The bonhomie and camaraderie among them were initiated in the bus itself, when singing, dancing and fun started in no time.



Parsis shine at the 16th Asian Masters Athletic Championships

A t the recently concluded 16th Asian Masters Athletic Championships held at the Bakit Jalil National Stadium in Kuala Lampur, Malaysia, three Parsi athletes shone.

Khurshid Mistry (in the 45+ age group) won Gold in the 4 x 100 metre relay. Fareez Vasunia (45+), the silver medallist at the World Masters Games in 2009 at Sydney, improved upon his Triple Jump distance of 11.77m, with a 12.22m jump in the Asian Masters. This is his new personal best. In the high jump, too, he surprised a strong field to annex the second position with 1.55m.

Veteran 400-metres-hurdler, Rohinton Mehta (50 + category), nursing an injury for more than two months and a calf pull in the heats (four hours before the Finals), could not match his Gold medal performance of 64.44 seconds at the Sydney World Masters Games in 2009 and slipped to a Silver with a timing of 65.84 seconds.

Given the stellar role they played at the Asian Masters, both Fareez and Rohinton have been selected to represent India at the 19th World Masters Athletics Championships, Sacramento, USA from July 5 to 17, 2011.

When Dr. Mehta was pursing his studies in Medicine, this amount was awarded as a scholarship by the BPP and, as Senior Executive Mr. Cawas S. Panthaki has succinctly put it in his letter of thanks, "Rarely do students refund the entire scholarship and you are rarest of the rare to have done so. Urvaksh schooled at Mount Carmel High School in the small town of Shahabad in North Karnataka. He moved to Mysore for his Pre-University education at the Ramakrishna Vidyashalla. Always interested in the biological sciences, he joined the Government Medical College at Mysore for his MBBS. He was a First Class student throughout.

Having a particular liking for the human behavioural sciences, he then shifted to Bangalore to join the National Institute of Mental Health and Neuro Sciences (NIMHANS) for the three-year MD Degree in Psychiatry. NIMHANS is India's leading facility for the study and treatment of Mental and Neuro disorders. His work at the Institute earned him laurels, both in India and abroad. He was declared the best outgoing student for MD Psychiatry. He received this award at the hands of the Union Minister of Health and Family Welfare, Mr. Gulam Nabi Azad on January 20, 2011, at the 15^{th} Convocation of NIMHANS. To quote the Times of India dated January 21, 2011, who interviewed him after the award presentation, "I wanted to look into the

Neuroscience behind human behaviour. I wanted to know why a certain behavioural problem happens. I am presently a Senior Resident at NIMHANS. Later, I want to do clinical care and research and study Schizophrenia."


His MD thesis work was titled 'Social Cognition in Patients with Schizophrenia in Remission and its Association with their Functioning'. For this work, he was given a financial award by the Indian Council of Medical Research, New Delhi (ICMR). He visited the US in 2009 to present his findings at a conference at San Diego, and his paper was published in the Schizophrenia Bulletin. He is also going to Seoul, South Korea, to present a paper in a similar conference. The subject will be



'Social Cognition Correlates of Empathy in Schizophrenia'.

Recently, he was sanctioned a research grant as the 'Principal Investigator' by the Department of Biotechnology, Ministry of Science and Technology, Government of India. The subject matter will be 'Mirror Neurons in Schizophrenia'.

Urvaksh is also deeply interested in music and is a keen guitarist. He has performed along with his college band at college fests and the like.

Mrs. Homai Vyarawalla


In the realm of press photography, Homai Vyarawalla has made a name for herself as India's first woman photojournalist. As a matter of fact, in the formative stages of the Post-Independence era, there has not been an event of note which does not bear the stamp of her photographic genius.

Amongst the world celebrities which she has covered are Her Majesty, Queen Elizabeth II, of England, Mohandas Karamchand Gandhi, Jawaharlal Nehru, Dr. S. Radhakrishnan, Lord Wavell, Admiral Lord Louis Mountbatten, Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel, Khan Abdul Ghaffar Khan, J.R.D. Tata, Indira and Feroze Gandhi, Rajiv and Sanjay Gandhi, Dr. Helen Keller, Martin Luther King, Jackie Kennedy, the Dalai Lama, Ho Chi Minh and a host of others.

In recognition of her amazing accomplishments, the Lifetime Achievement Award was conferred upon her by the Government of India, when the Information and Broadcasting Ministry recently instituted the National Photo Awards.



The crowning glory of her distinguished career has been the bestowal of the Padma Vibhushan this year by the President of India, Mrs. Pratibha Patil.

A fter his initial education in Pune and his medical studies in Bombay at the Grant Medical College and J.J. Hospital, he proceeded to Boston, U.S.A., to imbibe the latest techniques in Diagnostic and Therapeutic Cardiology under Dr. Paul White, the father of Modern Cardiology. On his return to India, he set up the Cardiology unit at the B.J. Medical College and Sassoon General Hospital at Pune, where he was later appointed as Honorary Professor of Medicine and Cardiology.

The famous Ruby Hall Clinic in Pune was created by him in 1959. With all this came the opportunity of carrying out a lot of research work leading to several papers, which were published in various journals.

On his retirement from the Sassoon General Hospital, he was designated as Professor Emeritus in Medicine and Cardiology. Subsequently, he was awarded the Fellowship of the American College of

Chest Physicians and made Founder Fellow of the Indian College of Physicians.

He was the driving force behind Ruby Hall Clinic, which took up the bulk of his time. Dr. Grant was obsessively fond of the great outdoors. Jogging was part of his daily routine and, in later years, he had been bitten by the golf bug. He was always a great believer in discipline, frugality and strict regimentation of diet.

He, along with his son Dr. Purvez and other members of his family, as well as a handful of dedicated professionals, have made Ruby Hall one of the premier medical institutions in India and amongst the first to offer sophisticated diagnostic treatment in various fields all under one roof.

Dadi Dorab Pudumjee

The Former Director of Sriram Centre for Puppet Theatre in Delhi and winner of the Sangeet Natak Akademi Award was made a Padma Shri for his sterling contribution to the Performing Arts. Founder of the Ishara Puppet Theatre, Pudumjee is currently President of the Union Internationale de la Marionnette, the only Asian to have been elected to this prestigious position.
