Temple finished the 2005 season by going undefeated in its final five matches



Coming off his second full recruiting season, head coach **David Jones** is hoping that all of his hard work will pay off. Fourteen of the 25 players on the roster are either freshmen or sophomores and about seven of those 14 will probably be consistently in the starting lineup. This may sound like a recipe for disaster for some but Jones is confident that the Owls youth movement will be able to compete against any opponent that they may face. Temple returns last year's leading scorer and A-10 All-Rookie Team member **Charisma Wright** as well as starters **Cori Gallagher**, **Katrina Lynch** and **Tiffany Kasunich**, who led TU to its best finish since the 2002 season.

"We may be young but there is experience in our youth," Jones said.

Goalkeepers

After playing every minute of every game last season, Kasunich returns as the most experienced of the Temple goaltenders. The sophomore stopped 115 shots, ranking her third in the Atlantic 10 and sixth on Temple's single season save list and posted a 71% save percentage. Junior **Liz Tarasevich** returns to the team after sitting out last season due to injury. Tarasevich has appeared in 16 games in her career. **Jamie Dzik** rounds out the goalkeepers. A sophomore transfer from East Stroudsburg, Dzik saw action in nine games for the Warriors, posting three shutouts and a goals against average of 1.56.

Defenders

Senior captain **Trish Dalton** is anxious to return to the Temple backfield after suffering a season-ending injury just three games into the season last year. Dalton has started virtually every game of her career and will be relied upon to settle the team and allow for smooth transitions from defense to offense. Gallagher returns to anchor the defense after starting in all 19 contests as a freshman last season. She was second on the team in scoring,

netting three goals and dishing two assists.

Kamille Edwards, **Kersha Walker** and **Stephanie Schafer** also lend experience to bolster the Owl defense. Edwards appeared in 14 games for Temple last season, starting in three. Walker saw action in 15 games and scored her lone goal of the season in TU's overtime thriller against George Washington, while Schafer started in 16 of 19 matches and took five shots.

Jessica Feinstein and **Casey Zellers** should also continue to see significant time. Both played in half of the Owls' matches last season, netting goals in games against Saint Louis and Delaware State, respectively. **Emily Lamp** is the lone newcomer to the Temple defense. A transfer from Slippery Rock, Lamp played in 12 games at SRU and dished the game-winning assist to lead the team to the 2005 PSAC Championship.

Defenders/Midfielders

Freshmen **Natalie Mell**, **Dana Kerem** and **Carly Metzger** should have an immediate impact on the defensive midfield position. A four-time all-state selection, Mell led Exeter Township High School to back-to-back district finals. Kerem will bring a toughness to the position after spending four years on the Israeli National Team. Metzger led Villa Joseph Marie High School to Pennsylvania state titles in 2003 and 2005 and should be a valuable asset at Temple.

Midfielders

Temple should continue to be strong in its midfield, as the Owls return six letterwinners from last season. Sophomore **Wendy Halina** started in 15 of 19 games last season, ranking third on the squad in scoring with two goals. **Katrina Lynch** made an immediate impact last season as a freshman midfielder. Lynch started in all 19 games, netting one goal and dishing one assist. Jones expects the Philadelphia native to be a strong

force again this season.

Jenna Rankin also returns as a starter from last season. Rankin dished two assists last season, including the game-winning assist against St. Bonaventure. Senior **Darlene Beamon** returns for her second season as an Owl. Beamon started in nine games last season and scored her lone goal of the season against Saint Joseph's to give Temple a 2-2 tie. **Elena Hekimian** and **Debbie Painter** serve as valuable options off the bench. Hekimian saw action in 18 games and dished one assist while Painter played in 16 games and scored the game-winner in TU's match vs. Wagner.

Midfielders/Forwards

The Owls will have a whole new look to their offensive midfield position. **Morgan Rapciewicz** should have an immediate impact on the squad after finishing her Burlington City High School career as the school's all-time leading scorer. The First Team All-South Jersey selection will be relied upon for her physical play and ability to score. **Katherine Schmelz**, a two-time all-conference performer from Saylorsburg, Pa., should provide speed to the Temple offense.

Junior **Jaclyn Fafinski** is the final new edition. A transfer from Monroe County Community College, Fafinski helped her team to back-to-back NJCAA Division I National Championships after scoring eight goals and three assists for 19 points as a sophomore.

Forwards

Wright emerged as TU's top offensive performer last season and, after leading the team with five goals, was rewarded with a spot on the Atlantic 10's All-Rookie Team. She should continue to be a scoring threat in her sophomore campaign.

Senior **Kelly Lare** returns after suffering an injury a year ago. Lare was the squad's leading scorer (three goals) and points (seven) in 2004.

DAVID JONES

HEAD COACH • 4TH SEASON



David Jones enters his third full season, and fourth overall, at the helm of the Temple women's soccer team and is setting his sights on a return to the postseason. After taking over midway through the 2003 season, he is just the third head coach in the program's history, which began in 1991.

In his second full season, Jones led the Owls to a 4-13-2 overall record and a 2-5-2 mark in the Atlantic 10, the squad's best finish since the 2002 season. Temple, led by a talented crop of freshman and sophomores, came on strong at the end of the season, either winning or tying its last five games.

In 2004, Temple posted a 4-14-1 record for the second straight year, but the season was not devoid of several highlights. The Owls topped Lehigh, who reached the Patriot League final, in the season opener and also downed perennial postseason contender, Xavier.

Under Jones, the Owls compiled a 4-10-1 in 2003. Overall, they ended the season 4-14-1 and 2-9-0 in the Atlantic 10 Conference. Jones' positive effect on the team was immediately evident, as Temple posted wins in its first two games with him at the helm.

Before accepting the head position with the women's team, Jones served as assistant coach for the Temple men's soccer team for two seasons.

During that time, he aided in the rebuilding of the men's soccer program, which advanced to the first Atlantic 10 championship game in Temple history in 2003.

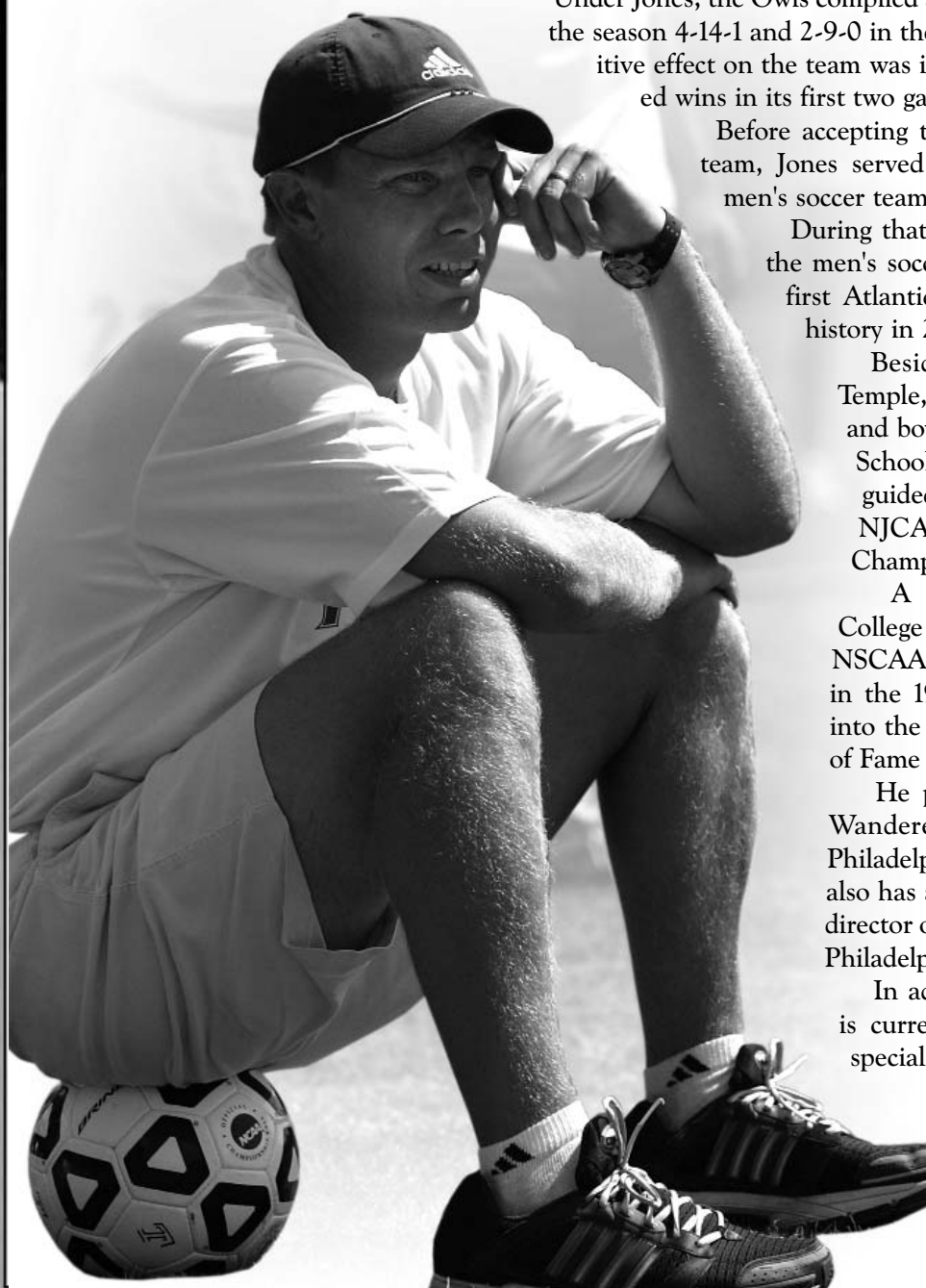
Besides his coaching experience at Temple, Jones has served as both the girls' and boys' soccer coach at North Penn High School (Lansdale, Pa.). Prior to that, Jones guided Gloucester County College to the NJCAA Division III National Championships in 1994 and 1995.

A standout player at Elizabethtown College ('86), Jones was selected to the 1985 NSCAA First All-American team and played in the 1986 Senior Bowl. He was inducted into the Elizabethtown College Athletic Hall of Fame in the fall of 2005.

He played professionally with the Bray Wanderers in Bray, Ireland and the Philadelphia Freedom in the USISL. Jones also has administrative experience, serving as director of sales and player personnel with the Philadelphia Kixx.

In addition to his coaching duties, Jones is currently pursuing a master's degree in special education at Temple.

He and his wife, Heidi, are the proud parents of two children, Claudia (8) and Joshua (4).

KAITLIN ROSS

ASSISTANT COACH • 5TH SEASON



Kaitlin Ross begins her fifth year as an assistant coach with the Temple University women's soccer team. She brings several years of both coaching and playing experience and works primarily with the Owl goalkeepers.

In 2001, Ross served as the assistant and goalkeeping coach for the FC Bucks Under-19 girls team. She also conducted private training for goalkeepers for girls ages 12-17.

A 2002 graduate of La Salle, Ross was a four-year starting goalie for the Explorers. She holds several all-time records including games played, games started, career shutouts, career wins, goals against average and single-season shutouts. She is ranked 22nd in NCAA history in career minutes played by a keeper. Ross served as the team captain in 2001 and was the team MVP.

Ross completed her master's degree in marriage and family counseling at Chestnut Hill College.

Year in Review

Coming off his second full season, **David Jones** led the Owls to a 4-13-2 overall record and a 2-5-2 mark in the Atlantic 10, the squad's best finish since the 2002 season. Temple, led by a talented crop of freshman and sophomores, came on strong at the end of the season, either winning or tying its last five games.

The Owls ran their offense by committee, with 15 of the 25 players on the roster earning a point via a goal or an assist. Freshman **Charisma Wright** paced the Temple attack with five goals, scoring one in each of the last five games. Wright was named to the Atlantic 10 All-Rookie Team, Temple's first honoree since 2002.

Fellow rookie **Cori Gallagher** was second on the squad in scoring with three goals and two assists, while **Wendy Halina** and **Kaitlin Gavaghan** each netted two tallies. Freshman **Katrina Lynch** and **Caitlin Pink** chipped in with one goal and one assist a piece. Senior forwards **Kate Lamplugh** and **Stephanie Vietry** led the team in helpers, each dishing three assists, while fresh-

man **Jenna Rankin** had two.

Freshman goaltender **Tiffany Kasunich** was the anchor of the Temple defense, racking up 115 saves, the sixth best tally on TU's single season save list. The rookie played every minute of every game, posting a 2.36 goals allowed average and a .710 save percentage. She also recorded her first collegiate shutout on September 18 when the Owls defeated Delaware State, 5-0.

Senior **Stephanie Vietry** not only performed well on the field but she excelled off the field as well. Vietry, a finance major, was voted to the Atlantic 10 All-Academic Team, the *ESPN The Magazine/CoSIDA* Academic All District Team and the *Philadelphia Inquirer* Academic All-Area Team after compiling a 3.92 grade point average. The Cranston, R.I. native ended her Temple career second on the Owls' all-time games played list. Vietry saw action in 76 games over her four-year stint.

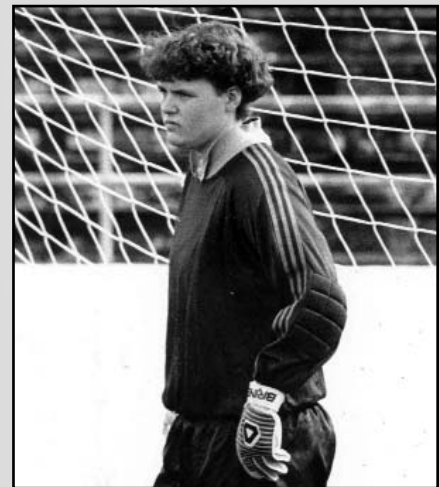

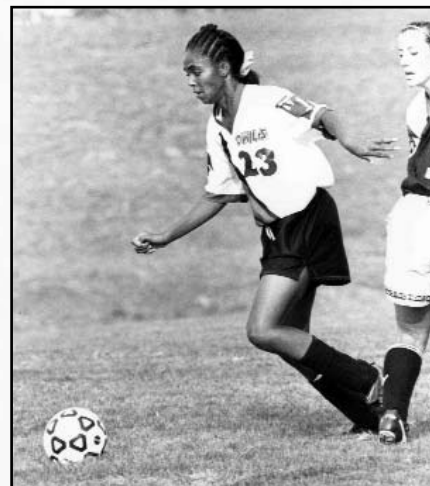
