What is London Tramlink?

London Tramlink, part of Transport for London (TfL), manages the Capital's tram network.

The network links Croydon, Wimbledon, Elmers End, Beckenham and New Addington.

Recent developments

In 2012, six new trams were introduced to the network enabling services in central Croydon to be increased from eight to twelve trams an hour.

London's trams are easily accessible for parents with buggies, people with impaired mobility and those carrying luggage. Oyster is accepted on all tram services.

Key facts

- Tramlink has 28km of track, 30 trams in the fleet and 39 stops
- It serves seven mainline stations and more than 50 bus routes
- More than 29 million passengers currently use the service every year – a 45 per cent increase since Tramlink was launched in 2000
