Rob Boyd was a member of the Canadian National Alpine Ski Team from 1985-1997. During this 12-year career, he won a total 3-World Cup Downhill races, finished in the top three on 6-occasions and finished in the top 15 no fewer than 28-times. He also qualified as a member of the national alpine ski team for 3-Winter Olympic Games (1988 Calgary, Alberta, 1992 Albertville Savoie, France, 1994 Lillehammer, Norway) and 6-World Championships. In 1989, he was the first Canadian male to win a World Cup Downhill event on Canadian soil at Whistler, British Columbia.

He was also a member of the British Columbia Alpine Ski Team in 1983 and 1984 which would lead to his selection to the National Development Group in 1985.

He retired from World Cup competition in February, 1997, competed on the professional downhill circuit for three seasons:

1997/1998,1998/1999,1999/2000, and has appeared in a number of films as a freeskier/stunt performer for a variety of film companies including DesLauriers Films, Warren Miller, Greg Stump Productions, and Fuji Film. From 1986 to 1997 he appeared as a television commentator providing coverage of World Cup ski racing.
