THE STORYLINE

- The Florida football team hosts Southeastern Conference rival LSU in The Swamp in Week 7.
- The Gators and Tigers are meeting for the 61st time; Saturday marks their 30th clash at Ben Hill Griffin Stadium.
- The Gators have won three of the last four meetings against the Tigers in Gainesville dating back to 2006.
- The Gator offense has shown great efficiency in the red zone through four games, converting 15-of-16 trips inside the opponent's 20-yard line into points.
 - UF has scored nine touchdowns in the red zone this year, with an additional six trips resulting in field goals.
- Conversely, Florida's defense has given up just four touchdowns on opponents' 11 red-zone trips (36.3 percent), which ranks ninth nationally.
 - UF has not allowed a red-zone touchdown for five straight trips.
- Florida has had one player both force and recover a fumble in back-to-back games.
 - At Alabama, Keanu Neal had a scoop-and-score in the first quarter to tie the game at 7.
 - At Tennessee, Jalen Tabor strip-sacked the Vols' Justin Worley in the third quarter, setting up a five-play scoring drive that culminated with Matt Jones' two-yard plunge to close the deficit to 9-7.
- The fumbles are a key part of Florida's SEC-leading plus-eight turnover margin, which ranks fifth nationally.
 - UF's average weekly margin of plus-two is tied for fourth among FBS schools.
 - The Gator defense has forced at least three turnovers in each game this year.
- The UF defense is forcing 6.25 three-and-outs per game, which leads the SEC and ranks fourth nationally.
- UF's lines have proven to be stout in pass protection on offense and in quarterback pressures on defense, as the Gators stand fourth in the SEC in sacks for (tie; 3.00 per game) and sacks against (1.25 per game).
- A strong run defense has seen the Gators allow just 11 double-digit runs this year, which is third in the nation.
 - Tennessee's longest carry last week went for 11 yards.
- Redshirt senior wide receiver Quinton Dunbar continues to climb the charts as his six-yard reception at Tennessee extended his streak of consecutive games with at least one catch to 32.
 - The Miami native now stands alone in third place in Florida history, trailing Ike Hilliard (35 games, 1994-97) and Cris Collinsworth (34 games, 1978-80).

LAST TIME OUT

Treon Harris replaced starter Jeff Driskel late in the third quarter -- with his team down two scores -- and promptly led UF on a pair of fourth-quarter scoring drives to surge UF to a 10-9 comeback win over Tennessee.

Austin Hardin's 49-yard field goal with 6:20 remaining proved to be the difference in UF's lowest-scoring victory in 46 years. Harris led UF on a five-play, 30-yard touchdown drive, capped by a 2-yard run from Matt Jones, as the Gators made it a one-score game. On the second Harris series, he marched his unit 49 yards in eight plays, with a 32-yard run by Jones, who had 114 yards on 23 carries, the big play. It set up Hardin for a career-long field goal attempt, which he converted.

Tennessee had a chance to drive to the winning score, but Keanu Neal's diving interception with 51 seconds to play preserved the victory and capped a spectacular overall effort by the UF defense. A week after Tennessee went to Georgia and rolled up 401 yards in a 35-32 loss, the Gators held the Vols to just 233 yards -- including just 29 on the ground -- and sacked quarterback Justin Worley six times to go with two interceptions.

UF penetrated the UF 20-yard line four times and came away with three field goals. On the day, the Gator defense limited Tennessee to eight red-zone snaps for minus-11 yards, with three incomplete passes, one interception and a sack.

Three Aaron Medley field goals, including a pair of 39-yarders in the second half, had Tennessee in front 9-0 in the third period before Harris entered the game and breathed life into the Florida offense.

FROM THE LAST GAME

- Florida overcame a nine-point deficit in the fourth quarter, marking its largest fourth-quarter comeback since Sept. 27, 2003 at Kentucky; in that contest, UF trailed by 18 and won 24-21.
 - The nine-point comeback marks the second-best road comeback by the Gators since 1966.
- Florida defeated Tennessee for the tenth consecutive year dating back to 2005.
- The Gators won for the ninth time in 11 meetings in Knoxville since 1994.
 - The Orange and Blue now lead the all-time series in Knoxville, 12-11.
- UF now leads the all-time series 25-19.
- The Gators converted seven third downs; entering the contest, Tennessee had allowed just 11 conversions (21 percent) in four games this season, and just four in its past two games.
- Florida was 4-of-10 on third down in the first half, marking its best first-half conversion rate in SEC play this year.
- The Gators sacked Tennessee quarterback Justin Worley six times on the day.
- UF forced Tennessee into four three-and-outs on 14 drives, including back-to-back three-and-outs to start the game.
- Tennessee was 3-of-4 on the day in the red zone, with three field goals and no touchdowns.
- The Gators outscored the Vols 10-6 after halftime, increasing their second-half advantage this year to 57-30.
- The Orange and Blue rushed for at least 100 yards as a team for the fourth straight contest.
- Sophomore cornerback Vernon Hargreaves III intercepted Worley on Tennessee's first drive of the second-half, marking his fourth career pick and his first this year.
- Freshman defensive backs Duke Dawson and Jalen Tabor made their first career starts.
- Tabor strip-sacked Tennessee quarterback Justin Worley in the third quarter and recovered the fumble.
- The play marked Tabor's first quarterback takedown and his first forced fumble as a Gator.
- Bryan Cox Jr. sacked Worley three times on the day, marking the first three-sack game by a Gator since Carlos Dunlap had three at Mississippi State on Oct. 24, 2009.
- Keanu Neal sealed the win for Florida with his team-leading third interception of the season.
- Junior running back Matt Jones scored a touchdown for the third time in four games this year.
- Jones rushed for 100+ yards in a game for the second time this season and the third time in his career.
- Quinton Dunbar caught a six-yard pass from Driskel in the second quarter, extending his streak of consecutive games with a reception to 32. Dunbar is second on Florida's all-time list, three games behind Ike Hilliard (35 games, 1994-97).

LAST FIVE MEETINGS

2013 | No. 10/11 LSU 17, No. 17/17 FLORIDA 6 (*Baton Rouge*) Quarterback Zach Mettenberger engineered a pair of long touchdown drives, tailback Jeremy Hill rushed for 121 yards and the LSU defense overwhelmed quarterback Tyler Murphy and the Florida offense in their Southeastern Conference showdown at "Death Valley." Fullback J.C. Copeland scored on a 1-yard run in the first quarter and wildcat quarterback Anthony Jennings added another 1-yarder in the second period. The Tigers also got a 31-yard field goal from Colby Delahoussaye in the fourth quarter. Florida managed two field goals from Frankie Velez. Velez was good on both his attempts, from 44 and 27 yards.

2012 | No. 10/11 FLORIDA 14, No. 4/3 LSU 6 (*Gainesville*) Mike Gillislee scored a pair of second-half touchdowns and Florida rallied for a 14-6 victory over LSU. LSU led early after a pair of field goals, but the Gators adjusted at halftime and marched 85 yards in eight plays and Gillislee scored from 12 yards out to give UF the lead. He scored again to cap a 77-yard drive to provide the final 14-6 margin of victory. Florida rushed for 176 yards in the game, led by Gillislee's 146 yards on a career-high 34 carries. His 34 carries were the most in a single game since Errict Rhett had 41 against Georgia in 1993. The win marked the first of three over top-10 ranked opponents in 2012.

2011 | No. 1/2 LSU 41, No. 17/18 FLORIDA 11 (*Baton Rouge*) The Florida football team fell to No. 1/2 LSU, 41-11, at Tiger Stadium. The early storyline surrounded the Gators entering the game with a true freshman at quarterback, with Jacoby Brissett making his first career start despite not having taken a snap prior to the game. As the game started, however, the Gators never got into a rhythm offensively, nor could they stop the LSU offense, as the Tigers pounced on Florida early and never looked back. Brissett finished 8-of-14 for 94 yards, the touchdown to Andre Debose and a pair of interceptions. Mike Gillislee led Florida in rushing with 56 yards on nine carries, while Chris Rainey had 52 yards on 13 rushes. The Gators surrendered 453 yards of total offense to LSU: 215 through the air on just 14 passing attempts and 238 yards on the ground.

2010 | No. 14/12 FLORIDA 29, No. 12/9 LSU 33 (*Gainesville*) The No. 14/12 Florida Gators fell to No. 12/9 LSU Tigers 33-29. Redshirt junior quarterback John Brantley threw for 154 yards and went 16-for-24 with one interception. Brantley connected with six different receivers. Leading Florida's receiving corps was redshirt senior wide receiver Carl Moore, who caught four receptions for 95 yards. It was redshirt freshman wide receiver Andre Debose who stepped up for Florida with five returns for 154 yards. Debose returned one 88-yards for a touchdown in the fourth quarter to start the Gator comeback. The Gators came up big on special teams when Debose took it home for Florida with an 88-yard kick return for a touchdown, the second freshman ever in Florida history to return a kick for a touchdown.

2009 | No. 1 FLORIDA 13, No. 4 LSU 3 (*Baton Rouge*) No. 1 Florida Gators took down the No. 4 LSU Tigers, 13-3, extending the nation's longest active 15-game win streak on the road. The Gators held the Tigers to just 162 yards total offense. Senior quarterback Tim Tebow completed 11-of-16 passes and threw one touchdown in the victory. Sophomore athlete Jeff Demps amassed 86 yards on 16 carries to lead Florida on the ground. Gator sophomore kicker Caleb Sturgis put the Florida on the board first on the Gators' first drive of the game, giving UF a 3-0 advantage in the first quarter. In the second quarter, a failed fourth-down conversion for the Gators and a series of Florida penalties allowed the Tigers to advance 77 yards downfield for a field goal, knotting the score at three-all. Florida responded with an 80-yard touchdown drive from Tebow to senior Riley Cooper, that brought the Gators ahead, 10-3. Sturgis put the only points of the second half on the board with a fourth quarter field goal that extended the lead, 13-3.

CROSSING PATHS

- LSU has five players on their roster from the state of Florida. UF has one player from Louisiana (DL Gerald Willis - New Orleans).
- UF head coach Will Muschamp worked at LSU for four seasons. In 2001 he served as the linebackers coach under head coach Nick Saban, then served as defensive coordinator and linebackers coach from 2002-04.
- Muschamp and defensive backs coach Travaris Robinson worked on the same staff at Auburn in 2006-07 as LSU's current tight ends coach Steve Ensminger. Muschamp was the defensive coordinator, Robinson a graduate assistant and Ensminger the tight ends coach.
- UF Director of Strength & Conditioning Jeff Dillman spent four seasons (2003-06) with the Tigers as an assistant strength & conditioning coach.

ON THIS DATE OCTOBER 11, 2008

No. 11 FLORIDA 51, No. 4 LSU 21 (*Gainesville, Fla.*)

Led by a stellar defense and an electrifying offensive charge, the Gators racked up 475 yards of offense, including 265 yards rushing against the Tigers. Junior wide receiver/running back Percy Harvin sparked the offensive charge for Florida, leading all receivers with 102 yards receiving after just the first quarter on his way to 112 total receiving yards, complimenting 13 yards rushing on the evening. Freshman Jeff Demps led all Florida rushers with 129 rushing yards, becoming the first true freshman to string together back-to-back 100-plus-yard rushing games since UF's Ernest Graham in 1999. Junior linebacker Brandon Spikes led a defensive force that only allowed 88 yards rushing from the LSU offense, while tacking on two interceptions for 55 yards, the first two of his career, one good for a touchdown.

- Offensive coordinator **KURT ROPER** is in his first year with the Gators after joining the UF staff in January following six seasons at Duke.
- Through Week 6, Florida's 33.0 points per game is tied for 29th in the nation and represents an increase of 11.9 points per game over UF's 2013 output.

- In its 36-30 triple-overtime win over Kentucky, UF had 230+ yards rushing and 275+ yards passing in an SEC game for the first time since Nov. 10, 2007 vs. South Carolina.
- Florida set a program record for total offense in two consecutive games during the season's first two contests:

- In its 65-0 win over EMU, Florida became the third SEC team since 1996 to rush for more than 250 yards (259) and pass for 395 or more (396) in the same game.
- Only four SEC schools scored 60 or more points in a game during the 2013 season, and UF is one of five conference members to crack the 60-point mark so far in 2014.
- Florida holds the nation's longest streak without being shut out, at 326 games.
 - UF's last shutout loss came on Oct. 29, 1988, a 16-0 defeat vs. Auburn.
- Against Eastern Michigan, the Gators' 655 total yards set a Muschamp-era record and ranked ninth all-time in Florida annals (fifth since 2001).
- Against Kentucky, UF had a 200-yard receiver (**DEMARCUS ROBINSON** - 216) and a 100-yard rusher (**MATT JONES** - 156) in a game for the fourth time in school history.
- AHMAD FULWOOD** and **TRIP THURMAN** made their first career starts in the season opener against Eastern Michigan.
- RODERICK JOHNSON** started for the first time in the Kentucky game.
- UF scored in 32 of 48 (67%) quarters in 2013, with a TD in 23 of 48 (48%) quarters.
- So far in 2014, the Orange and Blue have scored in nine of 16 regulation quarters (56%), with 16 additional points in overtime against Kentucky.
 - Florida scored at least 13 points in each quarter of the EMU game.
- This year, UF holds a 85-54 advantage in the second half.
 - The Orange and Blue outscored EMU 35-0, UK 33-27 and UT 10-6 after halftime.
- Through three games this year, the Gators lead their opponents 47-27 in the first half.
- UF had nine quarters in 2013 where it held the ball for 10-plus minutes.
 - The Gators had 27 drives of 10+ plays and 25 drives over five minutes long.
- Against Eastern Michigan, no Gator drive lasted longer than 6:31, and 12 of UF's 16 possessions took three minutes or less.
 - Five drives in the season opener had 10+ plays.
- UF's longest timed drive in its SEC opener against Kentucky took 5:09, and nine of its 13 regulation possessions lasted less than three minutes.
- The longest drive for the Orange and Blue at Tennessee lasted 3:47.
- Florida has allowed just six sacks in its last seven games dating back to 2013.
 - Before the Tennessee game, UF had give up just three sacks in its last six games.
- The Gators had 10 explosive plays vs. EMU, 9 vs. Kentucky, 4 vs. Alabama and 6 vs. Tennessee.

OFFENSIVE LINE

- UF's offensive line is in its first season under position coach **MIKE SUMMERS**, who has 34 years of coaching experience.
- Eleven players saw action on the line against Eastern Michigan, with an eight-man rotation against both Kentucky and Alabama and a six-man line group at Tennessee.
- Florida has allowed just five sacks through four games, with none allowed to either Eastern Michigan or Alabama.
- UF returned five student-athletes with starting experience: Max Garcia, Trenton Brown, Chaz Green, Tyler Moore and D.J. Humphries.
- Senior **CHAZ GREEN** returned to the line against Eastern Michigan after missing the 2013 season due to injury. He was sidelined against Kentucky with another injury. Green has started 22 games and appeared in 23 in his career. In addition, Green was named to the 2011 All-SEC freshman team.
- Redshirt senior **MAX GARCIA** competed in his first season as a Gator a year ago after sitting out the 2012 season due to NCAA transfer rules when he came from Maryland. He started all 12 games, playing mostly left guard and left tackle. Garcia moved to center before the 2014 season, making his debut at the position against Eastern Michigan.
- Senior **TRENTON BROWN** started the first two games of 2014 at right guard. He played in all 12 games and started the final five contests at right tackle for the Gators in 2013. Brown began last season on the field goal unit and as a reserve at tackle but took over the starting job against Georgia when Tyler Moore was lost for the year due to injury.
- Junior **TYLER MOORE** entered the 2013 season playing right guard but moved to right tackle due to injuries. Moore played in seven games and made six starts, five at right tackle and one at left tackle. He suffered a season-ending injury prior to the Vanderbilt game and missed the last four games. He returned against EMU and also played vs. UK before earning his first start of 2014 at Alabama.
- Redshirt junior **TRIP THURMAN** made his first career start in the season opener, playing left guard. He also started at that spot in the SEC opener and at Tennessee and appeared at Alabama. Thurman had played in 16 games during his first three seasons.
- Junior **D.J. HUMPHRIES** came back from a knee injury against EMU before he missed the UK and Alabama games. He returned to the starting lineup at Tennessee. Humphries played in seven games in 2013, starting the first six at left tackle, before the injury ended his season. In 2012, Humphries appeared in all 12 games, starting three and was named SEC Coaches' All-Freshman (OL) and *Sporting News* Freshman All-America.
- Redshirt freshman **RODERICK JOHNSON** made his first career start against Kentucky and also opened at right tackle at Alabama.
- The offensive line has paved the way for the third-highest yards per carry since 2008 among teams that have been SEC members for that entire span.

RUSHING

- Through four games in 2014, Florida is averaging 189.8 yards per contest on the ground, rushing for over 200 against Eastern Michigan (259) and Kentucky (237).
- Florida averaged 145.8 rushing yards per game in 2013, with four games over 200 yards.
- Under Muschamp, UF has rushed for 200 or more yards 14 times.
- In the season opener against EMU, Florida rushed for 259 yards and four scores.
- In its first SEC game against UK, UF had 251 rushing yards on 50 carries with 1 TD.
- The Gators rushed for 107 yards against Alabama, becoming the second team to rush for 100+ yards vs. the Tide in its last nine games.
- Florida gained 156 yards on the ground at Tennessee.
- The Gators had 49 runs of 10-plus yards (4.1 per game) last year, totaling 776 yards. In 2012, UF had 90 runs of 10-plus yards (6.9 per game).
- So far in 2014, Florida has 21 double-digit runs (5.25 per game) for 393 yards.
- UF had eight double-digit runs for 182 total yards against EMU, four for 67 against Kentucky, three for 43 at Alabama and six for 101 at Tennessee.
- Four Gator running backs averaged more than 8.0 yards per carry against Eastern Michigan: **MATT JONES**, **KELVIN TAYLOR**, **MACK BROWN** and **BRANDON POWELL**.
- Three Gators (Jones, Taylor, Brown) rushed for 60+ yards against Eastern Michigan.
- Both Jones (5.4) and Taylor (4.3) averaged more than four yards per attempt against Kentucky.
- Jones (5.0) and **TREON HARRIS** (6.0) both had a clip of 5+ yards per carry at Tennessee.
- The junior rushed for 156 yards against Kentucky, marking his second career 100-yard game.
- Jones crossed the century mark for the third time with 114 yards at Tennessee.
- Jones suffered a season-ending knee injury in 2013 against LSU and finished his 2013 season with 339 yards on 79 carries (4.3 avg.) and two touchdowns. He also had 5 catches for 25 yards.
- Jones had 176 yards rushing at Kentucky last year, the most by a Gator running back since Ciattrick Fason had 210 vs. Kentucky in 2004. His 176 yards rushing on the road was the most since Fason ran for 190 at South Carolina in 2003 and is the eighth best all-time by a Gator in a road game.
- Quarterback **JEFF DRISKEL** paced the squad in Week 4 at Alabama with 59 rushing yards on 11 carries (5.4 yards per rush).
- Sophomore **KELVIN TAYLOR** finished second on the team a season ago with 508 yards on 111 carries (4.6 avg.) with four touchdowns. He led the team in rushing in five of the last six games totaling 410 yards over that span with all four of his scores coming in those games. 105 of Taylor's 111 carries came in the final seven games of the season.
- Brown led the team in 2013 with 543 yards on 148 carries (3.7 avg.) and had four touchdowns. He had his first career start against Toledo and had a career day, rushing for 112 yards on 25 carries and scoring two touchdowns, all career highs. He also led the team in rushing against Tennessee (24 carries, 86 yards) and at LSU (15 carries, 56 yards).

PASSING

- Florida has a 54.8 completion percentage and a 111.8 QB rating through four games, compared to a 64.0 connection clip and a 125.27 rating in 2013.
 - The Gators recorded back-to-back games with 3+ touchdown passes (Eastern Michigan and Kentucky) for the first time since November 2009 against FIU and Florida State.
 - Redshirt junior quarterback **JEFF DRISKEL** is 15-4 as the Gators' starter. All four losses have come away from The Swamp, with three of them coming to ranked opponents (#3 Alabama in 2014, #12 Georgia and #22 Louisville in 2012). He suffered a fractured fibula against Tennessee in 2013 and missed the rest of the year.
 - Driskel threw for a career-high 295 yards against Kentucky, completing 18-of-23 passes for 179 yards with three touchdowns and no interceptions after halftime.
 - Against Eastern Michigan, the Oviedo native completed a career high 31 passes.
 - A 12-game starter in 2012, Driskel completed 156-of-245 passes for 1,646 yards with 12 touchdowns and five interceptions. He rushed 118 times for 408 yards with three scores.
 - **TREON HARRIS** battled for the backup QB role in fall camp and earned the No. 2 spot entering Week 1. Both of his passes against Eastern Michigan were touchdowns.
 - The Miami native later led the Gators to a nine-point comeback win at Tennessee, engineering two scoring drives in the fourth quarter.
 - Harris had two scoring passes against EMU, for 70 and 78 yards.
 - o Florida is one of 22 schools in the country with multiple passing plays of 70+ yards.
 - o The Gators are one of four SEC teams with two passing plays of 70+ yards; however, the other three squads each have played five or more games:

- Florida's 33 completions against Eastern Michigan were spread amongst 11 receivers; seven receivers caught at least one of Driskel's 25 completions against Kentucky, while six Gators had a catch at Alabama and seven hauled in a pass at Tennessee.
 - **DEMARCUS ROBINSON** had 216 receiving yards and two touchdowns against Kentucky; he is the first Gator since 2002 to cross the 200-yard mark, and recorded his first multi-score game.
 - o Robinson's 216 yards rank fourth in a game in school history and second in SEC play.
 - o The Fort Valley, Ga., native posted the second-highest yardage total ever at The Swamp (222, Travis McGriff vs. South Carolina, 1998).
 - Robinson's 15 catches against UK tied the UF record (Carlos Alvarez vs. Miami, Fla., 1969).
 - The sophomore ranks 12th nationally and third in the SEC with 6.5 catches per game:

 - **QUINTON DUNBAR** has caught a pass in 32-straight games, dating back to the 2011 Furman game. During that span, he has 91 catches for 1,142 yards and six touchdowns. His streak ranks third in school history and is four shy of the all-time Gator mark.
 - Dunbar led the team in receiving yards last year twice (Georgia-91, Vanderbilt-77) and led the team in catches six times (Miami-7, Tennessee-4, LSU-3, Georgia-4, Vanderbilt-6, South Carolina-3). Against Georgia, Dunbar had a career-long 83-yard reception.
 - **AHMAD FULWOOD** had 16 of his 17 catches in the last 7 games of 2013. He totaled 127 yards.
 - Fulwood's 17 receptions were the most by a true freshman wide receiver at Florida since Percy Harvin had 34 catches in 2006.
 - Sixth-year senior **ANDRE DEBOSE** looks to bounce back after he missed the 2013 season with a torn ACL. He has 29 career receptions for 543 yards and four touchdowns, along with a school-record four scores on kick returns.
 - Against the Tide, **VALDEZ SHOWERS** scored his second career TD on a 28-yard catch.
 - Tight ends will play a larger role under Roper after the position group accounted for just four catches in 2013. **CLAY BURTON** had seven receptions in the opener against EMU, just two shy of the UF single-game record for catches by a tight end.
 - o Burton's seven catches also mark the country's third-best single-game total by a tight end this season (Jonnu Smith, FIU, 9 catches on Sept. 6 lead country).
 - Burton also led Florida with three catches at Alabama.
 - **TEVIN WESTBROOK**'s TD against Kentucky was the first by a Gator tight end since Jordan Reed vs. South Carolina on Oct. 20, 2012.

FLORIDA'S DEFENSE

- UF is one of three schools to rank in the top 10 nationally in total defense each of the past three years (Alabama & Florida State).
- The UF red zone TD defense ranks ninth in the nation at 36.3 percent (4-of-11).
- Opponents haven't scored touchdowns in the last five trips to the red zone.
- Tennessee ran eight plays against UF in the red zone for -11 yards, attempting seven passes and one rush. Of those eight plays, zero went for positive yardage and the Gators recorded a sack and an interception.
- This season, Florida has allowed only four red zone touchdowns, which is tied for the second fewest total in the SEC.
- Freshmen **DUKE DAWSON** and **JALEN TABOR** started their first career games at Tennessee. The last true freshman to start in the UF secondary was **VERNON HARGREAVES III** on Sept. 21, 2013 against Tennessee.
- The Gators forced three turnovers (2 INT, 1 FR) at Tennessee. It marked the fourth-straight game the UF defense forced at least three turnovers.
- Florida forced five turnovers (1 INT, 4 FR) vs. Eastern Michigan, which was the most turnovers forced since Sept. 21, 2013 vs. Tennessee when the Gators forced six turnovers (4 INT, 2 FR).
- UF has forced 15 turnovers through its first four games (7 INT, 8 FR). It is the most turnovers by a UF defense through its first four games since the 1996 season when the Gators forced 15 turnovers (9 INT, 6 FR).

- The UF defense has averaged 6.25 3-and-outs per game, the fourth best mark in the nation.

PASS DEFENSE

- Dating back to 1996, SEC opponents have averaged under 200 yards passing per game (198.1) against Florida, sixth-best in the nation.
- The Gators' six sacks at Tennessee were the most sacks in a game since Florida had six sacks against Ohio State in the TaxSlayer.com Gator Bowl on Jan. 2, 2012.
- Redshirt sophomore **BRYAN COX, JR.** became the first Gator to record three sacks in a game since Carlos Dunlap accomplished the feat at Mississippi State on Oct. 24, 2009.
- Cox's three sacks against UT were the most sacks in a single game by an SEC defender this season.
- The Gators 14 pass breakups against UK are the most in a single game during the Will Muschamp era.
- Tennessee attempted 39 passes, and completed 26, for 205 yards. The Vols averaged 5.2 yards per attempt and 7.8 yards per completion.
- Florida ranks tied for 12th in the country averaging 1.75 interceptions per game.
- Florida ranks tied for fourth in the country averaging 7.00 passes defended a game, also ranking second in the SEC.
- Since the start of the 2012 season, Florida's 24 passing touchdowns allowed is the fewest in the nation, and opposing quarterbacks total a rating of 105.5, which is the third lowest.
- Freshman **DUKE DAWSON** became the first Florida true freshman to return an interception for a touchdown in his first-career game when he had a 36-yard pick-six vs. EMU. The last time a true freshman returned a pick for a score was De'Ante Saunders vs. Furman on Nov. 19, 2011.
- Dawson became the second true freshman in as many years at UF to notch an interception in his first collegiate game, joining **VERNON HARGREAVES III**, who had an interception last year against Toledo (8/31/13).
- The Gators lead the nation in interception touchdown returns and interception return yards since the start of the 2008 season and are third in interceptions:

- Sophomore **VERNON HARGREAVES III** had four pass breakups against UK, eclipsing his single-game high of three set on Sept. 21, 2012, vs. Tennessee.
- Hargreaves ranks 11th in the country and first in the SEC averaging 1.75 passes defended per game, while leading the conference in passes broken up with six.
- Hargreaves intercepted his first pass of the season off of Tennessee's Justin Worley.
- Sophomore **KEANU NEAL** ranks second in the SEC with three interceptions, while ranking second in the SEC and tied for fifth in the nation in interceptions per game (0.75).
- Neal intercepted his third pass of the season against the Vols. Against Kentucky, he recorded the first two interceptions of his career.
- Neal became the first Gator to record a two-interception game since Ahmad Black vs. Penn State on Jan. 2, 2011, in the Outback Bowl.
- Junior **DANTE FOWLER, JR.** had one sack, four quarterback hurries and a forced fumble vs. UK.
- Junior **BRIAN POOLE** notched his first interception of the season, and the third of his career, returning it 30 yards, against Kentucky.
- Neal and Poole rank tied for fourth in the SEC with 1.25 passes defended per game.
- The Gators rank fourth in the SEC averaging 3.0 sacks per game.
- Against Tennessee, the defense tallied six sacks. In three seasons at Texas, Muschamp's defense averaged 3.05 sacks, 3.97 quarterback hurries and 1.33 forced fumbles in 39 games.

RUSH DEFENSE

- Since 1996, SEC opponents have averaged 3.3 yards per carry against the Gators.
- The Gators have allowed just one rushing touchdown this season, tied for the fewest total in the nation.
- Florida ranks ninth in the country and second in the SEC holding opponents to 2.78 yards per rush.
- The Gators rank sixth in the nation and second in the SEC in rushing yards allowed (412).
- UF boasts the 15th-ranked rush defense, allowing 103 yards per game.
- Florida's defense averages 8.25 tackles-for-loss per game, which ranks sixth in the nation and third in the SEC.
- In the win at Tennessee, UF limited the Vols to 28 yards rushing, marking the first time in 12 games that the Gators held an opponent to less than 50 yards on the ground. (Last: 48 yards vs. Kentucky, Sept. 28, 2013).
- Florida's long rush allowed at Tennessee was 11 yards.
- Florida has allowed 11 runs of 10-plus yards this year, a total that ranks third-best in the nation.
- In the Muschamp era, the Gators have held opponents to under 100 yards rushing 15 times.
- The Gators have allowed less than 100 yards rushing in three of their four games this year (EMU, 80 yds; UK, 81 yds; UT, 28 yds).
- Of UT's 29 rushing attempts, the Gators held the Vols to one yard or less eight times (27.5 percent).
- UF totaled eight tackles-for-loss against Alabama.
- Sophomore **KEANU NEAL** notched a career-high 10 tackles against Alabama, including a forced fumble and a 49-yard fumble return for a score.
- Junior linebacker **ANTONIO MORRISON** totaled 11 tackles at Tennessee - it was his third-straight game with at least 10 tackles (10 at UA; 10 vs. UK). He ranks seventh in the SEC in tackles per game (8.0).
- Morrison's streak of three consecutive games with 10-plus tackles is the longest streak of his career. Prior to this season, he had never posted double-digit tackles in back-to-back games.
- Junior **DANTE FOWLER, JR.** had two tackles-for-loss and a sack against Kentucky. He has recorded multiple tackles-for-loss five times during his career.
- Fowler enters Saturday's game vs. LSU with 99 career tackles.
- Against Alabama, sophomore safety **KEANU NEAL** returned a fumble 49 yards for a touchdown. It was the sixth-longest fumble return for a touchdown in school history, and the longest fumble return for a score since Keiwan Ratliff had a 77-yard fumble return for a touchdown against FSU in 2003.
- Neal's fumble return for a touchdown was the first fumble return for a touchdown since 2011 when Jaye Howard had a two-yard return against Kentucky.

FLORIDA'S SPECIAL TEAMS

PUNTING

- 10 of senior **KYLE CHRISTY'S** 24 punts this season have soared for 50 yards or more, including three of 60+ yards.
- Five of Christy's eight total punts at Tennessee pinned the Vols inside the 20-yard line.
- Christy ranks 12th in the nation with a 45.3 yards per punt average.
- His 52.7 yards per punt at Alabama is the third best single game average in UF history. Christy holds the record of 54.3, set in 2012 vs. South Carolina.
- Christy's 66-yd punt against Alabama falls just 1 yard shy of his career-long 67-yarder which occurred in his first career appearance as a Gator at Auburn on Oct. 15, 2011.
- Christy recorded 3 punts for a total of 145 yards in the 2014 season opener against the Eastern Michigan Eagles, sending one 60 yards and averaging 48.3 yards per punt.
- His 43.8 career yardage average across 141 punts places him second on UF's all-time list behind Ray Criswell who recorded a 44.4 yard average during his career between 1982 and 1985.
- Florida ranks fourth in the SEC and 14th in the nation in net punt (41.0 net yards).
- The Gators are averaging 45.3 yards per punt this season, with 8 fair caught, 12 inside of the 20-yard line and 10 of 50-plus yards.

KICKING

- **AUSTIN HARDIN** kicked a career-high 49-yard game-winning field goal at Tennessee to help the Gators to a 10-9 victory in Knoxville.
- Hardin is the 10th Gator in UF history to notch a game-winning kick (see chart).
- His 49-yarder ranks third in the SEC in longest field goal made this season.
- **FRANKIE VELEZ** is 6-for-7 on field goal attempts this season.
- Velez nailed his first career OT field goal attempt, a 20-yarder vs. Kentucky, forcing a third OT and helping the Gators to a 36-30 victory.
- Florida scored on its opening drive of the season for the second straight year, when Velez converted a 33-yard field goal against EMU.
- Velez was a perfect 3-for-3 on field goal attempts vs. the Eagles, going 1-for-1 from 20-29 yards and 2-for-2 from the 30-39 yard range. His 36-yard field goal was 8 yards shy of tying his career-long.
- Florida's 17 pts. scored kicking vs. EMU (3FG, 8PAT) is tops in the SEC through Week 6.
- Velez is 14-for-14 on point after touchdown kicks through four games played in 2014.
- The Ocala native and former walk-on kicker who was awarded a scholarship this season made his collegiate debut at LSU in 2013 and converted field-goal attempts from 44 yards and 27 yards. The 44-yarder opened the scoring and was the longest successful kick by the Gators last season.

RETURN GAME

- **ANDRE DEBOSE** has recorded 14 total returns for 312 yards across the first four games of the 2014 season.
- He ranks second in the SEC and sixth in the nation in punt return average with 19.4 yards per return.
- The redshirt senior recorded four kick returns for 86 yards in Florida's 10-9 victory at Tennessee and two kick returns for 78 yards in the Gators' triple overtime win over Kentucky.
- Debose led the return effort against Eastern Michigan with four punt returns for 97 yards (second most in a game by a returner in the SEC this season) including a career-long 55-yard punt return.
- Debose holds the Florida career record for kick return touchdowns with 4, which is tied for the SEC record with Willie Gault (Tenn.), Felix Jones (Ark.) and Brandon Boykin (UGA). He owns the Florida season record in the same category with 2.
- The Gators are second in the SEC in punt return avg. (19.6) behind Auburn.
- UF's 7 kick returns for scores since 2009 is tied for the 5th-best total in the nation and the Gators' 6 KOR in the last 4 years is tied for 6th-best.
- Florida has returned either a kickoff or punt for a touchdown for 9-straight seasons dating back to 2005, with 10 total punt return touchdowns during that span (including blocked punts). The Gators have also returned a kickoff for a touchdown for 5 seasons in a row, totaling 7 kickoff return touchdowns since 2009.

COVERAGE UNITS

- The Gators limited Tennessee to six yards on three punt returns and held Eastern Michigan to one yard on a single punt return.
- On average, Florida is holding its opponent to 5.38 punt return yards in 2014.
- In 2013, the Gators allowed just 16.4 yards per kickoff return, the third-best coverage unit in the nation and tops in the SEC.
- In addition, it was UF's best coverage since allowing just 15.2 yards per return in 2001.
- In 2013, Florida's punt coverage allowed 3.8 yards per return, its best figure since allowing 3.7 in 2006.
- Last season, the Gators' punt coverage ranked 13th in the nation and second in the SEC.

BLOCKED KICKS

- Florida has blocked 13 kicks in Will Muschamp's 38 games as a head coach, including 6 in 2012 (4 FG, 1 extra point, 1 punt).

GATORS AND THE POLLS

- After not finishing in the final poll for two seasons (2010, 11), the Gators finished 2012 ranked No. 9 in the AP poll and No. 10 in the USA Today/Coaches Poll, marking the 17th time in school history that UF has finished in the top 10. Since 1990, Florida has finished in the AP Top 25 in 21 of 23 years, including 14 times in the top 10.
- From 2006-12, the Gators finished in the top 10 of the final poll four times, tied with LSU for the second-most in the SEC behind Alabama's five top-10 finishes.

- Since 1990, Florida has outscored its opponents by a combined 6,037 to 2,390 at home, putting the average outcome at 38.9 to 15.4 in favor of the Gators and making the average outcome a 23.5-point win.
- The Gators had two significant winning streaks at The Swamp in the 1990s: a 23-game streak from 1990-93 and a 30-game streak from 1994-99. In 152 home games from 1990-2013, UF has scored 31 or more points 100 times and held its opponent to 14 or less points 86 times.
- With a 7-0 performance in The Swamp in 2012, the Gators matched the 2006 and 2009 squads in finishing with the most wins at home in a season.

IN THE STANDS

- In 2013, the Gators sold out all season tickets for the 34th-consecutive season after averaging 87,597 fans during the 2012 season.
- Florida broke its single-game attendance record in 2009, drawing 90,907 to The Swamp for the Nov. 28 showdown against Florida State. It marked the largest crowd ever to watch a football game in the state of Florida. The state has hosted 14 Super Bowls, three BCS national title games and has featured 18 bowl games that included a team that went on to win at least a share of the national title.
- The crowd of 90,888 for the UF-Alabama game on Oct. 1, 2011, was the second-highest single-game total in school history and the most since 90,885 watched the Orange and Blue face South Carolina on Nov. 13, 2010.
- The Gators have ranked among the nation's top-15 schools in average home attendance in each of the last 32 years (1982-2013) and have ranked among the top 10 in each of the last 23 years (1991-2013).
- In addition, UF set a school attendance record during the 2009 season, averaging 90,635 per game, which ranked ninth in the nation. That broke the previous standard, set in 2008 when the Gators averaged 90,544.
- The largest crowd for a home opener at The Swamp was 90,707 in UF's 2005 win over Wyoming in Urban Meyer's first game as head coach of the Gators. The 2009 opener (90,621) was the second-largest.

PRO FOOTBALL HALL OF FAME

The University of Florida is the only school in the Southeastern Conference to have two inductees into the NFL Hall of Fame since 2001. Former Gator running back Emmitt Smith was inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame in Canton, Ohio, on Aug. 7, 2010, following Gator great Jack Youngblood into the elite fraternity.

A three-time All-American at UF from 1987-89. He set 58 school records in three seasons, including a career rushing mark of 3,928. Following his junior season with the Gators, Smith was a first-round selection in the 1990 NFL Draft by the Dallas Cowboys. He finished his career with 18,355 rushing yards and 164 rushing TD, both of which are NFL records. He was named honorary captain for the 2011 UF vs. Tennessee game.

Youngblood, regarded as the best defensive end in UF history, became the first Gator enshrined in the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 2001. He was named to the All-SEC team of the decade for the 1970s and was the Most Outstanding Player at the 1971 Senior Bowl. He went on to be a five-time All-Pro player for the L.A. Rams. Youngblood appeared in a Rams' record 201 consecutive games and only missed one game in his 14 seasons, that one coming in his final season in 1984.

UF'S LEGENDARY STATUS

NATION'S ELITE

- No other school has captured a national title while facing the nation's toughest schedule. According to NCAA statistics, Florida has done so twice, in 1996 and 2006, and also won the 2008 title facing the second-toughest schedule in the country.
- UF is one of two schools (Arkansas) to face a top-10 strength of schedule five times from 2006-12.
- Florida is one of three schools in the nation to win three outright national titles since 1990. The 2006 and 2008 national championships were decided in the BCS National Championship Game, and Florida was the unanimous pick in all four major polls in 1996. Alabama (1992, 2009, 2011, 2012), Florida State (1993, 1999, 2013) and Nebraska (1994, 1995, 1997) have also won more than two national titles in that time frame, but the Huskers' 1997 title was split with Michigan.
- Florida is one of only two schools in the nation with three quarterbacks to win the Heisman Trophy and one of two schools nationally to have multiple Heisman winners since 1996.
- Florida is the only school in the nation to post 100 wins during each of the last two decades. UF won 102 games in the 1990s and 100 games in the 2000s. UF is one of only three schools in NCAA history to win 100 or more games in two different decades.
- The Gators won at least nine games for a period of 12-consecutive years (1990-2001), something only three schools in major college history have done and no other SEC school has done.
- Florida became one of six schools in major college history to win 100 games during a decade, producing a 102-22-1 record in the 1990s. UF again reached that benchmark in the 2000s, going 100-30.
- UF is the only school in modern major college history to score 500 or more points for a period of four-straight years (1993-96).
- Florida is one of two schools to have a player selected in the first round of the NFL Draft for nine-consecutive years, with a Gator being tabbed each year from 1983-91 (Miami, 14 years, 1995-2008).
- UF is one of only four schools in the nation to have multiple recipients of the William V. Campbell Trophy (formerly the Draddy Trophy), which is presented by the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame to the nation's top football scholar-athlete. (Brad Culpepper, '91; Danny Wuerffel, '96; Tim Tebow, '09)
- UF is the only school in the nation to have a Heisman Trophy recipient who also received the Campbell Trophy. Wuerffel accomplished both in 1996, while Tebow earned the Heisman in 2007 and the Campbell in 2009.

SEC ELITE

- Florida is one of two SEC schools to have three Heisman Trophy winners: Steve Spurrier (1966), Danny Wuerffel (1996) and Tim Tebow (2007).
- UF is one of two SEC schools to win at least 10 games for a period of six-consecutive years (1993-98), something only four schools in major college history have done.
- The Gators are the only SEC team to rank in the top 15 of the final polls for 12-straight years, and only four have done it in major college football history.
- The Gators have the best league record over a 100-SEC-game span, going 87-13 in SEC play from the beginning of the 1990 season through the seventh conference game of 2001.
- Florida is only one of two schools in SEC history to claim four league championships in a row (1993-96). Florida has played in 10 of the 21 SEC Championship Games that have been held, winning seven.

GATORS IN THE PROS

- Florida had 33 players on 2014 NFL opening day rosters, fifth-most among all schools. UF's 7 NFL receivers were tied for the most and its 3 centers were the most from any school.
- Since 1998, Florida has had at least 29 players on opening day NFL rosters each year.
- During the 2013 NFL season, UF had 37 players appear on active rosters, totaling 193 starts and 341 games played.
- Thirty-three former Gators were on NFL teams' Week 4 rosters; in addition, three UF alumni are on injured reserve, two are on teams' practice squads and one is on a reserve/suspended list.
 - Florida has produced seven current NFL wide receivers and three active centers; both totals are tied for the lead among college teams.
- Florida has seen 20 former players go on to appear in the NFL's Pro Bowl. Of those, 13 made multiple appearances in the all-star showcase.
- A Gator has earned a Pro Bowl berth in 34 of the past 38 NFL seasons, including 14 of the past 15 and a streak of 11-consecutive Pro Bowls from 1986-96.
- At least one former UF player has appeared in the Super Bowl 28 times. Four Gators have appeared in the big game on two occasions (Super Bowls XXX and XLI).
- Fourteen former Gators have combined to win 21 Super Bowl rings. Don Chandler, Wilber Marshall and Max Starks have each won two, and Emmitt Smith and Godfrey Miles each claimed three.
- Florida is one of two schools (Pittsburgh) that has two players, Emmitt Smith and Fred Taylor, on the top-15 list of the NFL's all-time top rushers.
- Percy Harvin earned Offensive Rookie of the Year for his performance with the Minnesota Vikings in 2009. He then led the team in all major receiving and kickoff return categories in 2010.

HEAD COACH WILL MUSCHAMP



Muschamp, 43, came to UF after being the coach-in-waiting and defensive coordinator at the University of Texas since November 2008. He brought 16 years of coaching experience with him, including 12 years in the SEC, eight as a coach and four as a player at the University of Georgia. Muschamp also served as defensive coordinator at Auburn Uni-

versity (2006-07) and LSU (2002-04; he was LSU's linebackers coach in 2001) and was a finalist for the 2007 Broyles Award as the nation's top assistant coach.

Muschamp also brought a wealth of big-game experience. Prior to arriving at Florida, he coached in two national championship games, winning the ultimate prize in 2003 as the defensive coordinator at LSU, and coached in a third BCS bowl game following the 2008 season, when Texas won the Fiesta Bowl. In addition to his national championship past, Muschamp has coached in the SEC Championship Game twice and in the Big 12 Championship Game once, coming out on the winning side in each of those three contests.

After a 7-6 record in his first season at Florida, Muschamp led the Gators to one of the nation's top turnarounds in year two, finishing 11-2 and playing in a BCS bowl game. Florida improved from a 6-6 regular season in 2011 to an 11-1 regular season in 2012, which marked the biggest one-year leap for the program in 32 years (0-10-1 in 1979, 7-4 regular season in 1980). In addition, the Gators finished 7-1 in the SEC East, tying for the division crown, a year after posting a 3-5 record in the conference. Florida defeated three top-10 opponents for just the second time in school history. Muschamp was named the SEC Coach of the Year by the league's coaches as well as CBSsports.com.

The Gators finished No. 3 in the final regular-season BCS standings in 2012, the third-highest finish in school history, and ranked in the top 10 in both the final Associated Press and USA Today/Coaches' Poll. UF won 11 games for the sixth time in school history, won four of five games against the final BCS top-12 teams and beat seven bowl-eligible teams against the toughest schedule in the nation according to the NCAA.

In his first three seasons at UF, the formula for the Gators' success was to take care of the football, control both lines of scrimmage, finish games, have outstanding special teams and a physical defense. The Florida defense continued to be one of the nation's best in 2012, ranking fifth nationally in scoring defense (14.5 points per game) and total defense (287.5 yards per game). UF's rush defense improved dramatically from year one under Muschamp, limiting opponents to just 94.9 rushing yards per game after allowing 132.7 yards per game in 2011. The secondary also shut down the opposition, ranking as the nation's No. 2 pass efficiency defense (95.55) and allowing just seven touchdown passes, the second-fewest in the nation.

A year after being outscored 86-59 in the fourth quarter, UF posted a 128-32 edge in the final quarter in 2012. That led to a 5-1 record in games decided by one score or less and matched a school-record eight come-from-behind wins. UF improved from -12 in turnover margin to +15 and ranked seventh nationally. Punter Kyle Christy set a school record for average yards per punt, placekicker Caleb Sturgis finished his career as Florida's leader in career field goals made and the special teams unit blocked six kicks in the last eight games.

Muschamp's first season in Gainesville produced the school's 24th-consecutive winning season and its 32nd-consecutive season of .500 football or better, the longest streaks in the nation. With the victory over Ohio State in the TaxSlayer.com Gator Bowl, UF established a school record with its fourth-straight bowl win. Muschamp's first squad will go down as one of the youngest in school history: 15 true freshmen and 52 underclassmen saw action — the second most in school history.

Despite returning 37 combined starts on the defensive side of the ball, the fewest in the SEC, Muschamp's defense ranked second in the nation in third down conversion defense (.273) — the best national ranking

in school history. Florida allowed just 166.8 yards per game passing to rank seventh nationally and permitted just 299.5 yards per game to rank eighth nationally.

In his five seasons as an SEC defensive coordinator, Muschamp's defenses ranked among the nation's top 10 in total defense every single year, while always maintaining a top-15 rating in scoring defense, including three times inside the top 10.

In four of his eight seasons overall as a Division I defensive coordinator, his teams allowed less than 100 rushing yards per game and twice led the nation in rushing defense while yielding less than 75 rushing yards per game. His 2003 LSU defense led the country by allowing 67 yards per game on the ground, the best mark by an SEC team in the 2000s, while Texas gave up just 73.1 yards on the ground in 2009 to lead the nation.

From 2008-10 under Muschamp's guidance, the Texas defense ranked No. 1 in the nation with 119 sacks for 949 yards lost. His unit also ranked in the top-10 nationally during the same time frame in several other major categories, allowing 2.9 yards per rushing attempt (third), 96.7 rushing yards per game (fourth), 297.4 yards per game (seventh), all of which are Big 12 bests during that span.

In 2009, the Texas Longhorns advanced to the BCS National Championship Game as Muschamp's defense gave up just 73.1 rushing yards per game, the best figure by any BCS school from 2008-10. The Longhorns also led the nation in 2009 in third-down defense (26.5 percent), turnovers created (37, tied with Ohio University) and interceptions (25) as Texas claimed the Big 12 championship in 2009.

Under Muschamp's tutelage at Texas, Brian Orakpo claimed the 2008 Rotary Lombardi Award (lineman of the year), Bronko Nagurski Trophy (most outstanding defensive player) and Ted Hendricks Award (top defensive end), while the Longhorns' defense saw Sergio Kindle become the first player in college football history to be named a finalist for both the Butkus Award (nation's top linebacker) and the Hendricks Award (nation's top defensive end). Earl Thomas also earned finalist honors for the Jim Thorpe Award in 2009.

In the 2009 and 2010 NFL Drafts, Muschamp had a combined 10 players drafted, including nine in the first four rounds and two first-rounders in Orakpo and Thomas.

As the defensive coordinator at Auburn from 2006-07, Muschamp's defense ranked third in the nation in scoring defense (15.4 points per game) and fourth in the nation in pass defense (170.7 pass yards per game). During the same time frame, Auburn ranked third in the SEC in total defense by holding opponents to 295.1 yards per game.

Muschamp's first full-time coaching experience in the SEC came at LSU as the linebackers coach for the 2001 season before being elevated to defensive coordinator from 2002-04. His 2003 defense helped the Tigers to the national championship by leading the nation both in scoring defense (11.0 points per game) and total defense (252.0 yards per game), while finishing second nationally in pass efficiency defense (89.8) and third in rushing defense (67.0 yards per game). The Tigers allowed just 19 touchdowns all season in 2003, three less than the next closest competitor nationally.

Between his positions at LSU and Auburn, Muschamp spent a season with the NFL's Miami Dolphins in 2005 as Assistant Head Coach for Defense. He helped the Dolphins finish second in the league with 49 sacks, while leading Miami to top-10 rankings in yards per play (4.7, seventh), yards per rush (3.7, seventh) and yards per pass (6.0, ninth).

The 1994 graduate of Georgia moved immediately into coaching following his collegiate playing career, working as a graduate assistant at Auburn from 1995-96, earning his master's degree in 1996. He became a secondary coach at West Georgia (1998) and Eastern Kentucky (1999) before moving on to his first defensive coordinator position at Valdosta State for the 2000 season.

In his playing career at Georgia, Muschamp earned his way from walk-on to scholarship player by the spring of his redshirt freshman season and eventually was named co-captain for his senior season. He also earned a spot on the SEC Academic Honor Roll in 1993.

ASSISTANT COACHES

D.J. DURKIN

Defensive Coordinator/Linebackers

- In his first season as defensive coordinator in 2013, UF finished second in the SEC in total defense and eighth in the country (allowing 314.2 yards per game).
- The defense held half of its opponents to 275 total yards or less in 2013 and allowed just 27 touchdowns, the sixth-fewest total in the nation.
- With a veteran linebacker group in 2012, the Gators' defense finished ranked fifth in the country in total defense, allowing 287.5 yards per game, and fourth nationally in rush defense (94.9 yards per game).
- UF blocked six kicks last season, ranking fifth nationally and tied for first in the SEC, marking the sixth time in seven seasons and all three of Durkin's seasons that the Gators led the SEC in blocks.
- Florida scored a touchdown on a punt return for the eighth-straight year and also had a kickoff return touchdown for the fourth-straight season. Andre Debose set the career record with his fourth kickoff return for a touchdown.



COLEMAN HUTZLER

Special Teams Coordinator

- Returned to Florida in the spring of 2014. Previously served on the Florida staff from 2010-11, assisting off the field with the defense and special teams and working closely with current defensive coordinator D.J. Durkin.
- Joined the New Mexico staff in the spring of 2012 and coached the Lobos' special teams and outside linebackers for two seasons.
- UNM's kickoff return unit ranked 16th in the nation in 2013, averaging 24.0 yards per return.
- In 2012, New Mexico had three special teams' players earn honorable mention All-Mountain West honors: kicker Justus Adams, kick returner Chase Clayton and Skaer.
- On the defensive side, Hutzler's outside linebackers combined to record 19 tackles-for-loss and eight sacks.



BRAD LAWING

Assistant Head Coach/Defensive Line

- Joined the Florida staff after being at South Carolina for the last seven years.
- His 2012 unit set a school record with 43 sacks, the sixth-most in the nation. Sophomore Jadeveon Clowney was a unanimous first-team All-American after setting school records with 23.5 tackles for loss and 13.0 sacks.
- In 2011, the Gamecocks finished with the nation's third-best defense (268 yards per game), second-best pass defense and No. 11 scoring defense (18.4 points per game).
- Lawing spent three seasons as North Carolina's defensive line coach and recruiting coordinator from 2003-05. Each of his three recruiting classes was ranked among the nation's top-25.
- Between his stops at Carolina, Lawing spent four seasons at Michigan State as defensive line coach and recruiting coordinator. During his tenure, the Spartans led the Big Ten in total defense in 1999 and 2000.
- Began his college coaching career at Appalachian State, where he mentored the defensive line for five years and the tight ends and offensive tackles for one season.



CHRIS LEAK

Wide Receivers

- Joined the Florida coaching staff prior to the 2013 season as a graduate assistant.
- Assisted with the quarterbacks in 2013, a group that saw three different quarterbacks start multiple games on the season.
- For the season, Florida's quarterbacks completed 64.0 percent of its passes, sixth-best in school history.
- Following his playing career, he spent time as a host on SiriusXM College Sports Coast-to-Coast during the 2012 football season.
- Started 33 games at quarterback in his career at Florida, leading the Gators to an SEC title and BCS National Championship in 2006.
- Finished his career as UF's all-time passing leader (11,213 yards) and threw for 88 touchdowns, second-most in school history.
- Played in the Canadian Football League for three seasons, winning the 2009 Grey Cup, and spent one season in the Arena Football League



DEREK LEWIS

Tight Ends

- Tutored first-team All-SEC selection Jordan Reed, who led the team with 45 catches for 559 yards and scored three touchdowns last season. Reed ranked ninth nationally in catches by a tight end and 13th in receiving yards by a tight end.
- In 2011, led a tight end group that totaled 47 catches for 584 yards (12.4 ypc) and three touchdowns. Reed finished second on the team with 28 catches and third on the team with 307 receiving yards.
- Tutored Minnesota's Nick Tow-Arnett to an All-Big Ten Honorable Mention selection following the 2009 season after Tow-Arnett finished second on the team with 37 receptions for 505 yards and three touchdowns. As a group, Gopher tight ends in 2009 averaged over 13 yards per reception.
- Tight ends were also a prominent part of the Gopher offense in 2008, as the group hauled in 46 receptions for 542 yards and three TDs, averaging 11.8 yards per reception. Minnesota's tight ends accounted for 30 receptions and 351 yards in 2007, part of the second-best single-season passing mark (2,949 yards) in school history.
- From 2005-06, Lewis worked at Texas as a graduate assistant, where he was part of the staff that captured the 2005 BCS National Title.



TRAVARIS ROBINSON

Defensive Backs

- Oversaw a Gator secondary that was one of the best in the nation in 2012, ranking No. 2 in pass efficiency defense (95.55) and allowing just seven touchdown passes, the second-fewest in the nation.
- Florida had 20 interceptions last season, tied for the 10th-most in school history and seventh nationally.
- Tutored first-team All-America safety Matt Elam, who totaled 76 tackles, 11.0 tackles-for-loss and four interceptions before becoming a first-round selection in the NFL Draft by the Baltimore Ravens.
- Coached cornerback Marcus Roberson, who earned second team All-SEC honors and totaled 12 pass breakups in 2012, tied for the sixth-most in a single season in UF history and the most since Joe Haden had 12 in 2008.
- In 2011, guided a UF secondary that ranked seventh in the nation in pass defense (166.8 yds/game). Overall, the Gator defense ranked eighth nationally in total defense (299.5 yds/game) and second in third-down defense (27.12 percent).
- Worked under Will Muschamp in his two seasons with the Auburn program.



KURT ROPER

Offensive Coordinator/Quarterbacks

- Came to Florida in the spring of 2014 after spending six seasons at Duke as the Offensive Coordinator and Quarterbacks coach.
- Has mentored a trio of 3,000-yard passers.
- Broke over 100 Duke records and 8 ACC records as offensive coordinator.
- Duke enjoyed a record-setting season in 2013, winning a school-record 10 games en route to winning the ACC's Coastal Division championship for the first time since the league went to divisional play in 2005.
- The Blue Devils thrived in 2013, setting the school record for total touchdowns (54) while becoming the first squad in program history to post 20+ rushing and 20+ passing touchdowns in a season.
- In 2012, directed Duke to a school-record 410 points and 31.5 points per game, marking the fifth-highest average in school history.



MIKE SUMMERS

Offensive Line

- Has 34 years of experience, primarily coaching the offensive line; also has spent 15 years as an offensive coordinator.
- 2012 Kentucky team averaged nearly 140 rushing yards while the 2010 offense averaged 6.1 yards per play.
- Spent two seasons at Arkansas (2008-09); Razorbacks led the SEC in scoring in 2009 and won the 2010 AutoZone Liberty Bowl.
- Helped lead one of the nation's most prolific offenses at Louisville, where the Cardinals won the 2004 Conference USA Championship and 2006 Big East title, and played in the 2007 Orange Bowl, 2006 Gator Bowl, 2004 Liberty Bowl and 2003 GMAC Bowl. The 2004 and 2006 Cardinal teams both finished ranked No. 6 by the Associated Press.
- Spent two seasons at Ohio (2001-02) as the offensive line coach. The Bobcats ranked sixth nationally in rushing offense (240.1 ypg) in 2001 and eighth in 2002 (239.8 ypg).
- Assistant head coach and offensive coordinator at the University of the South for four seasons (1996-99), where he produced top-five ranked rushing and total offenses in the conference.

- Served Interim Offensive Coordinator during the 2012 Gator Bowl.
- Worked with running backs Jeff Demps and Chris Rainey, who each ranks among the top 10 in rushing yardage at Florida.
- During his 11-year tenure at Wisconsin from 1995-2006, he mentored 1999 Heisman Trophy winner Ron Dayne, 2001 NFL first-round draft choice Michael Bennett, 2001 Big Ten Freshman of the Year Anthony Davis and 2006 Capital One Bowl Most Valuable Player Brian Calhoun.
- Was a graduate assistant for the 1988 Notre Dame team that won the National Championship.

University of Florida Athletics Director Jeremy Foley and University of Idaho Athletics Director Rob Spear have agreed that Saturday night's game has been declared a no contest and that not rescheduling the game is the only viable option for both programs.

The two schools, however, have agreed to schedule a game in Gainesville for the 2017 season on a date to be determined later.

"We looked at a number of options and, in the end, we both thought it was in the best interest of our student-athletes and football programs to play out the remainder of our respective schedules as they stand," Foley said.

Florida will fulfill the terms of the contract between the two schools and pay Idaho its \$975,000 guarantee by February 1, 2015, as outlined in the agreement.

"I want to thank UF, especially AD Jeremy Foley, for the professional and first-class way they worked through this issue and the focus on student-athlete welfare," Spear said. "It was not in our best interest to play 10 consecutive weeks without a bye week. We look forward to our return to Florida in 2017."

The Florida offense racked up 655 total yards, ninth-most in school history, and ran 86 plays in offensive coordinator Kurt Roper's UF debut. Quarterback Jeff Driskel completed a career-high 31 passes for 248 yards and a touchdown in his first game back from a season-ending injury in 2013. Running backs Kelvin Taylor and Matt Jones combined for 142 total yards and four total touchdowns (3 rushing, 1 receiving), while freshman running back Brandon Powell rushed for 23 yards a touchdown in his first career game. True freshman quarterback Treon Harris also had a stellar debut, completing 2-of-2 passes for 148 yards and two touchdowns, scoring strikes of 70 and 78 yards. On the defensive side, the Gators limited the Eagles to 125 total yards, 80 on the ground and just 45 through the air. UF racked up 11 quarterback hurries, nine tackles-for-loss and three sacks while forcing five turnovers on the night. Linebacker Neiron Ball had a career game, totaling six tackles and a career-high two sacks. Freshman Duke Dawson picked off a pass and returned it 37 yards for a score, becoming the first true freshman to return an interception for a touchdown in his first-career game.

In a thrilling night game in The Swamp, the Gators outlasted the Wildcats in the first triple-overtime game in school history, 36-30. Matt Jones plunged in from one yard out in the third overtime period to secure the victory after Kentucky's Austin MacGinnis missed a field goal in the first half of the third overtime period. The star of the night was sophomore wide receiver Demarcus Robinson, who tied a school record with 15 catches in the game, totaling 216 yards (4th-most in school history) and two touchdowns. Robinson's 15 catches matched Carlos Alvarez's school record set back in 1969 against Miami. Jeff Driskel rebounded after a shaky first half to finish with a career-high 295 yards and three scores. Meanwhile, the Florida defense stuffed the run and came up with key turnovers to shut down the Wildcats passing attack late in the game. Safety Keanu Neal had two interceptions, including a pick with 28 seconds remaining in regulation to prevent Kentucky from getting into field goal range for a chance to win. Brian Poole also had an interception and broke up a key pass in the second overtime period on a ball thrown into the end zone to hold UK to a field goal.
