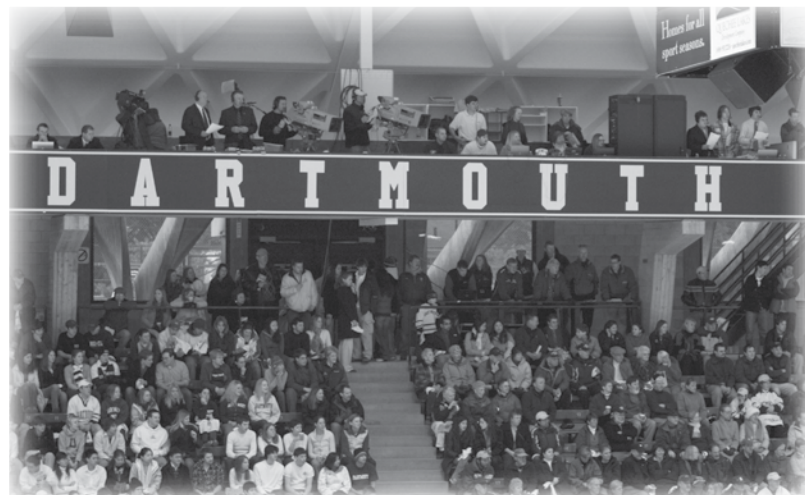

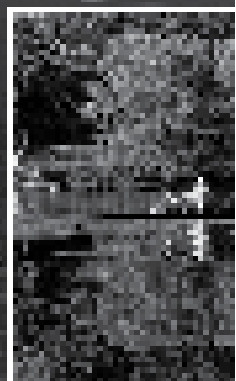

Founded in 1769, the nation's ninth-oldest college and a member of the Ivy League, Dartmouth is a private, four-year, liberal arts, coeducational college with schools of business, engineering and medicine as well as 18 graduate programs in the arts and sciences. Its 200-acre main campus features state-of-the-art academic facilities including the Berry Library, the Hood Museum of Art, the Hopkins Center for the Arts and the Rauner Special Collections Library.

- ◆ Located in Hanover, N.H. on the Connecticut River; two hours northwest of Boston, five hours north of New York City.
- ◆ Annual undergraduate enrollment of 4,100, graduate enrollment of 1,700 and endowment of \$3.092 billion (market value).
- ◆ Dartmouth students hail from all 50 states and 60 countries.

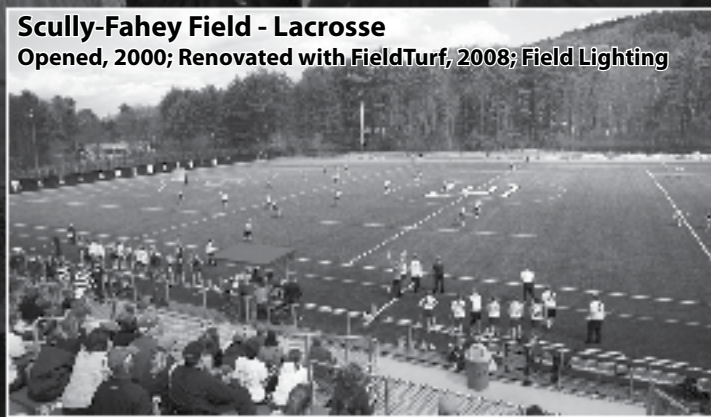

THOMPSON ARENA

The Big Green has spent 33 seasons in the friendly confines of Thompson Arena. Since Bob Gaudet took over the reins in 1997, the attendance and the winning have increased. The Big Green boasts an impressive 86-52-19 record at home during that stretch. In 102 years of hockey Dartmouth is .559 on home ice, playing to a record of 448-351-31.

THOMPSON ARENA



Occom Pond, just north of campus was home to Dartmouth men's hockey games during the 1920s. This photo is from January 12, 1929 when Dartmouth defeated Harvard, 2-1.

The Big Green has hosted a home playoff series eight of the last nine years, going 12-5 with an average attendance of 3,292 fans per game.

Dartmouth led the league in attendance in 2007-08, averaging 4,203 fans a game. The Big Green was in the top-15 nationally in attendance for six straight seasons and was 18th last year.



Davis Rink was Dartmouth's home from 1929-1975. The ice was natural and subject to nature but it was the fans that proved the most formidable in Davis Rink. Except for reserved seating at the east end, it was standing room only. Fans rushed to stand along the fencing surrounding the ice and they were loud.

Rupert Thompson Arena, home of the Dartmouth men's and women's hockey teams, is one of the nation's finest collegiate hockey facilities and is considered one of the premier rinks in the East. Construction began in 1973 and the first hockey game took place in November 1975, when the Dartmouth men and the United States Olympic Team skated to a 3-3 tie.

Crowds of more than 4,000 attend Dartmouth men's hockey games, and the atmosphere can be electric on weekends when the Big Green is hosting an Ivy or ECAC Hockey rival.

Pier Luigi Nervi, the Italian architect-engineer who also drew the complex for the 1960 Olympic Games in Rome, Italy, designed Thompson Arena. The arena has 3,500 individually-backed seats plus room for 1,000 standees, all encircling an ice sheet 200 feet long by 85 feet wide.

There are several unique features to Thompson Arena, which was dug into the ground and involved the use of 9,500 yards of pre-cast and cast-in-place concrete and 600 tons of reinforced steel. The vaulted ceiling includes 1,024 triangular sections, each weighing one ton. Buttresses extending over the bleachers hold up the press box, on the south side of the ice while additional buttresses suspend the arena itself on the outside. At the east end of the arena, the various championship banners fly, symbolizing titles won by both the men's and women's programs.

The arena also includes five spacious, carpeted dressing rooms, plus two complete training rooms. There is also a storage room and skate-sharpening area, as well as the William Smoyer '67 Lounge, where postgame receptions are held after all men's contests. In the Smoyer Lounge, one can find numerous individual and team photos displaying the hallowed history of both the Dartmouth men's and women's hockey programs.

Floren Varsity House Strength Training Center



The Dartmouth men's hockey team is entering a new era in terms of strength and conditioning. The Big Green utilizes a state-of-the-art varsity weight room in the Floren Varsity House. This versatile building was made possible by a \$25 million leadership gift from Olivia and Doug Floren '63 of Greenwich, Conn., and their family. The 10,000-square foot strength center in the Floren Varsity House allows student-athletes to undergo effective strength, power, plyometric, agility, flexibility and conditioning programs under the supervision of head strength coach Bob Miller. The equipment in the strength center benefits all 34 of Dartmouth's varsity programs. Equipment in the Floren Varsity House weight room includes:

BOB MILLER



"I cannot speak highly enough of Coach Miller. The strength and conditioning program that he uses focuses on all aspects of athleticism – strength, speed, core stability, flexibility and conditioning. At Dartmouth each player is evaluated regularly throughout the year, and the program is tailored to improve areas of weakness that will help that player maximize his/her potential. Coach Miller's philosophy involves educating players on the relationship that exists among training, nutrition and recovery. In addition, and perhaps most importantly, he gets to know his players on a personal level which leads to a mutual respect. I was pushed to the limit but Coach Miller understands these limits, which allows him to successfully rehabilitate injured athletes as well as to make healthy athletes stronger. I continue to speak with Coach Miller regularly for advice on training both during the season and in the off-season. I can honestly say that without the strength and conditioning program at Dartmouth I would not be the player that I am today."

Strength and Conditioning Coach Bob Miller joined the Dartmouth staff in March 2001. This position was endowed in 2007 with a gift of \$1 million from Kerry and Bill Holekamp '70 of St. Louis, Mo.

From 1999-2001, Miller worked at the University of Iowa, first as a graduate assistant strength and conditioning coach for football before being promoted to assistant coach.

Miller grew up in Stamford, Conn. A 1994 graduate of Southern Connecticut State University where he earned a bachelor's degree in exercise science, he worked at Yale University as an assistant strength and conditioning coach from 1994-1997. At Yale, Miller directly supervised athletes in field hockey, gymnastics, lacrosse and baseball, and assisted in training for football, men's and women's basketball and men's hockey.

From 1997-99, he was a graduate assistant at the University of Utah where he directed the training for women's soccer in addition to men's and women's swimming and diving. He also designed individual programs for athletes in football and men's basketball.

Miller is a National Strength Coaches Association certified strength and conditioning coach. He and his wife, Michele, have one daughter, Lauren, and a son, Shane.

Sponsoring conference championships in 33 men's and women's sports, and averaging more than 35 varsity teams at each school, the Ivy League provides intercollegiate athletic opportunities for more men and women than any other conference in the country.

The Ivy League's successful competition in Division I national athletics is achieved by approaching athletics as a key part of the student's regular undergraduate experience: with rigorous academic standards, the nation's highest four-year graduation rates and without athletics scholarships. Ivy athletic programs receive multi-million-dollar institutional support as part of each institution's overall academic programs.

Since 2000 alone, the Ivy League:

- Produced 47 NCAA individual/event champions in fencing, women's swimming and diving, women's rowing, men's indoor track & field, men's outdoor track and field, women's indoor track and field, women's outdoor track and field and wrestling while earning 11 NCAA team championships in fencing, men's lacrosse, women's lacrosse and women's rowing.
- Amassed nearly 100 All-Americans each year.
- Averaged more than a dozen Academic All-Americans each year, including an all-time high of 18 in 2006-07, for a total of 136 student-athletes honored.
- Had 204 competitors at the five Olympic Games (2000, 2002, 2004, 2006 and 2008). Those 204 athletes collected 81 medals, including 28 gold. At the 2008 Summer Olympics in Beijing, China, the League boasted 42 athletes who took home 14 medals.
- Boasts numerous athletes currently in the professional ranks of Major League Baseball, Major League Lacrosse, the National Football League, the National Hockey League, and the recently founded Women's Pro Soccer League.
- Became the first conference to sweep the four major NCAA Honors in the same year (2006) — Columbia's Robert Kraft claiming the Theodore Roosevelt Award; Princeton's John Doar the Inspirational Award; Yale's Susan Wellington a Silver Anniversary Award; and Brown's Nick Hartigan a Top VIII Award.
- Became the second conference with three of the six NCAA Silver Anniversary Award winners in the same year (2007) — Dartmouth's Gail Koziara Boudreaux, Brown's Steve Jordan and Yale's Patricia Melton.
- Posted far and away the best record in Division I, across all sports and conferences, in the first three annual compilations (2007-09) of the NCAA's Academic Progress Rate.

ECAC HOCKEY

ECAC Hockey, as it exists today, was founded in 1961. The evolution began with an 'informal' conference, which witnessed prosperous years in the late 60's and early 70's and now over the years progressed into one of the best college hockey leagues in the country.

ECAC Hockey is comprised of 12 institutions and is one of six conferences that compete in NCAA Division I Men's and Women's Hockey Championships.

On January 19, 1898, less than two years after the first-ever college hockey game, Brown defeated Harvard in Boston, Mass. in the first college hockey game between the two schools still sponsoring the sport.

ECAC Hockey has evolved into pure hockey. The rise to prominence has not been limited to the playing surface, as the league's alumni has cemented itself with such identifiable labels such as; integrity, sportsmanship, leadership, scholarship, pursuit of excellence, and commitment.

Today, many former players are enjoying careers and are respected on the next level in the National Hockey League (NHL). Former League standouts include **Anaheim Ducks** forwards George Parros (Princeton), and Todd Marchant (Clarkson); **Atlanta Thrashers** defenseman Grant Lewis (Dartmouth) and forwards Rich Peverley (St. Lawrence) and Todd White (Clarkson); **Boston Bruins** forward Byron Bitz (Cornell); **Buffalo Sabres** forward Dominic Moore (Harvard); **Calgary Flames** forward Craig Conroy (Clarkson); **Carolina Hurricanes** forward Erik Cole (Clarkson); **Colorado Avalanche** forwards T.J. Galiardi (Dartmouth) and David Jones (Dartmouth); **Columbus Blue Jackets** forward Craig MacDonald (Harvard); **Dallas Stars** forward Raymond Sawada; **Los Angeles Kings** forwards Matt Moulson (Cornell), Kevin Westgarth (Princeton) and John Zeiler (St. Lawrence); **Minnesota Wild** forward Dominic Moore (Harvard); **Montreal Canadiens** forward Chris Higgins (Yale) and defenseman Ryan O'Byrne (Cornell); **N.Y. Delivering hockey and connecting strong values beyond the playing surface has produced its share of administrators in the National Hockey League (NHL). Peter Chiarelli (Harvard) is the general manager of the Boston Bruins; Joe Nieuwendyk (Cornell) is the general manager of the Dallas Stars, while Dave Taylor (Clarkson) serves as its Director of Player Personnel; Mike Barnett (St. Lawrence) is currently serving as an advisor and scout for the New York Rangers, while fellow St. Lawrence University grad Ray Shero is the general manager of the Pittsburgh Penguins; Brent Flahr (Princeton) serves as the Assistant General Manager for the Minnesota Wild; Colgate alum David Conte is the Executive Vice President, Hockey Operations, for the N.J. Devils; St. Lawrence graduate Bill Torrey serves as the Florida Panthers' alternate governor, while fellow Saints' graduates Jacques Martin is the current head coach of the Montreal Canadiens and Randy Sexton is the assistant general manager for the Florida Panthers. In addition, NHL Commissioner Gary Bettman is a Cornell graduate and NHL Deputy Commissioner Bill Daley is a graduate of Dartmouth.

The future of ECAC Hockey continues to develop, as it is consistently labeled as one of the premier conferences from top to bottom. Each year all 12 institutions strive to set new standards of excellence.

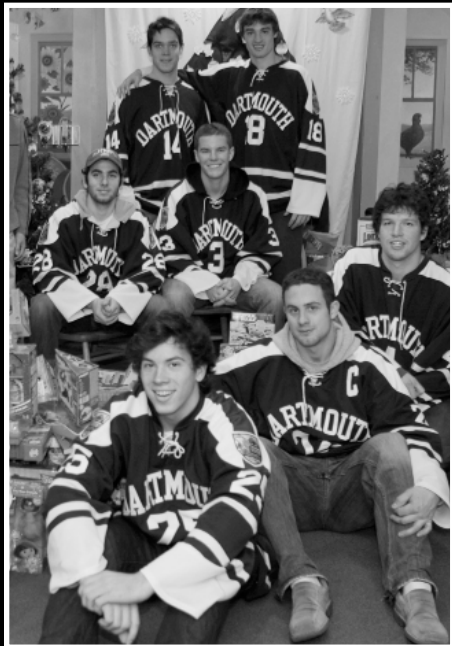
Dartmouth Hockey gives back

Dr. Jim Yong Kim
President

Dr. Jim Yong Kim, an internationally recognized physician and humanitarian and an accomplished educator and anthropologist, became the 17th president of Dartmouth College on July 1, 2009.

Dr. Kim, 49, has had a profound impact on a wide range of organizations throughout his distinguished career, including, among others, the Harvard Medical School, the World Health Organization and Partners In Health, a non-profit organization that supports health programs in poor communities worldwide. He is widely respected for his leadership in the fight against HIV/AIDS, tuberculosis and other diseases.

Dr. Kim's academic, humanitarian and global health work has earned him widespread recognition. He was awarded a MacArthur "Genius" Fellowship in 2003; was named one of America's 25 "Best Leaders" by US News & World Report in 2005; and was selected as one of TIME magazine's "100 Most Influential People in the World" in 2006.

Dr. Kim has been committed to educating young people since his first teaching experience more than 20 years ago at Harvard University. Since that time, he has taught undergraduate and graduate courses in anthropology, social analysis, social medicine and global health.

Dr. Kim is renowned for his leadership in the global fight against HIV/AIDS, tuberculosis and other diseases that disproportionately affect the world's poorest people. While at WHO, Dr. Kim led an unprecedented initiative to expand access to HIV/AIDS treatment worldwide. By 2007, the initiative had helped provide lifesaving antiretroviral therapy to more than three million people worldwide and accelerated global efforts to fight other diseases such as tuberculosis and malaria.

Born in Seoul, Korea in 1959, Jim Yong Kim moved with his family to the United States at the age of five and grew up in Muscatine, Iowa. He graduated magna cum laude with a B.A. from Brown University in 1982. He was awarded an M.D. from Harvard Medical School in 1991, and a Ph.D. from Harvard University, Department of Anthropology, in 1993.

Dr. Kim is married to Dr. Younsook Lim, a pediatrician, and the couple have two young sons. He is actively involved in a variety of sports including basketball, volleyball, tennis and golf.

Robert A. Ceplikas, a 1978 graduate of Dartmouth College and 30-year veteran of the college's staff in athletics and admissions assumed the role of Acting Director of Athletics and Recreation on July 1, 2009.

Ceplikas will serve for the 2009-2010 academic year while the college conducts a national search for a successor to Josie Harper, who served as the college's seventh athletics director for the past seven years before retirement.

As Acting Director, Ceplikas oversees 34 varsity sports (16 men's, 16 women's and two coed) as well as comprehensive club sports and intramural programs in which nearly three-quarters of Dartmouth's undergraduates participate.

Ceplikas has been the Deputy Director of Athletics for the past 15 years, serving under both Harper and former Athletics Director Dick Jaeger. He currently oversees the department's annual giving programs including the Athletic Sponsor Program (to support recruiting) and individual sports' Friends Groups. Total donations have grown nearly four times from approximately \$500,000 to nearly \$2 million annually during his tenure.

With extensive supervisory experience, Ceplikas has most recently overseen varsity athletics communications, and marketing and promotions. He has also played a pivotal role in long-range planning and assisted the athletics director with external relations and overall management of the department.

Upon graduating from Dartmouth in 1978, Ceplikas joined the college's admissions office, where he held four different positions in his 11 years on staff. For six of those years (1979-85), he also was an assistant coach for the Big Green women's hockey team, helping build that program from a fledgling varsity squad to a competitive team. After earning a master's degree in education from Stanford University in 1990, Ceplikas returned to his alma mater as an athletics administrator, which led to his appointment as Deputy Director of Athletics in 1994.

Ceplikas and his wife Lynn, an English teacher at Hanover High School, reside in Lebanon. Their daughter, Holly '13, is a member of the freshman class at Dartmouth and son, Luke, is a junior in high school.

COACHING STAFF



HEAD COACH BOB GAUDET



Bob Gaudet enters his 13th season as head coach of the Big Green. Gaudet is a 1981 graduate of Dartmouth and played four years for the varsity hockey team as a goaltender. He came back to Dartmouth after nine successful seasons behind the Brown University bench.

At Dartmouth, Gaudet guided the Big Green to seven straight winning seasons from the 2000-01 season to 2006-07 and had 20-win seasons in 2002-03 and 2004-05. The 20-13-2 record in 2004-05 marked the team's fifth consecutive campaign above .500, the first time that had happened in school history. Gaudet has also led the Big Green to seven straight home playoff series and

in 2001, the program made its first trip to the ECAC semifinals in 20 years. He earned his 200th career win against St. Lawrence on Feb. 11, 2005 and has a Dartmouth record of 163-151-41.

The Big Green has won two titles under Gaudet. In 2007 Dartmouth captured a share of its first Ivy title since Gaudet was in net in 1980. The 2005-06 season gave Dartmouth its first-ever ECACHL title. Gaudet was also named ECAC Hockey's Coach of the Year, making him the second coach to earn the award with two separate teams. He was also a finalist for the Division I Coach of the Year award. Gaudet has now had two Ivy League players of the year – Mike Ouellette earned the honor in 2005-06 while David Jones was given the title in 2006-07. Jones was also an All-America, giving Gaudet four back-to-back players to earn that distinction.

Gaudet took over Brown's coaching reins in 1988 and immediately went about transforming the Bears from a perennial cellar-dweller into one of the ECAC's top programs. During his tenure, Brown steadily climbed in the league standings, from 12th in '89 to eighth in '90 and '91, fifth in '92, third in '93, fourth in '94 and all the way to second in '95. Gaudet has begun the same process at Dartmouth. The Big Green finished 11th his first two years, eighth in 2000, fifth in '01, third in '05 and was tied for first in 2006-07.

During Gaudet's time at Brown, the Bears were crowned Ivy League champions twice (1991 and 1995) and, in 1993, made the school's first NCAA appearance since 1976. In both 1993 and 1995, he was a finalist for Division I Coach of the Year honors. He was named ECAC Coach of the Year in 1995 after leading Brown to a second-place finish in the league, just one-and-a-half games behind first-place Clarkson. The Bears also spent much of the year in and out of the top 10 in the national polls. Gaudet's career coaching record stands at a respectable 270-307-75.

Gaudet became head coach of the Bears in 1988 following a five-year tenure as an assistant coach with the Big Green. He assisted in all aspects at Dartmouth under head coaches George Crowe and Brian Mason while coordinating recruiting efforts and serving as varsity goaltender coach. In addition, he directed the junior varsity program his first season in Hanover.

Gaudet graduated in 1981 with a degree in visual arts after four productive seasons for the Big Green hockey team. In 1979 and 1980, Gaudet led the Big Green to Ivy League titles and appearances in the NCAA Frozen Four. As a senior, he served as co-captain and was a recipient of the Philip D. McInnis Award for spirit, loyalty and dedication to Dartmouth ice hockey. In 76 career games, he made a school-record 2,129 saves while allowing only 299 goals for a 4.00 career goals against average and an .877 save percentage. He had his most successful campaign as a sophomore when he recorded two of his four career shutouts to go along with a 3.03 goals against average. He was first team All-Ivy in 1978-79 and 1979-80, and was a two-time recipient of the Canterbury Society Award for the best Ivy League goalie.

Following graduation, Gaudet signed a free-agent contract with the Winnipeg Jets of the National Hockey League. He played for minor league affiliates of Winnipeg in the CHL and IHL for one year before a knee injury cut short his promising career.

In the summer of 1990, Gaudet served as the assistant coach of the East team in the Olympic Sports Festival, held in Minneapolis. In 1994, he served again as head coach of the East team, and also coached the East All-Star Team in the East-West Shrine College Hockey Classic. Gaudet spent the summer of 1998 behind the bench of the New England Select 16-Team at USA Hockey's Summer Festival in Ann Arbor, Mich.

Gaudet and his wife Lynne – also a 1981 Dartmouth graduate – reside in Etna, N.H., and have three children: sons Joe and Jim plus daughter Kelly. Both sons are current members of the Dartmouth men's hockey team.



"My family and I are extremely grateful for the opportunity that Coach Gaudet provided me at Dartmouth College. He is incredibly passionate and he makes sure that each player knows the rich tradition of Big Green Hockey. Wearing the Dartmouth jersey is an honor, and every player knows both the pride and responsibility that come with playing for the Big Green. Coach Gaudet is dedicated to every player, and he cares about all aspects of your life including your academics and family.

"Coach Gaudet and the entire coaching staff were instrumental in my development as a player. Practices were always high-tempo with an emphasis on individual skill development. He has a lot of confidence in allowing his players to make plays which leads to an exciting style of play. Instrumental in my development was Coach Gaudet's emphasis on player development, which helps players grow into greater roles and ultimately become better players. When I graduated from Dartmouth I felt like I was as prepared as I could possibly be for the tremendous jump from college to professional hockey, both as a person and as a player."

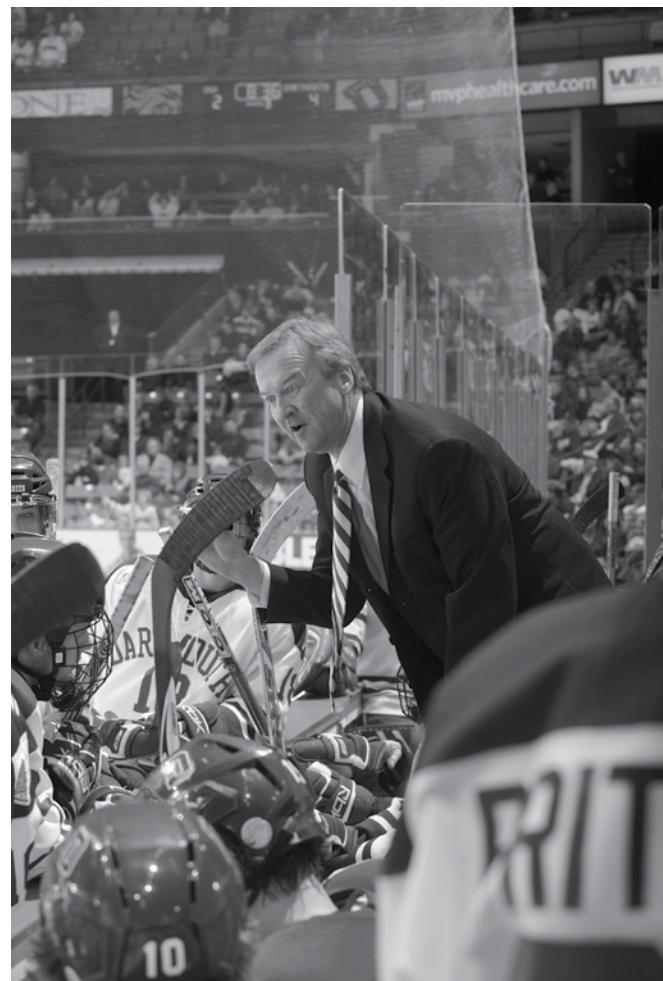

DID YOU KNOW?

- Since Bob Gaudet took over the men's hockey program in 1997, Dartmouth has improved to 177-165-44.
- The Big Green has captured a conference regular-season championship and made seven consecutive postseason appearances under Gaudet's reign.
- Bob Gaudet is the 21st coach in Dartmouth's 100-year history. He is the second winningest coach. It took Gaudet 246 games to reach 100 wins at Dartmouth.
- Gaudet had a winning season seven straight years.
- Dartmouth logged its second 20-win season under Gaudet in 2004-05. The Big Green had won 20 games in just two seasons prior to Gaudet's arrival.
- Dartmouth has had unprecedented success in the classroom since Gaudet took over the coaching reins. Gaudet has had six players named Academic All-Ivy, one named Academic All-America and 39 have been named Academic All-ECAC Hockey.
- The Big Green have established a terrific winning tradition at home, compiling an impressive 436-346-26 record in 100 seasons while going 82-46-15 under Gaudet.
- Gaudet has been named the ECAC Hockey League's Coach of the Year twice and is the only current coach to have earned the award with two different teams.
- Gaudet has coached nine players who have been drafted into the NHL, including a first and several second round draft picks, along with six players currently playing in the National Hockey League.



ASSOCIATE HEAD COACH DAVE PETERS



Dave Peters enters his eleventh season at Dartmouth College and his 19th overall as a college hockey coach. He was chosen as the winner of the 2008 Terry Flanagan Award, which honors an assistant coach for his career body of work. Peters is one of the most accomplished assistant coaches and recruiters in the country. He has a proven record for improving programs and helping to develop players.

His responsibilities at Dartmouth include recruiting, coaching the forwards and overseeing the power play. The Big Green had an All-America forward for four consecutive years beginning in 2003, and in 2007, David

Jones became the school's first Hobey Baker finalist. In 2004 Dartmouth had three players selected among the top 100 picks in the NHL draft, and in 2002-03 they had the highest scoring freshman class in the country. Since 2000 Dartmouth has had seven winning seasons, five trips to the ECAC semi-finals, two 20-win seasons, an Ivy League Championship and a share of the ECAC Championship for the first time in school history.

From 1993-98, Peters was the top assistant and recruiting coordinator at Providence College. In his third season, Peters helped lead the Friars to the 1996 Hockey East Championship and a trip to the NCAA Tournament. It marked the first and only time that Providence made back-to-back trips to the Hockey East finals. Peters was instrumental in recruiting 12 members of the Hockey East All-Academic Team and 10 NHL draft picks, including Fernando Pisani of the Edmonton Oilers.

In May of 1998, Peters was named head coach and general manager of the Danville Wings junior hockey team, where he assembled a team that went on to win the 2000 North American Hockey League Championship and finish third in the nation. While Peters was gaining valuable head coaching experience in junior hockey, he kept a close eye on the progress of Providence College, as the 1998-99 Friars advanced to the Hockey East semifinals, ranked fourth nationally in scoring and had three 50-point scorers for the first time since 1983.

From 1990-93, as the top assistant and recruiting coordinator, Peters was a driving force in building the Kent State University hockey program into a competitive CCHA member. In 1991-92 Kent State ranked ninth nationally in scoring and recorded upset wins over Michigan State, Boston College and Providence. In 1992-93, Kent swept the season series against both Ohio State and Notre Dame, and won both games at Bowling Green.

Peters spends part of the off-season working for USA Hockey, coaching and helping to develop elite players in New England. He was the head coach of the gold-medal winning New England Select 17 team at the 2000 Junior Olympic Festival. Peters is a 1982 graduate of Boston College with a bachelor's degree in marketing. A hard-working forward, Peters earned a roster spot on the 1979-80 team that won 25 games, a first for BC hockey. Peters lives in Hanover with his wife Katherine and their 10-year-old son Jake.

2009-10 OUTLOOK

With age comes wisdom and experience and the 2009-10 version of the Dartmouth men's hockey team should be very wise as the team begins to hit the ice in preparation for the season.

"We were very young last year but we have an experienced group back," said head coach Bob Gaudet. "I feel like I say that every year. We did lose some leadership and some good players, but those coming back have a lot of experience and make up a good nucleus. The players we have this season have shown their scoring ability and we have a much more seasoned defensive corps. I feel very good about our leadership with captain **Peter Boldt** and assistant captains **Joe Gaudet** and **Scott Fleming**. All bring different strengths to the table and will do an excellent job leading our squad."

The Big Green have just five seniors and six freshmen as the rest of the team are juniors and sophomores. Dartmouth has been waiting two years for its current crop of underclassmen to mature and be the force that they've been projected to be.

"This season we're going to focus on possible weaknesses and hone our strengths. Our guys are coming back bigger and stronger and more experienced than last year and they are very determined. That determination will be what fuels them," Gaudet said.

"This group gets it. They understand what they need to do. How we play, carry ourselves and meet the expectations of the classroom will go a long way in the success of the team. I don't feel like I'm going to need to do as much teaching on and off the ice as I've had to do the last few years."

The junior class made quite an impact last season, and with all of them back, Gaudet expects them to lead his squad this year.

"Our sophomore class did a great job last year. Two prime examples were **Adam Estoclet** and **Scott Fleming**. Esto led our team in scoring, followed closely by **Scott Fleming**. Fleming has gotten better and better as he's grown, while Esto is so skilled as he displayed last year," Gaudet said.

Classmates **Andrew Owsiak**, **Kyle Reeds** and **Matt Reber** will also factor in. Owsiak is a key player who earned quite a bit of playing time last season. Reeds is a hard worker with good all around skills who is primed to have a great junior year. Reber has tons of speed and continues to get better and develop consistency.

"On defense, **Evan Stephens** and **Joe Stejskal** have anchored our blueline and I am looking forward to seeing their continued development as key shut down players for us," Gaudet said.

"We have less questions on defense than we've had in the past. This is a very solid, veteran-led group."

In goal the Big Green had a big question mark going into last year, but this season that question mark doesn't seem to be as prominent.

"**Jody O'Neill** helped us more than we ever could have imagined last season," Gaudet said about the ECAC and Ivy Rookie-of-the-Year. "We were unsure about our goalie situation going into the year with an untested goalie and a young defense. But those guys logged a lot of ice time, and with the way Jody played, we know that things will be much more settled back there."

James Mello and rookie **Charles Corsi** will push O'Neill as Dartmouth finally has a good depth in goal.

"The question marks surrounding this year are not as pronounced

as last season. We have a good group of younger players and it is my hope that they will fit in seamlessly with our returning players."

Going into 2008-09 the Big Green didn't have quite the mark on its back like it had in previous seasons. Dartmouth was picked in the preseason polls to finish 11th, but the Big Green defied the critics and, despite being in the top half of the league standings all year, finished tied for fifth with Harvard.

"Having us finish in the top half of the league after being chosen to be one of the bottom teams at the beginning of the year was an interesting position for us," Gaudet said. "I think it will continue to be a big motivating factor for us. We're always trying to prove ourselves, and while you try not to listen to other opinions, it can be motivating to know that others don't think you're very good."

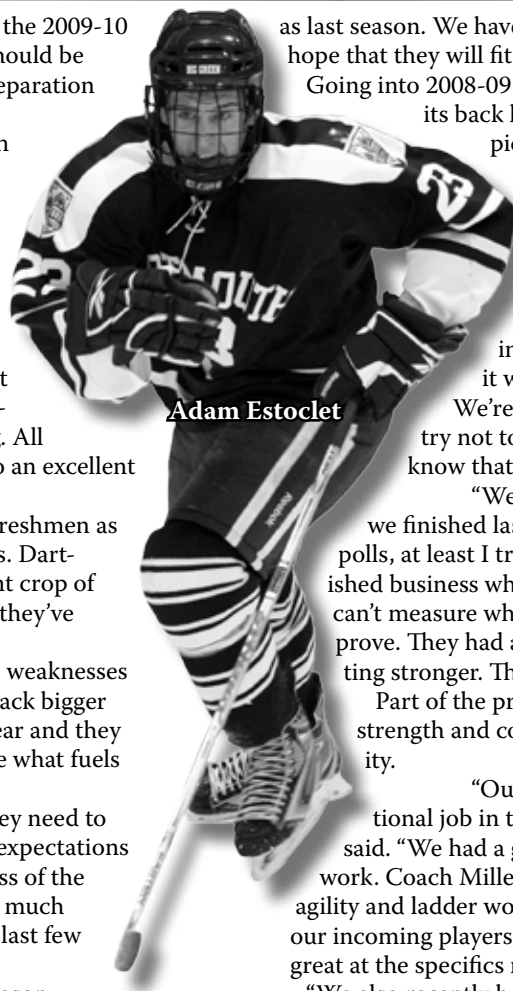
"We know we were picked to finish this year where we finished last season. I don't put much stock in preseason polls, at least I try not to. I think we know we have some unfinished business which will be a positive factor for this team. You can't measure what's inside, and this team has heart and a lot to prove. They had a great spring and summer working out and getting stronger. Their prep work has been tremendous."

Part of the preparations Dartmouth has been doing involves strength and conditioning as well as a new multi-purpose facility.

"Our strength coach Bob Miller has done an exceptional job in terms of conditioning and development," Gaudet said. "We had a great spring in term with weight training and skill work. Coach Miller had the guys doing stick skill drills, warmups, agility and ladder work to just name a few. He's been great at helping our incoming players adapt to the game of college hockey, and he's great at the specifics needed to train hockey players."

"We also recently had a new room built in Davis Varsity House that helps us in skill work. It's a surface that mimics ice but allows us to be on it at all times of the year. It's been invaluable for helping our team learn the nuances of the game."

The Big Green will have a better sense and understanding of what is expected of them as the team now fully knows the style, how to play

both sides of the puck and how to play full ice.

"It shouldn't be a learning process so much this season as it will be honing things more," Gaudet said. "I expect we'll be much more prepared than we were at this time last year."

Joining Corsi as newcomers this season will be forwards **Mark Goggin, Dustin Walsh, Alex Goodship** and **Jason Bourgea**, and defenseman **Mike Keenan**.

"Our young players this season are going to be worked into the mix slowly as we finally will have a deep enough bench to do that," Gaudet said. "They'll be given the luxury of getting used to things and not thrown into the fire right away."

Keenan had a great career in high school and the USHL and has proven to be a solid defenseman. He brings a lot of hockey experience at different levels and should be very effective on the blueline. Goodship has terrific speed and the ability to play center or wing. He brings several intangibles to the team, but his speed should be his biggest asset. Bourgea is a local kid from South Burlington, Vt. He has good skills and understanding of the game. The year he played in the USHL has proven to be very beneficial. Corsi is going to help push our other two goalies and will help give us depth at the goalie position."

Joining six rookies behind the bench will be new assistant coach John Rose. Rose will replace long-time assistant Brendan Whittet who became the head coach at Brown.

"The continuity as a staff the last couple of seasons has been great. It's going to be strange to not have Brendan on the bench, but we got a great coach in John," Gaudet said. "I'm excited to have John and I'm equally as excited that Brendan got the opportunity with a head job. I'm very proud of him. To have John come into an already pretty established coaching duo and system will be good. Dave Peters is an exceptional coach in all facets of the game and will prove to be a valuable resource for John."

"I always hesitate singling out individual players and holding them up in preseason, but there are a few of our freshmen that on paper look like they could come in and make an impact right away. Dustin Walsh and Mark Goggin are two very capable players who have been to several prospect camps and have gained valuable experience at those pro camps," Gaudet said.

"The upperclassmen we have coming back will all get valuable playing time and will help our freshmen adjust to the college game quickly," Gaudet said.

The senior class will consist of captain defensemen **Peter Boldt** and **Kevin McCarthy** while forwards **Joe Gaudet, Josh Gillam** and **Rob Smith** will provide the leadership.

Along with Estoclet, Fleming, Owsiak, Reeds, Reber, Stephens and Stejskal, the junior class will also have defenseman **Dan Markowitz**.

"Dan has really helped us prepare our defense to be solid with a strong bench," Gaudet said.

The sophomore class will have **Doug Jones, Connor Goggin, Troy Mattila, Jim Gaudet, Paul Lee, Kyle Schussler, O'Neill** and Mello.

"Jones by far was one of our biggest contributors last year and I expect him to just get better and better. Lee, Schussler and Mattila all provided depth for us at the forward position while the defense was helped by Gaudet and Goggin," Gaudet said.

Dartmouth hockey has had the privilege of fostering several generations of Big Green athletes a trend that will continue this season as older brothers Goggin and Walsh will be joined by their younger siblings. Dartmouth will have three sets of siblings on the team for 2009-10.

"The last couple of years I've had several unusual things happen," Gaudet said. "First I coached my son for the first time and then last season I had both sons on the team. This year we'll have three sets of brothers. By and large that's a very positive thing for our team because it means the older brother has had a great experience at Dartmouth, and it speaks well of the school and their hockey experience here. Having Dustin and Mark join their brothers Connor and Nick helps continue the tradition of family members coming to Dartmouth."

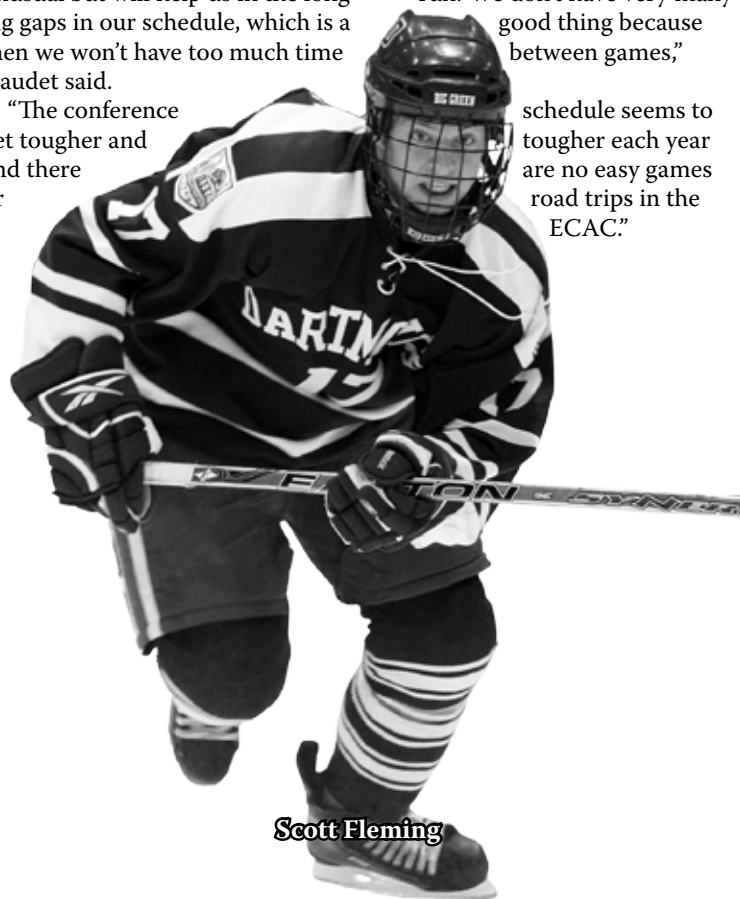
Another tradition that Gaudet has continued is the strength of schedule the Big Green has played year in and year out.

This year the schedule will again test Dartmouth as the Big Green looks to climb back to the top of the ECAC Hockey standings with a shot at a possible postseason berth.

"We have a good schedule; I like the strength of it," Gaudet said. "Our nonconference games are strong as usual with Vermont, UNH, Sacred Heart, Northeastern and possible matchups with UMass-Lowell or Holy Cross. To have that many Hockey East teams on our schedule is good for us."

"We will play three games against Harvard this year, which will be unusual but will help us in the long run. We don't have very many big gaps in our schedule, which is a good thing because then we won't have too much time between games," Gaudet said.

"The conference schedule seems to get tougher and tougher each year and there are no easy games or road trips in the ECAC."

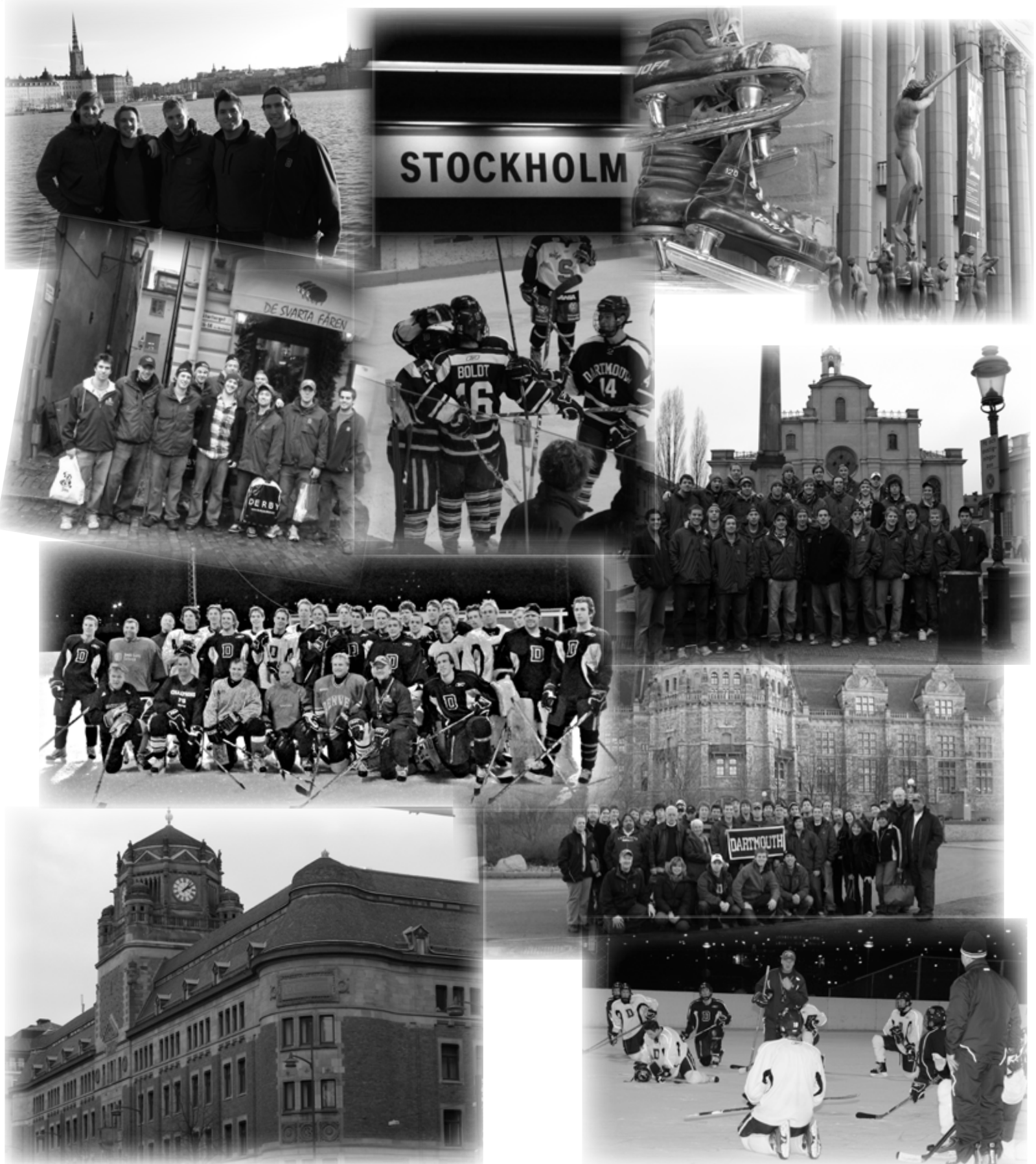
2008 TRIP TO SWEDEN/DENMARK

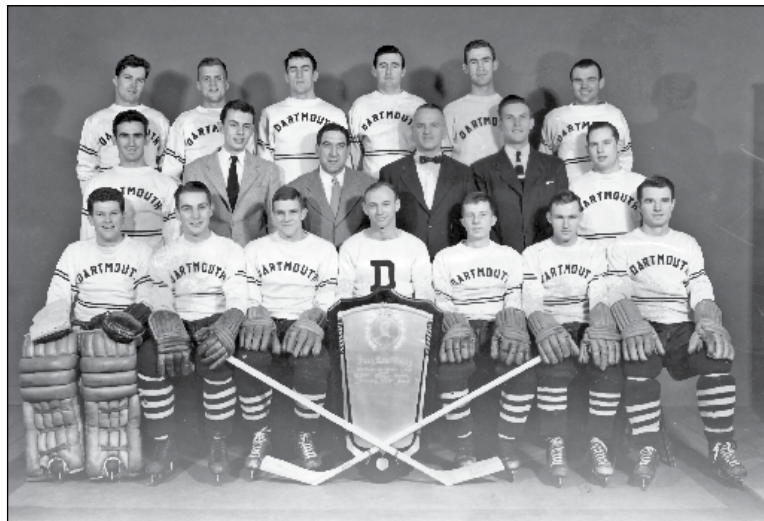

100+ YEARS OF DARTMOUTH HOCKEY

During the past century, Dartmouth men's hockey has earned a place in the nation's athletic annals with league championships and national competitions. Some significant moments in Dartmouth history include the first Big Green team to take the ice (1905), Alumni Gym opens (1921), Davis Rink opens (1930), Eddie Jeremiah begins his Dartmouth coaching career (1937), the 1941-42 team earns the national collegiate title, the 1947-48 team is Dartmouth's first NCAA Tournament team, Dartmouth stuns New Hampshire for the ECAC Holiday Tournament title (1972), Thompson Arena opens (1975), 1978-79 team wins the Ivy title and advances to NCAA Tournament, Bob Gaudet becomes head coach (1997), Dartmouth has its second 20-win season in three years (2004-05), the Big Green wins its first-ever ECACHL title (2006) and the Ivy League title (2007).



Myles Lane was a two-sport athlete at Dartmouth. He led the Big Green football team in scoring and then became a hockey defenseman in the winter, scoring 50 career goals. He was captain of the 1927-28 hockey team and is enshrined in the U.S. Hockey Hall of Fame and the College Football Hall of Fame.



Lee Stempniak '05 helped Dartmouth to two 20-win seasons during his storied career. As a junior and senior, Stempniak became Dartmouth's first two-time All-America selection since Bill Riley '46. Stempniak was the team captain in 2004-05 and he finished his career with his name in several career categories including Dartmouth's all-time games played leader. The St. Louis Blues picked him in the fifth round of the 2003 NHL draft and in July 2005 he signed a contract with the team.



Bill Smoyer was the scoring leader on Eddie Jeremiah's last two teams. He followed his father, Stan '34, and brother Dave '63 to Dartmouth. The Smoyer Lounge in Thompson Arena was made possible by a gift from the Smoyer family in memory of Bill.



Dartmouth's first hockey team was in 1905-06. Players included Addison Brooks '06, Eugene Brooks '07, John Crocker '07 and Warren Foote '08. Addison, Dartmouth's first team captain, scored the Big Green's first-ever goal in a 4-2 win over Williams College, although some records have indicated that Gene Brooks might have scored it. Brooks was named the second captain in Dartmouth history but an injury forced him into a coaching role.

Eddie Jeremiah '30 accumulated a 300-239-11 record at Dartmouth. He was inducted into the U.S. Hockey Hall of Fame and he led two Big Green teams to the national championships.

HOCKEY HALL OF FAME MEMBERS

Eddie Jeremiah**1973**

A seven-time letterwinner at Dartmouth, Eddie Jeremiah was the Big Green's hockey coach from 1937-67 and compiled a coaching record of 300-247-10. His teams in 1948 and 1949 were runners-up in the NCAA championship tournament. After his successful playing days at Dartmouth ended, Jeremiah went on to a five-year professional career.

Myles Lane**1973**

Myles Lane ranks as one of Dartmouth's greatest athletes of all time. From 1925-28, Lane earned three letters each in hockey and football and another in baseball. He was captain of the 1927-28 hockey team and gained national prominence by becoming the first American collegian to successfully enter professional hockey, joining the New York Rangers. While at Dartmouth he established records for goals in a season by a defenseman (20) and career goals by a defenseman (50).

Doug Everett**1974**

Doug Everett was one of the greatest hockey players to come out of Dartmouth during the 1920s. He was a member of the Dartmouth teams from 1922-26. Everett was All-College in his sophomore and junior years as selected by the Boston Transcript and was named by the New York Herald Tribune to one of the earliest All-America teams.

William Riley**1977**

Bill Riley was one of the great all-time scorers in college hockey and was one of three famous hockey playing brothers. Playing four varsity seasons, Riley appeared in 71 games, scoring 228 points (118g, 110a). Riley was a major factor in the Big Green's march to two NCAA finals. He continued his interest in the game and became an official in New England. Riley was honored for his contributions to hockey when he received the Sheaffer Pen Award.

Jack Riley**1979**

Jack Riley coached the 1960 American team to a first-place finish in Olympic competition. Riley was an outstanding college player at Dartmouth, graduating in 1947 due to time served. He competed on the 1948 Olympic team and was a player/coach on the 1949 national team. Joining the U.S. Military Academy in 1950, he served continuously as hockey coach, retiring in 1986. He twice was named NCAA Coach of the Year.

Walter Bush**1980**

Walter Bush was the primary founder of the Minnesota North Stars. He attended the Breck School and graduated from Dartmouth in 1951. He helped organize the U.S. Central League. He was instrumental in organizing the Minneapolis Bruins. He was the first American to win the Lester Patrick Trophy, which he received in 1943. Bush was named NHL Executive of the Year in 1972.

Richard Rondeau**1985**

Dick Rondeau starred at Mt. St. Charles Academy and then at Dartmouth College. In 1941-42, Rondeau led the nation in scoring with 76 points (45g, 31a) as Dartmouth won the national championship. In 40 games he accumulated 176 points (103g, 73a), averaging 4.4 points per game. One of only two Dartmouth players to be elected captain for two successive seasons, Rondeau scored three or more goals in 18 games. He was Dartmouth's leading scorer for the 1941-42 and 1943-44 seasons and holds many Dartmouth scoring records.

Richard Desmond**1988**

Dick Desmond backstopped the Dartmouth team during one of its most successful eras. He was a two-sport athlete with the Big Green, playing hockey and baseball. Dartmouth advanced to the finals of the NCAA Tournament twice and Desmond was named MVP of the 1948-49 finals. He earned All-Ivy honors for three years and captained Dartmouth in 1948-49. Desmond was the only goalie on the 1950 U.S. National team that claimed the silver medal and was voted tournament MVP. In 1952, he played for the U.S. Olympic team that won the silver medal.

Charlie Holt**1997**

Charlie Holt began his career in 1962 at Colby College. In 1968 he took the head coaching job at the University of New Hampshire where he remained for 18 years. Under his leadership, the Wildcats gained the ECAC playoffs in 14 of those years, played three times in the NCAA Division 1 Final Four and had a 347-232 record. The Spencer Penrose College Coach of the Year Award was presented to him three times.

Bruce Mather**1998**

Bruce Mather was a 1947 Dartmouth graduate who went on to play on the 1948 U.S. Olympic team (which finished fourth) and the 1949 U.S. national team. He was one of only two players to score 100 points with the Olympic team. Mather also played for the Boston Olympics in the Quebec Senior League. He was a member of the U.S. National team in the 1958 World Championships.

Joe Riley**2002**

Joe Riley grew up in Medford, Mass. with his two Hall of Fame brothers. After a year at the University of Illinois and World War II military service, Riley transferred to Dartmouth where he played two seasons from 1947-49. He matched the single season record for goals and collected 67 goals and 49 assists in his two-season career. Dartmouth advanced to the finals of the NCAA Tournament twice and Riley was named MVP of the 1947-48 finals. He was named to the All-New England team and the NCAA All-Tournament team, and he was an All-American in 1949. Riley also played in the 1948 Olympics.
