ABOUT BEAULIEU

- The name Beaulieu means 'beautiful place' in French.
- The National Motor Museum opened in 1972 and even today this building is not large enough to show all of the vehicles.
- Behind the scenes there is a workshop which restores rusty, old vehicles to good-as-new condition.
- As well as the National Motor Museum, Beaulieu is home to Palace House, Beaulieu Abbey, World of Top Gear and the James Bond Experience.

- The monorail is the longest one in the country; it came from Butlin's Holiday Camp in Minehead, and was first opened in 1974 by The Wombles.
- During WW2, the Beaulieu estate was used as a 'finishing school' for the training of special agents who were then parachuted into occupied Europe to work for the resistance.

- The Mini Outspan Orange was made from a special fibre glass body which is built onto a frame of a Mini.

- In real life Rowan Atkinson, who plays Mr Bean is an accomplished historic racing car driver. See Mr Bean's mini on display in the National Motor Museum.
- A veteran car = Any car built up to and including December 1918.
- A vintage car = Any car built between January 1919 and December 1930.

PALACE HOUSE

- Palace House was originally the Great Gatehouse of Beaulieu Abbey.
- Beaulieu was first opened to the public in 1952 with just five cars on show in Palace House reception hall but had to be moved to sheds in the garden when the family objected to the smell of petrol throughout the house.

- The movement of music festivals, such as Glastonbury, began at Beaulieu in 1956 when Lord Montagu held his first outdoor jazz festival on the lawn outside Palace House.
- A ghost in the house, 'The Gray Lady' thought to be Lady Isabella, Countess of Beaulieu, who died in 1976 has been seen several times walking through walls and making a lot of noise.

BEAULIEU ABBEY

- Beaulieu Abbey was the only place in the South of England that offered a permanent sanctuary for criminals; most famous was Perkin Warbeck who was the pretender to throne during the reign of Henry VIII.
- One famous priest at Beaulieu, known as Daddy Powes, said he knew the ghostly monks by name and would hold a candle light mass on Christmas Eve for the monks.

• Arthur Conan Doyle who wrote Sherlock Holmes did paranormal investigations in the Abbey and made many visits to Beaulieu and it is believed he contacted a ghost.
