## FROM THE LAST GAME

- Treon Harris' 215 passing yards are the most by Florida quarterback in an SEC road game since Jeff Driskel had 218 at Tennessee in 2012. It's the most passing yards by a true freshman quarterback since Chris Leak threw for 268 against Iowa in the 2004 Outback Bowl.
- UF's 16.5 yards per catch is the third most under Muschamp and most since 20.6 against Furman in 2011. 16.5 ypc is the most in an SEC game for Florida since averaging 20.4 against Georgia in 2011.
- Jeff Driskel scored on a one-yard touchdown run in the second quarter. The junior now has four rushing touchdowns in his last two games in Nashville.
- Antonio Morrison forced a fumble in the second quarter, and Vernon Hargreaves recovered. The play marked Morrison's second career forced fumble, and his first this year. Hargreaves recorded his second career fumble recovery, and second in 2014.
- Quinton Dunbar had 97 receiving yards, marking the second-highest output of his career (98 at Miami, 2013)
- Chris Thompson caught a 12-yard pass from Treon Harris in the second quarter, marking his first catch of the year. All three of Thompson's receptions in his career have come against Vanderbilt (2 in 2013).

TEAM

- Kyle Christy recorded a 58-yard punt in the third quarter, marking his 16th punt of 50+ yards this season.
- Vernon Hargreaves had his second interception of the season in the fourth quarter (also: Oct. 4 at Tennessee).
- Jalen Tabor picked off a Vanderbilt pass in the endzone in the fourth quarter, marking his first career pick.
- Ahmad Fulwood's 48-yard reception from Treon Harris in the first guarter marked his longest catch of the year.

## **PREVIOUS MEETINGS**

**2013 No. 11 South Carolina 19, FLORIDA 14 (Columbia)** The 11th-ranked Gamecocks held off the Gators 19-14 in their Southeastern Conference game at sold-out Williams-Brice Stadium. The defeat was the fifth straight for UF (4-6, 3-5) and marked the Gators' longest losing skid since they went 0-10-1 in 1979. USC quarterback Connor Shaw passed for 213 yards, including a key second-half touchdown strike, and Elliott Fry booted four field goals, including two in the fourth quarter, as the the Gamecocks won their 16th straight home game. UF freshman tailback Kelvin Taylor rushed 21 times for a career-best 96 yards and two touchdowns that capped two long drives, but other than that the Gators struggled to get much going offensively and, frankly, played things close to the vest to protect their rookie quarterback.

**2012 | No. 3 FLORIDA 44, South Carolina 11 (Gainesville)** Jeff Driskel threw four touchdown passes and Florida dismantled South Carolina, 44-11, in a key SEC East showdown a the Swamp. Despite having just 183 yard of total offense, the Gators put up their highest point total of the season by forcing turnovers and taking advantage of great field position. UF jumped out to a 21-3 lead after having three touchdown drives of less than 30 yards. Driskel threw two touchdown passes to Jordan Reed and one each to Quinton Dunbar and Frankie Hammond, while Omarius Hines and Matt Jones had touchdown runs. Adam Yates hit three field goals for South Carolina. Driskel finished 11-of-16 for 93 yards with the four touchdown passes and Mike Gillislee totaled 37 yards on 19 carries. The Gator defense had four sacks, three fumble recoveries and an interception to shut down the Gamecocks.

**2011** [FLORIDA 12, South Carolina 17 (Columbia) After trailing 14-3 at the half, the Gators cut the deficit to 14-12 after a 2-yard touchdown run by Jacoby Brissett. A game-tying two-point conversion failed, South Carolina added a field goal, and the Gators were unable to complete the comeback. The Gators got 21-yard and 24-yard field goals from Caleb Sturgis, while Connor Shaw scored a pair of touchdowns, a 10-yard scramble and a 1-yard keeper for South Carolina. South Carolina rolled up 215 yards on the ground, getting 120 yards on 29 carries from Brandon Wilds and 88 yards and two touchdowns from Shaw. Florida was limited to just 84 yards of total offense in the first half, 47 rushing and 37 passing and gained 177 of its 261 yards in the second half. Chris Rainey finished with 17 carries for 132 yards, while John Brantley hit 13-of-21 passes for 119 yards. Jordan Reed led the Gators with five receptions for 62 yards.

**2010 | No. 22/24 FLORIDA 14, No. 23/22 South Carolina 36 (Gainesville)** John Brantley completed 16-of-31 passes for 130 yards and one interception and connected with seven different Florida wide receivers. Tight end Jordan Reed went 3-for-7 for 46 yards passing and one touchdown. The Gators finished with 191 yards through the air, compared to USC's 156. The Florida receiving corps had three players record a catch for over 30 yards. Wide receiver Omarius Hines led the team with three receptions for 38 yards, while Chris Rainey led the rushing game for Florida with five carries for 32 yards. Ahmad Black notched a career-high 16 tackles on the night and Jelani Jenkins aided Black and the UF defense with 11 total tackles. Andre Debose made Gator history by becoming the first player in school history to run two kickoffs back for a touchdown in one season, tallying 159 kickoff return yards against South Carolina.

**2009 No.1 FLORIDA 24, South Carolina 14 (Columbia)** Sparked by an interception by junior defensive end Justin Trattou, the No. 1 Florida Gators defeated South Carolina, 24-14. Tim Tebow finished the game 14-for-25 for 199 yards and one touchdown. Tebow tallied 26 rushing yards on 16 carries with one touchdown. Senior wide receiver Riley Cooper led the Gators' receiving corps with three receptions for 112 and one touchdown. Junior Joe Haden led the defense with one interception for 20 yards, a sack for a loss of nine yards, 11 tackles, two forced fumbles and one pass break up. The defense held South Carolina scoreless in the second half after surrendering 14 points in the first. Florida finished the day with 339 yards of total offense, compared to South Carolina's 247. South Carolina quarterback Stephen Garcia finished the day 17-for-32 for 186 yards, with two interceptions and one touchdown.

## **CROSSING PATHS**

- South Carolina has 17 players on its roster from the state of Florida. Freshman offensive lineman Nolan Kelleher is UF's only player from South Carolina.
- Florida sophomore running back Matt Jones and freshman wide receiver Alvin Bailey both went to Armwood High School in Tampa, along with the Gamecocks' Cody Waldrop, a redshirt freshman center.
- Florida's Raphael Andrades and South Carolina offensive lineman Cody Gibson both went to Lincoln High School in Tallahassee, Fla.

## **ON THIS DATE** NOVEMBER 15, 2008

### No. 3 Florida 56, No. 24 South Carolina 6 (Gainesville, Fla.)

No. 3 Florida cruised to a 56-6 win over No. 24 South Carolina in front of a crowd of 90,646 at Ben Hill Griffin Stadium. The 50-point win over the Gamecocks marked the fifth-straight game that the Gators have put up 42 or more points, tying Oklahoma for the longest active streak in the nation.

It was a career-best day for junior running back/wide receiver Percy Harvin (Virginia Beach, Va.), who recorded eight rushes for a career-high 167 yards and two rushing touchdowns. Harvin additionally extended his scoring streak to 12-straight games with a touchdown.

UF junior quarterback Tim Tebow led the Gators in the air, completing 13-of-20 passes for 173 yards and two touchdowns. Tebow additionally accumulated 39 yards on the ground on 14 carries, punching one rush into the end zone for his 11th rushing touchdown of the season.

- In its 65-0 win over EMU, Florida became the third SEC team since 1996 to rush for more than 250 yards (259) and pass for 395 or more (396) in the same game.
- UF is one of five conference members to crack the 60-point mark so far in 2014.
- Florida holds the nation's longest streak without being shut out, at 330 games. o UF's last shutout loss came on Oct. 29, 1988, a 16-0 defeat vs. Auburn.
- Against EMU, the Gators' 655 yards set a Muschamp-era record and ranked ninth all-time in Florida annals (fifth since 2001).
- Against Kentucky, UF had a 200-yard receiver (DEMARCUS ROBINSON 216) and a 100-yard rusher (MATT JONES - 156) in a game for the fourth time in school history.
- AHMAD FULWOOD and TRIP THURMAN made their first career starts in the season opener against Eastern Michigan.
- RODERICK JOHNSON started for the first time in the Kentucky game.
- C.J. WORTON started against Missouri, becoming the first UF true freshman to start at wide receiver since Chris Thompson last season against Florida State.
- TREON HARRIS became UF's first true freshman QB to start since 2003 vs. Georgia.
- UF scored in 32 of 48 (67%) quarters in 2013, with a TD in 23 of 48 (48%) quarters.
- So far in 2014, the Orange and Blue have scored in 20 of 32 regulation guarters
- (62.5%), with 16 additional points in overtime against Kentucky. o Florida scored at least 13 points in each quarter of the EMU game.
- UF holds a 149-108 advantage after halftime.
   o Includes 35-0 vs. EMU, 33-27 vs. UK, 10-6 at UT, 24-13 vs. UGA and 17-3 at VU.
- The Gators lead their opponents 95-75 in the first half.
- Against Eastern Michigan, 12 of UF's 16 possessions took three minutes or less. o Five drives in the season opener had 10+ plays.
- UF's longest timed drive vs. UK took 5:09; 9 of 13 regulation drives were less than 3:00.
- The longest drive for the Orange and Blue vs. LSU lasted 3:49.
- Both UF scoring drives against Missouri took more than four minutes (4:14 and 6:36).
- A strong ground game led to two scoring drives of six minutes or more against Georgia (6:35, touchdown; 6:13, field goal).
- Just three series at Vandy lasted more than 4 minutes, and none lasted more than 5:00.
- The Gators had 10 explosive plays vs. EMU, 9 vs. Kentucky, 4 at Alabama , 6 at Tennessee, 5 vs. LSU, 3 vs. Missouri, 14 (all runs) against Georgia and 10 at Vandy.
- Florida entered the Georgia game with 64 double-digit gains on the year, which ranked second-to-last in the FBS; against UGA, UF had 16 plays of 10 yards or more.

## **OFFENSIVE LINE**

- UF's offensive line is in its first season under position coach **MIKE SUMMERS**, who has 34 years of coaching experience.
- Eleven linemen played against EMU, with an eight-man rotation against UK, Bama and Vandy, a six-man group vs. UT, LSU and Missouri and a seven-man rotation vs. Georgia.
- Florida allowed just five sacks through the season's first five games, with none allowed to Eastern Michigan, Alabama or LSU; the Gators also allowed no sacks to UGA.
- UF returned five offensive linemen with starting experience: Max Garcia, Trenton Brown, Chaz Green, Tyler Moore and D.J. Humphries.
- Senior **CHAZ GREEN** returned to the line against Eastern Michigan after missing the 2013 season due to injury. He was sidelined against Kentucky with another injury. Green has started 22 games and appeared in 23 in his career. In addition, Green was named to the 2011 All-SEC freshman team.
- Redshirt senior **MAX GARCIA** competed in his first season as a Gator a year ago after sitting out the 2012 season due to NCAA transfer rules when he came from Maryland. He started all 12 games, playing mostly left guard and left tackle. Garcia moved to center before the 2014 season, making his debut at the position against Eastern Michigan.
- Senior TRENTON BROWN started the first two games of 2014 at right guard. He played in all 12 games and started the final five contests at right tackle for the Gators in 2013.
   Brown began last season on the field goal unit and as a reserve at tackle but took over the starting job against Georgia when Tyler Moore was lost for the year due to injury.
- Junior TYLER MOORE entered the 2013 season playing right guard but moved to right tackle due to injuries. Moore played in seven games and made six starts, five at right tackle and one at left tackle. He suffered a season-ending injury prior to the Vanderbilt game and missed the last four games. He returned against EMU and also played vs. UK before earning his first start of 2014 at Alabama; Moore also started at Vanderbilt.
- Redshirt junior TRIP THURMAN made his first career start in the season opener, playing left guard. He also started at that spot vs. UK and at UT and VU and appeared at Bama and vs. UGA. Thurman had played in 16 games during his first three seasons.
- Junior D.J. HUMPHRIES came back from a knee injury against EMU before he missed the UK and Alabama games. He returned to the starting lineup at Tennessee. Humphries played in seven games in 2013, starting the first six at left tackle, before the injury ended his season. In 2012, Humphries appeared in all 12 games, starting three and was named SEC Coaches' All-Freshman (OL) and *Sporting News* Freshman All-America.
- Redshirt freshman RODERICK JOHNSON made his first career start against Kentucky and also opened at right tackle at Alabama.
- The offensive line has paved the way for the third-highest yards per carry since 2008 among teams that have been SEC members for that entire span.

## FLORIDA'S OFFENSE

## RUSHING

- Through eight games in 2014, Florida is averaging 206.1 yards per contest on the ground.
- Florida's 418 rushing yards against Georgia is the fifth-best single-game total in school hitory, and the second-best against an SEC opponent (454 vs. Vanderbilt, 1975).
- Against UGA, Florida had two players with more than 120 yards rushing in a game (KELVIN TAYLOR - 197; MATT JONES - 192) for the first time in school history, in records dating back to 1930.
- UF also rushed for over 200 against EMU (259) Kentucky (237) and Vanderbilt (214).
- Florida averaged 145.8 rushing yards per game in 2013, with four games over 200 yards.
- Under Muschamp, UF has rushed for 200 or more yards 15 times.
- In the season opener against EMU, Florida rushed for 259 yards and four scores.
- In its first SEC game against UK, UF had 251 rushing yards on 50 carries with 1 TD.
- The Gators rushed for 107 yards against Alabama, becoming the second team to rush for 100+ yards vs. the Tide in its last nine games.
- Florida gained 156 yards on the ground at Tennessee, and also cracked the century mark against LSU (123) and Missouri (135).
- The Gators had 49 runs of 10-plus yards (4.1 per game) last year, totaling 776 yards. In 2012, UF had 90 runs of 10-plus yards (6.9 per game).
- So far in 2014, Florida has 49 double-digit runs (6.1 per game) for 857 yards.
- This includes 11 double-digit carries for 271 yards agianst Georgia.
- Four Gator running backs averaged more than 8.0 yards per carry against Eastern Michigan: Jones, Taylor, MACK BROWN and BRANDON POWELL.
- Three Gators (Jones, Taylor, Brown) rushed for 60+ yards against Eastern Michigan.
- Both Jones (5.4) and Taylor (4.3) averaged more than four yards per attempt against Kentucky.
- Jones (5.0) and TREON HARRIS (6.0) both had a clip of 5+ yards per carry at Tennessee.
- Jones, Taylor and Harris all had multiple carries and averaged at least six yards per rush against Georgia.
- The junior rushed for 156 yards against Kentucky, marking his second career 100-yard game.
- Jones crossed the century mark for the third time with 114 yards at Tennessee.
- Jones suffered a season-ending knee injury in 2013 against LSU and finished his 2013 season with 339 yards on 79 carries (4.3 avg.) and two touchdowns. He also had 5 catches for 25 yards.
- Jones had 176 yards rushing at Kentucky last year, the most by a Gator running back since Ciatrick Fason had 210 vs. Kentucky in 2004. His 176 yards rushing on the road was the most since Fason ran for 190 at South Carolina in 2003 and is the eighth best all-time by a Gator in a road game.
- Quarterback JEFF DRISKEL rushed for a team-high and season-high 71 yards against LSU. He has now rushed for more than 70 yards four times during his career.
- Taylor finished second on the team a season ago with 508 yards on 111 carries (4.6 avg.) with four touchdowns. He led the team in rushing in five of the last six games totaling 410 yards over that span with all four of his scores coming in those games. 105 of Taylor's 111 carries came in the final seven games of the season.
- Taylor's 65-yard touchdown run against Georgia was a career-long for him.
- Brown led the team in 2013 with 543 yards on 148 carries (3.7 avg.) and had four touchdowns. He had his first career start against Toledo and had a career day, rushing for 112 yards on 25 carries and scoring two touchdowns, all career highs. He also led the team in rushing against Tennessee (24 carries, 86 yards) and at LSU (15 carries, 56 yards).
- Redshirt senior **ANDRE DEBOSE** ran once for 35 yards against LSU, setting a new career long for a rush.

## PASSING

- The Gators recorded back-to-back games with 3+ touchdown passes (Eastern Michigan and Kentucky) for the first time since November 2009 against FIU and Florida State.
- Redshirt junior quarterback **JEFF DRISKEL** is 15-6 as the Gators' starter. Four of the five losses have come away from The Swamp, with three of them coming to ranked opponents (#3 Alabama in 2014, #12 Georgia and #22 Louisville in 2012). He suffered a fractured fibula against Tennessee in 2013 and missed the rest of the year.
- Driskel passed for his 20th-career touchdown pass vs. LSU, hooking up with Demarcus Robinson for an 11-yard score.
- Driskel threw for a career-high 295 yards against Kentucky, completing 18-of-23 passes for 179 yards with three touchdowns and no interceptions after halftime.
- Against Eastern Michigan, the Oviedo native completed a career high 31 passes.
- A 12-game starter in 2012, Driskel completed 156-of-245 passes for 1,646 yards with 12 touchdowns and five interceptions. He rushed 118 times for 408 yards with three scores.
- TREON HARRIS earned the No. 2 spot entering Week 1, and became the starter vs. UGA.
- Both of his passes against Eastern Michigan were touchdowns.
- The Miami native later led the Gators to a nine-point comeback win at Tennessee, engineering two scoring drives in the fourth quarter.
- Harris had two scoring passes against EMU, for 70 and 78 yards.
  - o Florida is one of 41 schools in the country with multiple passing plays of 70+ yards. o The Gators are tied for the SEC lead with three passing plays of 70 yards or more. That
  - total also ranks tied for eighth in the nation.

- Florida's 33 completions against Eastern Michigan were spread amongst 11 receivers; seven receivers caught at least one of Driskel's 25 completions against Kentucky, while six Gators had a catch at Alabama and seven hauled in a pass at Tennessee.
- True freshman BRANDON POWELL's six receptions vs. LSU tied for the fourth-most in a single game by a Gator running back since 1996, and his six grabs are the most by a Gator at his position since Chris Rainey had six against Florida Atlantic on Sept. 3, 2011.
- Powell recorded the most catches by a UF running back in a conference game since Markus Manson had six against Vandy on Nov. 5, 2005.
- **DEMARCUS ROBINSON** had 216 receiving yards and two touchdowns against Kentucky; he is the first Gator since 2002 to cross the 200-yard mark, and recorded his first multi-score game.
- o Robinson's 216 yards rank fourth in a game in school history and second in SEC play. o The Fort Valley, Ga., native posted the second-highest yardage total ever at The Swamp (222, Travis McGriff vs. South Carolina, 1998).
- Robinson's 15 catches against UK tied the UF record (Carlos Alvarez vs. Miami, Fla., 1969).
- The sophomore ranks sixth in the SEC with 4.5 catches per game:
- Robinson is one of 24 players in the country this season with multiple 70+yard catches.
- Before being held without a catch vs. LSU, **QUINTON DUNBAR** had caught a pass in 32-straight games, dating back to the 2011 Furman game. During that span, he had 91 catches for 1,142 yards and six touchdowns. His streak ranks third in school history and was four shy of the all-time Gator mark.
- Dunbar led the team in receiving yards last year twice (Georgia-91, Vanderbilt-77) and led the team in catches six times (Miami-7, Tennessee-4, LSU-3, Georgia-4, Vanderbilt-6, South Carolina-3). Against Georgia, Dunbar had a career-long 83-yard reception.
- Dunbar had 97 receiving yards at Vanderbilt, which is one yars shy of his career high set in 2013 at Miami.
- Against the Tide, VALDEZ SHOWERS scored his second career TD on a 28-yard catch.
- CLAY BURTON had seven receptions in the opener against EMU, just two shy of the UF single-game record for catches by a tight end.
  - o Burton's seven catches also mark the country's third-best single-game total by a tight end this season (Jonnu Smith, FIU, 9 catches on Sept. 6 lead country).
- **TEVIN WESTBROOK**'s TD against Kentucky was the first by a Gator tight end since Jordan Reed vs. South Carolina on Oct. 20, 2012. He caught his second career TD against Mizzou.

## FLORIDA'S DEFENSE

- UF is one of three schools to rank in the top 10 nationally in total defense each of the past three years (Alabama & Florida State).
- In 2014, UF ranks 18th in the country and fourth in the SEC in total defense, allowing 334.0 yards per game.
- Florida allowed 119 yards of total offense against Missouri, the lowest total since Nov. 26, 2011 vs. Florida State (95 yards).
- Twice this year UF has allowed 125 total yards or less to an opponent. The first coming against Eastern Michigan (9/06/14, 125 yards).
- Florida is one of only two teams in the country (Clemson) to have held an opponent to 125 yards or less more than one time this season; 13 other schools have accomplished the feat once.
- The Gators allowed just seven first downs against Mizzou, which is tied for the thirdbest performance in school history against a Southeastern Conference opponent, and marks UF's fewest first downs allowed to an SEC team since Alabama had six in the 1999 SEC Championship Game.
- Through seven games this season, opponents are averaging 4.99 plays per drive, which is the lowest total allowed by a Florida defense since 2010 when opponent's ran 4.88 plays per drive.
- The Gators forced five three-and-outs vs. Vanderbilt, and have now forced 46 in 2014 (41.0 percent of opponent drives).
- On three of Vanderbilt's six second-half possessions, the Commodores turned the ball over three times (2 INT & 1 downs).
- Junior linebacker **ANTONIO MORRISON** made a career-high 15 tackles against Georgia. The 15 stops were the most tackles by a Gator defender since Ahmad Black's 16 tackles vs. South Carolina on Nov. 13, 2010.
- Morrison has now made 10 or more tackles in a game five times this year (15 vs. UGA; 14 vs. LSU; 11 at UT; 10 at UA; 10 vs. UK). He ranks fourth in the SEC in tackles per game (9.0).
- Earlier in the season, Morrison had a streak of four consecutive games with 10-plus tackles (UK, Bama, UT & LSU), which was the longest streak of his career. Prior to this season, he had never posted double-digit tackles in back-to-back games.
- Freshman **QUINCY WILSON** started his first-career game against Georgia, becoming the third true freshman defensive back to make his collegiate debut this season in the UF secondary. The other two were **DUKE DAWSON** and **JALEN TABOR**, who started their first career games at Tennessee.
- Florida forced four turnovers against Vanderbilt (2 INT, 2 FR).
- The Gators forced three turnovers (2 INT, 1 FR) at Tennessee. It marked the fourthstraight game the UF defense forced at least three turnovers.
- Florida forced five turnovers (1 INT, 4 FR) vs. Eastern Michigan, which was the most turnovers forced since Sept. 21, 2013 vs. Tennessee when the Gators forced six turnovers (4 INT, 2 FR).
- UF forced 15 turnovers in its first four games of the season (7 INT, 8 FR). It is the most turnovers by a UF defense through its first four games since the 1996 season when the Gators forced 15 turnovers (9 INT, 6 FR).

## PASS DEFENSE

- Dating back to 1996, opponents have averaged under 200 yards passing per game (194.2) against Florida, sixth-best in the nation.
- UF broke up seven passes against Georgia.
- Florida allowed 20 passing yards to Missouri, which is the lowest total allowed by a UF defense since the Gators allowed zero passing yards to Georgia Southern on Nov. 23, 2013.
- UF is one of only four teams (Air Force, Clemson & New Mexico) to hold an opponent to less than 50 passing yards in a game multiple times this season. All four teams have done it twice.
- Florida allowed 20 passing yards to Mizzou. It was the third time this season, the Gators allowed less than 125 passing yards to an opponent (110 yards, vs. Mizzou 10/11/14; 45 yards, vs. EMU, 9/6/14).
- In the Muschamp era, the Gator defense has surrendered less than 125 passing yards or less 11 times.
- The Gators allowed only six completions vs. Mizzou, marking the third time this season the defense has allowed 10 or fewer completions. (9, vs. EMU 9/6/14; 10, vs. LSU 10/11/14).
- During the Muschamp era, the Gators have allowed 10 or fewer completions in a game 11 times.
- UF has allowed only 146 completions this season, tied for 12th in the country and first in the SEC.
- The Gators 14 pass breakups against UK are the most in a single game during the Will Muschamp era.
- Florida ranks seventh in the country averaging 6.38 passes defended a game, also ranking second in the SEC.
- Since the start of the 2012 season, Florida's 27 passing touchdowns allowed is the fewest total in the nation, and opposing quarterbacks total a rating of 104.4, which is the third-lowest.
- Freshman **JALEN TABOR** nabbed his first career interception in the fourth quarter against Vanderbilt, making a one-handed, leaping catch in the back of the endzone.
- Sophomore VERNON HARGREAVES III ranks tied for second in the SEC in passes defended per game with 1.50 and tied for 12th in the country.
- Hargreaves notched his second interception of the season, and fifth of his career, off Vanderbilt's Johnny McCrary.
- Freshman **DUKE DAWSON** became the first Florida true freshman to return an interception for a touchdown in his first-career game when he had a 36-yard pick-six vs. EMU. The last time a true freshman returned a pick for a score was De'Ante Saunders vs. Furman on Nov. 19, 2011.
- Dawson became the second true freshman in as many years at UF to notch an interception in his first collegiate game, joining **VERNON HARGREAVES III**, who had an interception last year against Toledo (8/31/13).
- Since the start of the 2008 season, the Gators rank second in the nation in interception return yards and touchdowns, while being tied for fourth in interceptions:

- Hargreaves had four pass breakups against UK, eclipsing his single-game high of three set on Sept. 21, 2012, vs. Tennessee.
- Hargreaves intercepted his first pass of the season off of Tennessee's Justin Worley.
- Neal intercepted his third pass of the season against the Vols. Against Kentucky, he recorded the first two interceptions of his career.
- Neal became the first Gator to record a two-interception game since Ahmad Black vs. Penn State on Jan. 2, 2011, in the Outback Bowl.
- Redshirt sophomore MARCUS MAYE intercepted his first pass of the season and second of his career off Missouri's Maty Mauk.
- Junior **BRIAN POOLE** notched his first interception of the season, and the third of his career, returning it 30 yards, against Kentucky.
- The Gators' six sacks at Tennessee were the most sacks in a game since Florida had six sacks against Ohio State in the TaxSlayer.com Gator Bowl on Jan. 2, 2012.

- Redshirt sophomore **BRYAN COX**, **JR**. notched his fourth sack of the season against Georgia, tying him for the team lead with redshirt sophomore **ALEX MCCALISTER**.
- Cox became the first Gator to record three sacks in a game since Carlos Dunlap accomplished the feat at Mississippi State on Oct. 24, 2009.
- Against Georgia, the defense tallied zero sacks and three hurries. In three seasons at Texas, Muschamp's defense averaged 3.05 sacks, 3.97 quarterback hurries and 1.33 forced fumbles in 39 games.

## **RUSH DEFENSE**

- The Gators have allowed just seven rushing touchdowns this season, tied for ninth-fewest in the nation.
- UF boasts the 15th-ranked rush defense, allowing 116.3 yards per game.
- Florida ranks 16th in the country and second in the SEC holding opponents to 3.26 yards per rush.
- The Gators rank 7th in the nation and second in the SEC in rushing yards allowed (930).
- Florida's defense averages 7.13 tackles-for-loss per game, which ranks 25th in the nation and fourth in the SEC.
- Florida held Vanderbilt to under 100 rushing yards, allowing 98.
- The Gators have allowed less than 100 yards rushing in five of their eight games this year (EMU, 80; UK, 81; UT, 28; Mizzou, 99; Vandy, 98).
- In the win at Tennessee, UF limited the Vols to 28 yards rushing, marking the first time in 12 games that the Gators held an opponent to less than 50 yards on the ground. (Last: 48 yards vs. Kentucky, Sept. 28, 2013).
- In the Muschamp era, the Gators have held opponents to under 100 yards rushing 17 times.
- Junior **DANTE FOWLER**, JR. made 2.5 tackles-for-loss and a notched a sack in the win over Georgia. It was the sixth game of his career having two or more tackles-for-loss.
- Fowler made a career-high 11 tackles vs. LSU, while adding one sack and one tackle-forloss. He topped the 100-career tackle mark against LSU.
- Sophomore **KEANU NEAL** notched a career-high 10 tackles against Alabama, including a forced fumble and a 49-yard fumble return for a score.
- Against Alabama, sophomore safety **KEANU NEAL** returned a fumble 49 yards for a touchdown. It was the sixth-longest fumble return for a touchdown in school history, and the longest fumble return for a score since Keiwan Ratliff had a 77-yard fumble return for a touchdown against FSU in 2003.
- Neal's fumble return for a touchdown was the first fumble return for a touchdown since 2011 when Jaye Howard had a two-yard return against Kentucky.

## FLORIDA'S SPECIAL TEAMS

## PUNTING

- Senior **KYLE CHRISTY** ranks 13th in the nation and third in the SEC with a 45.0 yards per punt average.
- 17 of Christy's 43 punts this season have soared for 50 yards or more, including four of 60+ yards.
- Two of Christy's five punts at Vanderbilt spotted the Commodores inside the 20-yard line. On average, Vanderbilt began drives obtained by punt at their own 22-yard line.
- Christy kicked a 63-yd punt vs. LSU, his second-longest of the season. Two of his four punts against the Tigers sailed for 50+ yards.
- Five of Christy's eight total punts at Tennessee pinned the Vols inside the 20-yard line.
- His 52.7 yards per punt at Alabama is the third best single game average in UF history. Christy holds the record of 54.3, set in 2012 vs. South Carolina.
- Christy's season-long 66-yd punt against Alabama falls just 1 yard shy of his career-long 67-yarder which occurred in his first career appearance as a Gator at Auburn on Oct. 15, 2011.
- Christy recorded 3 punts for a total of 145 yards in the 2014 season opener against the Eastern Michigan Eagles, sending one 60 yards and averaging 48.3 yards per punt.
- His 43.9 career yardage average across 160 punts places him second on UF's all-time list behind Ray Criswell who recorded a 44.4 yard average during his career between 1982 and 1985.
- The Gators are averaging 45.0 yards per punt this season, with 11 fair caught, 17 inside of the 20-yard line and 17 of 50-plus yards.

## KICKING

- FRANKIE VELEZ leads the SEC and is tied for 14th in the nation in field goal percentage, as he is 11-of-12 (91.7%) on the year.
- Velez knocked in a 25- and 40-yard field goals and was 4-for-4 on PATs to help the Gators to win over Vanderbilt. The 40-yard FG was just four yards shy of his career long.
- Velez and the field goal unit executed a fake field goal for a touchdown scored by specialist **MIKE MCNEELY** to swing the momentum in the second quarter versus Georgia.
- The fake field goal was Florida's first successful ruse since Sept. 8, 2012, at Texas A&M.
- Velez nailed a 21-yard field goal and was 3-for-3 on PATs to help the Gators to victory over the Bulldogs.
- Velez capped a 74-yard, game-tying drive beginning at the 2:40 mark of the fourth quarter vs. LSU with an 18-yard field goal.
- Velez nailed his first career OT field goal attempt, a 20-yarder vs. Kentucky, forcing a third OT and helping the Gators to a 36-30 victory.
- Florida scored on its opening drive of the season for the second straight year, when Velez converted a 33-yard field goal against EMU.
- Velez was a perfect 3-for-3 on field goal attempts vs. the Eagles, going 1-for-1 from 20-29 yards and 2-for-2 from the 30-39 yard range.
- Florida's 17 pts. scored kicking vs. EMU (3FG, 8PAT) is tops in the SEC through Week 11.
- Velez is 26-for-27 on point after touchdown kicks through seven games played in 2014.
- The Ocala native and former walk-on kicker who was awarded a scholarship this season made his collegiate debut at LSU in 2013 and converted field-goal attempts from 44 yards and 27 yards. The 44-yarder opened the scoring and was the longest successful kick by the Gators last season.
- AUSTIN HARDIN went 2-for-2 on PATs to help Florida to a win over East rival Georgia.
- Hardin kicked a career-high 49-yard game-winning field goal at Tennessee to help the Gators to a 10-9 victory in Knoxville.
- Hardin is the 10th Gator in UF history to notch a game-winning kick (see chart).
- His 49-yarder ranks tied for fourth in the SEC in longest field goal made this season.

## **RETURN GAME**

- Florida tallied two explosive returns in the Gators, 34-10 win at Vanderbilt, as **ANDRE DEBOSE** notched two 30-plus yard kick returns to set UF up with good field position.
- Georgia entered the game versus Florida allowing just 13 total punt return yards on the season, including a long of 9-yards. Florida tallied two punt returns for 38 yards, including a long of 38, made by Debose.
- Debose opened scoring vs. LSU in the first quarter with his first career punt return for a TD, a 62-yard effort.
- The score was Debose's second punt return of 50+yards this season. Entering the contest, just six players in the country have multiple 50-yard returns this season.
- His 115 punt return yards versus the Tigers stand as the individual game high in the SEC

## through Week 10.

- The redshirt senior is now tied for third all-time in SEC history with five combined kick/ punt return touchdowns.
- Debose's punt return for a touchdown marks Florida's 10th consecutive year with a scoring return.
- Florida has returned either a kickoff or punt for a touchdown for 10-straight seasons dating back to 2005, with 11 total punt return touchdowns during that span (including blocked punts). The Gators have also returned a kickoff for a touchdown for 5 seasons in a row, totaling 7 kickoff return touchdowns since 2009.
- Debose ranks seventh in the nation and second in the SEC in punt return average with 16.9 yards per return. Florida is 13th in the nation and second in the conference with 15.9 yards per punt return.
- Debose has recorded 31 total returns for 637 yards across the first eight games of the 2014 season, leading the Gators in both punt and kick return yards.
- The redshirt senior recorded four kick returns for 86 yards in Florida's 10-9 victory at Tennessee and two kick returns for 78 yards in the Gators' triple overtime win over Kentucky.
- Debose led the return effort against Eastern Michigan with four punt returns for 97 yards (second most in a game by a returner in the SEC this season) including a career-long 55-yard punt return.
- Debose holds the Florida career record for kick return touchdowns with 4, which is tied for the SEC record with Willie Gault (Tenn.), Felix Jones (Ark.) and Brandon Boykin (UGA). He owns the Florida season record in the same category with 2.
- UF's 7 kick returns for scores since 2009 is tied for the 5th-best total in the nation and the Gators' 6 KOR in the last 4 years is tied for 6th-best.

## **COVERAGE UNITS**

- UF held Vanderbilt to a total of 14 punt return yards on two punt returns.
- Despite the Bulldogs averaging 10.6 yards per punt return, the Gators held Georgia to a total of 13 yards on two punt returns.
- The Gators limited Tennessee to six yards on three punt returns and held Eastern Michigan to one yard on a single punt return.
- In 2013, the Gators allowed just 16.4 yards per kickoff return, the third-best coverage unit in the nation and tops in the SEC.
- In addition, it was UF's best coverage since allowing just 15.2 yards per return in 2001.
- In 2013, Florida's punt coverage allowed 3.8 yards per return, its best figure since allowing 3.7 in 2006.
- Last season, the Gators' punt coverage ranked 13th in the nation and second in the SEC.

• Florida has blocked 13 kicks in Will Muschamp's 45 games as a head coach, including 6 in 2012 (4 FG, 1 extra point, 1 punt).

- After not finishing in the final poll for two seasons (2010, 11), the Gators finished 2012 ranked No. 9 in the AP poll and No. 10 in the USA Today/Coaches Poll, marking the 17th time in school history that UF has finished in the top 10. - Since 1990, Florida has outscored its opponents by a combined 6,077 to 2,462 at home, putting the average outcome at 38.7 to 15.7 in favor of the Gators and making the average outcome a 23-point win.
- The Gators had two significant winning streaks at The Swamp in the 1990s: a 23-game streak from 1990-93 and a 30-game streak from 1994-99. In 152 home games from 1990-2013, UF has scored 31 or more points 100 times and held its opponent to 14 or less points 86 times.
- With a 7-0 performance in The Swamp in 2012, the Gators matched the 2006 and 2009 squads in finishing with the most wins at home in a season.

## IN THE STANDS

- In 2013, the Gators sold out all season tickets for the 34th-consecutive season after averaging 87,597 fans during the 2012 season.
- Florida broke its single-game attendance record in 2009, drawing 90,907 to The Swamp for the Nov. 28 showdown against Florida State. It marked the largest crowd ever to watch a football game in the state of Florida. The state has hosted 14 Super Bowls, three BCS national title games and has featured 18 bowl games that included a team that went on to win at least a share of the national title.
- The crowd of 90,888 for the UF-Alabama game on Oct. 1, 2011, was the second-highest single-game total in school history and the most since 90,885 watched the Orange and Blue face South Carolina on Nov. 13, 2010.
- The Gators have ranked among the nation's top-15 schools in average home attendance in each of the last 32 years (1982-201) and have ranked among the top 10 in each of the last 23 years (1991-2013).
- In addition, UF set a school attendance record during the 2009 season, averaging 90,635 per game, which ranked ninth in the nation. That broke the previous standard, set in 2008 when the Gators averaged 90,544.
- The largest crowd for a home opener at The Swamp was 90,707 in UF's 2005 win over Wyoming in Urban Meyer's first game as head coach of the Gators. The 2009 opener (90,621) was the second-largest.

## PRO FOOTBALL HALL OF FAME

The University of Florida is the only school in the Southeastern Conference to have two inductees into the NFL Hall of Fame since 2001. Former Gator running back Emmitt Smith was inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame in Canton, Ohio, on Aug. 7, 2010, following Gator great Jack Youngblood into the elite fraternity.

A three-time All-American at UF from 1987-89. He set 58 school records in three seasons, including a career rushing mark of 3,928. Following his junior season with the Gators, Smith was a first-round selection in the 1990 NFL Draft by the Dallas Cowboys. He finished his career with 18,355 rushing yards and 164 rushing TD, both of which are NFL records. He was named honorary captain for the 2011 UF vs. Tennessee game.

Youngblood, regarded as the best defensive end in UF history, became the first Gator enshrined in the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 2001. He was named to the All-SEC team of the decade for the 1970s and was the Most Outstanding Player at the 1971 Senior Bowl. He went on to be a five-time All-Pro player for the L.A. Rams. Youngblood appeared in a Rams' record 201 consecutive games and only missed one game in his 14 seasons, that one coming in his final season in 1984.

# UF'S LEGENDARY STATUS

#### NATION'S ELITE

- No other school has captured a national title while facing the nation's toughest schedule. According to NCAA statistics, Florida has done so twice, in 1996 and 2006, and also won the 2008 title facing the second-toughest schedule in the country.
- UF is one of two schools (Arkansas) to face a top-10 strength of schedule five times from 2006-12.
- Florida is one of three schools in the nation to win three outright national titles since 1990. The 2006 and 2008 national championships were decided in the BCS National Championship Game, and Florida was the unanimous pick in all four major polls in 1996. Alabama (1992, 2009, 2011, 2012), Florida State (1993, 1999, 2013) and Nebraska (1994, 1995, 1997) have also won more than two national titles in that time frame, but the Huskers' 1997 title was split with Michigan.
- Florida is one of only two schools in the nation with three quarterbacks to win the Heisman Trophy and one of two schools nationally to have multiple Heisman winners since 1996.
- Florida is the only school in the nation to post 100 wins during each of the last two decades. UF won 102 games in the 1990s and 100 games in the 2000s. UF is one of only three schools in NCAA history to win 100 or more games in two different decades.
- The Gators won at least nine games for a period of 12-consecutive years (1990-2001), something only three schools in major college history have done and no other SEC school has done.
- Florida became one of six schools in major college history to win 100 games during a decade, producing a 102-22-1 record in the 1990s. UF again reached that benchmark in the 2000s, going 100-30.
- UF is the only school in modern major college history to score 500 or more points for a period of four-straight years (1993-96).
- Florida is one of two schools to have a player selected in the first round of the NFL Draft for nine-consecutive years, with a Gator being tabbed each year from 1983-91 (Miami, 14 years, 1995-2008).
- UF is one of only four schools in the nation to have multiple recipients of the William V. Campbell Trophy (formerly the Draddy Trophy), which is presented by the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame to the nation's top football scholar-athlete. (Brad Culpepper, '91; Danny Wuerffel, '96; Tim Tebow, '09)
- UF is the only school in the nation to have a Heisman Trophy recipient who also received the Campbell Trophy. Wuerffel accomplished both in 1996, while Tebow earned the Heisman in 2007 and the Campbell in 2009.

## **SEC ELITE**

- Florida is one of two SEC schools to have three Heisman Trophy winners: Steve Spurrier (1966), Danny Wuerffel (1996) and Tim Tebow (2007).
- UF is one of two SEC schools to win at least 10 games for a period of six-consecutive years (1993-98), something only four schools in major college history have done.
- The Gators are the only SEC team to rank in the top 15 of the final polls for 12-straight years, and only four have done it in major college football history.
- The Gators have the best league record over a 100-SEC-game span, going 87-13 in SEC play from the beginning of the 1990 season through the seventh conference game of 2001.
- Florida is only one of two schools in SEC history to claim four league championships in a row (1993-96). Florida has played in 10 of the 21 SEC Championship Games that have been held, winning seven.

## **GATORS IN THE PROS**

- Florida had 33 players on 2014 NFL opening day rosters, fifth-most among all schools. UF's 7 NFL receivers were tied for the most and its 3 centers were the most from any school.
- Since 1998, Florida has had at least 29 players on opening day NFL rosters each year.
- During the 2013 NFL season, UF had 37 players appear on active rosters, totaling 193 starts and 341 games played.
- Thirty-three former Gators are on NFL teams' Week 9 rosters; in addition, three UF alumni are on injured reserve and two are on teams' practice squads.
  - o Florida has produced seven current NFL wide receivers and three active centers; both totals are tied for the lead among college teams.
- Florida has seen 20 former players go on to appear in the NFL's Pro Bowl. Of those, 13 made multiple appearances in the all-star showcase.
- A Gator has earned a Pro Bowl berth in 34 of the past 38 NFL seasons, including 14 of the past 15 and a streak of 11-consecutive Pro Bowls from 1986-96.
- At least one former UF player has appeared in the Super Bowl 28 times. Four Gators have appeared in the big game on two occasions (Super Bowls XXX and XLI).
- Fourteen former Gators have combined to win 21 Super Bowl rings. Don Chandler, Wilber Marshall and Max Starks have each won two, and Emmitt Smith and Godfrey Miles each claimed three.
- Florida is one of two schools (Pittsburgh) that has two players, Emmitt Smith and Fred Taylor, on the top-15 list of the NFL's all-time top rushers.
- Percy Harvin earned Offensive Rookie of the Year for his performance with the Minnesota Vikings in 2009. He then led the team in all major receiving and kickoff return categories in 2010.

#### HEAD COACH WILL MUSCHAMP



Muschamp, 43, came to UF after being the coach-in-waiting and defensive coordinator at the University of Texas since November 2008. He brought 16 years of coaching experience with him, including 12 years in the SEC, eight as a coach and four as a player at the University of Georgia. Muschamp also served as defensive coordinator at Auburn Uni-

versity (2006-07) and LSU (2002-04; he was LSU's linebackers coach in 2001) and was a finalist for the 2007 Broyles Award as the nation's top assistant coach.

Muschamp also brought a wealth of big-game experience. Prior to arriving at Florida, he coached in two national championship games, winning the ultimate prize in 2003 as the defensive coordinator at LSU, and coached in a third BCS bowl game following the 2008 season, when Texas won the Fiesta Bowl. In addition to his national championship past, Muschamp has coached in the SEC Championship Game twice and in the Big 12 Championship Game once, coming out on the winning side in each of those three contests.

After a 7-6 record in his first season at Florida, Muschamp led the Gators to one of the nation's top turnarounds in year two, finishing 11-2 and playing in a BCS bowl game. Florida improved from a 6-6 regular season in 2011 to an 11-1 regular season in 2012, which marked the biggest one-year leap for the program in 32 years (0-10-1 in 1979, 7-4 regular season in 1980). In addition, the Gators finished 7-1 in the SEC East, tying for the division crown, a year after posting a 3-5 record in the conference. Florida defeated three top-10 opponents for just the second time in school history. Muschamp was named the SEC Coach of the Year by the league's coaches as well as CBSSports.com.

The Gators finished No. 3 in the final regular-season BCS standings in 2012, the third-highest finish in school history, and ranked in the top 10 in both the final Associated Press and USA Today/Coaches' Poll. UF won 11 games for the sixth time in school history, won four of five games against the final BCS top-12 teams and beat seven bowl-eligible teams against the toughest schedule in the nation according to the NCAA.

In his first three seasons at UF, the formula for the Gators' success was to take care of the football, control both lines of scrimmage, finish games, have outstanding special teams and a physical defense. The Florida defense continued to be one of the nation's best in 2012, ranking fifth nationally in scoring defense (14.5 points per game) and total defense (287.5 yards per game). UF's rush defense improved dramatically from year one under Muschamp, limiting opponents to just 94.9 rushing yards per game after allowing 132.7 yards per game in 2011. The secondary also shut down the opposition, ranking as the nation's No. 2 pass efficiency defense (95.55) and allowing just seven touchdown passes, the second-fewest in the nation.

A year after being outscored 86-59 in the fourth quarter, UF posted a 128-32 edge in the final quarter in 2012. That led to a 5-1 record in games decided by one score or less and matched a school-record eight come-from-behind wins. UF improved from -12 in turnover margin to +15 and ranked seventh nationally. Punter Kyle Christy set a school record for average yards per punt, placekicker Caleb Sturgis finished his career as Florida's leader in career field goals made and the special teams unit blocked six kicks in the last eight games.

Muschamp's first season in Gainesville produced the school's 24thconsecutive winning season and its 32nd-consecutive season of .500 football or better, the longest streaks in the nation. With the victory over Ohio State in the TaxSlayer.com Gator Bowl, UF established a school record with its fourth-straight bowl win. Muschamp's first squad will go down as one of the youngest in school history: 15 true freshmen and 52 underclassmen saw action – the second most in school history.

Despite returning 37 combined starts on the defensive side of the ball, the fewest in the SEC, Muschamp's defense ranked second in the nation in third down conversion defense (.273) – the best national ranking in school history. Florida allowed just 166.8 yards per game passing to rank seventh nationally and permitted just 299.5 yards per game to rank eighth nationally.

In his five seasons as an SEC defensive coordinator, Muschamp's defenses ranked among the nation's top 10 in total defense every single year, while always maintaining a top-15 rating in scoring defense, including three times inside the top 10.

In four of his eight seasons overall as a Division I defensive coordinator, his teams allowed less than 100 rushing yards per game and twice led the nation in rushing defense while yielding less than 75 rushing yards per game. His 2003 LSU defense led the country by allowing 67 yards per game on the ground, the best mark by an SEC team in the 2000s, while Texas gave up just 73.1 yards on the ground in 2009 to lead the nation.

From 2008-10 under Muschamp's guidance, the Texas defense ranked No. 1 in the nation with 119 sacks for 949 yards lost. His unit also ranked in the top-10 nationally during the same time frame in several other major categories, allowing 2.9 yards per rushing attempt (third), 96.7 rushing yards per game (fourth), 297.4 yards per game (seventh), all of which are Big 12 bests during that span.

In 2009, the Texas Longhorns advanced to the BCS National Championship Game as Muschamp's defense gave up just 73.1 rushing yards per game, the best figure by any BCS school from 2008-10. The Longhorns also led the nation in 2009 in third-down defense (26.5 percent), turnovers created (37, tied with Ohio University) and interceptions (25) as Texas claimed the Big 12 championship in 2009.

Under Muschamp's tutelage at Texas, Brian Orakpo claimed the 2008 Rotary Lombardi Award (lineman of the year), Bronko Nagurski Trophy (most outstanding defensive player) and Ted Hendricks Award (top defensive end), while the Longhorns' defense saw Sergio Kindle become the first player in college football history to be named a finalist for both the Butkus Award (nation's top linebacker) and the Hendricks Award (nation's top defensive end). Earl Thomas also earned finalist honors for the Jim Thorpe Award in 2009.

In the 2009 and 2010 NFL Drafts, Muschamp had a combined 10 players drafted, including nine in the first four rounds and two first-rounders in Orakpo and Thomas.

As the defensive coordinator at Auburn from 2006-07, Muschamp's defense ranked third in the nation in scoring defense (15.4 points per game) and fourth in the nation in pass defense (170.7 pass yards per game). During the same time frame, Auburn ranked third in the SEC in total defense by holding opponents to 295.1 yards per game.

Muschamp's first full-time coaching experience in the SEC came at LSU as the linebackers coach for the 2001 season before being elevated to defensive coordinator from 2002-04. His 2003 defense helped the Tigers to the national championship by leading the nation both in scoring defense (11.0 points per game) and total defense (252.0 yards per game), while finishing second nationally in pass efficiency defense (89.8) and third in rushing defense (67.0 yards per game). The Tigers allowed just 19 touchdowns all season in 2003, three less than the next closest competitor nationally.

Between his positions at LSU and Auburn, Muschamp spent a season with the NFL's Miami Dolphins in 2005 as Assistant Head Coach for Defense. He helped the Dolphins finish second in the league with 49 sacks, while leading Miami to top-10 rankings in yards per play (4.7, seventh), yards per rush (3.7, seventh) and yards per pass (6.0, ninth).

The 1994 graduate of Georgia moved immediately into coaching following his collegiate playing career, working as a graduate assistant at Auburn from 1995-96, earning his master's degree in 1996. He became a secondary coach at West Georgia (1998) and Eastern Kentucky (1999) before moving on to his first defensive coordinator position at Valdosta State for the 2000 season.

In his playing career at Georgia, Muschamp earned his way from walkon to scholarship player by the spring of his redshirt freshman season and eventually was named co-captain for his senior season. He also earned a spot on the SEC Academic Honor Roll in 1993.

## ASSISTANT COACHES

#### **D.J. DURKIN**

Defensive Coordinator/Linebackers

- In his first season as defensive coordinator in 2013, UF finished second in the SEC in total defense and eighth in the country (allowing 314.2 yards per game).
- The defense held half of its opponents to 275 total yards or less in 2013 and allowed just 27 touchdowns, the sixth-fewest total in the nation.
- · With a veteran linebacker group in 2012, the Gators' defense finished ranked fifth in the country in total defense, allowing 287.5 yards per game, and fourth nationally in rush defense (94.9 yards per game).
- · UF blocked six kicks last season, ranking fifth nationally and tied for first in the SEC, marking the sixth time in seven seasons and all three of Durkin's seasons that the Gators led the SEC in blocks.
- · Florida scored a touchdown on a punt return for the eighth-straight year and also had a kickoff return touchdown for the fourth-straight season. Andre Debose set the career record with his fourth kickoff return for a touchdown.

## **COLEMAN HUTZLER**

- Returned to Florida in the spring of 2014. Previously served on the Florida staff from 2010-11, assisting off the field with the defense and special teams and working closely with current defensive coordinator D.J. Durkin.
- · Joined the New Mexico staff in the spring of 2012 and coached the Lobos' special teams and outside linebackers for two seasons.
- UNM's kickoff return unit ranked 16th in the nation in 2013, averaging 24.0 vards per return
- In 2012, New Mexico had three special teams' players earn honorable mention All-Mountain West honors: kicker Justus Adams, kick returner Chase Clavton and Skaer.
- · On the defensive side, Hutzler's outside linebackers combined to record 19 tackles-for-loss and eight sacks.







University of Florida Athletics Director Jeremy Foley and University of Idaho Athletics Director Rob Spear have agreed that Saturday night's game has been declared a no contest and that not rescheduling the game is the only viable option for both programs.

The two schools, however, have agreed to schedule a game in Gainesville for the 2017 season on a date to be determined later.

"We looked at a number of options and, in the end, we both thought it was in the best interest of our student-athletes and football programs to play out the remainder of our respective schedules as they stand," Foley said.

Florida will fulfill the terms of the contract between the two schools and pay Idaho its \$975,000 guarantee by February 1, 2015, as outlined in the agreement.

"I want to thank UF, especially AD Jeremy Foley, for the professional and first-class way they worked through this issue and the focus on student-athlete welfare," Spear said. "It was not in our best interest to play 10 consecutive weeks without a bye week. We look forward to our return to Florida in 2017."

The Florida offense racked up 655 total yards, ninth-most in school history, and ran 86 plays in offensive coordinator Kurt Roper's UF debut. Quarterback Jeff Driskel completed a career-high 31 passes for 248 yards and a touchdown in his first game back from a season-ending injury in 2013. Running backs Kelvin Taylor and Matt Jones combined for 142 total yards and four total touchdowns (3 rushing, 1 receiving), while freshman running back Brandon Powell rushed for 23 yards a touchdown in his first career game. True freshman quarterback Treon Harris also had a stellar debut, completing 2-of-2 passes for 148 yards and two touchdowns, scoring strikes of 70 and 78 yards. On the defensive side, the Gators limited the Eagles to 125 total yards, 80 on the ground and just 45 through the air. UF racked up 11 quarterback hurries, nine tackles-forloss and three sacks while forcing five turnovers on the night. Linebacker Neiron Ball had a career game, totaling six tackles and a career-high two sacks. Freshman Duke Dawson picked off a pass and returned it 37 yards for a score, becoming the first true freshman to return an interception for a touchdown in his first-career game.

In a thrilling night game in The Swamp, the Gators outlasted the Wildcats in the first triple-overtime game in school history, 36-30. Matt Jones plunged in from one yard out in the third overtime period to secure the victory after Kentucky's Austin MacGinnis missed a field goal in the first half of the third overtime period. The star of the night was sophomore wide receiver Demarcus Robinson, who tied a school record with 15 catches in the game, totaling 216 yards (4th-most in school history) and two touchdowns. Robinson's 15 catches matched Carlos Alvarez's school record set back in 1969 against Miami. Jeff Driskel rebounded after a shaky first half to finish with a career-high 295 yards and three scores. Meanwhile, the Florida defense stuffed the run and came up with key turnovers to shut down the Wildcats passing attack late in the game. Safety Keanu Neal had two interceptions, including a pick with 28 seconds remaining in regulation to prevent Kentucky from getting into field goal range for a chance to win. Brian Poole also had an interception and broke up a key pass in the second overtime period on a ball thrown into the end zone to hold UK to a field goal.

Alabama continued to pound away at the tired Florida defense in the fourth quarter and added another score, as Amari Cooper hauled in his third touchdown catch of the day. The Crimson Tide offense finished the day with 645 yards, the most ever allowed by a Gator team. Bama quarterback Blake Sims finished a career-best day with 445 yards and four touchdown passes. LSU kicker Colby Delahoussaye hit a 50-yard field goal with three seconds remaining as the Tigers escaped with a narrow win over the Florida Gators in Gainesville, 30-27. After a back-and-forth second half, the score was tied 27-27 when Jeff Driskel's pass was tipped and intercepted by Rickey Jefferson and returned to the Tigers' 36 yard line with 24 seconds left on the clock. LSU was able to gain three yards and stop the clock, setting up Delahoussaye's game winner. Florida opened the scoring in electric fashion, as Andre Debose returned a punt 62 yards for his fifth-career kick return touchdown (first punt return touchdown). LSU responded just over two minutes later with a 12 yard touchdown run by freshman Leonard Fournette, who totaled 140 yards on 27 carries and added a second score in the third quarter to give LSU its first lead of the day. Driskel finished with 183 passing yards and one touchdown, which gave UF a lead with 6:10 left in the game. Driskel also led the team with 71 rushing yards on 21 carries and scored on a nine yard touchdown run in the first quarter. The Gator defense limited LSU to 110 passing yards, but gave up 195 yards on the ground and three rushing touchdowns. For the first time on the season, UF did not force a turnover; meanwhile Florida turned it over three times.
