

CHAPTER 1 Introduction

District at a Glance

Background: The present Natore district was a sub-division of the former Rajshahi district. Nothing is definitely known about the origin of the district name. In the remote past, the present district headquarters was within 'Chandrabati Beel'. There are two views about the origin of the district name. The first view is that previously the present place of the district headquarters was neither a high land nor a low lying area. It was not (means **Na** in Bengali) high enough for movement on foot (means **Tar** in Bengali). The other opinion is that the district might have originated its name from the name of the **Norad** River which was following by the side of the district headquarters. It is generally believed that the district might have derived its name from the above two words.

Geographic Area and Location: Natore district is bounded on the north by Bogra and Noagaon districts, the east by Sirajganj and Pabna districts, the south by Pabna and Kushtia districts and the west by Rajshahi district. It lies between 24°25' & 24°58' north latitudes and between 88°01' & 88°30' east longitudes. The total area of the district is 1900.19 Sq.km (733.66 Sq. miles) of which 6.56 Sq. km.covers forest area.

Annual Average Temperature and Rainfall: The average temperature of the district varies from maximum 37.8°C to minimum 11.2°C. The annual average rainfall of the district is 1862 mm.

Main Rivers: The Atrai, Baral, Narod and Nandakunja are main rivers of this district.

Administration: Natore subdivision was established in 1845 under Rajshahi district and it was turned into a district in 1984. Natore municipality was established in 1869 but it was transformed into Town Committee in 1959. Municipality was again established in 1993. The area of the town is 19.26 sq km. The district consists of 6 upazilas, 52 unions, 1272 mauzas, 1351 villages, 8 paurashavas, 75 wards and 161 mahallas. The upazilas are Natore Sadar, Bagatipara, Baraigram, Gurudaspur, Lalpur and Singra.

Archaeological Heritage and Relics: Natore Rajbari and Dighapatia Rajbari (Uttara Ganabhaban), Dayarampur Rajbari (Bagatipara) and Budpara Kali Mandir (Lalpur) are notable archaeological heritage and relics.

Historical Events: Indigo resistance movements were held in this district during 1859 to 1860. During the War of Liberation in 1971, a direct battle was fought between the Pak army and the Freedom fighters on 29 March in which about 40 members of the Pak army including Major Aslam and Capt. Ishaq were killed.

Marks of the War of Liberation: Five mass graves, one memorial are the marks of the war of liberation of this district.

Educational Institution: The numbers of educational institution of this district are government college 4, non-government college 53, government high school 3, non-government high school 274, government primary school 404, non-government primary school 312, madrasa 95, teachers' training college 1, nursing institution 1.

Cultural Organisation: There are 298 clubs, 8 libraries, 6 cinema halls of this district.

Locally Published Newspapers and Periodicals: Dainik Uttar Bangabarta, Dainik Uttarpath and weekly Natore Barta are noted locally published newspapers of this district.

Main Crops: The main crops of the district are Paddy (Boro), wheat, sugarcane and betel leaf.

Main Fruits: The main fruits that grow in the district are mango, jackfruit, banana, coconut and litchi.

Traditional Transport: Palanquin, horse carriage, bullock cart, buffalo cart etc. are found local transport of ths district.

Manufacturing Industries: Sugar mill, rice mill, oil mill, flour mill, printing, biscuit factory, ice factor are some caterory of manufacturing industry of this district.

Hats, Bazars and Fairs: Total number of hats and bazars are 152. There are 13 seasonal fairs sit in the different places of the district.

NGO Activities: Operationally important NGOs are BRAC, CARE, Grameen Bank, ITCL, Thengamara Mahila Sabuj Sangha, etc.

Economic Situation: The economy of Natore is predominantly agricultural. Out of total 369 thousand households of the district 65.4% holdings are farms which produce varieties of crops namely local and HYV rice, jute, wheat, potato, vegetables, spices, pulses, oil seeds, sugarcane and other minor corps etc. Various fruits like mango, jackfruit, litchi, jam, palm, banana, guava, watermelon etc. are the main fruits of the district. Varieties of fish are caught from rivers, beels and paddy fields during rainy season. The most common fishes are ruhi, katla, mrigel, magur, shing, koi, puti, shoil, gozar, boal etc. All these fishes are economically valuable. Besides these common varieties some other well known varieties of fish are pangash, airh, bacha, rita batasi, khalisha and chingri are found. Besides crops, livestock and poultry are the subsidiary source of household income of the district.

The following table1 shows the total establishments in the rural and urban areas and persons engaged by sex and activities in Natore district.

According to the above, table there are 40,772 establishments in the district in which 112,666 persons are engaged in different types of non-farm activities. Female participation in non-farm activities was very poor (8.34%) in Natore district. The table also shows that establishment and person engaged in construction and electricity, gas and water supply sector are very poor. It indicates that Natore district is still in a developing stage.

Flora and Fauna

Flora: Natore district is surrounded by Naogaon and Bogra district on the north, Rajshahi district on the west, Kushtia district on the south and Sirajgong and Pabna districts on the east. Obviously, growing of plants and trees in the district is influenced by all these districts. Depending on environmental conditions, a large number of natural vegetation grows in the district. In the limited char areas, which are frequently eroded and rebuilt, the variety is limited to a few.

The northern part of Singra upazila of the Natore district lies within Barind region, where soil is stiff red clay. Lalpur upazila has only grey sandy soil. The remaining upazilas of the district have the characteristic features of the marshes and swamps (beels). The soil of this area is ordinarily black loam, very fertile. The soil of the beels of some depth contains black clay enriched by vegetable matter. Natore district is well known for the number and extent of beels. The eastern extremity of the district includes a portion of the great Chalan Beel. There are also some other beels in the district.

Like other adjoining districts, Natore is also an agricultural district. Various agricultural crops are grown in the district. The major crops comprise aus, aman, boro, jute and wheat. Among rice crops, aman covers the largest area followed by boro and aus. Other crops include sugarcane, potato, mustard, khesari, mash kalai, masur, spices, sesame, vegetables, tobacco, water-melon etc.

The homesteads usually contain a host of tree species, shrubby plants and thickets of bamboos (Bambusa bambus) and bananas (Musa sapientum). The homestead flora includes mango (Mangifera indica), black berry (Syzygium cumini), Jack fruit (Artocarpus heterophyllus), coconut (Cocos nucifera), date (Phoenix sylvestris), betel nut (Areca catechu), dumur (Ficus sp.), palm (Borassus flabellifer), wood apple (Aegle marmelos), kamranga (Averrho karambola), guava (Psidium guajava), jambura (Citrus decumana), papaya (Carica papaya), sajna (Moringa obifera), mandar (Erythrina ovalifolia), barak bans (Bambusa balcooa), beora bans (Bambusa bambos) etc. The main timber trees are the Mango (Mangifera indica), jack-fruit (Artocarpus heterophyllus), jamrul (Syzygium samarangense), cotton tree (Bombax ceiba), neem (Azadirachta indica) and pitraj (Aphanamixls polystachia). Their wood is used for making doors, windows and household furniture. The wood of the babla/Indian gumtree (Acacia nilotica) is largely used for cart wheels. Bamboos (Bambusa bambus) are abundant and furnish the most common materials for house building.

In addition to these, a jungle plant called zhau (*Casuarina littorea*), extensively used as fuel grows in several parts of the district and is a source of income of some people. There is no forest but there are extensive patches of jungles in some parts of the district.

Fauna: In the 19th century, Barking deer (*Muntiacus muntjak*), wild buffaloes (*Bubalus bubalis*), wild pigs (*Sus scrofa*), leopards (*Panthera pardus*) and wild boars (*Sus-scrofa*) were plentiful in the district. But along with the passage of time, deer (*Muntiacus muntjak*), wild buffaloes (*Bubalus bubalis*), have disappeared with the advancement of cultivation while leopards (*Panthera pardus*) and wild boars (*Sus-scrofa*) have vanished into the village jungles. They are still found in the river chars. Jackals (*Canis aureus*), the jungle cats (*Felis chaus*), foxes (*Vulpes bengalensis*), hares (*Orvctulagus cuniculus*) and squirrels (*Callosciurus pygerythrus*) are some of the common mammals.

There is an abundance of aquatic birds in the district. During the winter several kinds of geese and ducks (*Cairina scntulata*) visit the district. Among them, the grey-leg goose (*Anser spp*), bare headed goose (*Anser indicus*) black-backed goose, the pintail, sheldrake, shoveller, gad wall, pochard, mallard and spotted billed duck (*Cairina sentulata*) and the familiar brahmini duck (*Cairina scntulata*) are ordinarily seen in the chars of the Padma. Teals of various types and snipes are also found. Other waterbirds like herons (*My cticaras*), storks (*Ephippiar-hynchus*), coots, moorhens snippets, kingfishers (*Alcedo atthis*) dabchiks are numerous. Of other game birds, those that are found only on land are many in number, Plover and green pigeon (*Columba livia*) are frequent and the common gray quail and button quail are occasionally shot. Black patridges are also seen. Besides these common birds, the different species of kites (*Milvus migrans*), vultures (*Gyps bengalensis*), eagles (*Accipiter badius*), buzzards, doves (*Streptopelia tranquebarica*), cuckoos (*Cuculus microplerus*) as well as mynas (*Gracula religiosa autra*), bayas, king-crows, crows (*Corvus macrorhynchos*), fly-catchers including the paradise fly-catchers, shrikes, swallows, swifts, bee-caters, flower-peckers and many other small resident and migratory birds are will represented in the district.

Concepts and Definitions

1. Population and Housing Census 2011

The population and housing census is the unique source of reliable and comprehensive data about the size of the population of the country, major socio-economic and socio-demographic characteristics.

It is the total process of collecting, compiling, evaluating, analyzing and publishing or otherwise disseminating demographic, economic and social data pertaining, at a specified time, to all persons in a country. The essential features of a population census are individual enumeration, universality within a defined territory, simultaneity and defined periodicity.

The population and housing census provides information on the geographic and administrative distribution of the population and household in addition to the demographic and socioeconomic characteristics of all the people in the country. The data from the census are classified, tabulated and disseminated so that political leaders, election officials, planners, national organizations including NGOs and civil society, regional and international organizations can use the data in decision-making.

The purpose of community report is to disseminate census data by communities (ward/mahalla in urban area and union/mauza/village in rural area). Data on all key variables namely area, household, population by sex and age group, ethnic population, literacy rate, marital status, school attendance, employment status and religion as well as physical facilities such as source of drinking water, sanitation, electricity and dwelling units have been presented in this report. The planners, researchers and policy makers as well as development partners and community administrators will find this report as a valuable reference for use in advising plans and programs for advancing welfare and well-being of the common people, in particular and the community in general.

Household

Persons, either related or unrelated, living together and taking food from the same kitchen constitute a household. A single person living and eating alone forms one-person household.

Literacy

It denotes ability to write a letter in any language. Literacy status assessment is made for population 7 years and over.

Community

It refers to the following five lower geographic, administrative or revenue units:

- i) **Union:** Smallest administrative rural geographic unit comprising of mauzas and villages and having union parishad institution.
- ii) **Mauza**: Mauza is the lowest administrative unit having a separate jurisdiction list number (J.L. No.) in revenue records. Every mauza has its well-demarcated cadastral map. Mauza should be distinguished from local village since a mauza may consist of one or more villages.
- iii) Village: Lowest rural geographic unit either equivalent to a mauza or part of a mauza.
- iv) **Ward:** Smallest administrative urban geographic unit comprising of mahallas and having ward council institution.
- v) Mahalla: Lowest urban geographic unit having identifiable boundaries.

Urban Area

It corresponds with area developed around a central place having such amenities as metalled roads, improved communication, electricity, gas, water supply, sewerage, sanitation and also having comparatively higher density of population with majority population in non-agricultural occupations.

- i) City Corporation: It includes city corporation area declared by the Ministry of Local Government.
- **ii) Paurashava/Municipality Area:** It includes paurashavas incorporated and administered by local government under Paurashava Ordinance, 1977.

2. Agriculture Census year and reference period

The census year extends over twelve consecutive months having for different census items the different reference periods or days of data collections. Some items have a year or week reference period. Some others have a specific reference day.

The census year covered twelve months from 1 Baishak to 30 Choitra, 1414 Bangla Shal (BS). This year was the reference period for such census items as operated land use, crops, agriculture employment, livestock & poultry deaths and agriculture loan. A single reference day was used for items like holdings, farm size, land tenure, farm population, livestock & poultry inventories and agriculture implements.

The different census items by their reference periods or days are shown below:

Agriculture holding

An agriculture holding is a techno-economic unit of agricultural production under single management comprising all livestock kept and all land used wholly or partly for agricultural production purposes without regard to title, legal form or size. Single management may be exercised by either an individual holder or jointly by two or more individuals or holders or by a judicial person such as a corporation, co-operative or government agency. A holding may consist of one or more parcels (fragments of land) located in one or more areas or mauzas or in more than one administrative unit or division provided that all separate parcels of fragments form parts of same technical unit under operational control of same management.

The definition covers practically all holdings/households engaged in agricultural production of both crops and livestock. Some agriculture holdings may have no significant agricultural land, e.g. holdings keeping livestock, poultry and hatcheries for which land is not an indispensable input for production.

Farm holding

A farm holding is defined as being an agricultural production unit having cultivated land equal to or more than 0.05 acres. Farm holdings are classified into following three broad groups:

- (a) **small:** Farm holdings having minimum cultivated land 0.05 acre but operated land more than this minimum but upto 2.49 acres.
- (b) **medium:** Farm holdings having operated land in between 2.50 to 7.49 acres.
- (c) **large**: Farm holdings having operated land 7.50 acres and above.

Small cultivated land 0.04 acre or less is generally used for kitchen garden growing mainly vegetables. Often seeds of white gourd, water gourd, pumpkin and other strains are sown on households; but these creepers spread out around house roofs and other structures. As such, the minimum cultivated land considered for qualifying to be a farm holding is 0.05 acres.

Non-farm holdings

A non-farm holding is defined as being the one which has neither cultivated nor operated land or has cultivated land less than 0.05 acre.

Tenancy

Owner holdings are those having and operating their owned land and who may or may not be leasing out land.

Tenant holdings are those having no owned land but operating land taken from others on share cropping basis or on other terms.

Owner-cum-tenant holdings are those having owned land and who may or may not be leasing out their own land to others and who may be taking land from others on share cropping basis or on other terms.

Agriculture work

Agriculture work signifies all activities of holder and his/her labour force doing planning, management, and operation of a holding. It includes land preparation, sowing, weeding, harvesting, feeding and tending livestock & poultry, kitchen gardening, supervising agricultural workers, keeping farm records & accounts, preparing agriculture products for marketing (including packaging), repairing farm equipment, constructing farm buildings & fences, and engaging in land reclamation and improvement and other related activities. It excludes home and other family domestic chores.

Area under pond

The pond area remains under water almost through out the year. Normally, households use pond water for various domestic and sometimes agriculture purposes. Ponds are also generally used for fish culture.

In the census the pond area data were collected separately for both single ownership and joint ownership of households.

Area under temporary crops

It is the land area planted to crops having growing cycle or length of life less than one year. These are the temporary crops such as paddy, wheat, jute, cotton, tobacco, sugarcane, pulses, oil seeds, potato, vegetables and other seasonal crops. A list of temporary crops for which data were collected separately was given in back page of "Tally Sheet". The minimum area recorded for a temporary crop was 0.01 acre. Area under temporary crops and temporary-crops net area are equivalents.

Area under permanent crops

It is the land area planted to crops which remain standing for a long period of time and do not need to be replanted after a seasonal harvest. Mango, jackfruit, coconut, guava, lemon, and other fruit varieties are all permanent crops.

Current fallow

It is land brought into cultivation but left out uncultivated in census year for fertility regaining and improvement or for other reasons.

Net cultivated area

This is land area actually cropped during the census year regardless of number of crops grown plus current fallow. It includes areas under temporary and permanent crops and also current fallow.

Permanent fallow

It is land not available for cultivation due to coming into residence and commercial & other uses. Play ground, graveyard, wild shrubs and jungles, marshy land, and the like fall in this category.

Irrigated area

This is area of total land brought under irrigation coverage for growing crops with irrigations done through mechanical or manual means. Irrigated area classifications fall into two categories: (1) surface water irrigation with main water sources being rivers, canals, beels, ponds, and other water bodies; and (2) underground water irrigation with water lifted by shallow tube-wells, deep tube-wells, and country traditional devices. The irrigation equipments are run by electricity, diesel or petrol, or manual labour.

Cattle and Buffalo

Cattle and buffalo heads owned by households on day of enumeration were counted.

Goats and Sheep

Goats and sheep owned by households on day of enumeration were counted.

Fowls, Ducks and Pigeons

Fowls, ducks and pigeons owned by households on day of enumeration were counted.

Temporary crops gross area

Areas aggregated for all temporary crops grown in the census year have made **temporary crops gross area** greater than **temporary crops net area** since the latter has within it the same land cropped more than once in different seasons of a year.

Intensity of cropping

It is percentage of temporary crops gross area in comparison with temporary crops net area. It is expressed as follows:

Intensity of cropping =
$$\frac{\text{Temporary crops gross area}}{\text{Temporary crops net area}} \times 100$$

Cereals

Main cereals are rice and then wheat. Other cereals are jab, barley, cheena, maize, kaun, bajra and joar.

Pulses

Main and common pulses are gram, mung, lentil, arhar, gari kalai, khesari and pea.

Oil seeds

Main oil seeds are rape and mustard, sesamum, linseed, groundnut, soybean, sunflower and castor.

Vegetables

Farmers grow both summer and winter vegetables. Main vegetables are potato, brinjal, raddish, arum, lady's finger, cauliflower, cabbage, bean, tomato, patal, gourd, cucumber, pumpkin, knoll-kal-turnip, dhundal, barbati, khirai, chichinga, carrot, kakrol and sak.

Cash crop

Main cash crops are jute, mesta, sunhemp, cotton, sugarcane and tobacco.

Spices

The main spices include turmeric, ginger, chillies, onion, garlic, corriander, black cumin and ani seed.

Fuel crops

Dhaincha and other smaller plants used as cooking-fue.
