METHODOLOGY:

The sample size for the survey is 707 Active Voters taken from a listed sample of registered voters who

have voted in the 2010 or 2012 general elections. The margin of error is +/- 3.6 %. The MoE for the GOP Primary Voter Series is +/- 5.2 %. 534 interviews were completed using automated telephone technology and 173 were conducted using mobile based survey technology. All interviews were conducted May 14-15, 2014 by Vox Populi Polling. The total percentages for responses may not equal 100% due to rounding.
