarillo Library. A crowd of nearly 200 people gathered to celebrate the start of the massive construction project. On that day, Mayor Kildee hosted the festivities as the City Councilmembers, Ventura

County and State officials congratulated the City on its immense undertaking.

On Saturday, March 31, 2007 the entire community is invited to attend and celebrate the Grand Opening and dedication of the new Camarillo Library. The event will feature a ribbon cutting ceremony, special programs, entertainment, refreshments and, most importantly, the Library's first day of service to the community!

Ultra-Low Flush Toilet Drop Ship Program to Begin March 1, 2007

The City of Camarillo Water Division, in cooperation with Calleguas Municipal Water District and the Metropolitan Water District of Southern California, is pleased to announce its fifth Ultra-Low Flush Toilet (ULFT) Direct Distribution Program, scheduled to begin on March 1, 2007. ULFTs are a great way to conserve water because they use 1.6 gallons of water per flush compared to older toilets that use from 3.5 to 5 gallons per flush.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

If you live in a single family dwelling, multiple family dwelling or mobile home, and pay your water bill to the City of Camarillo, you may be eligible to receive up to two ULFTs free of charge. If you have received only one ULFT in any of the City's previous programs, you may still be eligible to receive one additional ULFT!

Toilets being replaced must use 3.5 gallons or more per flush and must have existing floor bolts at least 10" from the wall behind the toilet to ensure proper fit. You will be provided with everything you need for installation.

DELIVERY

For your convenience, your new ULFT(s) will be shipped directly to your front door by Fed Ex, unlike our previous distribution programs where the participants had to pick them up at a designated City facility. Delivery of the new ULFT's can be expected within three weeks from the date that an eligible coupon is received by city staff.

HOW TO PARTICIPATE

- Complete the form below and mail it to: City of Camarillo, ULFT Program, P.O. Box 248, Camarillo, CA 93011-0248.
- All coupons received will be reviewed for eligibility.
- Applicants declared ineligible will be notified by mail.
- Only 300 ULFTs will be distributed through this year's program so mail your coupon today.

Customers may be randomly selected for a site visit to verify installation. Those who do not install their new toilets will be charged \$110 per toilet on their water bill. Customers who decide to return their new toilet(s) will be responsible for all shipping arrangements and costs. Proof of return will be required if a site visit is conducted.

Each customer is responsible for disposal of the old toilet(s). E.J. Harrison and Sons provides one bulky item pick up free of charge – not more than two times in a 12-month period. To schedule a single bulky item pick up, please call 647-1414.

Spring Cleaning Guide

ime to clean out your garage and attic, but what should you do with that dingy old chair or mattress and the other clutter gathered during your cleaning spree? Here are some suggestions on several recycling and disposal programs available to residents.

Bulky Items—Call 647-1414

City of Camarillo refuse customers (those who receive a refuse bill directly from the City) can have two bulky items picked up in a 12-month period without an additional charge. Accepted items include mattresses, appliances, water heaters, furniture, etc., and tree stumps that weigh less than 50 pounds.

For non-City of Camarillo refuse customers, E.J. Harrison & Sons, the City's franchised refuse hauler, will charge \$25 per bulky item, plus handling fees for special handling such as freon removal, Cathode Ray Tube (CRT) recycling and other hard-to-handle items.

Refuse Bin Rental—Call 647-1414

Three-cubic-yard refuse bins and large roll-off containers may be rented for big clean-up projects. E.J. Harrison & Sons will bill customers directly for these services. Please contact the Public Works Department at (805) 388-5340 before bins and roll-offs are placed in the street or while your construction permit is in effect for the property.

Household Hazardous Wastes (HHW) like paint, solvents, pesticides, pool chemicals, and household cleaners

must NOT be discarded in refuse or recycling barrels. The City's HHW drop-off center is open the second consecutive Friday and Saturday of each month by appointment. Used motor oil and oil filters may be recycled at the drop-off location or at State-certified recycling centers. For a complete list of State-certified centers, please visit the City's

U-Waste Program

Universal Waste Program (U-Waste)—Call 987-0717

Common batteries such as AA, AAA, C and D cells, button batteries (e.g. hearing aids), fluorescent tubes and bulbs and other mercury-containing lamps, and thermometers (sealed glass style) contain toxic chemicals that can cause harm to people, animals and the environment. These wastes must NOT be discarded in your refuse or recycling barrels. Please contact the City's HHW drop-off center for an appointment.

City of Camarillo Water Division to Begin Water Main Flushing


It's time again for the annual flushing of the City's water mains. The Public Works Water Division conducts this program to provide water of the highest quality possible to its customers. Flushing is done under the recommendation of the California Department of Health Services. It removes mineral deposits within the City's water distribution system, and will identify unexpected leakage from valves or hydrants that need to be repaired or replaced. The benefits derived from this program will outweigh the comparatively small amount of water that will be flushed from the system.

The City of Camarillo will begin flushing Sunday night, April 1 from 9 p.m. to 6 a.m. Monday, April 2. The nighttime flushing will take place on the first day in Zone 1 only. Flushing will continue with Zones 2 through 10 from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. beginning Tuesday, April 3 through Friday, April 13. No flushing will be conducted the weekend of April 7-8.

Your water service should not be interrupted when the mains are flushed, but there may be less water pressure than normal. There is also a possibility that the water may be discolored for a short time in the zone being flushed, and possibly adjacent zones. This is a temporary condition and not a health risk. Before doing laundry or other projects that may be affected by the discolored water, make sure the water is running clear by running your cold water. If you develop a problem with a rusty color on laundry items, stain remover is available from the Water Division at no cost by calling (805) 388-5373.

This flushing program will not affect residents served by Camrosa Water District (in the Mission Oaks/Leisure Village area), Pleasant Valley Mutual Water District, Crestview Water District, or the Cal-American Water District.

Bike Safety Tips

In the past two months there have been four traffic accidents involving bicyclists near Monte Vista School in Camarillo. Most of these accidents were the fault of the cyclists. Camarillo Police



Department would like to remind everyone of some of the following bike safety tips:

- 1. Wear a helmet! It's the law. You could be fined up to \$120 for not wearing a helmet. Studies show that 74-85% of bicycle related injuries could be prevented with the proper use of a helmet. Proper use means buying a good helmet, making sure it fits, and making sure to buckle the chin strap, fitting securely under the chin.
- 2. **Don't ride in high traffic areas**. Kids under 10 should not be riding without an adult nearby.
- 3. Make sure the bike fits the rider. To make sure your bike fits, sit on the bike and try to balance the bike with your toes. If you can't reach the ground, it may be as simple as adjusting the seat height.
- 4. Obey traffic rules and use hand signals. A bike is considered a "vehicle" and it must follow the same rules of the road as a car. This means you must stop at stop signs and be sure to walk your bike across the street.
- 5. Watch for road hazards such as: potholes, people, animals, or any object in your path.
- 6. Wear reflective clothing. If you are riding at night or even at dusk, make yourself visible. You are also required to have a working headlight if you are biking at night (you can tape a flash light to your handle bars).
- 7. **Ride on the right side of the road**, with the flow of traffic.
- 8. Look left, right, and left again when entering traffic.
- 9. **Ride in single file**. Riding in a group is always safer, but remember to ride in single file.
- 10. Never listen to headphones while riding a bike. Safe cyclists rely on their ears to bring sounds of approaching vehicles, animals, and people!
