# Appendix B: Public art in Guildford Borough

#### What is public art?

Following guidance from IXIA (see Annexe), Guildford Borough Council recognises a broad definition of public art. Much of the importance of public art is about the process – for example, the community involvement and the different ways of thinking that arise from involving artists in the design process – as about the end result.

### A definition of public art for Guildford Borough Council

There is no single definition of public art and there are explanations of public art available on Public Art Online and IXIA (see Bibliography for more information). Guildford Borough Council will use the definition of public art set out below:

Public art involves artists and craftspeople in the design of artworks in the public realm, which is any open space or public building that is free to access. The best public art is designed for its location, with the input of local people and with the artist involved at the earliest possible stage of the process.

Some of the ways that artists can work in the public realm include:

- a) artist in residence schemes to develop permanent artworks
- b) artists working as members of design teams to create landscape or building schemes
- c) artists creating temporary installations or performance based artworks to develop or launch major public art schemes.

### Public art around the Borough

There is already a variety of public art works in Guildford. To date these have taken the form of sculptures, street furniture, lighting, temporary installations, performances and processions. It is important to celebrate and care for our existing art works so that the public gain the most benefit from them.

Examples of public art in Guildford Borough include:

<u>Farm Talk</u> by Jo Wood and Caroline Jackman: a bronze life size bull with an oak carved farmer adjacent to the Artington Park and Ride site. It was created to raise the profile of the farming industry, so the artists organised workshops, events and an exhibition to involve local communities in the project.

<u>Rhythm Blue</u> by Peter Freeman: a lighting design under the bridge by The Electric Theatre. The artist has lit the columns under the bridge with different coloured lights, so the area is now brighter and more attractive for cyclists and walkers, as well as a safer environment.

<u>Guildford Flower Fiesta – an arts procession designed by Street Processions Organisation</u>: a celebration of the Summer Festival with costumes made by local school children and adults from Lockwood Day Centre.

#### Public art audit

A public art audit for Guildford Borough began in 2005 and is an ongoing process. It maps the many artworks in the Borough to find out where the main clusters and gaps are, to help us plan for public art schemes in the future.

Current research indicates that there are over 25 artworks in Guildford town centre with further significant collections at the University of Surrey and the Royal Surrey Hospital. The audit shows that many artworks have been funded and commissioned by independent trusts and institutions such as the University as well as by Guildford Borough Council. Most of the artworks that the Borough Council commissions are funded through Percent for Art, where developers agree to give a proportion of their total project costs towards public art in the area.

As well as the town centre there are a few artworks in rural areas and villages, which tend to be made using traditional materials or methods, such as ironwork village signs and timber sculptures.

The most striking gap in public art is that there are almost no artworks in urban areas outside the town centre, such as Ash, Westborough and Stoke wards.
