### Federal Liberals with slim lead over Conservatives

### Liberal vote share has decreased

Toronto, July 24<sup>th</sup>, 2013 – In a random sampling of public opinion taken by the Forum Poll™ among 1,782 Canadians 18 years of age and older, just more than a third would vote Liberal if an election were held today (35%) and this represents a slight decline from last month (38%). By contrast, 3-in-10 will vote Conservative (31%) and this is steady since last month (30%). Fewer than one quarter will vote NDP (22%, a slight increase from 20%). The Bloc Quebecois attracts the support of about a tenth (7%), while the Greens have about half this support (4%) and very few will vote for any other party (1%).

#### Conservatives on track for more seats

Seat projections based on these results would actually see the Conservatives take a minority of 129 seats in a 308 seat house to the Liberals' 120 seats. This represents a decrease from 150 seats for the Liberals last month to 113 seats for the Conservatives. The NDP are projected to take 44 seats, up from 39 last month. The Bloc Quebecois would see the biggest boost, from 5 seats last month to 14 this month. The Green Party is projected to retain leader Elizabeth May's seat.

#### Leader approvals steady

Prime Minister Harper has the approval of 3-in-10 Canadians (31%), steady since last month (33%), but his net favourable (approve minus disapprove) is a dismal -29, and growing worse. Tom Mulcair has similar approvals at 33% (35% last month) but his net is a much more favourable +4. Justin Trudeau has the highest approval at 44% (down from 47% last month), and his net is a sterling +9.

"The bloom is coming off the rose a bit, Justin Trudeau is beginning to look like just another politician and the Liberals like just another party. The special aura has worn off it seems, and Canadians are evaluating the political options on their merits. The Liberals are still favoured, but it's competitive again," said Forum Research President, Dr. Lorne Bozinoff.

#### **HIGHLIGHTS:**

### Methodology

The Forum Poll™ was conducted by Forum Research with the results based on an interactive voice response telephone survey of 1,782 randomly selected Canadians 18 years of age and older. The poll was conducted on June 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2013.

Results based on the total sample are considered accurate +/- 2%, 19 times out of 20. Subsample results will be less accurate. Margins of error for subsample (such as age, gender) results are available at www.forumresearch.com/samplestim.asp

Where appropriate, the data has been statistically weighted to ensure that the sample reflects the actual population according to the latest Census data.

This research is not necessarily predictive of future outcomes, but rather, captures opinion at one point in time. Forum Research conducted this poll as a public service and to demonstrate our survey research capabilities.
