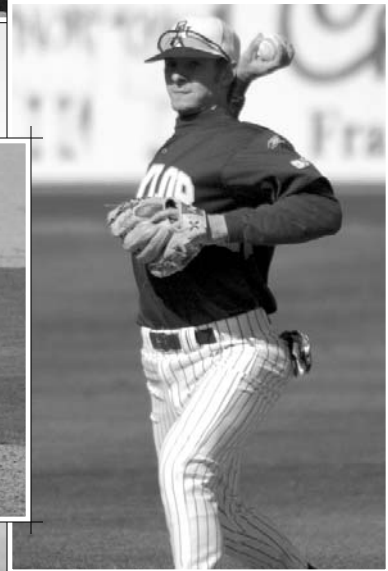
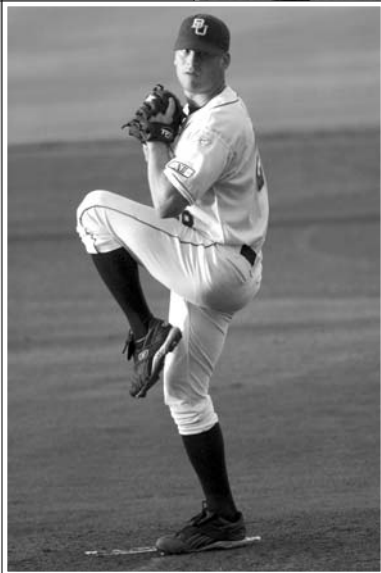
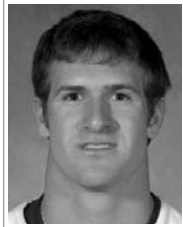

2004 (JUNIOR)

Became third player in Baylor history to hit .400 in Big 12 Conference play, posting a league-best .404 mark ... Big 12 average ranked fourth in school history ... Also led conference with 14 doubles in league play, four more than any other player and most ever by a Baylor player in a Big 12 season ... Ranked third in league play with 40 hits ... Hit safely in 21 of 25 Big 12 games with streaks of nine and eight games ... Did not go more than six conference at bats without a hit ... Led team with 12 multiple-hit games in Big 12 play ... Ranked ninth overall in Big 12 with .355 batting average400 hitter (36-for-90) with bases loaded, .304 (24-for-79) with runners on base ... Strong at home, hitting .309 with two home runs and 17 RBI at Baylor Ballpark ... Even stronger in road games, hitting .417 ... Hit .427 with 11 doubles, three triples, two home runs and 15 RBI in 89 at bats in day games ... Had an RBI sac fly Feb. 15 against LMU ... Went 1-for-2 Feb. 17 against UTSA ... Went 2-for-3 with an RBI double in second game of Feb. 21 doubleheader at Long Beach State ... Had a triple in first game of Feb. 28 doubleheader against Arizona ... Was 2-for-5 with a run scored March 14 against Vanderbilt ... Went 2-for-4 with a walk, a run and an RBI double March 19 at Texas A&M ... Had a pinch-hit RBI double March 20 against Texas A&M ... Went 1-for-4 with two-run double March 23 against Northwestern State ... Had two hits and an RBI March 26 at Oklahoma ... Had a hit and a run scored March 30 against TCU ... Went 8-for-14 in Missouri series with at least two hits in each game ... Recorded first career four-hit game in the Saturday contest, going 4-for-6 with two runs scored ... Enjoyed a career-long 11-game hitting streak March 19 through April 4 ... Went 3-for-5 with an RBI and three doubles April 11 against Oklahoma State ... Went 2-for-4 with two RBI and a run scored April 13 against Sam Houston ... Plated two and went 1-for-3 with a sacrifice fly April 25 against Kansas ... Homered and went 2-for-2 with two runs, three RBI and a sacrifice fly April 28 against Texas Southern ... Went 5-for-11 with four runs, an RBI and two doubles in the Kansas State series, hitting safely in all three games ... Hit a walk-off RBI double May 4 against Dallas Baptist, scoring pinch runner Jake Rippee for the winning run ... Was 2-for-3 with a run May 12 against Texas State ... Went 2-for-4 with a pair of doubles, a run and an RBI May 14 against Nebraska ... Was 3-for-4, came a double shy of the cycle, scored three runs and had an RBI May 16 against Nebraska ... Went 4-for-6 with two doubles, a triple, three runs and four RBI May 22 at Texas Tech ... Was 3-for-5, came a triple shy of the cycle, scored a run and had two RBI May 23 at Texas Tech ... Missed Big 12 Conference Tournament due to staph infection.

SUMMER 2003

Led the Central Illinois Collegiate League in RBI (32) and tied for the conference lead in home runs (six) as his Danville Dans won the Eastern Division and the CICL league title ... Also finished among the league leaders in batting, slugging, runs scored, hits, total bases and stolen bases ... Named the league's top player in the first half of the summer ... Made the CICL's final all-star team and was named Co-Player of the Tournament for the league's playoffs... Hit .285 and was 13-of-14 on steals.

2003 (SOPHOMORE)

Saw extensive time at DH against left-handed pitching ... Made his first collegiate start as DH Feb. 28 at UC Irvine ... Went 2-for-3 and scored a run in that game ... Pinch-hit double helped start a five-run ninth-inning rally in a 23-18 loss April 19 against Missouri ... Came off the bench and recorded his first collegiate home run May 6 against Centenary, a two-run, pinch-hit shot ... Homered in the fourth inning as Baylor built its lead in an eventual 7-5, 14-inning win May 24 over Nebraska at the Big 12 Tournament.

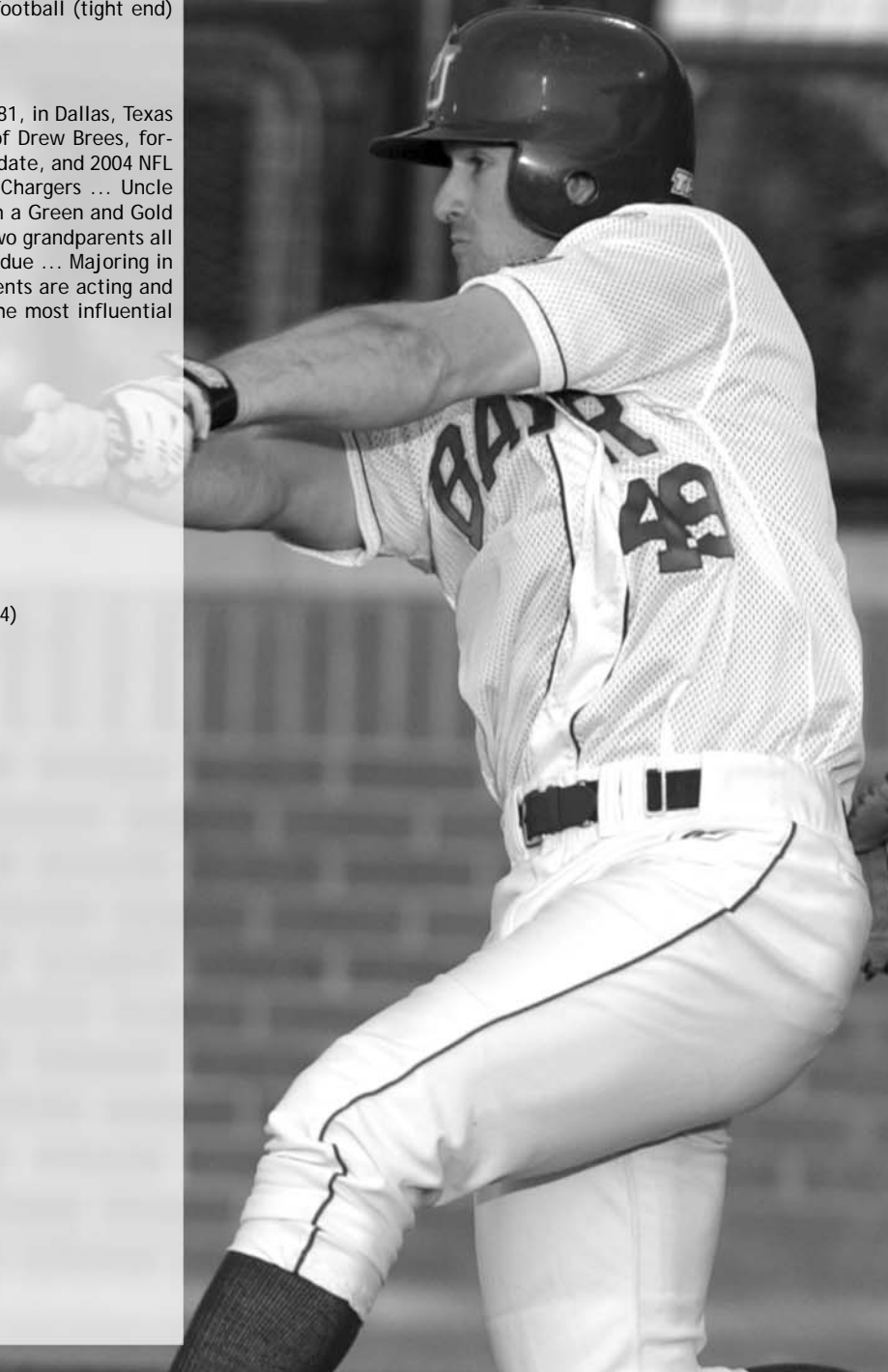

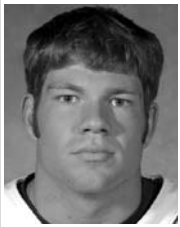

2004 (JUNIOR)

Bears' everyday starter at DH ... Sidelined from C duties after off-season shoulder surgery ... Hit .354 (34-for-96) with two runs, four doubles, two triples, nine home runs and 22 RBI in Big 12 games ... Hit safely in each of final four Big 12 games ... Also enjoyed Big 12 hitting streaks of six and five games ... Hit safely in 20 of 25 conference games ... Shared team lead with six multiple-RBI games in Big 12 play ... Ranked seventh in batting average, tied for fifth in triples, tied for first with teammate Michael Griffin in home runs and third in total bases in league play ... Home run total tied for second-best single-season Big 12 total ever by a Baylor play-



er ... Big 12 slugging percentage of .719 ranked third in school history ... Tied for sixth in Big 12 with 14 home runs in all games ... Overall slugging percentage of .579 ranked ninth in Big 12 ... Steady hitter, posted .310 batting average both with bases empty (36-for-116) and with runners on base (31-for-100) ... Hit .309 (17-for-55) with runners in scoring position ... ALL-STAR MCCORMICK AMONG TOP PROSPECTS

Baseball America included Baylor's Mark McCormick among the Cape Cod League's top 30 prospects. For the second consecutive year, McCormick was tabbed the league's sixth-best pro prospect. This year, he was the third-rated pitcher and the second-rated right-hander.

McCormick was selected to participate in the Cape Cod All-Star Game and was clocked at 100 miles per hour by scouts in attendance.

At the conclusion of the 2003 Cape Cod season, ESPN baseball analyst Peter Gammons had this to say about McCormick:

"Actually, the best pitching prospect (for 2003) is an '05 draftee — Baylor (Wareham) pitcher Mark McCormick, who might be the best right-handed prospect in the league in a decade, including Matt Morris."

VANALLEN INSTRUMENTAL IN YARMOUTH-DENNIS TITLE RUN

Baylor southpaw Cory VanAllen posted a 2.43 ERA in 11 appearances for Eastern Division and playoff champion Yarmouth-Dennis. While VanAllen did not earn a decision, he played an instrumental role in the the Red Sox' playoff championship.

In the second and deciding game of Yarmouth-Dennis' best-of-three series with Falmouth, VanAllen pitched 4.0 innings of two-hit scoreless relief that gave the Red Sox a chance to rally for the win.

VanAllen entered the game with Falmouth leading 4-2 and pitched the fifth through eighth innings, facing one over the minimum. The Red Sox then tied the game in the top of the ninth and eventually won 8-4 in 11 innings.

On the summer, VanAllen allowed just 22 hits in 29.2 innings with 24 strikeouts. He held opposing batters to a .206 average.

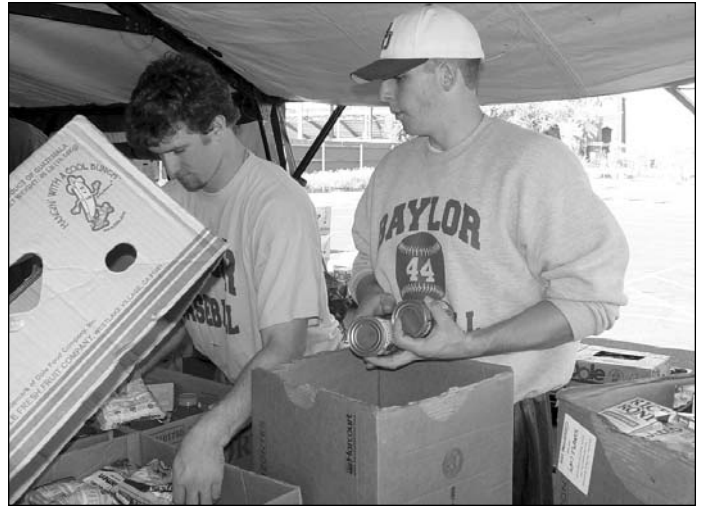

NCAA COMPLIANCE GUIDELINES

Baylor University is committed to absolute compliance with all NCAA and Big 12 Conference rules and regulations. Institutional control of athletics is a fundamental principle of NCAA legislation. It requires each institution to conduct its intercollegiate athletics programs in accordance with the rules and regulations of the NCAA. This responsibility includes ensuring that coaches, staff, and other groups representing the institution's athletics interests comply with all applicable rules.

As a result, it is important for prospects, fans, and alumni to have some understanding of the principles governing college athletics. Below are a few definitions and rules that apply to all athletic boosters.

NCAA DEFINITIONS

REPRESENTATIVE OF ATHLETICS INTERESTS (BOOSTER)

A "representative of athletics interests" (booster) is any individual or group that has ever:

- Been a member of an organization promoting Baylor athletics.
- Contributed to the Athletics Department or its booster organization.
- Assisted in evaluating or recruiting prospective student-athletes.
- Provided benefits (e.g. employment) to prospective student-athletes, enrolled student-athletes or their family members.
- Otherwise promoted the Baylor athletics program.

Keep in mind that it is very easy to meet one or more of these criteria and once you become an athletics representative, you retain this status FOREVER!

PROSPECTIVE STUDENT-ATHLETE

A "prospect" is a high school student that has started classes for the ninth grade and also any junior college student. A student that has not started classes for the ninth grade becomes a prospect if the student receives any benefits that the institution does not provide to all prospective students in general. An individual remains a prospect until he or she starts classes at Baylor or reports for practice, whichever occurs first.

STUDENT-ATHLETE

A "student-athlete" is a student whose enrollment was solicited by an athletics staff member with the expectation that the student will participate in intercollegiate athletics. A student not solicited by an athletics staff member becomes a student-athlete when he or she joins an intercollegiate team or reports for practice.

RECRUITING

"Recruiting" is any solicitation of a prospect or the prospect's family by an authorized institutional staff member for the purpose of securing the prospect's enrollment at Baylor and participation in athletics. Athletics representatives may not be involved in the recruitment of prospects except as outlined in the following section.

CONTACT

A "contact" is any face-to-face encounter between a prospect or the prospect's parent or legal guardian and an institutional staff member or athletics representative during which any dialogue occurs.

GUIDELINES AND REMINDERS FOR BOOSTERS

- A booster may not contact a prospect, prospect's family, friends, coach or school administrator in an attempt to evaluate or recruit the prospect.
- A booster may not expend funds to entertain or provide transportation for a prospect or the prospect's family or friends.
- A booster may not write, make phone calls, or otherwise communicate with a prospect or the prospect's family or friends for recruiting purposes.
- A booster may not contribute funds to a prospect's high school or club team as a form or recruiting inducement or if solicited to do so by a collegiate coach.
- A booster may attend a prospect's athletic events without contacting the prospect or his/her family.

- A booster may send recommendation letters and newspaper clippings about a prospect in their area to Baylor's coaches.
- A booster may continue a pre-existing relationship with a prospect and his/her family as long as the relationship pre-dated the prospect's recruitment or notoriety as an athlete and the nature of the relationship is not enhanced after their notoriety as an athlete. Such a relationship may not be for recruiting purposes.
- A booster may host a current student-athlete or an entire team in their home for a meal, but only on an occasional basis.
- A booster may provide a job for a student-athlete, but the job responsibilities must be legitimate and the pay commensurate for the task.

GUIDELINES FOR EXTRA BENEFITS

An "extra benefit" is any special arrangement by an institutional employee or athletics representative to provide a prospect, a student-athlete or his or her family with a benefit not expressly authorized by the NCAA. Boosters may not provide any special arrangement considered to be an extra benefit. Examples of extra benefits include, but are not limited to:

- Gifts of money, awards or other tangible items.
- Use of vehicles or payment of transportation costs incurred by prospect, prospect's relatives or friends.
- Free or reduced housing arrangements.
- Promise of employment after graduation or employment of prospect's relatives or friends.
- Special discounts or payment arrangements.

RECRUITING GUIDELINES FOR PROSPECTS

LETTERS AND NOTES

Coaches may begin to write notes and letters to prospects beginning September 1 of their junior year in high school (conclusion of sophomore year for men's basketball prospects).

PHONE CALLS

- **Prospect Calling:** A coach may receive a call initiated by a prospect and paid for by the prospect at any time, including the prospect's freshman or sophomore years. Prospects may call coaches collect or by dialing 800-BAYLORU only after July 1 after their junior year.
- **Football:** Coaches may call a prospect once in May of their junior year and then begin making regular phone calls September 1 after their junior year. At some times of the year, calls are limited to once per week while at others calls are unlimited.
- **Men's Basketball:** Coaches may call a prospect once after June 21 after their junior year, and three more times in the month of July, and then once per week thereafter.
- **Other Sports:** Coaches may call a prospect once in March of their junior year, then once per week beginning July 1 after their junior year.

UNOFFICIAL VISITS

There are no limits on the number of unofficial (unpaid) visits to Baylor a prospect may make and no age restriction on who may make unofficial visits. At each unofficial visit, a prospect may receive three (3) complimentary admissions to a home athletic event. No other expenses may be paid by Baylor. At certain times of the year, unofficial visits are prohibited so please coordinate your visit with the coaching staff.

OFFICIAL VISITS

A prospect may only make a total of five official (paid) visits and only one official visit to Baylor. A prospect may not make an official visit until the first day of classes of their senior year (January 1 of junior year for men's basketball prospects). All official visits will be coordinated by the coaching staffs.
