A Shared Mission

Kent State University supports the mission of the Ohio College of Podiatric Medicine, which is to educate students to be highly competent doctors of podiatric medicine who excel in residency training. The goals of the college are to provide a high-quality, comprehensive educational program by which students will acquire the requisite knowledge, skills, judgment, leadership and ethical values necessary to deliver high-quality podiatric medical and surgical care to meet the health care needs of the public.

Education And Technology

The curriculum at OCPM consists of two components: the basic sciences and the clinical sciences. The basic sciences make up the first two years of study at OCPM, where students develop a competence for understanding the entire body and its many functions. In the second through fourth years, students encounter the study of clinical sciences, which included formal course work and clinical rotations. The clinical curriculum at OCPM includes student rotations through general medicine, orthopedics, podiatric medicine and surgery.

OCPM is dedicated to having the highest level of technology available to its students. Our technology resources include a wireless internet campus, a student computer lab consisting of 30 computers, flat screen plasma TVs in all labs and group meeting rooms, 24-hour high-tech security system with 36 on-site cameras, motion sensored lighting throughout various parts of the campus and student and staff ID cards that grant access throughout the building and also serve as debit cards for purchases in the cafeteria, vending machines and library.





Affiliations

Our locations within the Cleveland medical community allows the college to foster several educational affiliations, thus expanding the resources available to our students. OCPM has regional and national affiliations with over 50 worldwide hospitals including the Cleveland Clinic and University Hospitals. In addition, more than 300 private practitioners nationwide provide clerkship training to OCPM students.

OCPM is accredited by the Council on Podiatric Medical Education as a sponsor of continuing education in podiatric medicine. From large, national continuing medical education conferences, to innovative, intimate conferences, OCPM provides a wealth of diverse programs for its alumni, students and the podiatric community.
