**THE SCORECARD:** The Humane Society Legislative Fund and the Texas Humane Legislation Network publish this Humane Scorecard to assess the support of Texas state legislators on a broad range of animal protection issues. The Scorecard provides an easy way for you to judge how your state senators and representatives have acted on animal protection measures during the 2011 legislative session and helps chart the progress of our public policy work on behalf of animals.

**HOW SCORES ARE CALCULATED:** Many animal protection issues never receive floor votes; some fail in committee and some languish until the end of session, never receiving a vote. To accurately measure legislators' support for animal protection, we scored all House and Senate floor votes and indicated authorship of measures. Scores are given as percentages of the total number of items counted, which varies for each legislator. Members who led as prime sponsor of pro-animal legislation received "extra credit" equivalent to one vote unless they already had a score of 100 – in which case, their scores appear in bold with a plus (+) sign. **2011 Texas Legislation Scored by Humane Society Legislative Fund and Texas Humane Legislation Network**

- HB 716**  
OPPOSE Allows for the aerial gunning of feral hogs and coyotes by landowners.  
• Authors: Rep. Sid Miller and Senator Troy Fraser. SIGNED INTO LAW
- HB 963**  
SUPPORT Ensures that animals seized from persons charged with cruelty to animals are not held in shelters for long periods of time pending an appeal and requires persons convicted of animal cruelty to reimburse the shelter for actual cost of care for the animals during the court process.  
• Authors: Rep. Will Hartnett and Sen. Jose Rodriguez. SIGNED INTO LAW
- HB 1043**  
SUPPORT Prohibits a person from attending a cockfight, owning or training a rooster to fight, owning or selling the knives, gaffs or other weapons used in the fight, and allowing one's property to be used in a fight.  
• Authors: Rep. Wayne Christian and Sen. Eddie Lucio Jr. SIGNED INTO LAW
- HB 1103**  
SUPPORT Allows a judge to order a person convicted of animal cruelty to attend a responsible pet owner course sponsored by the local municipal animal shelter.  
• Authors: Rep. Eddie Lucio III and Sen. Rodney Ellis. SIGNED INTO LAW
- HB 1451**  
SUPPORT Requires licensing and inspection of dog and cat breeders who maintain 11 or more female breeding animals and sell 20 or more animals per year. Provides for licensing, inspection, daily exercise, grooming, rest between breeding cycles, and basic standards of care.  
• Authors: Rep. Senfronia Thompson and Sen. John Whitmire. SIGNED INTO LAW
- HB 1768**  
SUPPORT Allows counties with a population of greater than 450,000 to adopt ordinances to regulate the sale of animals (other than livestock). However, if the county's population is greater than 3.3 million then the county may regulate the roadside sale of all animals.  
• Authors: Rep. Sergio Munoz and Sen. Chuy Hinojosa. VETOED BY GOVERNOR PERRY
- HB 2471**  
SUPPORT Limits civil liability of a person, an animal control agency, or an animal control agency employee who renders aid to an injured or distressed animal from civil action brought as a result of seeking or providing such care.  
• Authors: Rep. Larry Phillips and Sen. Robert Deuell. SIGNED INTO LAW
- SB 279**  
SUPPORT Requires the inclusion of pets and other companion animals in protective orders.  
• Authors: Sen. Wendy Davis and Rep. Jodie Laubenberg. SIGNED INTO LAW
- SB 1301**  
SUPPORT Requires manufacturers of antifreeze and engine coolant to add a bittering agent to the product to render it unpalatable to both children and animals.  
• Authors: Senator Robert Deuell and Rep. Eddie Rodriguez. Passed the House and Senate; failed to pass on concurrence by midnight deadline on last day of session.
