Trudeau Liberals at historic high

On track for overwhelming majority

Toronto, May 23rd, 2013 – In a random sampling of public opinion taken by the Forum Poll™ among 1,779 Canadians 18 years of age and older after a week of bad news for the Prime Minister, an historic high of well more than 4-in-10 would vote for the Liberals if a federal election were held today (44%), and this compares to just one quarter for the ruling Conservatives (27%) and just one fifth for the official opposition, the NDP (20%). Few would vote for the Bloc Quebecois (4%), the Greens (3%) or any other party (1%).

The Liberals have an advantage among females (48%), the least wealthy (<\$20K - 56%), Atlantic Canada (57%), among those with the highest education (post-grad - 48%), Catholics (51%), those from a background other than European or Canadian (49%) and among those who saw Trudeau ads on television, both those produced by the Conservatives (48%) and the Liberals (50%).

Conservatives have more support among the oldest (65+ - 36%), those in the prairies (37%), Alberta (46%) and BC (35%), among Protestant (42%) and Evangelical Christians (74%) and those who claim British heritage (38%). The NDP has stronger support among those in BC (28%).

It should be noted that one quarter of past Conservative voters will support the Liberals now (22%), as will one third of past NDP voters (35%).

Liberals would claim overwhelming majority

If these results held on election day, the Liberals would claim almost two thirds of the seats in the House (192 out of 308), leaving just 77 for the Conservatives and just 37 for the NDP, reducing them to third party status again. The Greens would claim leader Elizabeth May's seat, and the Bloc would take one seat in Quebec. These projections represent a sharp increase for the Liberals (from 170 seats last month), accompanied by a commensurate drop in seat counts for the Conservatives (from 99 last month).

Trudeau favourables sky high, Harper's down sharply

One half of Canadians approve of the job Justin Trudeau is doing as the leader of the Liberal Party (49%), and this is an increase since last month (46%), as well as the highest approval we have registered for a party leader. His net favourable (approve minus disapprove) is a lofty +23. Meanwhile, Prime Minister Harper's approval rating has declined from 32% last month to 29% this month, and his net

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is an abysmal -35. NDP leader Tom Mulcair, who has enjoyed favourable ratings, has the approval of just more than one third (36%), and his net is a neutral +3.

"Mr. Harper's very bad week has had a drastic effect on his approval and his party's. It doesn't help, when the Liberals are surging as they have been, to be stonewalling a controversy. Justin Trudeau needs only to listen to Sun Tzu, and stay out of the way. Meanwhile, the NDP appear to have functionally ceded the role of the opposition to the Liberals in the public's mind," said Forum Research President, Dr. Lorne Bozinoff.

Methodology

The Forum Poll™ was conducted by Forum Research with the results based on an interactive voice response telephone survey of 1,779 randomly selected Canadians 18 years of age and older. The poll was conducted between May 21st to May 22nd, 2013.

Results based on the total sample are considered accurate +/- 2%, 19 times out of 20. Subsample results will be less accurate. Margins of error for subsample (such as age, gender) results are available at www.forumresearch.com/samplestim.asp

Where appropriate, the data has been statistically weighted to ensure that the sample reflects the actual population according to the latest Census data.

This research is not necessarily predictive of future outcomes, but rather, captures opinion at one point in time. Forum Research conducted this poll as a public service and to demonstrate our survey research capabilities.
