Fed Makes Bold Rate Cut

Central bank responds to global fears with .75 percent cut

WASHINGTON | The Federal Reserve unexpectedly slashed a key interest rate by a bold three-fourths of a percentage point on Tuesday, responding to a global plunge in stock markets that heightened concerns about a recession. The Fed signaled that further rate cuts were likely.

The reduction in the federal funds rate from 4.25 percent to 3.5 percent marked the biggest reduction in this target rate for overnight loans on records going back to 1990. It marked the first time that the Fed has changed the funds rate between meetings since 2001, when the bank was battling the impacts of a recession and the Sept. 11 terrorist attacks.

Federal Reserve Chairman Ben Bernanke and his colleagues approved the large rate cut Monday night, a day when global markets had been pounded by rising concerns that weakness



→ Democratic leaders vow to work closely with President Bush to enact a stimulus package. PAGE 3 in the world's largest economy was spreading worldwide. Despite the bold move, Wall Street plunged at the opening with the Dow Jones industrial average down 465 points before stocks began to rebound. The Dow finished the day off 128.11 points at 11,971.19, according to preliminary calculations.

Analysts said the fact that the Fed did not wait until its meeting next week to cut rates underscored the seriousness of the situation. "The world's stock markets are in meltdown, so the Fed came in with an inter-meeting move to try to stop the panic," said Christopher Rupkey, senior economist at Bank of Tokyo-Mitsubishi. (AP)



NEW YORK City Revives Effort to Put Calorie Counts on Menus

The New York City Board of Health voted Tuesday to approve a new version of a law requiring fast-food outlets to display calorie counts on their menus, hoping the fat-filled truth will shock New Yorkers into eating healthier. The regulation, which takes effect March 31, was altered slightly after a judge rejected the city's first attempt last year. The new regulation applies to any chain that operates at least 15 separate outlets, including those that don't currently provide any information on calories. (AP)

FORT COLLINS, COLO. Man Freed From Prison On Results of New DNA Test

Timothy Masters walked out of court a free man for the first time in nearly a decade Tuesday, his murder conviction wiped out by DNA evidence that points to another suspect. Masters, 36, who was sentenced to life in prison in 1999, was ordered freed on a personal recognizance bond by Larimer County District Judge Joseph Weatherby. New tests announced last week showed DNA found on the victim's clothing was not from Masters. (AP)


Economic Bill Quickly Takes Shape

Bush, Congress united on need for swift vote on stimulus package

WASHINGTON | You know the economy is in big trouble when Democrats and Republicans start talking cooperation instead of confrontation.

Recession fears and an unnerving meltdown in global markets are forcing a burst of emergency action rarely seen in this slow-moving and politically divided capital.

The bitterness and name calling that have been the hallmark of relations between President Bush and the Democratic-led Congress were replaced on Tuesday — at least for

now — by cordiality and cooperation. Lawmakers joined administration officials in negotiations on upward of \$150 billion in tax cuts and government spending to pump up the economy.

Bush summoned lawmakers to the White House to talk about his recent trip to the Middle East, but the subject on everyone's mind was the deteriorating economy and plummeting world markets.

"The urgency that we feel at home is now even more urgent as we see the impact of our markets on others," House Speaker Nancy Pelosi said afterward.


Senate Majority Leader Harry Reid said the goal was to get a deal through Congress and on Bush's desk within roughly three weeks — lightning speed compared with the usual snail's pace on Capitol Hill.

Bush expressed confidence that he and the Democratic-led Congress could put aside sharp differences that have marked his presidency.

Administration officials are focusing on rebates of \$800 to \$1,600 for individuals and couples and so-called bonus depreciation to allow companies to deduct 50 percent of business investments made this year.

Democrats say the package also should include boosts in unemployment benefits, food stamp payments and the Medicaid health care program for the poor and disabled. TERENCE HUNT (AP)

Minn. Bridge Victims Prep Lawsuit

ST. PAUL, MINN. | Dozens of victims of last summer's bridge collapse in Minneapolis — from surviving spouses to the parents of children riding on a yellow school bus — have filed preliminary paperwork to sue the state. The documents provide a glimpse into a brewing legal battle over the Aug. 1 disaster, in which the Interstate 35W bridge plummeted 60 feet into the Mississippi River, killing 13 people and injuring 145. The first legal deadline requiring those injured to notify the state within 180 days — is coming up Sunday. Lawyers described the notices as a formality that may not even be necessary to sue later, but the number of notices indicate that many victims are contemplating their options in court. (AP)

Sentence For Padilla Is 17 Years

Man once accused of 'dirty bomb' plot gets lenient jail term

MIAMI | Jose Padilla, an American once accused of plotting with al-Qaeda to detonate a radioactive "dirty bomb," was sentenced Tuesday to a relatively lenient 17-year prison term on unrelated terror support charges.

Prosecutors in the case, who long ago dropped the "dirty bomb" claim that made Padilla infamous, had sought life sentences for Padilla and two

co-defendants, but a federal judge said authorities never even proved Padilla was a terrorist.

Padilla, 37, and co-defendants Adham Amin Hassoun, 45, and Kifah Wael Jayyousi, 46, were convicted in August after a three-month trial of being part of a support cell that sent recruits, money and supplies to Islamic extremists, including al-Qaeda. CURT ANDERSON (AP)

Thompson Exits GOP Race

Ex-senator struggled to gain traction with voters in early states

NAPLES, FLA. | Republican Fred Thompson, the actor-politician who attracted more attention as a potential presidential candidate than as a real one, quit the race for the White House on Tuesday after a string of poor finishes in early primary and caucus states.

"Today, I have withdrawn my candidacy for president of the United States. I hope that my country and my party have benefited from our having made this effort," the former Tennessee senator said in a brief statement.

Thompson's fate was sealed last Saturday in the South Carolina primary, when he finished third in a state that he had said he needed to win.

In the statement, Thompson did not say whether he would endorse any of his former rivals.

Thompson placed third in Iowa and South Carolina, two states seemingly in line with his rightleaning pitch and laid-back style, and fared even worse in the four other states that have held contests thus far. Money already tight, he ran out of it altogether as the loss-

Despite initial impressions that Thompson could garner strong conservative support, it never materialized. He never won backing from more than one in five conservatives in any of the earliest primaries and Caucuses. DAVID ESPO (AP)

Democratic Race Takes Fiery Turn

Clinton, Obama trade barbs after intensely personal S.C. debate

WASHINGTON | Democrat Hillary Rodham Clinton argued on Tuesday that Barack Obama's frustration with losing prompted him to look for a fight in their latest debate. Obama said his rival and her husband, former President Clinton, were distorting his record.

"I think it's very clear that Senator Clinton ... and the president have been spending the last month attacking me in ways that are not accurate," Obama told reporters in a conference call shortly after she lashed out at him in a bitter exchange that carried over from Monday night's debate.

Speaking to reporters in Washington, Hillary Clinton belittled Obama's line of debate criticism against her as "rehearsed points." "I think what we saw last night was that he's very frustrated," she said. "I believe that the events of the last 10 or so days, the outcome of New Hampshire and Nevada, have apparently convinced him to adopt a different strategy."

Former President Clinton said Tuesday he enjoyed the bickering.

"I know you think it's crazy, but I kind of like to see Barack and Hillary fight," Bill Clinton told a mostly white crowd at a black church in Greenville, S.C. "They're flesh-andblood people, and they have their differences - let them have it."

When asked whether he thought his legacy among blacks would be harmed by challenging Obama, Bill Clinton said he wasn't standing in Obama's way but rather advocating for his wife.

"I think it would be just as much a change, some people think more, to have the first woman president than to have the first African-American president," he said. BETH FOUHY (AP)



In Europe, President Pervez Musharraf said border attacks were "pinpricks" that his government must manage. The attack on the fort, the second this month, occurred in South Waziristan, a lawless tribal region whereal-Qaeda- and Taliban-linked militants operate. (AP)

BAGHDAD, IRAQ Suicide Attacker Targets High School, Injuring Dozens

A suicide bomber pushing an electric heater atop a cart packed with hidden explosives attacked a high school north of Baghdad on Tuesday, leaving students and teachers bloodied and bewildered as insurgents appeared to be expanding their list of targets. The bombing was one of two attacks near Iraqi schools on the same day. One man was killed and 21 people were wounded. (AP)



6 Nations Agree on Iran Sanctions

Draft of 3rd resolution strengthens penalties over nuclear program

BERLIN | The five permanent members of the U.N. Security Council and Germany agreed Tuesday to impose new sanctions on Iran over its suspect nuclear program, yet the measures appeared to fall short of what the Bush administration had wanted.

After months of diplomatic bickering and U.S. pressure, Washington and its European allies overcame strong Chinese and Russian resistance to a third U.N. sanctions resolution and they all approved a draft that expands and strengthens the penalties that were in the two earlier ones.

The draft was presented as a sign of international resolve that Iran should not be allowed to develop nuclear weapons and unity on the need to press the country into suspending its uranium enrichment that can produce material needed to make the bomb.

ELUSIVE DRAFT DETAILS

→ U.S. and European diplomats said the draft bolsters existing sanctions, notably asset freezes and travel bans on Iranian officials. But they disagreed on whether it contains new measures. A U.S. official insisted that the resolution has "new elements," but declined to elaborate on what they were. A European official said the draft does not feature new economic sanctions. But the document, hailed by U.S. officials as a victory for the Bush administration's tough line on Iran, was not released. And participants in the two-hour negotiating session that produced it pointedly refused to discuss details.

In addition, the foreign ministers of the six nations represented — Britain, China, France, Russia, the U.S. and Germany — canceled a planned news conference and forced the meeting's host, German Foreign Minister Frank-Walter Steinmeier, to announce results. MATTHEW LEE (AP)

Limited Supplies Allowed Into Gaza

70 people injured in clashes along closed Gaza-Egypt border

GAZA CITY, GAZA STRIP | Israel sent fuel to Gaza's power plant on Tuesday, easing its five-day blockade of the Palestinian territory amid growing international concern about a humanitarian crisis.

The U.S. warned Israel not to add to the hardship for ordinary Palestinians but blamed the problem on Gaza's Islamic Hamas rulers. Israel imposed the siege in response to increasing attacks on its border communities by Gaza militants.

Despite the easing of the closure, Palestinian militants fired 19 rockets toward Israel on Tuesday, the military said, up from just two on Monday.

The lights were back on in most of Gaza City by Tuesday afternoon after a blackout that lasted almost two days. But Gazans still vented their anger.

Hundreds of Hamas supporters briefly broke through the Gaza-Egypt border and clashed with Egyptian riot police who fired in the air, injuring 70 people on both sides. Protesters hurled insults at Egyptian President Hosni Mubarak, calling him a coward.

Israel and Egypt have banned most crossings in and out of Gaza since Hamas seized control of the territory in June. Egypt has kept its border closed, tacitly supporting Israel's blockade.

Israeli tanker trucks pumped in 185,000 gallons of fuel, enough to provide electricity to Gaza City for two days. Other trucks delivered cooking gas and medicine. IBRAHIM BARZAK (AP)

Putin Heir Opens His Campaign

Medvedev urges crime crackdown as foe is accused of forgery

MOSCOW | President Vladimir Putin's likely successor opened his election campaign Tuesday with a promise of stability and contin-

ued economic growth for Russia, and called for a redoubled effort to root out corruption. Dmitry Med-



vedev said U.S. and Europe-

an criticism of Russian policies stemmed from misconceptions. But he signaled no shift from Moscow's assertive foreign policy.

Medvedev's call for a crackdown on corruption came as prosecutors accused the campaign of Mikhail Kasyanov, a former prime minister who is the only liberal Kremlin critic left in the race, of forging signatures on election petitions.

Kasyanov, who accuses Putin of strangling democracy, said his campaign victim to "an orgy of lawlessness" by authorities. He claimed his activists were intimidated into signing false confessions that signatures were faked. VLADIMIR ISACHENKOV(AP)



WASHINGTON | The Supreme Court dealt a probably fatal blow Tuesday to Enron Corp. investors' efforts to recover \$40 billion from Wall Street banks in the 2001 collapse of the Texas energy company.

Without comment, the justices refused to hear arguments in the Enron case. Attorneys for shareholders immediately vowed to return to federal court in Houston in an attempt to prove that the investment banks helped conceal Enron's true financial condition.

With Antonio Daniels starting, Washington now runs coach Eddie Jordan's offense far smoother than they did under Arenas.





First-Place Pens Will Miss Crosby

All-Star center will miss most of the year, like his mentor used to

NHL | If Sidney Crosby wants any advice on dealing with the first major injury of his hockey career, he needs only to bring up the subject at the dinner table.

After all, who is better versed on handling a bad injury than Penguins co-owner Mario Lemieux, the team's longtime but oft-injured star?

Crosby, the NHL's marquee name and the player the Penguins are building a contender around, learned Tuesday he will be out for six to eight weeks with a high ankle sprain.

"I was hoping three or four weeks would be the most," Crosby said, talking publicly Tuesday for the first time since being hurt. "It doesn't look like it will be like that. We'll see how fast I heal."

If Crosby is out for eight weeks, or until mid-March, he would miss most of the remaining regular season. That would be major setback to the Penguins, who are locked in a three-way race for the division.

The Penguins, who lost to the Capitals in a shootout on Monday night, are 10-1-2 in their last 13 games but are only 1-2-3 in the six games they've played without Crosby the last three seasons.

Still, the Penguins are very familiar with coping with the loss of a major star to a major injury. It happened repeatedly to Lemieux as he sat out the equivalent of 91/2 seasons due to back problems, cancer, a heart condition and other injuries during a Hall of Fame career that began in 1984 and ended in 2006.

"His injuries were a little different from mine - cancer and life-threatening things are a little different," said Crosby, who lives in Lemieux's house during the season. "But he's definitely someone who knows. We'll see if I need to pick his brain at some point." ALAN ROBINSON (AP)



United Makes Its Ist Signing of '08

Team brings in striker from Argentina, may snag more foreign stars

UNITED | D.C. United will hold its first practice of the 2008 season next Monday, and it appears that after several weeks of rumors and waiting, a team is starting to take shape.

United announced its first major acquisition of the offseason on Wednesday: Argentine striker Franco Niell, who could be joined as early as this week by two more South American players.

Niell, 24, will be on loan to D.C. for one year from Argentinos Juniors, the Buenos Aires club famed for launching the legendary Diego Maradona. Niell has scored 10 goals in 60 games since 2004 and had one goal in nine matches last fall, when Argentinos finished a surprising fifth.

"We're getting a player who we believe has all the qualities to be successful on our team," GM Dave Kasper said. "Franco is an energetic, hard-working forward who will be a good complement to our team."

In addition to the rumored acquisitions of a Colombian defender and Peruvian goalkeeper, United is waiting on unsigned veterans Jaime Moreno and Christian Gomez. Its first game is not until March 12, when it visits Jamaican titlist Harbour View in the first round of the Champions Cup. BRIAN STRAUS

Sharapova Knocks **Off the Top Seed**

Serena loses, removing chance of a rematch in Australian Open final

TENNIS | Serena Williams stumbled one round short of a rematch, so Maria Sharapova had to unload a year's worth of retribution on somebody else.

Justine Henin caught the brunt of it.

Sharapova advanced to the Australian Open semifinals for the fourth straight year with a convincing 6-4, 6-0 win over top-ranked Henin, snapping the Belgian star's 32-match winning streak.

"Even though I beat Justine, it's definitely not over," the 20-year-old

Russian star said. "I still have a lot of business to take care of."

Defending champion Williams had slumped 6-3, 6-4 earlier in the afternoon to third-ranked Jelena Jankovic, who reached the semifinals at Melbourne Park for the first time and only the third time in a major.

Williams was unseeded and ranked No. 81 when she made her stunning run to an eighth Grand Slam title 12 months ago, punctuating that with an emphatic 6-1, 6-2 win over Sharapova.

It was a big setback for Sharapova, who struggled with a shoulder problem for most of the season and saw her ranking slip outside the top 5. John pye (AP)



'08 Versa Skips Vices

Lowest-priced Nissan car sticks to basics as entry-level sedan

PLAIN CAR | The 2008 Nissan Versa isn't your run-of-the-mill, entrylevel car.

Sure, the Versa's starting manufacturer's suggested retail price of \$13,255 for a sedan and \$13,355 for a five-door hatchback make it Nissan's lowest-priced model — car or truck.

In fact, the 2008 five-passenger Versa has the second-lowest starting price of any Japanese-brand new car offered in the United States.

Among all non-hybrid, 2008 mid-size cars, the Versa ranks first in federal government fuel economy ratings. All Versa models are rated at more than 30 miles per gallon in highway driving and at least 24 mpg in city driving. This means a Versa driver can potentially go more

than 400 miles on one fillup of the 13.2-gallon gasoline tank.

I just wish the Versa looked more interesting. The hatchback has a neat shape, but the sedan is ho-hum.

And on both sedan and hatchback, the Versa front end is similar in looks to that of a Nissan Quest minivan — which is hardly praise. Inside, the Versa can seem mainstream and uninspired in base trim with suede-like upholstery. In the test Versa S sedan, the dashboard and gauges looked plain, and the black fabric on the seats not only provided painful static shocks as I departed, but it also held tight to crumbs and dust.

In the backseat, three people sit close but not too close, and legroom of 38 inches is surprisingly generous — there are only 34.5 inches in the backseat of a Sentra and 34.6 inches in a Civic sedan.

I did hear the Versa engine as it worked, though, and road noise came through regularly from the 15-inch tires.

The front-wheel-drive Versa isn't a heavy car. It weighs about 2,700 pounds — about the same as a Civic sedan — and can feel lightweight as it travels.

While the test Versa sedan handled nimbly around town and on

country roads, it didn't exactly convey a refined ride.

Driver and passengers felt road bumps along the way, and big bumps brought harsh jolts. Also, the Versa can be buffeted while traveling in high wind conditions.

The Versa also is not top-rated in federal government crash test ratings. Instead, it received across the board four out of five stars for both front and side crash protection.

The Versa has done well at Nissan. Versa's 79,443 sales in 2007 helped account for the company's 75,000-car sales improvement over that of 2006. ANN M. JOB (AP)

Windy City on a Whim

Cold Chicago draws a handful of tourists even during the winter

DESTINATIONS | Paul Morrison and Chicago are a perfect match. To him, winter is supposed to be cold, and, in Chicago, it is.

So, maybe it's not surprising that the psychiatrist from Edinburgh, Scotland, was strolling around Millennium Park — a heavy jacket on his back and what looked like a sleeping muskrat on his head – taking in the sights the other day. And he was happy about it.

The Chosen Ones

It's Oscar time again! Without further ado, the nominees are ...

OSCAR | "No Country for Old Men" and "There Will Be Blood" led with eight Academy Award nominations each Tuesday, among them best picture and acting honors for Daniel Day-Lewis and Javier Bardem but it remained in doubt wheth-

er any stars would cross striking writers' picket lines to attend the ceremony.

"No Country for Old Men," a crime saga about a drug deal gone bad, and "There Will Be Blood," a historical epic set in California's oil boom years, will compete for best picture against the melancholy romance "Atonement," the pregnancy comedy "Juno" and the legal drama "Michael Clayton."

Awards shows have become casualties of the strike by writers, whose union leaders say they will not allow members to work on the Oscars. Nominees already are saying they would stay away in support of writers if the strike lingers until Oscar night Feb. 24.

Viggo Mortensen, who received a best-actor nomination for his performance as a Russian mob member in "Eastern Promises," said he would not go if the strike is still on.

"I wouldn't do that. I couldn't. I come from a tradition of not crossing picket lines," chimed in Tom Wilkinson, a supporting-actor nominee for "Michael Clayton."

"Atonement" and "Michael Clayton" trailed with seven nominations each, including best actor for George Clooney in the title role of "Clayton." The lead players in "Atonement," Keira Knightley and James McAvoy, were shut out on nominations, however, with teenager Saoirse Ronan the only performer nominated for that film, for supporting actress.

Past Oscar winner Cate Blanchett had two nominations, as best actress for the historical pageant "Elizabeth: The Golden Age" and supporting actress for the Bob Dylan tale "I'm Not There."

The acting categories generally played out as expected — with a few surprises, including best actress nominee Laura Linney for "The Savages" and best-actor nominee Tommy Lee Jones for "In the Valley of Elah."

Best actress looks like a twoperson duel between Julie Christie, an Oscar winner for "Darling," as a woman succumbing to Alzheimer's in "Away From Her" and Marion Cotillard as singer Edith Piaf in "La Vie En Rose." Both won Golden Globes, Christie for dramatic actress, Cotillard for musical or comedy actress. Yet they face strong competition from Blanchett, Linney and relative newcomer Ellen Page as a whip-smart pregnant teen in "Juno." david germain (AP)


Cat Power takes on Ol' Blue Eyes, Billie Holiday on 'Jukebox'

MUSIC | Listening to "Jukebox" is like sitting in a bar, late at night, after most folks have gone home and the band is onstage winding down by playing its favorites.

As she did with her first covers record, released in 2000, Chan Marshall, aka Cat Power, puts her own idiosyncratic stamp on a group of songs by her favorite singers. Unlike last time, when it was just

the broken and shy Power, "Jukebox" features Power's new bluesy, soulful sound with the Dirty Delta Blues Band backing her as on 2006's breakthrough album, "The Greatest."

Power's lived-in voice is fantastic as she puts a new, otherworldly spin on Frank Sinatra's version of "New York, New York," slows down Billie Holiday's "Don't Explain" or gives Hank Williams' "Ramblin'

Man" a funky soul on "Ramblin' (Wo)Man."

She even gives herself the treatment, re-imagining her own song "Metal Heart" from "Moon Pix," the first album that showed her unbounded promise. As she has with most of these covers, she adds gravitas in the arrangements and vocals scarred by liquor and cigarettes.

While we'd rather have an album of original material, "Jukebox" is a nice way to pass the time while we wait. CHRIS TALBOTT (AP)

Heath Ledger Dies

The actor was best known for his role in 'Brokeback Mountain'

OBIT | Heath Ledger was found dead Tuesday at a downtown Manhattan residence, and police said drugs may have been a factor. He was 28.

NYPD spokesman Paul Browne said Ledger had an appointment for a massage at the Manhattan apartment believed to be his home. The housekeeper who went to let him know the masseuse had arrived found him dead at 3:26 p.m.

The Australian-born actor was nominated for an Oscar for "Brokeback Mountain," on the set of which he met his girlfriend actress Michelle Williams, in 2005. Ledger and Williams had a daughter, Matilda, together and lived in Brooklyn until they split up last year.

Ledger was to appear as the Joker this year in "The Dark Night," a sequel to 2005's "Batman Begins." He's had starring roles in "A Knight's Tale" and "The Patriot," and played the suicidal son of Billy Bob Thornton in "Monster's Ball."

Ledger grew up in Perth and began doing amateur theater at age 10. At 16, he moved to Sydney to pursue an acting career, quickly landing TV movie roles and guest spots on Australian television.

After several independent films and a starring role in the short-lived Fox TV series "Roar," Ledger moved to Los Angeles and co-starred in "10 Things I Hate About You," a teen comedy reworking of "The Taming of the Shrew."

Offers for other teen flicks came his way, but Ledger turned them down, preferring to remain idle rather than sign on for projects he didn't like.

"It wasn't a hard decision for me," Ledger told The Associated Press in 2001. "It was hard for everyone else around me to understand. Agents were like, 'You're crazy'; my parents were like, 'Come on, you have to eat."



Ween is still singing about the sacred, the profane and the inane

DUO | Alt-rock's greatest jokers, Gene and Dean Ween, return with their familiar stylistic restlessness and lyrical mixture of the sacred, the profane and the inane on Ween's new CD, "La Cucaracha."

The brothers Ween — aka Aaron Freeman and Mickey Melchiondo — offer mariachi, dance-pop, balladry, country, hard rock, reggae, new age, pop-rock, epic-rock and schmaltzy David Sanborn-abetted easy listening on "La Cucaracha."

The songs are, without fail, extremely tuneful, frustratingly memorable and characterized by lyrics such as "You are a piece of meat. And I am a butcher," "I can make an airplane that travels over land!" and "I'm in a very defensive place." It's not laugh-out-loud funny, but "La Cucaracha" is consistently amusing and stands up to frequent listening.



"Parody implies something pretty negative," he said. "Is there a parody act out there other than Weird Al? Are we the second one? I don't think so. We listen to all kinds of music, and the music we make is a reflection of what we listen to. We just make music that we would want to listen to."

So, it's a sincere tribute to genres you like, then, not a joke?

"No! We don't think about this [stuff]! We don't put any thought into it," Melchiondo said. "We don't discuss it. It's a very natural thing. We listen to everything — Frank Sinatra, Stevie Wonder, Slayer. That's what made our style — the diversity of our record collections." TIM FOLLOS


The Truth Hurts

Bad dogs or bad press? When it comes to pit bulls, it seems like most people assume it's the first. But it wasn't always that way.

A pit bull named Stubby earned the rank of sergeant in World War I and appeared on the cover of "Life" magazine. Loyal pet of "The Little Rascals" on TV, the breed also used to symbolize the nation in editorial cartoons and Army posters at the beginning of the 20th century. At one time, pit bull terriers were the classic American dog.

and a \$5,000 grant for his or her shelter. "There are myths about every breed," says Dr. Emily Weiss of the ASPCA, who developed the Meet Your Match program. "If you read the breed description of American pit bull terriers, it doesn't say aggressive. They're incredibly social. They've been our heroes at war, our companions at home."

In fact, it's only recently that pit bulls have become the dogs that we fear most.

Ledy VanKavage, senior director for legal training and legislation at the ASPCA, knows this from experience. She had a German shepherd in the 1970s, when that breed had a fearsome reputation.

"When I was a kid, once I was walking my German shepherd. A woman came up to me and said, 'That dog's going to rip your face off," she says.

That experience was good preparation, perhaps, because VanKavage now has three adopted pit bulls - which she dresses in frilly collars so that people will stop to pet them instead of crossing the street to avoid them.

Perceptions of breeds change over time not because the dogs change, but because they become popular with different types of owners. "It's the fad dogs, not the DOGGED BY HISTORY: Pit bull terriers, including "The Little Rascals" Petey, above, used to be a national symbol.

bad dogs," VanKavage says of the changing fashions for "dangerous" breeds.

Behaviorist Weiss says that it's important to focus on individual animals. Each dog that comes into the ASPCA goes through the same testing, to rule out aggression - which can appear in any breed and to evaluate personality. Adopters are then given color-coded categories corresponding to the results of these tests, so they can look through the shelter for dogs that will meet their preferences.

"People walk in the door thinking they'd never have a pit bull. We've had people completely change their minds after seeing that animal as an individual," says Weiss.

Lisa LaFontaine, the CEO of the Washington Humane Society, is an advocate for the breed because she has her own pit bull mix, Nicholas

Some bachelors enjoy a solitary life, free of serious relationships

At 57, winemaker Bull Gulvin has never been married and has no such plans in the works.

He's not a mama's boy or a playboy. Instead, the Columbia, Pa., resident calls himself a "realist" for remaining single.

"There aren't many really compelling reasons to get married anymore," Gulvin says.

A lot of attention gets paid to single women, who can cheer themselves with chick flicks, self-help books and shows like "Sex and the City," which aim to empower female consumers to think of singledom as independence or self-reliance.

But this Valentine's Day, it's worth noting: Men can be single and fabulous, too.

While single women have seemingly banded together to change their image in the popular culture,

there's been no such battle cry for men, who have a whole different set of stereotypes to fight: They're confirmed bachelors, James Bond-style playboys, cranky old men or gay.

None of this is helped by the fact that married men live longer, or by the common notion that men need a woman's touch to perform household tasks like cooking.

But some proud, single men say they're better off alone.

In 2006, 33% of men in their early 30s had never been married.

"A man is a sperm bank, a meal ticket, a handyman and an early retirement plan," Gulvin says. For those reasons and others, he has decided to go through life without committing to one romantic relationship.

Both men and women are staying single longer, as the median marriage age rises. In 2006, 33 percent of men in their early 30s had never been married, compared to 29 percent of women, according to census numbers.

Experts say society still favors married men over their single coun-

terparts, though. The most common complaints come from the workplace, where many say they are discriminated against.


"Especially as you approach your mid-30s and 40s and all your colleagues around you are married, there's a lot of unsaid words that go on and feelings of inadequacy at work," says Sherri Langburt, founder of the new Web site Singleedition.com, an online community for happy singles.

Those include speculation about a single man's sexual preferences and, concomitantly, a difficulty in making friends with heterosexual co-workers because colleagues might question his motives.

Single men often say they are asked to work on holidays, put in longer hours or travel more for business. Employers often assume that without a spouse, unwed workers have extra time to spare, says Nicky Grist, executive director of the Alternatives to Marriage Project.

Particularly in the powerful worlds of business and politics, it's often all about appearances and presenting oneself as a stable man, Grist says.

"Part of that expectation probably still stems from the idea that in order to completely fulfill your role as a leader in this business or policy setting, you need the support of a family," she says. HILLARY RHODES (AP)

So, each place setting still requires some sort of memento. But what that should be is now up for debate.



a cupcake. "The good thing about food is that somebody will always eat it," notes planner Terri Carter (Benchmarkevents.com). The latest trend in that arena is the "candy bar," a buffet of sugary snacks often displayed in clear glass containers. Guests get a cellophane bag or a Chinese take-out box, then go to town scooping their favorite treats.

In a twist on that concept, Bob Mikolitch, director of catering for the Fairmont Washington hotel, worked with a bride who loved baking cookies. She supplied her favorite recipes, and his staff whipped up dozens of mini versions. On their way out, guests could customize a doggie bag and take recipe cards to try replicating the experience at home.

That kind of surprise unveiling near the event's end "gives a final oomph to the last hour of the wedding. It's all about the unexpected," Mikolitch says. Food-centric favors also provide a sugar rush for tiring dancers and a cake alternative for folks who just say no to fondant. Another popular option to fill that niche: luxe lollipops. Couples may opt for cheesecake scoops on a stick, or they can call on a company like A Sweet Idea (Asweetideaonline.com) to set up a station where guests can have images of themselves imprinted on chocolate lollipops.

Greenstein, however, steers her couples away from edibles. "It's nice to have that nosh, but with food, you eat it and you're done. The point is to make it last," she explains. Even with virtually no budget for the favors, you can make a CD. ("Although it's cheap, and people know that," she admits.) With a little more effort and cash, couples can cobble together Greenstein's new favorite idea — the family cookbook. "It has Grandma's cookies, the fish dish he's famous for, the pasta carbonara she made for that great dinner party," she explains. Just laminate the pages and stick them on a binder ring, and you're done.

Gifts aren't totally off-limits, of course (except for maybe those votive candles). If they capture an aspect of the couple's personality, there might be nothing better. That way, they don't need a monogram to be memorable, which means guests are more likely to keep using them — even if the couple isn't married five years later.

BAR NONE: At a candy bar, guests fill bags or boxes with favorite confections.

The real secret to favor success is putting some thought into them, Johnson says, which isn't always easy when dealing with the never-ending list of other concerns related to throwing this epic bash. Her most recent bull's-eye came from a couple whose invitation featured the image of a groom in a fez presenting his bride with a jewelry box. So, at the wedding, when ladies got jewelry boxes and gentlemen got fezzes, everyone felt in on the joke. Even better: They wore them onto the dance floor. "It turned into a free-for-all, with all of those tassels spinning," Johnson recalls.

So, remember, when all else fails, there are always silly hats. VICKY HALLETT (EXPRESS)

A Place in the Fun

Head to the craft store to create witty, memorable DIY place cards

When it comes to wedding seating arrangements, you have a few options. A) Enlist a pushy family member to escort guests to their tables. B) Let anarchy reign as guests snatch up seats next to their buds, giving you flashbacks of elementary school field trips. Or C) Give everyone a card that leads them pleasantly and directly to their assigned seats.

Sure, craft stores and Web sites sell place cards and holders and frames by the dozen, but if you're feeling inventive, you can break out of the folded-paper rut by pairing cardstock with some artful accents from a craft store. (We like A.C. Moore). Designers, beware: You will end up spending more cash and time if you go the DIY route. These designs each took only two to five minutes to throw together, but when multiplied by your guest list, those minutes will add up. But if you have a short roster — and some willing friends and family — glue, glue away.

GARDEN PARTY

Spongy reindeer moss gives this combination a rainforest-y feel. Plug the flower pot (49 cents) with the moss (\$4.49 for 2.5 ounces). Found in the garden section of the craft store, this feathery butterfly (\$1.29 cents for a set of two) is attached to a bendable wire. Stick the wire in the moss and then fold the butterfly over a place card.

BEACH BASH

Pair a wee bucket (\$1) with some sand (\$2.49 for a 2pound bag) for this whimsical display. Add an accent like a beachball sticker (\$1 per sheet) to the card, which can be tucked askew

into the sand as if it washed up on the beach.

DOUBLE-TIMER

Make that place card do twice the work by attaching it to a small pillow box (\$1.49) containing reception favors, like chocolate or matchbooks. We dressed up this simple version by looping a band of ribbon (\$1.99 per spool) around the middle and gluing the place card to the front.

MESSAGE ON A BOTTLE

Fill an artful miniature vase (99 cents) with colorful glass pebbles (96 cents for a bag big enough to fill two containers). Attach a place card to a T-pin (\$2.39 for 100) with tape or glue and stick the pin into the top of the container. do," she says. "Just little, tiny changes that make a difference."

It's true — it doesn't take much to add a tinge of green. Hire a digital rather than a traditional photographer, or a DJ like Evan Reitmeyer (Mydeejay.com), whose company offsets its carbon emissions and runs a paperless office. Maybe you'll choose a green hotel for your out-of-town guests, or, instead of buying new, look on Craigslist.com or rent what you know you'll use only once. "It's the type of stuff I don't think anyone even noticed," says Mackay. In that spirit, we've gathered some easy wedding tweaks ranging from mini to medium to major.


Invites

→ **GREEN**: Calligraphy is expensive, but it eliminates the inks and chemicals that might be used in a commercial printing process.

→ GREENER: Look for locally sourced paper, either recycled or made from cotton, a renewable resource. Logan Circle's the Written Word (1427 P St. NW; 202-223-1400), for instance, sells soybased inks printed on U.S.-made cotton paper.

→ GREENEST: Skip the paper invites and e-mail/call your guests. Build a Web site with the pertinent details and send guests to it for info. Or do as Mackay did: She and her fiance sent invitations but included only one extra slip of paper. "We put a little bird on it that said, 'To support our conservation efforts, go to our Web site to RSVP.' That's as aggressive as my husband was willing to go," she laughs.



Flowers

→ GREEN: Reuse ceremony flowers as reception centerpieces. Planner Laura Auer of Soiree Special Events (Soireespecialevents.com) says it's as simple as checking with your florist, who may be heading back in your direction anyway.

→ GREENER: Buy pesticide-free flowers, so their area of origin stays clean and/or less-polluted.

→ GREENEST: Harvest seasonal posies from a friend or neighbor, or buy from a local farmer. This is tougher for a winter wedding, but still possible: Cindy Brown, assistant director of Greenspan Gardens in Fairfax County, suggests using brightly colored berries or dogwoods, which have red, pink or gold branches. If you don't want to give up flowers entirely, talk to Barbara Von Elm (Growingwildfloral.com), who combines imported and homegrown blooms (from her Delaplane, Va., farm) for her clients.

Food

→ GREEN: Donate your extra edibles to a local food bank. Some don't have the staff to pick up food from an evening reception, but for

PETA are right: Vegetarianism and veganism really are better. For the environment, at least. According to a 2006 UN Food and Agriculture Organization study, the international meat industry is responsible for 18 percent of the world's greenhouse gas emissions - even more than transportation.

Dress

→ GREEN: Borrow accessories instead of buying, and ask bridesmaids to buy a dress they'll wear again. Or, if you must have it all match, ask your entourage to donate their dresses to the Glass Slipper Project (Glassslipper project.org) or Fairy Godmothers Inc. (Fairygodmothersinc.com), organizations that give dresses to underprivileged teens come prom time.

→ GREENER: Buy a vintage wedding dress. Poshgirlvintage.com has a wide selection that varies weekly. And Brides Against Breast Cancer's sales of donated dresses benefit Making Memories, a nonprofit that grants the wishes of breast cancer patients.

→ GREENEST: Consider a gown made from sustainable materials, such as hemp. Rawganique.com and others sell organic hemp wedding dresses; hemp's a renewable, quick-growing resource that requires few to no chemicals to grow.

Venue/ Transportation

→ GREEN: Consider a reception spot that supports the environment, like a museum, garden or arboretum. At the Philip Merrill Environmental Center in Annapolis, one can admire views of the Chesapeake Bay from inside a LEED-certified building. → GREENER: Use shuttles or hybrid vehicles to move guests from the ceremony to the reception. Bonus points if you arrange for group transporta-

tion to get your out-of-town guests to and from the airport.

→ GREENEST: Hold the ceremony and reception at the same venue, or within walking distance of each other. Nowoslawski is doing this at the Decatur House, and the hotel is five blocks away.

Hair/Makeup

→ GREEN: Cargo Cosmetics' Plant Love lipsticks (\$20 each, Sephora) come in a compostable tube made out of corn. Plant the box and it'll sprout a patch of wildflowers.

→ GREENER: Look for the USDA

National Organic Program seal, which signifies at least 70 percent organic goodness inside. Or, set a natural tone with non-productshellacked hair. Go "more relaxed, with loose, natural-looking waves - something any hair type can accomplish with a great stylist and a good blow-dryer," says Fred Hawck, event-styling specialist at one80 Salon on K Street.


→ **GREENEST**: Skip the nail salon. Several chemicals in polish have been designated by the EPA as potentially harmful.

Honeymoon

→ GREEN: Calculate the CO2 your airplane trip will emit, using a calculator like the one at Terrapass.com, then buy offsets - money that funds the development of wind, solar or other renewable energy products. Warning: Carbon offsets are a controversial topic right now, with many debating the pros and cons.

→ GREENER: Select a hotel at Greenhotels.com. They're responsible for many of the changes occurring in the hotel industry - notably, those little cards in the room that ask you to reuse your towels.

→ **GREENEST**: It's official: Being green shows good taste! Anna Post, greatgreat-granddaughter of etiquette maven Emily Post, suggests: "Look locally for a cozy little B&B to hole up in - it cuts down on your carbon footprint and keeps your dollars in your local community." RACHEL KAUFMAN



Have we asked ourselves this question? Here are the 13 things we need to remember to bring with us to the ceremony. Here are the 14 questions we have to ask this vendor when we go to visit them.

How can brides prevent getting overwhelmed by all the to-dos?

We basically said we want to make it less overwhelming by the fact that it's broken down, but we're not going to shy away from the fact that all those things are "to-do."

Yes, it might be overwhelming to look at all those to-dos, but with the book, you should have the confidence that you're not going to be panicked at the last minute. It's not like you can't glaze over certain things. You might be like, "You know what? I just don't care about transportation. I'm going to delete that entire chapter." We wanted this to be a book that, by the end of your process, you probably just want to throw the heck out; it's really meant to be a working manual.

Why did you decide to include little tidbits about wedding traditions?

To keep it fun. It's cool to know that getting married on a half-hour has meaning in Chinese tradition about starting your relationship on an upswing. It's good cocktail party conversation - not just the questions you need to ask your florist.

What are some of the biggest pitfalls that await brides and grooms?

Good people go wrong most often in two categories. One, the guest list. They start talking about the wedding to everyone, then they feel backed into a corner to invite everybody that they've talked to. And that's not just the bride and groom; that's the moms. They're talking to their friends at the manicure salon and then all of a sudden, the reality strikes that they're only having 250 people at that wedding and that doesn't actually include your friends from the manicure salon.

This all ties in with budget, too. People spend money before they know how much money they're going to spend and can get themselves into a real pickle when they have that drop-dead gorgeous \$7,000 wedding dress and realize, "Hmm, maybe there won't be a cake."

I think the other thing is not

knowing what's important to them from the start. Your average bride wants every single thing to be a priority, and that's simply not realistic. And your friends will hate you.

OK: Bridezillas. What happens to these otherwise normal people?

I think this "unbearableness of brides" is anxiety. This is the day where you are being seen for "all that you are" by everyone you know, so every decision you make, in the background, you're thinking, "What will my boss think about this? My sister always thought I was cooler than I really am; maybe I should choose the cooler thing."

It's not often you get to throw \$30,000 into your own Broadway show, so I respect how anxiety-pro-

ed in certain parts of the country, but now that guests come from all over, you can't expect everyone at your wedding to know the rules of your local area. So, we're trying to make some nationwide expected standards. We're not saying, "You must do it this way. Who cares how much it costs?" We try to give you workarounds for it because we know that none of us have as much money as we'd like to have to throw our wedding. My wedding cost \$5,000. And I found a way. I just had sangria at my wedding because I couldn't have an open bar. But it was a festive solution; people still had something to drink. And, you know, I'm sure my uncle wanted his whiskey on the rocks, but it didn't create that complication for everyone.

voking it is, because you are in the limelight. I think people lose perspective on the fact that it's the relationships that matter most - notthe color of the bridesmaid dress.

The Knot sometimes shows an editorial opinion — when plus-1s are OK, why cash bars are out. How do vou come up with these "rules"?

We try to balance what we know are the realities of people's lives and the feedback. We do a lot of surveying of wedding guests and something like the cash bar, for example - people are just so bummed out about that. We're trying to translate for you: It's not worth it. Buy the cheapest beer you can think of. And we know that it's very accept-

Your wedding only cost \$5,000? For flowers, I had an aunt and I was, like, "Can you get some flowers and decorate the place?" And she just bought potted plants and put them in baskets and put them everywhere. Was it the most glamorous look on Earth? No. Did it feel festive? Yes. My wedding was not ready for the pages of my own magazine.

What you don't want people to do is, "Oh, we don't have any money. OK, so we're going to take two friends and go to city hall and have a quiet dinner and it'll just sort of be a non-wedding."
