The high school knowledge bowl team finished in third place at the regional meet held Friday earning the opportunity to represent the 1A schools in the state meet. The Colorado State Knowledge Bowl is scheduled for April 17th and 18th on the Colorado College Campus in Colorado Springs. The intent of the tournament is recognition of academic excellence among many of the finest students in Colorado's secondary schools. Over sixty teams will take part in the event.

Representing Campo for the regional meet was Zane Jenkins, senior and team captain; Hunter Huffman, junior; Katie Jenkins, sophomore; Ty Ownbey, sophomore; and Shaelynn Wood, sophomore. The team earned 66 points from a written round of 60 questions and 4 orals rounds, each consisting of 50 questions.

The state meet is arranged as a power tournament with the first round being a written, objective test of 60 questions being taken each day of the competition. Team members will work cooperatively on the exam. One point is awarded for each correct answer. Each oral round will consist of 50 questions with alternates being allowed to check in after 25 questions. Each team may have 4 members and 4 alternates. One point for each correct answer is awarded. Points will be accumulated throughout the competition. Throughout the two-day event, the teams will participate in 2 written rounds and a total of 7 orals rounds. The final day will include a championship round for all classes followed by the state championship round. Awards will be presented on the final day with trophies being given to the overall top three teams in each division. The overall winner will be presented with the traveling Governor's Cup for a period of one year.

Congratulations to the team members and good luck as you participate in the state meet!

Town of Campo to Hold Election

Municipal elections will be held April 1, 2014. The Town of Campo will elect three trustees for four-year terms. Terms will expire for Trustees Lennie Johnson, Sandy Dodge, and Brianna Billings.

Nomination petitions may be picked up at the Town Office on Monday, February 10, 2014. Nomination petitions may not be circulated until Monday, February 10, 2014. The petitions must be returned to the Town Clerk by 3:00 p.m. on Friday, February 28, 2014.

Electors eligible to hold offices must be registered electors 18 years of age or older, and they must have resided in the municipality for a period of at least 12 consecutive months immediately preceding the election.

In accordance with the Colorado Fair Campaign Practices Act (CRS 1-45-101, et. Seq.) all candidates for a municipal office must file a candidate affidavit and other reports. If you have further questions, Please call Campo Town Clerk, Linda Holbert at 787-2416.


