New Book Selection 2008

Read to Me! is committed to providing families with the very best board books for babies. To ensure we are providing the best and newest books, our book selection committee, a team of experts in the field of children's literature and development, meets every few years to review new books. Our committee uses a book selection policy to ensure the books are developmentally appropriate and culturally inclusive.

The committee looks for books with good rhyme, rhythm, and repetition in the text, books that encourage loving interaction between parent and child, books that have bright colours, and books that are culturally inclusive.

This year the committee looked at a large number of books submitted from publishers across Canada, the United States, and Britain. From these we have selected two wonderful new titles

for the Read to Me! bag. Pat-A-Cake, published by Monarch Books, is a delightful collection of nursery rhymes illustrated by award-winning artist Annie Kubler. Go, Baby, Go! is part of the "Amazing Baby" series and has

bouncing language, beautiful photos of babies, and a place at the back of the book for parents to put a photo of their own little star. Along with these two new books, we will also include Sheree Fitch's *Kisses Kisses Baby-O!* from Nimbus Publishing.

A Bigger Better Bag

In 2006, Read to Me! worked with a team of researchers from the IWK Health Centre to measure the uptake of the program. We wanted to find out what happened to the Read to Me! bags once they left the hospital - were families using the books, were they listening to the CD, were they connecting to their public library? Over 1,000 families were contacted and generously provided information on how they were using their Read to Me! bag and books.

We were thrilled to learn that 92.6% of families were using the books in the bag, and enjoyed reading to their baby. There was very positive feedback on the quality of the books in the bag, and many families told stories of how they couldn't go anywhere without their Read to Me! books. Families told us they loved the books

in the bag but wanted more, more, more books! Families also requested more nursery rhymes and an expanded list of recommended books.

By putting research into practice, we have developed an exciting new bigger, better bag. The new Read to Me! bag will be slightly larger, as parents told us that a larger bag would be more practical for toting books to and from the library. In response to the requests for more books, the new bag will now have three beautiful board books. We will also be including an expanded list of recommended books, more information on reading development and tips for sharing books with babies. Finally, every new Read to Me! bag will have a beautiful cotton Read to Me! hat. Based on our research, we're confident that our bigger better bag will be a big hit for new families across Nova Scotia.
