

Todd McKenney and Mitchell Butel star in Jonathan Biggins' riotous production of *Orpheus in the Underworld*

Get ready for one of the most unruly and raucous nights at the opera, complete with the 'can-can', with **Jonathan Biggins**' riotous and gorgeous production of *Orpheus in the Underworld*. The worlds of musical theatre and comic opera collide when the sensational song-and-dance man, **Todd McKenney** (*The Boy from Oz, Annie the Musical*) takes the lead as Aristaeus/Pluto in Biggins' topical version of *Orpheus in the Underworld*. And who better to partner McKenney onstage than the king of comic-timing, **Mitchell Butel**, who had audiences in stitches in Opera Australia's *The Mikado*. Joining this dynamic duo is soprano **Rachelle Durkin** with her dazzling voice and infectious humour. Together, this terrific trio are sure to keep the show moving at an entertaining pace. *Orpheus in the Underworld* is at **Sydney Opera House from February 28 to March 27**.

The stylish fooling and newly-minted satire by Biggins and fellow wit **Phil Scott** re-ignites Offenbach's 1850s parody to make its vision of lust and power ripe for the times. The sparkling melodies, cartoonish delights, pyrotechnics (yes, really!) and fast-paced dance routines make the production a treat for all ages.

Designer **Mark Thompson**'s imaginative towers and temples, and gorgeous and witty costumes create a setting as vibrant and bright as a Broadway musical. With its frenzied pace, sight gags and a show-stopping finale, this is sure to be the most fun-filled event of the summer season.

About the work:

Right from its premiere in Paris in 1858, Jacques Offenbach's *Orpheus in the Underworld* was a runaway success, running for extended seasons in Paris, New York and London. The composer's most ambitious operetta to date (and regarded as the first classical full-length operetta), *Orpheus* lampoons Greek mythology and culminates in the somewhat risqué 'Infernal Galop', better known to today's audiences as the 'can-can'.

About the artists:

One of Australia's sharpest satirists, **Jonathan Biggins** is perhaps best known for his long-running gig as writer, director and performer in Sydney Theatre Company's annual Wharf Revue. As a director, he won a Helpmann award in 2010 for the national tour of *Avenue Q* (starring Mitchell Butel). Other directing credits include *The Republic of Myopia* for STC and David Williamson's *Flatfoot* for Ensemble Theatre.

Inspiring, provocative, compelling and generous are just a few words that describe the critically acclaimed and awardwinning performer, actor and host, **Todd McKenney**. McKenney's versatile career was kick-started by the prized role of Peter Allen in the hit production *The Boy From Oz*. His reign as Australia's leading man of song and dance musicals confirms his status as a household name with performances in 42^{nd} *Street, West Side Story, Camelot, Pirates of Penzance, Cabaret, Strictly Ballroom, La Cage aux Folles, Singin' In the Rain, Annie the Musical* and many more. Since 1994 he's been the 'colourful' and often controversial judge on the Channel 7 hit series *Dancing With the Stars. Orpheus in the Underworld* marks his debut with Opera Australia.



Triple Helpmann Award-winner Mitchell Butel makes his welcome return to Opera Australia after an hilarious performance in The Mikado in 2011. He has worked extensively for all of Australia's major theatre companies. Music theatre credits include Grease, Little Shop of Horrors, Man of La Mancha, Oklahoma!, Tomfoolery Dusty and, in 2010, Avenue Q, for which he won a Helpmann Award. Most recently, Mr Butel starred in A Funny Thing Happened on the Way to the Forum, taking Melbourne audiences by storm. He is also the voice of the Playschool theme song!

Australian soprano Rachelle Durkin is one of opera's most striking sopranos performing at major houses worldwide to critical acclaim. After winning the 2001 Metropolitan Opera National Council Auditions, Ms Durkin joined the Metropolitan Opera's Lindeman Young Artists Development Program, and has been performing with the company since then. She most recently performed for OA as Violetta in Handa Opera on Sydney Harbour: La Traviata.

The production brings together a dream cast of thrilling and diverse voices with tenor Andrew Brunsdon (Orpheus), Katherine Wiles (Cupid), Stephen Smith (Mercury) and mezzo-soprano Suzanne Johnston (Public Opinion) making a welcome return to the Sydney stage.
