THE STORYLINE

- The Florida football team hosts SEC Eastern Division rival Kentucky in The Swamp in Week 3.
- The Gators are 47-17 all-time against the Wildcats.
- UF has won 27 consecutive games against UK, dating back to 1986. This represents the longest active winning streak over a major opponent in an annual series.

LAST TIME OUT

- The Gators scored 65 points, their highest output since Nov. 22, 2008, when they beat FCS opponent The Citadel 70-19.
 - UF tallied its most points against an FBS opponent since a 65-3 win over San Jose State on Aug. 30, 2003.
- The 65-point margin of victory is Florida's largest since an 82-6 win over Central Michigan on Sept. 6, 1997.
- Florida registered 655 yards of total offense, which marks the ninth-best performance in school history.
 - The Gators have topped 600 yards 17 times in program annals.
- The Gators are the third Southeastern Conference team for rush for more than 250 yards and pass for 395 or more in the same game since 1996. (See chart on Page 5)
- UF ran 86 plays, which is nearly 20 snaps above its season average from 2013 (66.1).
- The Orange and Blue shut out an opponent for the first time since Nov. 17, 2012, vs. Jacksonville.
 - The 65-point margin marks Florida's biggest shutout victory since a 65-0 win over Kentucky on Sept. 28, 1996.
- Florida now has 168 shutouts in school history, including four under Head Coach Will Muschamp.
- UF recorded its 78th all-time win of 40 or more points.
- The Gators forced five Eastern Michigan turnovers (four lost fumbles and one interception), including a 36-yard interception return for a touchdown by true freshman Duke Dawson.
 - Dawson's pick-six was the first by a UF true freshman since De'Ante Saunders against Furman on Nov. 19, 2011.
 - UF was +5 in turnover margin, as the Orange and Blue did not give the ball away to the Eagles.
- Senior Clay Burton caught seven passes against the Eagles, which is two catches shy of the school record by a tight end (9 - three players)
- Redshirt senior Quinton Dunbar caught five passes for 81 yards; this marks the 29th consecutive game he has registered at least one reception, extending his school record.
 - The previous mark was held by Carlos Alvarez, who caught a pass in 25 straight contests from 1969-71.
- Sophomore wideout Demarcus Robinson had six catches for 123 yards, leading the team and crossing the 100-yard mark for the first time in his career.
- EMU ran just five plays in UF territory, and did not cross the Gators' 42-yard line.
- The Orange and Blue registered nine big plays (six 10+ yard runs, three 20+ yard passes) during the contest, and did not allow any to the Eagles.
 - Three of the six double-digit runs were touchdowns.
- Florida forced the Eagles into seven three-and-outs on their 17 total possessions.
- Twenty-five Gators (including nine freshmen and 12 redshirt freshmen) saw their first action in Orange and Blue.
 - Transfers Brooks Abbott, Jake McGee and Drew Sarvary made their UF debuts.
- The Gators crossed the 6,000-point mark in games at Ben Hill Griffin Stadium since 1990.
 - Florida has scored 6,001 points at The Swamp in the last 24+ seasons.
- Florida improved to 81-27 all-time in season openers, including 66-7 in Gainesville and 51-4 in The Swamp.

LAST FIVE GAMES VS. KENTUCKY

2013 | No. 20 FLORIDA 24, Kentucky 7 (Lexington) Tyler Murphy passed for a touchdown and ran for another Saturday night and tailback Matt Jones rushed for a career-high 176 yards and a score as captured their Southeastern Conference road opener. The win was the 27th straight for the Gators in the series, dating to 1987. That's the longest current winning streak for one team over another in the nation and now the longest by any program in SEC history. Murphy, the fourth-year junior from Connecticut making his first career start, completed 15 of 18 passes -- including his first 13 attempts -- for 156 yards, including a 9-yard scoring strike to Trey Burton in the second quarter and later in the period added a 5-yard TD run on an option keeper. He was intercepted once.

2012 | No. 14 FLORIDA 38, Kentucky 0 (Gainesville) Florida shook off some early rust to run away from Kentucky 38-0, giving the Gators their 26th-straight win in the series. For UF, it was its first shutout of an SEC opponent since defeating Mississippi State, 52-0, on Sept. 29, 2001. Florida got its scoring from a 27-yard field goal from Caleb Sturgis, 1-yard touchdown runs from Mike Gillislee, Jeff Driskel and Jacoby Brissett, a 26-yard interception return by Jaylen Watkins and a 19-yard reception by Quinton Dunbar. Florida had near perfect balance offensively, getting 403 yards of total offense with 203 yards passing and 200 yards rushing.

2011 | No. 15 FLORIDA 48, KENTUCKY 10 (Lexington) The Gators turned four Kentucky turnovers into 24 points and rushed for over 400 yards. Jeff Demps finished the game with 10 rushes for 157 yards and two touchdowns, while Chris Rainey had 15 carries for 105 yards. The Gators rushed for 405 yards on the night on 46 carries (8.8 yards per attempt). The Gators' first three scoring drives took just seven plays, covered 126 yards and took 2:08 combined. Florida's defense forced three first-half turnovers and turned it into 21 points. In the third quarter, Demps raced 84 yards for a touchdown, the sixth-longest rush in UF history. Linebacker Mike Taylor's interception of Morgan Newton set up a 27-yard field goal by Caleb Sturgis late in the third quarter to increase the lead to 41-10. Mike Gillislee made it 48-10 with an electrifying 60-yard touchdown run in the fourth quarter, the longest rush of his career, which closed out the scoring. The 405 yards rushing by Florida was the sixth-best single-game performance in school history.

2010 | No. 9 FLORIDA 48, KENTUCKY 14 (Gainesville) The ninth-ranked Florida Gators defeated the Kentucky Wildcats, 48-14, delivering head coach Urban Meyer his 100th career win and notching the Gators' 24th-straight win against Kentucky. Freshman Trey Burton accounted for 36 points against Kentucky with all six offensive touchdowns (five rush, one receiving), to propel a Gator offense that finished with 466 yards. Burton finished the day with 42 yards passing (1-of-1), five carries for 40 yards on the ground (five TD) and five catches for 37 yards through the air and one touchdown. John Brantley threw for 248 yards, connecting on 24-of-35 passes to eight different Florida receivers. Deonte Thompson had 5 receptions for 86 yards, Andre Debose made his first appearance, catching four passes for 36 yards, while senior Carl Moore also had four catches for 72 yards. Senior punter Chas Henry booted a season-long punt in the last minute of the first half, sailing the ball 61 yards. Henry averaged 56.0 yards on three punts against Kentucky. The Florida defense held Kentucky to just 99 yards rushing on the night, while also holding the Wildcats to just 5-of-14 third down conversions.

2009 | No. 1 FLORIDA 41, KENTUCKY 7 (Lexington) The Florida Gators beat the Kentucky Wildcats, 41-7, at Commonwealth Stadium in Lexington. The Gators jumped out to a 31-0 lead in the first quarter, amassing 223 yards of total offense, compared to Kentucky's -1 yard. Tim Tebow finished the night 5-of-10 for 103 yards and one touchdown pass, and with 123 yards on 16 carries with two touchdowns. Kentucky's Mike Hartline finished the game 14-for-30 for 92 yards and one touchdown. The Wildcats were also led by Derrick Locke, who tallied 37 yards on 14 carries, and Chris Matthews, who had three receptions for 28 yards. Florida totaled 282 yards of offense (185 rushing, 97 passing) in the first half and limited Kentucky to 74 yards (39 rushing, 35 passing). The Gators totaled 362 yards rushing on the night and 495 yards overall.

CROSSING PATHS

- Former quarterback **Chris Leak**, who is now the Gators' wide receivers coach, led the biggest comeback on the road in UF history at Kentucky in 2003. After trailing 21-3 late in the third quarter in Lexington, Leak threw two touchdown passes and led another touchdown drive to give UF a 24-21 win.
- Kentucky has 16 players on their roster from the state of Florida. UF has one player from Kentucky (redshirt freshman DB **Garrett Stephens**).

- Against Eastern Michigan last week, the Gators' 655 total yards set a Muschamp-era record and ranked ninth all-time in UF annals (fifth since 2001).
- Nine Gators recorded their first career start during the 2013 season.
- AHMAD FULWOOD** and **TRIP THURMAN** made their first career starts in the season opener against Eastern Michigan.
- The Gators scored points in 32 of 48 (67%) quarters last season. UF scored a TD in 23 of 48 (48%) quarters.
 - Florida scored at least 13 points in each quarter of the EMU game.
- UF outscored its opponents 113-108 in the second halves of games in 2013, including an 82-39 margin of victory through the first eight games.
 - The Orange and Blue led the Eagles 30-0 at halftime.
- In its four wins in 2013, Florida outscored opponents 62-21 in the first half of games. In eight losses, UF was outscored 111-42 before halftime.
- UF had nine quarters in 2013 where it held the ball for 10-plus minutes.
- The Gators had 27 drives of 10+ plays and 25 drives over five minutes long.
- Against Eastern Michigan, no Gator drive lasted longer than 6:31, and 12 of UF's 16 possessions took three minutes or less.
- Five drives in the season opener had 10+ plays.
- Florida has allowed just one sack in its last four games dating back to 2013.
- UF averaged 145.8 rushing yards per contest as the Gators totaled 1,789 yards on 482 carries and had 14 rushing TDs in 2013.
 - In the season opener against EMU, Florida rushed for 259 yards and four scores.
- The Gators totaled nine explosive plays in the season opener vs. Eastern Michigan.

OFFENSIVE LINE

- UF will strive for improved production on the offensive line in 2014 under first-year position coach **MIKE SUMMERS**, who has 34 years of coaching experience.
- Eleven players saw action on the line in the season opener against Eastern Michigan.
- UF returned five student-athletes with starting experience: Max Garcia, Trenton Brown, Chaz Green, Tyler Moore and D.J. Humphries.
- Senior **CHAZ GREEN** returned to the right side of the Gators offensive line against Eastern Michigan after missing the 2013 season due to injury. Green has started 20 games and appeared in 21 throughout his career at UF. In addition, Green was named to the 2011 All-SEC freshman team.
- Redshirt senior **MAX GARCIA** competed in his first season as a Gator a year ago following him sitting out the 2012 season due to NCAA transfer rules when he came from Maryland. He started all 12 games, playing mostly left guard and left tackle. Garcia was named a team captain against Vanderbilt and he won the Scrap Iron Award following the Toledo, Tennessee and Arkansas games. Garcia moved to center before the 2014 season, making his debut at the position against Eastern Michigan.
- Senior **TRENTON BROWN** started the season opener at right guard. He played in all 12 games and started the final five contests at right tackle for the Gators in 2013. Brown began last season on the field goal unit and as a reserve at tackle but took over the starting job against Georgia when Tyler Moore was lost for the year due to injury.
- Junior **TYLER MOORE** entered the 2013 season playing right guard but moved to right tackle due to injuries. Throughout the season, Moore played in seven games making six starts, five at right tackle and one at left tackle. He suffered a season-ending injury prior to the Vanderbilt game and missed the last four games. He returned to the field against EMU.
- Redshirt junior **TRIP THURMAN** made his first career start in the season opener, playing left guard against Eastern Michigan. Thurman had appeared in 16 games during the previous three seasons.
- Junior **D.J. HUMPHRIES** returned from a knee injury against the Eagles. He played in seven games in 2013, starting the first six at left tackle, before the injury ended his season. In 2012, Humphries appeared in all 12 games, starting three (South Carolina, Missouri, and Louisiana) and was named SEC Coaches' All-Freshman (OL) and Sporting News Freshman All-America.
- The offensive line has paved the way for the fourth-highest yards per carry at 4.7 yards since the start of the 2008 season, among teams that have been SEC members for that entire span.

FLORIDA'S OFFENSE

RUSHING

- Florida averaged 145.8 rushing yards per game in 2013, and had four games with 200+ yards (262 yards vs. Toledo, 215 vs. Tennessee; 246 vs. Kentucky; 200 at S.C.).
- In the 2014 season opener against Eastern Michigan, Florida rushed for 259 yards.
- Under Muschamp, UF has rushed for 200 or more yards 13 times.
- Three Gators rushed for 60+ yards against the Eagles.
- The Gators had 49 runs of 10-plus yards (4.1 per game) last year, totaling 776 yards. In 2012, UF had 90 runs of 10-plus yards (6.9 per game).
- UF had six double-digit runs against EMU for 162 total yards.
- Sophomore **KELVIN TAYLOR** finished second on the team a season ago with 508 yards on 111 carries (4.6 avg.) with four touchdowns. He was the team's leading rusher in five of the last six games totaling 410 yards over that span with all four of his scores coming in those games. 105 of Taylor's 111 carries came in the final seven games of the season.
- Taylor started to get more carries beginning with the game at Missouri, leading the team with 13 carries for 74 yards (6.2 avg.). He scored his first-career touchdown on a 20-yard run in the third quarter that cut the Missouri lead to 23-17.
- Taylor made his first career start against Georgia and led the Gators' rushing attack with 20 carries for 76 yards.
- At South Carolina, Taylor rushed 21 times for a career-high 96 yards and scored two touchdowns.
- Junior **MATT JONES** suffered a season-ending knee injury against LSU and finished his 2013 season with 339 yards on 79 carries (4.3 avg.) and two touchdowns. He also had 5 catches for 25 yards.
- Jones had 176 yards rushing at Kentucky, the most by a Gator running back since Ciatrick Fason had 210 vs. Kentucky in 2004. His 176 yards rushing on the road was the most since Ciatrick Fason ran for 190 at South Carolina in 2003 and is the eighth best all-time by a Gator in a road game.
- Jones also led the team in rushing against Miami (47 yards) and Arkansas (50 yards).
- Redshirt senior **MACK BROWN** led the team in 2013 with 543 yards on 148 carries (3.7 avg.) and had four touchdowns. Brown had his first career start against Toledo and had a career day, rushing for 112 yards on 25 carries and scoring two touchdowns, all career highs. He also led the team in rushing against Tennessee (24 carries, 86 yards) and at LSU (15 carries, 56 yards).
- Four Gator running backs averaged more than 8.0 yards per carry against Eastern Michigan: Jones, Taylor, Brown and **BRANDON POWELL**.

PASSING

- In 2013, Florida completed 64.0 percent of its passes and averaged 10.3 yards per completion. The Florida QB Rating was 125.27 (199-of-311, 2,051 yards, 11 TD, 9 INT).
- UF completed 70 percent (33-of-47) of its passes in the 2014 opener.
- Redshirt junior quarterback **JEFF DRISKEL** owns a 13-3 career record as the Gators' starter. He suffered a fractured fibula against Tennessee in 2013 and missed the remainder of the season. His numbers for two-plus games were 42-of-61 for 477 yards, two touchdowns and three interceptions with a passer rating of 135.52.
- Driskel threw for 248 yards against Eastern Michigan in Game 1 of 2014.
- In 2012, Driskel started 12 games for the Gators and completed 156-of-245 passes for 1,646 yards with 12 touchdowns and five interceptions on the year. In addition, Driskel carried the ball 118 times for 408 yards (3.5 avg.) on the season with three touchdowns.
- In a game at Tennessee in 2012, Driskel notched 195.0 passer rating and was named the SEC Offensive Player of the Week for his efforts. At Vanderbilt that same year, he carried the ball 11 times for a career-high 177 yards and three touchdowns which set a new school record by a Gator quarterback.
- Freshmen **WILL GRIER** and **TREON HARRIS** have battled throughout fall camp for the backup quarterback spot behind Driskel. Grier enrolled in January of 2014 while Harris enrolled during the summer.
- Harris earned the No. 2 spot for Week 1, and both of his passes against Eastern Michigan went for scores; the two touchdown tosses totaled 148 yards.
- Redshirt sophomore **SKYLER MORNHINWEG** started the final three games of the season. Mornhinweg finished the 2013 season with 344 yards passing, completing 69.8 percent of his passes (44-of-63) with three touchdowns and one interception.
- 17 different players caught a pass last year and five players had 15 or more receptions.
- Florida's 33 completions against Eastern Michigan were spread amongst 11 receivers.
- Overall in 2013, the wide receivers accounted for 148 of the team's 199 receptions (74 percent). In 2012, the group totaled 67 catches out of 183 for UF (36 percent). Against Miami, UF receivers totaled 19 of the team's 22 receptions.
- Florida lost two of its top pass catchers from a season ago including Solomon Patton, who led UF in receiving yards (556), catches (44) and touchdowns (6), and Trey Burton, who finished the season with 38 grabs for 445 yards and one touchdown.
- **QUINTON DUNBAR** set career highs last season at Miami with 7 catches for 98 yards. He finished the 2013 campaign with 40 catches for 548 yards.
- Dunbar has caught a pass in 29-straight games, dating back to the game against Furman in 2011. During that span, he has totaled 87 catches for 1,112 yards and 6 touchdowns. His streak of 29-straight games with a catch is a school record, surpassing Carlos Alvarez's streak of 25 games from 1969-71.
- Dunbar led the team in receiving yards last year twice (Georgia-91, Vanderbilt-77) and led the team in catches six times (Miami-7, Tennessee-4, LSU-3, Georgia-4, Vanderbilt-6, South Carolina-3). Against Georgia, Dunbar had a career-long 83-yard completion from Murphy.
- **DEMARCUS ROBINSON** recorded his first 100-yard game against Eastern Michigan, hauling in a career-best six passes from Driskel.
- **AHMAD FULWOOD** came on midway through the season a year ago with 16 of his 17 catches coming in the last seven games. He totaled 127 yards on his 17 catches. Against Vanderbilt, he caught three passes for 33 yards and scored his first career touchdown.
- Fulwood's 17 receptions were the most by a true freshman wide receiver at Florida since Percy Harvin had 34 catches in 2006.
- Robinson and **CHRIS THOMPSON** each caught two passes against Vanderbilt. Robinson had 5 catches for 23 yards in 2013, while Thompson totaled 2 catches for 13 yards.
- Sixth-year senior **ANDRE DEBOSE** will look to bounce back after he missed the 2013 season with a torn ACL. He has 29 career receptions for 543 yards and four touchdowns, along with a school-record four scores on kick returns.

FLORIDA'S DEFENSE

- In 2013, Florida yielded 21.1 points per game to rank 15th nationally in scoring defense and the Gators were also eighth in total defense (314.2 ypg). UF is one of three schools to rank in the top 10 nationally in total defense each of the past three years (Alabama & Florida State).
- EMU ran just five defensive plays inside UF territory all game and the deepest they got into UF territory was the 42-yard line.
- The longest the UF defense was on the field against EMU was for 3:16. Average time of possession per drive for EMU was 1:25. 11-of-17 drives were less than two minutes.
- In three games against Kentucky under Will Muschamp, Florida has allowed only 17 points (5.6 points per game), including a 38-0 shutout in 2012. Dating back to 2008 (six games), Florida has allowed 43 points to Kentucky (7.1 points per game).
- Dating back to 1981, UF has won 17-straight home games against Kentucky. In those games, Kentucky has averaged 16.5 points per game, and has been held under seven points six times, including two shutouts (9/22/12, 38-0; 9/28/96, 65-0).
- Of the teams UF has played three times during the Will Muschamp era, Florida's 110-17 point differential over Kentucky is the highest of any opponent.
- Florida allowed only 125 total yards to EMU, which was the lowest total since the Gators allowed 95 total yards vs. Florida State on Nov. 26, 2011.
- The Gators shutout of Eastern Michigan was the first since Nov. 17, 2012, when UF shutout Jacksonville St., 23-0. It was also the first opening week shutout since the 1988 season when the Gators shutout Montana St., 69-0, at home (9/3/88).
- The shutout vs. Eastern Michigan was the fourth during the Muschamp era.

- Over the last three seasons, the Gators' third-down defense ranks third nationally, holding opponents to a .306 (157-for-513) conversion rate. In 2013, UF ranked 21st in the country (51-for-150, .340). The 51 opponent conversions were the second fewest in the country, behind only Louisville (46).
- The Gators forced the EMU offense into seven three-and-outs in its 17 total drives.
- In 137 opponent drives last year, the UF defense forced 36 three-and-outs (26.2 percent).
- In 2013, UF tied for sixth nationally in opponent first downs (16.1), while posting the best mark in the SEC. It was also UF's lowest total since 2009 (14.9).
- Florida forced five turnovers (1 INT, 4 FR) vs. Eastern Michigan, which was the most turnovers forced since Sept. 21, 2013 vs. Tennessee when the Gators forced six turnovers (4 INT, 2 FR).
- UF forced a turnover in every game except two last year (Vanderbilt & South Carolina), including six turnovers (4 INT, 2 FR) against Tennessee (9/21). It was the most turnovers by UF under Muschamp, and the most against an SEC foe since Sept. 21, 1996 at Tennessee.
- The Gators forced and recovered four fumbles vs. EMU. The four fumble recoveries are the most since UF recovered four fumbles vs. Middle Tennessee State on Sept. 9, 2000.
- No SEC defense has forced more turnovers than the Gators since the 2000 season.

PASS DEFENSE

- Last year, Florida allowed 2,062 passing yards, which was the third-best mark in the nation and best mark in the SEC.
- In 2013, the Gators allowed opposing quarterbacks to complete just 49.8 percent of their passes, fifth in the nation, and average 6.46 yards per attempt, good for 24th. Opponent quarterbacks had a rating of 107.2, eighth-lowest in the nation.
- Dating back to 1996, SEC opponents have averaged under 200 yards passing (195.1) against Florida.
- Against EMU, the Gators allowed 45 yards passing, which is the lowest total since UF allowed zero passing yards against Georgia Southern on Nov. 23, 2013.
- EMU completed 42.8 percent of its passes against UF (9-for-21). EMU's average yards per completion was five yards, while its average yards per attempt was 2.1 yards.
- In the Will Muschamp era, the Gators have allowed less than 100 yards passing six times

- EMU's longest completion went for 13 yards.
- Since the start of the 2012 season, Florida's 16 passing touchdowns allowed is the fewest in the nation, and opposing quarterbacks total a rating of 99.1, which is the third lowest.
- EMU quarterbacks combined for a 51.3 quarterback rating, which is the third-lowest total during the Muschamp era.
- Freshman **Duke Dawson** became the first Florida true freshman to return an interception for a touchdown in his first-career game when he had a 36-yard pick-six vs. EMU. The last time a true freshman returned a pick for a score was De'Ante Saunders vs. Furman on Nov. 19, 2011.
- Dawson became the second true freshman in as many years at UF to notch an interception in his first collegiate game, joining **Vernon Hargreaves III**, who had an interception last year against Toledo (8/31/13).
- The Gators lead the nation in interception touchdown returns and interception return yards since the start of the 2008 season and are third in interceptions:

- Since the beginning of the 2008 season, Florida's 56 interceptions in home games ranks tied for eighth in the nation.
- Sophomore **Vernon Hargreaves III** ranked second in the SEC in passes defensed (1.17) and tied for eighth in interceptions (3) in his true freshman season. His 11 pass breakups equaled the most by a true freshmen in school history (Janoris Jenkins, 2008), while ranking as the ninth-most in single-season school history.
- Dating back to '96, Hargreaves is the first true freshmen at UF to open his career with a pick in each of his first two collegiate games.
- The Gators feature three of the top cornerback prospects from the 2014 recruiting class in their defensive backfield. According to Rivals.com, freshmen **Jalen Tabor**, **Duke Dawson** and **J.C. Jackson** ranked third, ninth and 21st, respectively.
- Four true freshmen defensive backs (Dawson, Jackson, Tabor and **Quincy Wilson**) saw time on defense against EMU.
- Florida had three sacks and nine tackles-for-loss against EMU.
- Redshirt senior linebacker **Neiron Ball** recorded a career-high two sacks and 2.5 tackles-for-loss against Eastern Michigan.
- Against EMU, the defense had three sacks, 11 quarterback hurries and forced four fumbles. In three seasons at Texas, Muschamp's defense averaged 3.05 sacks, 3.97 quarterback hurries and 1.33 forced fumbles in 39 games.

RUSH DEFENSE

- Since 1996, SEC opponents have averaged 3.3 yards per carry against the Gators.
- Florida ranked 33rd in the country and second in the SEC in rushing yards allowed per game (142.4).
- UF allowed 80 yards rushing against EMU. In the Muschamp era, the Gators have held opponents to under 100 yards rushing 13 times.
- Of EMU's 34 rush attempts, nine went for zero or negative yards (26.4 percent). The Eagles averaged 2.4 yards per carry.
- EMU managed only one rush over 10 yards.
- Against Eastern Michigan, 10 Gators recorded a tackle-for-loss.
- Redshirt senior linebacker **Neiron Ball** tied a career high with six tackles against EMU.
- Against EMU, redshirt senior linebacker **Michael Taylor** recorded his 10th-career game with at least six tackles. His 136 career tackles are the most of any current Gator.
- Dating back to 1996, a span of 18 games, the Gators have held Kentucky to under 100 rushing yards 11 times, most recently on Sept. 28, 2013 when they allowed 48 yards.
- In 374 opponent rushing plays (not including sacks) last year, the Gators stopped them for zero or negative yardage on 80 plays (21.4 percent).
- Junior **Dante Fowler, Jr.** recorded 10.5 tackles-for-a-loss in 2013, the fifth most of any returning player in the SEC. His .88 tackles-for-a-loss per-game rate ranks as the fourth-highest total of any SEC returning player. In 2013, his three fumbles forced tied for the second-most in the SEC.
- Florida returns its top two tacklers from a year ago in senior **Michael Taylor** (62, 11 games) and junior **Antonio Morrison** (56, eight games). 2014 is the first season the Gators return their top two tacklers since the team's 11-win 2012 season (Jon Bostic, 94; Matt Elam, 78).

FLORIDA'S SPECIAL TEAMS

PUNTING

- Senior **KYLE CHRISTY** recorded 3 punts for a total of 145 yards in the 2014 season opener against the Eastern Michigan Eagles, sending one 60 yards and averaging 48.3 yards per punt.
- His 43.6 yardage average across 120 punts places him second on the all-time Florida career yardage average list behind Ray Criswell who recorded a 44.4 yard average during his career between 1982 and 1985.
- Christy's 60-yard boot was seven yards shy of his career-long 67-yard punt which came against Auburn in 2011.
- A finalist for the Ray Guy Award in 2012, Christy had 21 punts with a 39.6 average last season, with 10 fair caught, 7 inside the 20-yard line and 2 of 50-plus yards.
- The Gators averaged 40.9 yards per punt last season, with 18 fair caught and 14 inside of the 20-yard line.

KICKING

- Florida scored on its opening drive of the season for the second straight year, when redshirt senior **FRANKIE VELEZ** converted a 33-yard field goal.
- Velez was a perfect 3-for-3 on field goal attempts, going 1-for-1 from 20-29 yards and 2-for-2 from the 30-39 yard range. His 36-yard field goal was 8 yards shy of tying his career-long.
- The Ocala native and former walk-on kicker who was awarded a scholarship this season made his collegiate debut at LSU in 2013 and converted field-goal attempts from 44 yards and 27 yards. The 44-yarder opened the scoring and was the longest successful kick by the Gators last season.

RETURN GAME

- **ANDRE DEBOSE** led the return effort against Eastern Michigan with four punt returns for 97 yards including a career-long 55-yard punt return.
- Debose holds the Florida career record for kick return touchdowns with 4, which is tied for the SEC record with Willie Gault (Tenn.), Felix Jones (Ark.) and Brandon Boykin (UGA). He owns the Florida season record in the same category with 2.
- Florida was one of 16 teams nationally to have multiple players with a punt return of longer than 30 yards in 2013.
- UF's 7 kick returns for scores since 2009 is tied for the 5th-best total in the nation and the Gators' 6 KOR in the last 4 years is tied for 6th-best.
- Florida has returned either a kickoff or punt for a touchdown for 9-straight seasons dating back to 2005, with 10 total punt return touchdowns during that span (including blocked punts). The Gators have also returned a kickoff for a touchdown for 5 seasons in a row, totaling 7 kickoff return touchdowns since 2009.

COVERAGE UNITS

- The Gators held Eastern Michigan to one yard on a single punt return.
- In 2013, the Gators allowed just 16.4 yards per kickoff return, the third-best coverage unit in the nation and tops in the SEC.
- In addition, it was UF's best coverage since allowing just 15.2 yards per return in 2001.
- Florida's punt coverage allowed 3.8 yards per return, its best figure since allowing 3.7 in 2006.
- Last season, the Gators' punt coverage ranked 13th in the nation and second in the SEC.

BLOCKED KICKS

- Florida has blocked 13 kicks in Will Muschamp's 38 games as a head coach, including 6 in 2012 (4 FG, 1 extra point, 1 punt).
- At Miami, Loucheiz Purifoy got the only block of the 2013 season after getting a hand on a Miami punt in the first quarter. The Gators scored a touchdown on the ensuing drive.

TITLE CENTRAL

Florida is one of three schools to win three outright national titles since 1990. The 2006 and 2008 championships were won in the BCS National Championship Game, and Florida was the unanimous pick in all four major polls in 1996. Alabama, Florida State and Nebraska have also won more than two national titles in that time frame, but the Huskers' 1997 title was split with Michigan.

GATORS AND THE POLLS

- After not finishing in the final poll for two seasons (2010, 11), the Gators finished 2012 ranked No. 9 in the AP poll and No. 10 in the USA Today/Coaches Poll, marking the 17th time in school history that UF has finished in the top 10. Since 1990, Florida has finished in the AP Top 25 in 21 of 23 years, including 14 times in the top 10.
- From 2006-12, the Gators finished in the top 10 of the final poll four times, tied with LSU for the second-most in the SEC behind Alabama's five top-10 finishes.

- Since 1990, Florida has outscored its opponents by a combined 6,001 to 2,360 at home, putting the average outcome at 39.2 to 15.4 in favor of the Gators and making the average outcome a 23.8-point win.
- The Gators had two significant winning streaks at The Swamp in the 1990s: a 23-game streak from 1990-93 and a 30-game streak from 1994-99. In 152 home games from 1990-2013, UF has scored 31 or more points 100 times and held its opponent to 14 or less points 86 times.
- With a 7-0 performance in The Swamp in 2012, the Gators matched the 2006 and 2009 squads in finishing with the most wins at home in a season.

IN THE STANDS

- In 2013, the Gators sold out all season tickets for the 34th-consecutive season after averaging 87,597 fans during the 2012 season.
- Florida broke its single-game attendance record in 2009, drawing 90,907 to The Swamp for the Nov. 28 showdown against Florida State. It marked the largest crowd ever to watch a football game in the state of Florida. The state has hosted 14 Super Bowls, three BCS national title games and has featured 18 bowl games that included a team that went on to win at least a share of the national title.
- The crowd of 90,888 for the UF-Alabama game on Oct. 1, 2011, was the second-highest single-game total in school history and the most since 90,885 watched the Orange and Blue face South Carolina on Nov. 13, 2010.
- The Gators have ranked among the nation's top-15 schools in average home attendance in each of the last 32 years (1982-2011) and have ranked among the top 10 in each of the last 23 years (1991-2013).
- In addition, UF set a school attendance record during the 2009 season, averaging 90,635 per game, which ranked ninth in the nation. That broke the previous standard, set in 2008 when the Gators averaged 90,544.
- The largest crowd for a home opener at The Swamp was 90,707 in UF's 2005 win over Wyoming in Urban Meyer's first game as head coach of the Gators. The 2009 opener (90,621) was the second-largest.

PRO FOOTBALL HALL OF FAME

The University of Florida is the only school in the Southeastern Conference to have two inductees into the NFL Hall of Fame since 2001. Former Gator running back Emmitt Smith was inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame in Canton, Ohio, on Aug. 7, 2010, following Gator great Jack Youngblood into the elite fraternity.

A three-time All-American at UF from 1987-89. He set 58 school records in three seasons, including a career rushing mark of 3,928. Following his junior season with the Gators, Smith was a first-round selection in the 1990 NFL Draft by the Dallas Cowboys. He finished his career with 18,355 rushing yards and 164 rushing TD, both of which are NFL records. He was named honorary captain for the 2011 UF vs. Tennessee game.

Youngblood, regarded as the best defensive end in UF history, became the first Gator enshrined in the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 2001. He was named to the All-SEC team of the decade for the 1970s and was the Most Outstanding Player at the 1971 Senior Bowl. He went on to be a five-time All-Pro player for the L.A. Rams. Youngblood appeared in a Rams' record 201 consecutive games and only missed one game in his 14 seasons, that one coming in his final season in 1984.

UF'S LEGENDARY STATUS

NATION'S ELITE

- No other school has captured a national title while facing the nation's toughest schedule. According to NCAA statistics, Florida has done so twice, in 1996 and 2006, and also won the 2008 title facing the second-toughest schedule in the country.
- UF is one of two schools (Arkansas) to face a top-10 strength of schedule five times from 2006-12.
- Florida is one of three schools in the nation to win three outright national titles since 1990. The 2006 and 2008 national championships were decided in the BCS National Championship Game, and Florida was the unanimous pick in all four major polls in 1996. Alabama (1992, 2009, 2011, 2012), Florida State (1993, 1999, 2013) and Nebraska (1994, 1995, 1997) have also won more than two national titles in that time frame, but the Huskers' 1997 title was split with Michigan.
- Florida is one of only two schools in the nation with three quarterbacks to win the Heisman Trophy and one of two schools nationally to have multiple Heisman winners since 1996.
- Florida is the only school in the nation to post 100 wins during each of the last two decades. UF won 102 games in the 1990s and 100 games in the 2000s. UF is one of only three schools in NCAA history to win 100 or more games in two different decades.
- The Gators won at least nine games for a period of 12-consecutive years (1990-2001), something only three schools in major college history have done and no other SEC school has done.
- Florida became one of six schools in major college history to win 100 games during a decade, producing a 102-22-1 record in the 1990s. UF again reached that benchmark in the 2000s, going 100-30.
- UF is the only school in modern major college history to score 500 or more points for a period of four-straight years (1993-96).
- Florida is one of two schools to have a player selected in the first round of the NFL Draft for nine-consecutive years, with a Gator being tabbed each year from 1983-91 (Miami, 14 years, 1995-2008).
- UF is one of only four schools in the nation to have multiple recipients of the William V. Campbell Trophy (formerly the Draddy Trophy), which is presented by the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame to the nation's top football scholar-athlete. (Brad Culpepper, '91; Danny Wuerffel, '96; Tim Tebow, '09)
- UF is the only school in the nation to have a Heisman Trophy recipient who also received the Campbell Trophy. Wuerffel accomplished both in 1996, while Tebow earned the Heisman in 2007 and the Campbell in 2009.

SEC ELITE

- Florida is one of two SEC schools to have three Heisman Trophy winners: Steve Spurrier (1966), Danny Wuerffel (1996) and Tim Tebow (2007).
- UF is one of two SEC schools to win at least 10 games for a period of six-consecutive years (1993-98), something only four schools in major college history have done.
- The Gators are the only SEC team to rank in the top 15 of the final polls for 12-straight years, and only four have done it in major college football history.
- The Gators have the best league record over a 100-SEC-game span, going 87-13 in SEC play from the beginning of the 1990 season through the seventh conference game of 2001.
- Florida is only one of two schools in SEC history to claim four league championships in a row (1993-96). Florida has played in 10 of the 21 SEC Championship Games that have been held, winning seven.

GATORS IN THE PROS

- Since 1998, Florida has had at least 29 players on opening day NFL rosters each year.
- During the 2013 NFL season, UF had 37 players appear on active rosters, totaling 193 starts and 341 games played.
- Thirty-four former Gators are on NFL teams' Week 1 rosters for the 2014 season; in addition, two UF alumni are on teams' practice squads and two are on injured reserve.
- Florida has seen 20 former players go on to appear in the NFL's Pro Bowl. Of those, 13 made multiple appearances in the all-star showcase.
- A Gator has earned a Pro Bowl berth in 34 of the past 38 NFL seasons, including 14 of the past 15 and a streak of 11-consecutive Pro Bowls from 1986-96.
- At least one former UF player has appeared in the Super Bowl 28 times. Four Gators have appeared in the big game on two occasions (Super Bowls XXX and XLI).
- Fourteen former Gators have combined to win 21 Super Bowl rings. Don Chandler, Wilber Marshall and Max Starks have each won two, and Emmitt Smith and Godfrey Miles each claimed three.
- Florida is one of two schools (Pittsburgh) that has two players, Emmitt Smith and Fred Taylor, on the top-15 list of the NFL's all-time top rushers.
- Percy Harvin earned Offensive Rookie of the Year for his performance with the Minnesota Vikings in 2009. He then led the team in all major receiving and kickoff return categories in 2010.

MUSCHAMP NOTABLES

HEAD COACH WILL MUSCHAMP



Muschamp, 43, came to UF after being the coach-in-waiting and defensive coordinator at the University of Texas since November 2008. He brought 16 years of coaching experience with him, including 12 years in the SEC, eight as a coach and four as a player at the University of Georgia. Muschamp also served as defensive coordinator at Auburn Uni-

versity (2006-07) and LSU (2002-04; he was LSU's linebackers coach in 2001) and was a finalist for the 2007 Broyles Award as the nation's top assistant coach.

Muschamp also brought a wealth of big-game experience. Prior to arriving at Florida, he coached in two national championship games, winning the ultimate prize in 2003 as the defensive coordinator at LSU, and coached in a third BCS bowl game following the 2008 season, when Texas won the Fiesta Bowl. In addition to his national championship past, Muschamp has coached in the SEC Championship Game twice and in the Big 12 Championship Game once, coming out on the winning side in each of those three contests.

After a 7-6 record in his first season at Florida, Muschamp led the Gators to one of the nation's top turnarounds in year two, finishing 11-2 and playing in a BCS bowl game. Florida improved from a 6-6 regular season in 2011 to an 11-1 regular season in 2012, which marked the biggest one-year leap for the program in 32 years (0-10-1 in 1979, 7-4 regular season in 1980). In addition, the Gators finished 7-1 in the SEC East, tying for the division crown, a year after posting a 3-5 record in the conference. Florida defeated three top-10 opponents for just the second time in school history. Muschamp was named the SEC Coach of the Year by the league's coaches as well as CBSsports.com.

The Gators finished No. 3 in the final regular-season BCS standings in 2012, the third-highest finish in school history, and ranked in the top 10 in both the final Associated Press and USA Today/Coaches' Poll. UF won 11 games for the sixth time in school history, won four of five games against the final BCS top-12 teams and beat seven bowl-eligible teams against the toughest schedule in the nation according to the NCAA.

In his first three seasons at UF, the formula for the Gators' success was to take care of the football, control both lines of scrimmage, finish games, have outstanding special teams and a physical defense. The Florida defense continued to be one of the nation's best in 2012, ranking fifth nationally in scoring defense (14.5 points per game) and total defense (287.5 yards per game). UF's rush defense improved dramatically from year one under Muschamp, limiting opponents to just 94.9 rushing yards per game after allowing 132.7 yards per game in 2011. The secondary also shut down the opposition, ranking as the nation's No. 2 pass efficiency defense (95.55) and allowing just seven touchdown passes, the second-fewest in the nation.

A year after being outscored 86-59 in the fourth quarter, UF posted a 128-32 edge in the final quarter in 2012. That led to a 5-1 record in games decided by one score or less and matched a school-record eight come-from-behind wins. UF improved from -12 in turnover margin to +15 and ranked seventh nationally. Punter Kyle Christy set a school record for average yards per punt, placekicker Caleb Sturgis finished his career as Florida's leader in career field goals made and the special teams unit blocked six kicks in the last eight games.

Muschamp's first season in Gainesville produced the school's 24th-consecutive winning season and its 32nd-consecutive season of .500 football or better, the longest streaks in the nation. With the victory over Ohio State in the TaxSlayer.com Gator Bowl, UF established a school record with its fourth-straight bowl win. Muschamp's first squad will go down as one of the youngest in school history: 15 true freshmen and 52 underclassmen saw action — the second most in school history.

Despite returning 37 combined starts on the defensive side of the ball, the fewest in the SEC, Muschamp's defense ranked second in the nation in third down conversion defense (.273) — the best national ranking

in school history. Florida allowed just 166.8 yards per game passing to rank seventh nationally and permitted just 299.5 yards per game to rank eighth nationally.

In his five seasons as an SEC defensive coordinator, Muschamp's defenses ranked among the nation's top 10 in total defense every single year, while always maintaining a top-15 rating in scoring defense, including three times inside the top 10.

In four of his eight seasons overall as a Division I defensive coordinator, his teams allowed less than 100 rushing yards per game and twice led the nation in rushing defense while yielding less than 75 rushing yards per game. His 2003 LSU defense led the country by allowing 67 yards per game on the ground, the best mark by an SEC team in the 2000s, while Texas gave up just 73.1 yards on the ground in 2009 to lead the nation.

From 2008-10 under Muschamp's guidance, the Texas defense ranked No. 1 in the nation with 119 sacks for 949 yards lost. His unit also ranked in the top-10 nationally during the same time frame in several other major categories, allowing 2.9 yards per rushing attempt (third), 96.7 rushing yards per game (fourth), 297.4 yards per game (seventh), all of which are Big 12 bests during that span.

In 2009, the Texas Longhorns advanced to the BCS National Championship Game as Muschamp's defense gave up just 73.1 rushing yards per game, the best figure by any BCS school from 2008-10. The Longhorns also led the nation in 2009 in third-down defense (26.5 percent), turnovers created (37, tied with Ohio University) and interceptions (25) as Texas claimed the Big 12 championship in 2009.

Under Muschamp's tutelage at Texas, Brian Orakpo claimed the 2008 Rotary Lombardi Award (lineman of the year), Bronko Nagurski Trophy (most outstanding defensive player) and Ted Hendricks Award (top defensive end), while the Longhorns' defense saw Sergio Kindle become the first player in college football history to be named a finalist for both the Butkus Award (nation's top linebacker) and the Hendricks Award (nation's top defensive end). Earl Thomas also earned finalist honors for the Jim Thorpe Award in 2009.

In the 2009 and 2010 NFL Drafts, Muschamp had a combined 10 players drafted, including nine in the first four rounds and two first-rounders in Orakpo and Thomas.

As the defensive coordinator at Auburn from 2006-07, Muschamp's defense ranked third in the nation in scoring defense (15.4 points per game) and fourth in the nation in pass defense (170.7 pass yards per game). During the same time frame, Auburn ranked third in the SEC in total defense by holding opponents to 295.1 yards per game.

Muschamp's first full-time coaching experience in the SEC came at LSU as the linebackers coach for the 2001 season before being elevated to defensive coordinator from 2002-04. His 2003 defense helped the Tigers to the national championship by leading the nation both in scoring defense (11.0 points per game) and total defense (252.0 yards per game), while finishing second nationally in pass efficiency defense (89.8) and third in rushing defense (67.0 yards per game). The Tigers allowed just 19 touchdowns all season in 2003, three less than the next closest competitor nationally.

Between his positions at LSU and Auburn, Muschamp spent a season with the NFL's Miami Dolphins in 2005 as Assistant Head Coach for Defense. He helped the Dolphins finish second in the league with 49 sacks, while leading Miami to top-10 rankings in yards per play (4.7, seventh), yards per rush (3.7, seventh) and yards per pass (6.0, ninth).

The 1994 graduate of Georgia moved immediately into coaching following his collegiate playing career, working as a graduate assistant at Auburn from 1995-96, earning his master's degree in 1996. He became a secondary coach at West Georgia (1998) and Eastern Kentucky (1999) before moving on to his first defensive coordinator position at Valdosta State for the 2000 season.

In his playing career at Georgia, Muschamp earned his way from walk-on to scholarship player by the spring of his redshirt freshman season and eventually was named co-captain for his senior season. He also earned a spot on the SEC Academic Honor Roll in 1993.

D.J. DURKIN

Defensive Coordinator/Linebackers



- In his first season as defensive coordinator in 2013, UF finished second in the SEC in total defense and eighth in the country (allowing 314.2 yards per game).
- The defense held half of its opponents to 275 total yards or less in 2013 and allowed just 27 touchdowns, the sixth-fewest total in the nation.
- With a veteran linebacker group in 2012, the Gators' defense finished ranked fifth in the country in total defense, allowing 287.5 yards per game, and fourth nationally in rush defense (94.9 yards per game).
- UF blocked six kicks last season, ranking fifth nationally and tied for first in the SEC, marking the sixth time in seven seasons and all three of Durkin's seasons that the Gators led the SEC in blocks.
- Florida scored a touchdown on a punt return for the eighth-straight year and also had a kickoff return touchdown for the fourth-straight season. Andre Debose set the career record with his fourth kickoff return for a touchdown.

COLEMAN HUTZLER

Special Teams Coordinator



- Returned to Florida in the spring of 2014. Previously served on the Florida staff from 2010-11, assisting off the field with the defense and special teams and working closely with current defensive coordinator D.J. Durkin.
- Joined the New Mexico staff in the spring of 2012 and coached the Lobos' special teams and outside linebackers for two seasons.
- UNM's kickoff return unit ranked 16th in the nation in 2013, averaging 24.0 yards per return.
- In 2012, New Mexico had three special teams' players earn honorable mention All-Mountain West honors: kicker Justus Adams, kick returner Chase Clayton and Skaer.
- On the defensive side, Hutzler's outside linebackers combined to record 19 tackles-for-loss and eight sacks.

BRAD LAWING

Assistant Head Coach/Defensive Line



- Joined the Florida staff after being at South Carolina for the last seven years.
- His 2012 unit set a school record with 43 sacks, the sixth-most in the nation. Sophomore Jadeveon Clowney was a unanimous first-team All-American after setting school records with 23.5 tackles for loss and 13.0 sacks.
- In 2011, the Gamecocks finished with the nation's third-best defense (268 yards per game), second-best pass defense and No. 11 scoring defense (18.4 points per game).
- Lawing spent three seasons as North Carolina's defensive line coach and recruiting coordinator from 2003-05. Each of his three recruiting classes was ranked among the nation's top-25.
- Between his stops at Carolina, Lawing spent four seasons at Michigan State as defensive line coach and recruiting coordinator. During his tenure, the Spartans led the Big Ten in total defense in 1999 and 2000.
- Began his college coaching career at Appalachian State, where he mentored the defensive line for five years and the tight ends and offensive tackles for one season.

CHRIS LEAK

Wide Receivers



- Joined the Florida coaching staff prior to the 2013 season as a graduate assistant.
- Assisted with the quarterbacks in 2013, a group that saw three different quarterbacks start multiple games on the season.
- For the season, Florida's quarterbacks completed 64.0 percent of its passes, sixth-best in school history.
- Following his playing career, he spent time as a host on SiriusXM College Sports Coast-to-Coast during the 2012 football season.
- Started 33 games at quarterback in his career at Florida, leading the Gators to an SEC title and BCS National Championship in 2006.
- Finished his career as UF's all-time passing leader (11,213 yards) and threw for 88 touchdowns, second-most in school history.
- Played in the Canadian Football League for three seasons, winning the 2009 Grey Cup, and spent one season in the Arena Football League

DEREK LEWIS

Tight Ends



- Tutored first-team All-SEC selection Jordan Reed, who led the team with 45 catches for 559 yards and scored three touchdowns last season. Reed ranked ninth nationally in catches by a tight end and 13th in receiving yards by a tight end.
- In 2011, led a tight end group that totaled 47 catches for 584 yards (12.4 ypc) and three touchdowns. Reed finished second on the team with 28 catches and third on the team with 307 receiving yards.
- Tutored Minnesota's Nick Tow-Arnett to an All-Big Ten Honorable Mention selection following the 2009 season after Tow-Arnett finished second on the team with 37 receptions for 505 yards and three touchdowns. As a group, Gopher tight ends in 2009 averaged over 13 yards per reception.
- Tight ends were also a prominent part of the Gopher offense in 2008, as the group hauled in 46 receptions for 542 yards and three TDs, averaging 11.8 yards per reception. Minnesota's tight ends accounted for 30 receptions and 351 yards in 2007, part of the second-best single-season passing mark (2,949 yards) in school history.
- From 2005-06, Lewis worked at Texas as a graduate assistant, where he was part of the staff that captured the 2005 BCS National Title.

TRAVARIS ROBINSON

Defensive Backs



- Oversaw a Gator secondary that was one of the best in the nation in 2012, ranking No. 2 in pass efficiency defense (95.55) and allowing just seven touchdown passes, the second-fewest in the nation.
- Florida had 20 interceptions last season, tied for the 10th-most in school history and seventh nationally.
- Tutored first-team All-America safety Matt Elam, who totaled 76 tackles, 11.0 tackles-for-loss and four interceptions before becoming a first-round selection in the NFL Draft by the Baltimore Ravens.
- Coached cornerback Marcus Roberson, who earned second team All-SEC honors and totaled 12 pass breakups in 2012, tied for the sixth-most in a single season in UF history and the most since Joe Haden had 12 in 2008.
- In 2011, guided a UF secondary that ranked seventh in the nation in pass defense (166.8 yds/game). Overall, the Gator defense ranked eighth nationally in total defense (299.5 yds/game) and second in third-down defense (27.12 percent).
- Worked under Will Muschamp in his two seasons with the Auburn program.

KURT ROPER

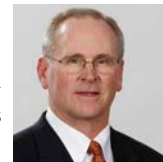
Offensive Coordinator/Quarterbacks



- Came to Florida in the spring of 2014 after spending six seasons at Duke as the Offensive Coordinator and Quarterbacks coach.
- Has mentored a trio of 3,000-yard passers.
- Broke over 100 Duke records and 8 ACC records as offensive coordinator.
- Duke enjoyed a record-setting season in 2013, winning a school-record 10 games en route to winning the ACC's Coastal Division championship for the first time since the league went to divisional play in 2005.
- The Blue Devils thrived in 2013, setting the school record for total touchdowns (54) while becoming the first squad in program history to post 20+ rushing and 20+ passing touchdowns in a season.
- In 2012, directed Duke to a school-record 410 points and 31.5 points per game, marking the fifth-highest average in school history.

MIKE SUMMERS

Offensive Line



- Has 34 years of experience, primarily coaching the offensive line; also has spent 15 years as an offensive coordinator.
- 2012 Kentucky team averaged nearly 140 rushing yards while the 2010 offense averaged 6.1 yards per play.
- Spent two seasons at Arkansas (2008-09); Razorbacks led the SEC in scoring in 2009 and won the 2010 AutoZone Liberty Bowl.
- Helped lead one of the nation's most prolific offenses at Louisville, where the Cardinals won the 2004 Conference USA Championship and 2006 Big East title, and played in the 2007 Orange Bowl, 2006 Gator Bowl, 2004 Liberty Bowl and 2003 GMAC Bowl. The 2004 and 2006 Cardinal teams both finished ranked No. 6 by the Associated Press.
- Spent two seasons at Ohio (2001-02) as the offensive line coach. The Bobcats ranked sixth nationally in rushing offense (240.1 ypg) in 2001 and eighth in 2002 (239.8 ypg).
- Assistant head coach and offensive coordinator at the University of the South for four seasons (1996-99), where he produced top-five ranked rushing and total offenses in the conference.
- Assistant head coach/offensive coordinator at Oregon State (1991-95) for five seasons. The Beavers led the Pac-10 in rushing his final four seasons. Was named the league's top "Offensive Backfield Coach" in 1993.
- While offensive coordinator at Northern Illinois for six seasons (1985-90), his offense established 51 school records and seven NCAA marks.

BRIAN WHITE

Running Backs



- A 27-year coaching veteran and the 2004 winner of the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Division I Assistant Coach of the Year Award. Has coached in 16 bowl games and served on coaching staffs that have won a national title and two league championships.
- In 2012, led a Gator rushing attack that ranked third in the SEC, averaging 188 yards per game. Coached senior Mike Gillislee to the first 1,000-yard season at Florida since 2004 and just the 10th all-time. He also earned first team All-SEC honors in his only year as starting tailback.
- Served Interim Offensive Coordinator during the 2012 Gator Bowl.
- Worked with running backs Jeff Demps and Chris Rainey, who each ranks among the top 10 in rushing yardage at Florida.
- During his 11-year tenure at Wisconsin from 1995-2006, he mentored 1999 Heisman Trophy winner Ron Dayne, 2001 NFL first-round draft choice Michael Bennett, 2001 Big Ten Freshman of the Year Anthony Davis and 2006 Capital One Bowl Most Valuable Player Brian Calhoun.
- Was a graduate assistant for the 1988 Notre Dame team that won the National Championship.

University of Florida Athletics Director Jeremy Foley and University of Idaho Athletics Director Rob Spear have agreed that Saturday night's game has been declared a no contest and that not rescheduling the game is the only viable option for both programs.

The two schools, however, have agreed to schedule a game in Gainesville for the 2017 season on a date to be determined later.

"We looked at a number of options and, in the end, we both thought it was in the best interest of our student-athletes and football programs to play out the remainder of our respective schedules as they stand," Foley said.

Florida will fulfill the terms of the contract between the two schools and pay Idaho its \$975,000 guarantee by February 1, 2015, as outlined in the agreement.

"I want to thank UF, especially AD Jeremy Foley, for the professional and first-class way they worked through this issue and the focus on student-athlete welfare," Spear said. "It was not in our best interest to play 10 consecutive weeks without a bye week. We look forward to our return to Florida in 2017."

The Florida offense racked up 655 total yards, ninth-most in school history, and ran 86 plays in offensive coordinator Kurt Roper's UF debut. Quarterback Jeff Driskel completed a career-high 31 passes for 248 yards and a touchdown in his first game back from a season-ending injury in 2013. Running backs Kelvin Taylor and Matt Jones combined for 142 total yards and four total touchdowns (3 rushing, 1 receiving), while freshman running back Brandon Powell rushed for 23 yards a touchdown in his first career game. True freshman quarterback Treon Harris also had a stellar debut, completing 2-of-2 passes for 148 yards and two touchdowns, scoring strikes of 70 and 78 yards. On the defensive side, the Gators limited the Eagles to 125 total yards, 80 on the ground and just 45 through the air. UF racked up 11 quarterback hurries, nine tackles-for-loss and three sacks while forcing five turnovers on the night. Linebacker Neiron Ball had a career game, totaling six tackles and a career-high two sacks. Freshman Duke Dawson picked off a pass and returned it 37 yards for a score, becoming the first true freshman to return an interception for a touchdown in his first-career game.
