

The results presented below were obtained through automated telephone interviews conducted by the New England College Polling Center on October 31, and November 1, 2014. A total of 1,526 responses were obtained, 778 from registered likely NH voters in Congressional District 1 and 748 from registered likely NH voters in Congressional District 2. The margin of error for questions 1, 2,and 4 is +/- 2.51%. The margin of error for question 3-CD1 is +/- 3.51% and for question 3-CD2 is +/- 3.58%. The margin of error for question 5 is +/- 3.66% and for question 6 is +/- 4.06.
