performed by the Greenwich Music Festival

Plans are moving along for the Greenwich Arts Council's summer music series, produced in cooperation with the town's Department of Parks & Recreation. This year over 25 different musical events will be offered.

Kicking off the series, this Sunday, June 15, at 7:30 in the Cole Auditorium of the Greenwich Library, the GAC will present the Greenwich Music Festival in a concert of Monteverdi's love songs, *Madrigali Amorosi*.

Based on The Eighth Book of Madrigals, often considered the pinnacle of achievement of the madrigal form (and taking over 20 years to complete), the Eighth Book of Madrigals contains two halves: madrigali guerreri and madrigali amorosi or, roughly, songs of war and songs of love. The Greenwich Music Festival, under the direction of conductor Robert Ainsley, will present the love songs with featured soloists soprano Lisa Hopkins (who, as a principal in the ensemble of Baz Luhrmann's *La Boheme on Broadway*, received Tony honors for excellence in the theatre), tenors Steven Paul Spears and Karim Sulayman, and baritone Ted Huffman (cofounder of the Greenwich Music Festival). A chorus of local high school students and a baroque ensemble round out the June 15 performance. Admission is free on a first-come, first-served basis, and doors will open to the general public at 7 pm.
