#### **TIGHT RACE IN CD1, KUSTER LEADS IN CD2**



DURHAM, NH – In New Hampshire's 1<sup>st</sup> Congressional District, Congresswoman Carol-Shea Porter and former Congressman Frank Guinta remain locked in a tight contest while Republican Dan Innis is gaining strength. In District 2, Congresswoman Ann Kuster's favorability ratings have improved and she leads three largely unknown GOP opponents.

These findings are based on the latest **WMUR Granite State Poll**, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Six hundred and sixty-nine (669) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed by landline and cellular telephone between June 19 and July 1, 2014. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/-3.8 percent. Included were 342 residents of New Hampshire's First Congressional District (MSE = +/-5.3%) and 327 from the Second District (MSE = +/-5.4%). Of these residents, 263 in the First District (MSE = +/-6.0%) and 246 (MSE = +/-6.2%) in the Second District are 2014 likely voters.

#### Favorability Ratings - Congresswoman Carol Shea-Porter

Democrat Congresswoman Carol Shea-Porter, who was elected in 2006 from New Hampshire's First Congressional District, lost in 2010, and regained the seat in 2012, remains modestly popular in her district. Currently, 43% of 1<sup>st</sup> District adults have a favorable opinion of Shea-Porter, 31% have an unfavorable opinion, 5% are neutral, and 21% don't know enough about her to say. Her net favorability rating, the percentage who have a favorable opinion of her minus the percentage who have an unfavorable opinion, is +12%, has slipped slightly from +15% in April. Shea-Porter is very popular among Democrats (net +64%), somewhat unpopular among Independents (net -13%), and unpopular among Republicans (net -34%). Shea-Porter's net favorability among likely 2014 voters is +8%.




#### GOP Challengers for U.S. Congress - District 1

Two GOP candidates vying to challenge Shea-Porter are former Congressman Frank Guinta (R-Manchester), who was defeated by Shea-Porter in 2012, and former UNH business college Dean Dan Innis (R-Portsmouth).

Guinta, who was mayor of Manchester from 2006 to 2010, is the better known of the two, but his favorability ratings have been unstable in recent months. Currently 32% of 1<sup>st</sup> C.D. adults have a favorable opinion of Guinta, 27% have an unfavorable opinion of him, 8% are neutral and 33% don't know enough about him to say. His net favorability rating is +5% which is up from -6% in April. Guinta is remarkably unpopular among Republicans (net +16%) compared with Shea-Porter's popularity among Democrats (net +64%). He is more popular among Independents (+32%), and is unpopular among Democrats (-20%). Guinta's net favorability among likely 2014 voters is +6%.




Innis remains largely unknown in the 1<sup>st</sup> District. Currently, 11% have a favorable opinion of Innis, 3% have an unfavorable opinion, 3% are neutral and 83% don't know enough to say. His net favorability is +8%, unchanged since April. Innis's net favorability among likely 2014 voters is +7%. There are no partisan differences in his favorability ratings.




## 2014 U.S. Congress Election – 1<sup>st</sup> District

In a trial heat between Shea-Porter and Guinta, 46% of likely 1<sup>st</sup> District likely voters say they would vote for Guinta if the election were held today, 43% would support Shea-Porter, 2% would support someone else and 10% are undecided. When undecided voters are asked which candidate they lean toward supporting, 47% would vote for Guinta, 43% would vote for Shea-Porter, 2% would support someone else and 9% are still undecided. Support for Shea-Porter has remained stable while support for the lesser known Guinta has fluctuated somewhat.




If Dan Innis were the Republican nominee, 45% of likely voters say they would vote for Shea-Porter if the election were held today, 38% for Innis, 1% support someone else and 16% remain undecided. When undecided voters are asked which candidate they lean toward supporting, 46% would vote for Shea-Porter, 39% would vote for Innis, 1% would support someone else and 14% are still undecided. While Innis continues to trail Shea-Porter, this race has tightened since April.



As would be expected in hypothetical matchups this early, Democrats and Republicans largely support their party's candidate and a high percentage of independents are undecided. After trailing among Independents in April, both Guinta (62%-12%) and Innis (48%-21%) lead Shea-Porter in among Independent voters. Guinta leads Shea-Porter by a wide margin in the Manchester area (55%-30%), while Innis leads Shea-Porter by a smaller margin in this area (44%-34%).


#### Favorability Ratings - Congresswoman Ann Kuster

In New Hampshire's Second Congressional District, first term Congresswoman Ann Kuster's favorability ratings have improved somewhat since April. Currently, 34% of 2<sup>nd</sup> District adults have a favorable opinion of Kuster, 28% have an unfavorable opinion of her, 7% are neutral, and 31% don't know enough about her to say. Her net favorability rating is +6%, which is up from -6% in April. She is popular among Democrats (net +43%), somewhat popular among Independents (net +6%) and very unpopular among Republicans (net -46%). Kuster's net favorability among likely 2014 voters is +5%.




#### GOP Challengers for U.S. Congress - District 2


Three major Republican candidates are vying to challenge Kuster, but former State Senator Gary Lambert (R-Nashua), State Representative Marilinda Garcia (R-Salem) and former State Representative Jim Lawrence (R-Hudson) all struggle with name recognition. Currently 8% of Second District adults have a favorable opinion of Lambert, 3% have an unfavorable opinion, 3% are neutral, and 86% don't know enough about him to say. His net favorability rating is +5%, which is up from -2% in April. Lambert's net favorability among likely 2014 voters is +4%.



Meanwhile 9% of Second District adults have a favorable opinion of Garcia, 6% have an unfavorable opinion, 2% are neutral, and 83% don't know enough about her to say. Her net favorability rating is +3%, which is down from +7% in April. Garcia's net favorability among likely 2014 voters is +1%.




Jim Lawrence, who just entered the race last month, is also not well known. Currently, only 5% of Second District adults have a favorable opinion of Lawrence, 3% have an unfavorable opinion, 3% are neutral, and 89% don't know enough about him to say. His net favorability rating is +2%, and among likely 2014 voters is also +2%.




## 2014 U.S. Congress Election – 2<sup>nd</sup> District

Among Republicans, Gary Lambert currently matches up best against Kuster -- 45% of likely voters in the 2<sup>nd</sup> District say they would vote for Kuster if the election were held today, 36% would vote for Lambert, 1% would vote for someone else and 18% are undecided. When undecided voters are asked which candidate they lean toward supporting, 46% would vote for Kuster, 38% would vote for Lambert, 1% would support someone else and 15% are still undecided.



When matched with Garcia, 49% of likely voters in the 2<sup>nd</sup> District say they would vote for Kuster, 35% would vote for Garcia, 1% would vote for someone else and 15% are undecided. When undecided voters are asked which candidate they lean toward supporting, 50% would vote for Kuster, 36% would vote for Garcia, 1% would support someone else and 14% are still undecided.



When matched with Lawrence, 47% of likely voters in the 2<sup>nd</sup> District say they would vote for Kuster if the election were held today, 35% would vote for Lawrence, 1% would vote for someone else and 17% are undecided. When undecided voters are asked which candidate they lean toward supporting, 48% would vote for Kuster, 36% would vote for Lawrence, 1% would support someone else and 16% are still undecided.

US Congress District 2 - Kuster vs. Lawrence

As would be expected in hypothetical matchups this early, Democrats and Republicans largely support their party's candidate and a high percentage of independents are undecided. Kuster slightly leads her opponents among Independents after trailing in that category in April.

#### **Granite State Poll Methodology**

These findings are based on the latest WMUR Granite State Poll, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Six hundred and sixty-nine (669) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed by landline and cellular telephone between June 19 and July 1, 2014. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/-3.8 percent. Included were 342 residents of New Hampshire's First Congressional District (MSE = +/-5.3%) and 327 from the Second District (MSE = +/-5.4%). Of these residents, 263 in the First District (MSE = +/-6.0%) and 246 (MSE = +/-6.2%) in the Second District are 2014 likely voters.

The data have been weighted to adjust for numbers of adults and telephone lines within households, respondent sex, age, and region of the state. In addition to potential sampling error, all surveys have other potential sources of non-sampling error including question order effects, question wording effects, and non-response. Due to rounding, percentages may not sum to 100%. The number of respondents in each demographic below may not equal the number reported in cross-tabulation tables as some respondents choose not to answer some questions.
