levels of the game - nurturing our young talent involved in grassroots football, right through to the ASB Premiership's elite players.

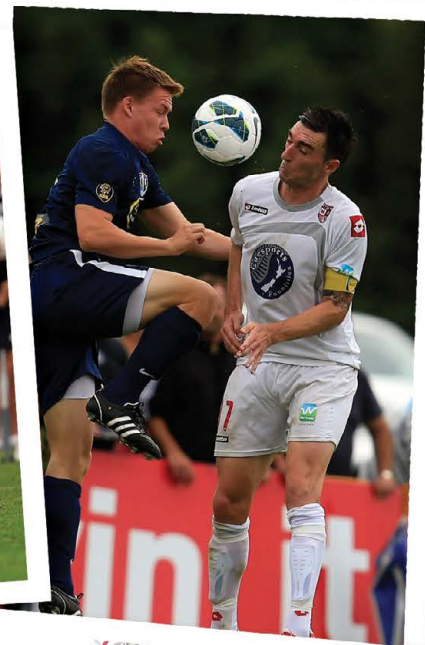
Our partnership with New Zealand Football is continuing to develop and we have already seen the game growing in profile and popularity across the country as more and more young players choose to take up this great sport every year.

## OVERVIEW

Auckland City thrives on international competition securing its third consecutive OFC Champions League title and fifth overall last season. But where the Navy Blues dominate the Oceania region replicating that form domestically has evaded them in recent times and in March it will be the five years since the club last won the ASB Premiership.

If coach Ramon Tribulietx wants to wrestle the ASB Premiership from the grip of arch-rivals Waitakere United he'll have to depend on the services of veteran All White and Auckland City skipper Ivan Vicelich. The club has lost Spanish players Manel Exposito, Gustavo Souto and Pedro Garcia, but can rely on the formidable goal scoring prowess of new signing Roy Krishna, snatched from Waitakere United alongside another former Fred Taylor Park favourite, Ryan de Vries.

## COACH – Ramon Tribulietx

Tribulietx returns for his third season in full charge of Auckland City and has a new look backroom team to support him. Former Navy Blues foundation player and All White, Riki van Steeden, is assistant coach, while Italian goalkeeper coach replaces Grant Robertson. The 41-year-old Tribulietx hopes to guide Auckland to its first ASB Premiership title for five years while delivering a credible performance at the FIFA Club World Cup in Morocco in December.

## PLAYER TO WATCH – Roy Krishna

Roy Krishna is not the first high-profile Waitakere United striker to swap West Auckland for Central. The 26-year-old Fiji international has pace, aggression, maturity and a career haul of 71 goals in all competitions for his former club and adds another attacking dimension to an already formidable attacking line-up that includes Ryan de Vries, Darren White and Adam Dickinson. Krishna may be about to enter his prime as a footballer and that alone could go a long way to ending Auckland City's five year ASB Premiership title drought.

## OVERVIEW

Canterbury made it to their fourth straight playoff appearance last season and anything less than a repeat would be considered failure such as has been the turnaround of fortune under coach Keith Braithwaite.

Braithwaite's conundrum is extending that impressive record to a fifth appearance as teams around the country add to their squads. Striker Russell Kamo and All Whites midfielder Aaron Clapham are key components in Canterbury United's attacking arsenal while veteran goalkeeper Adam Highfield is one of the most experienced custodians in the domestic game. ASB Football Park is another string in Canterbury United's bow with the Dragons home record an impressive one that shows only four defeats in 14 regular season games stretching back two seasons. But how Canterbury United harness their away form in the coming season could be key to determining whether they will again be in the playoff mix.

## COACH – Keith Braithwaite

Now in his fifth consecutive season as Dragons' boss, Braithwaite has made Canterbury United a force to be reckoned with in the ASB Premiership. The English-born former All White signed a two year extension to his current deal and has targeted qualification for the OFC Champions League for the Dragons. Braithwaite is now the longest serving coach currently in charge of an ASB Premiership franchise with 64 matches under his belt and boasts a 50% win rate, the highest of any previous Canterbury United coach.

## PLAYER TO WATCH – Aaron Clapham

Second top goal scorer in the ASB Premiership for the second consecutive season, Clapham has amassed 13 international caps and is a contender to be involved with the New Zealand All Whites FIFA World Cup Inter-continental Playoff in November. Clapham is Canterbury United's top goal scorer of all time level with Russell Kamo and brings experience, attacking verve and a much needed goal threat. If Canterbury go all the way to the playoffs again it will be due to Clapham's contribution in no small part.

## OVERVIEW

Last season Hawke's Bay United delivered its best ever performance in the ASB Premiership by cracking the playoff barrier for the first time in history.

Led by a pacy attacking frontline that consisted of Dakota Lucas, Sean Lovemore and veteran striker Jarrod Smith, the Bay tore through the regular season as a competitive unit capable of beating any opponent on their day. An epic semi-final tussle with Waitakere United ended in a remarkable 10-5 aggregate defeat but left supporters and players alike believing that there could be more to come from the Bluewater Stadium-based franchise this season.

The evidence suggests that there is still much more to come from Hawke's Bay United as they seek to return to the top four for a second consecutive season. The loss of Cole Peverley to Team Wellington is a blow to their hopes of a repeat but is offset by the transfer capture of All Whites and former Wellington Phoenix midfielder David Mulligan.

## COACH – Chris Greatholder

Chris Greatholder's side had his stamp firmly on it last season as the former Hawke's Bay United player signed a raft of exciting talent aimed at qualifying for the semi-finals. Greatholder has his side playing with confidence and attacking verve that has seen fans return to Bluewater Stadium in their droves. Active in the transfer market during the off-season and a coach with an eye for detail, don't be surprised to see Hawke's Bay United pushing for a playoff spot come the business end of the season. Greatholder's wins/games ratio remains higher than any previous coach of the club.

## PLAYER TO WATCH - David Mulligan

A player with plenty to prove, David Mulligan's signing could be coup of the season if the diminutive midfield man can recapture the early season form he showed for Waitakere United last year before his neck injury. Comfortable on the ball and deadly from set-pieces, Mulligan's arrival is timely as coach Chris Greatholder seeks to strengthen his midfield engine room following the departure of Cole Peverley. One of the best players in New Zealand on his day, Mulligan is a goal threat as well as a creator and could be a vital cog in Hawke's Bay United's bid for success.

## OVERVIEW

A fresh approach under a new coach Luiz Uehara sees Otago United rebranded as Southern United for the 2013-14 ASB Premiership season. Uehara takes over from predecessor Richard Murray and faces a tough challenge to lift the club out of the lower reaches of the competition and back into the play-off frame. It's been seven years since Southern United last tasted the playoffs and four years since they missed out narrowly on goal difference to Canterbury United.

Four players with professional experience gained in leagues in Asia, South America and Europe have been recruited to bolster the side with the addition of David Low, Patrick Ebanda, Henrique Alves Viana and Jefferson Potrich. Low, a left back, hails from Singapore's S-League, while both goalkeeper Potrich and striker Henrique Alves Viana arrive from Brazil. Ebanda, a defensive midfielder from Cameroon, has played professionally in Kiev, Ukraine.

## COACH – Luiz Uehera

A debut season for Luiz Uehara shapes as a difficult one for the Brazil-born teacher of Physical Education at Otago University. Shorn of the bulk of the club's core players from last season, the University coach of four years has no shortage of experience to draw on having coached in Japan and cut his teeth in New Zealand's domestic scene with Football South. But if Southern United and Uehara are to make a big impact on the ASB Premiership much depends on the success of his four overseas signings.

## PLAYER TO WATCH – Regan Coldicott

Top scorer for the club last season, Regan Coldicott could make the difference between finishing in the bottom two or climbing the ASB Premiership table for Southern United. A physical player who boasts pace and a deadly finish with a lethal right foot shot, Coldicott can play through the middle or out wide. Coldicott bagged six goals last season as Otago United engaged in a three-way scrap with Waikato FC and YoungHeart Manawatu to avoid the wooden spoon. The highlight for Coldicott was scoring for Otago United in both matches with Oceania champions Auckland City FC at Kiwitea Street and Forsyth Barr Stadium.

## OVERVIEW

A new season, a new coach and a new look and feel as Waikato FC underwent a facelift to become Waibop United. Coach Peter Smith replaced Mark Cossey during the off-season as Waibop United set about seeking buy-in from a wider catchment area.

## COACH – Peter Smith

Peter Smith makes his debut as an ASB Premiership coach and becomes the eighth coach of this franchise in ten seasons. Expect Smith to capitalise on the advice and guidance of Tauranga-based former Auckland City boss Allan Jones while the addition of another former Waikato FC coach and All White Che Bunce looks a shrewd appointment. ## OVERVIEW
