The 2014-15 Budget includes \$50.3m for Capital Upgrades.

The 2014-15 Budget also includes \$716m for Works in Progress over the four years and other infrastructure projects.

In addition, the ACT Government spends \$4.9b on services to the ACT community. About 50 per cent of all expenditure relates to the Health and Education projects.
