REUNION OMAHA/OFFUTT-"RETURN TO RECCA" 20-24 SEPTEMBER 2006 PILGRIMAGE COMPLETE!!!



The 25th reunion of *Fightin' Fifty-Fifth* was one more in a line of memorable gatherings of veterans, families and friends of the Association. This one was made more so as the 'old guard' was able to visit the home of the current generation of warriors in the 55th Wing at Offutt AFB, NE.

President and **Reunion Chair Jim Thomas'** attention to every planning detail paid off in a big way as the events flowed and his minions of volunteers made for an enjoyable and varied series of activities appealing to all who participated.

The Embassy Suites staff, led by Annebeth Kearney Black and Beth Groh, could not have been more accommodating. Questions became 'can do', and suggestions were commands as every staff member did not hesitate to make the guests and attendees pleased and comfortable in every manner.

Registration was steady from the git-go on Wednesday the 20th, and at times was hectic, but never chaotic due to the diligent oversight of **Michael Cook**. All told **330** souls signed-in for all or parts of the festivities.

Some came in early and others stayed past Sunday. The weather was atypical for Omaha in September (some rain and coolish temps), but that did not dampen the ardor of getting together with friends and comrades (with the exception of the golfers who got dumped on and had to cancel.)

As always the hospitality area was the focal point with generous hours each day. Having it in adjoining suites allowed the Association to bring in our own refreshments which was a cost savings boon. Bartenders **Kim** and **Amy**, identical twins, kept on top of it all (and also caused some confusion among the revelers who thought they might be seeing double early and often).

The variety of tours allowed participants to see how Omaha has grown and prospered in addition to visiting some of the area's attractions.

Two bus loads made the excursion on I-80 to Lincoln Airpark to see the 55th operations area while Offutt's runway undergoes extensive rehab, and toured an RC-135U Combat Sent aircraft. On the return leg, they visited the former SAC Museum near Ashland, NE, and then had lunch at Mahoney State Park's lodge. While at the Museum **Tom Reed** held forth explaining the operations of the SR-71, which is the focal display in the museum's main entrance atrium.



Others went to the Lauritzen Botanical Gardens, or Boys Town and Village Pointe Mall. Bus commanders **Pete Glenboski**, **Shirley Hoover** and **Carol Moore** rode herd on the various groups and lost nary a person.

The banquet was held on Friday night and featured the Noteables big band component of the ACC Heartland of America Band from Offutt. The ladies and gents were gussied up and on their best behavior for the most part. The Association 'regimental' tie and sparkling 55th pins were in evidence where ever one looked.



Pres Thomas asked the **Reverend Fred Glass**, the Assn ex-officio chaplain, to give the opening blessing, and **Harry Tull** rang the ceremonial bell to begin the program. Thomas recognized the 2005 winner of the **55**th **SRW Association** Award for Excellence, **MSgt Norman De La Vega**, of the 55th Security Forces Sqd (Elite Guard). Since he was deployed once again, his wife **Aneth** was present.

The Assn membership meeting on Saturday morning drew about 150 folks to attend to business.

Pres Thomas gave a state of the Association, and reviewed accomplishments and Board actions since the last reunion. The election of the Board of Directors, and deciding where to have the next reunion in the spring of 2008, among other business, were concluded. The complete minutes of that meeting follows in this newsletter.

Col Don Kelly, the 55th Wing Operations Group Deputy Commander and Assn Board member, presented the Wing's Unit Mission briefing which gave members a full update on how the largest and busiest wing in Air Combat Command conducts its wide, varied and important missions every day.



The wing has diverse operational responsibilities worldwide, but also has been the host unit at Offutt since 1986. In addition, there are component units at RAF Mildenhall, UK; Kadena AB, Okinawa, Japan; Souda Bay, Crete; Davis Monthan AFB, AZ; Salt Lake City, Utah; and Hurlburt Field, FL, all under the command of **BGen Jonathan George**. The wing deployed troops and aircraft to Southwest Asia in 1990 and have been in operations there ever since.

Saturday's afternoon highlight excursion was to Offutt where two buses of "rubberneckers" got to view the many changes at the base; toured the ground simulator area, and Wing HQ building command section and Hall of Fame area.

45th RS Commander and Association Board member, LtCol Ken Bauer had no trouble marshalling volunteers to assist in the Lincoln and Offutt tours. Those troops were Captains Nick Wisnewski and Brandon Pollett, and Lieutenants Wes Cramer, Bobby Wren, and Travis Degan, and SrAmn Jonathan Fruzen. Well done by all hands!

The grand finale of this reunion was the Saturday night informal barbeque held in the spacious Offutt Aero Club Hangar.

The crowd swelled to over 450 as the Association **hosted** over 100 active duty personnel and guests of all ranks and specialties from the Wing. The intermingling of the veterans, families, and the current crop of *Fightin' Fifty-Fifthers* was a rewarding experience the extent of which has not been duplicated to this scale at past reunions.

Hall of Fame Nominations Process

At the reunion membership meeting I put out the call for submissions to the Hall of Fame for the 2007 cycle. Let me address a few more items here and redo that call out. Submissions for the next cycle are due to me **NLT 15 Dec 2006**. That is the latest date that a complete and correct submission can be properly worked to be considered for presentation at the 55th Wing Birthday Ball scheduled next for 31 March 2007. Earlier is better, of course. The Hall of Fame Criteria and Process is available on our website at **www.55srwa.org** linked to Memorandum for Record (#07211047), and later in this edition of the *Videmus Omnia* (pgs 18-19).

Modifications to the process are necessary each year based on the date of the Birthday Ball and changing names of committee members. Applicable changes for this cycle are mail/deliver original package to Jim Thomas, 4418 Anchor Mill Dr, Bellevue, NE 68123. Electronic submissions may be made to JThomas927@aol.com. We will make copies of the package submitted for use by the committee members.

Writing styles, availability of live witnesses, availability of source documents, makes it sometimes problematic when building a package for acts accomplished 40 years ago compared to more recent times. We have standardized the makeup of the package and specified the criteria for eligibility in order to level the playing field and to **prevent** the process becoming "a writing contest". "Just the facts, ma'am. Just the facts."

Pay special attention to para 6 dealing with nominator signature and one additional individual witness and/or supporting documentation. We have a solid program which seeks to recognize the most outstanding contributors to the *Fightin' Fifty-Fifth*

missions...those worthy of our admiration and the admiration of future airman in the wing.

Please check out the new section on our website, Memory Lane. It is a "gold mine" of 55th memories and happenings that are priceless. Furthermore, it is a safe place to store those bits of history. MEMBERSHIP MEETING MINUTES

SATURDAY 23 SEPTEMBER 2006 EMBASSY SUITES DOWNTOWN/OLD MARKET OMAHA, NE

President Jim Thomas called the meeting to order at 0905. He noted that a quorum was present to conduct any Association business.

He called for Secretary **Max Moore** to the read the minutes from the membership meeting at the San Diego reunion in March 2005. Bill Simon moved to dispensed with that reading. Motion was seconded by many and passed. Moore noted for the record that the minutes had been published in the May 2005 *Videmus Omnia* newsletter and was available on the Association web site.

George Miller moved the minutes be approved. Seconded. Motion passed.

Treasurer **Errol Hoberman** gave the Assn financial report as of 1 September. The checking account has \$5083.15; the savings account has \$3471; and a CD has \$10,273.56. **The Association is solvent.** He also reported that there are now 1181 members in good standing.

Sparky Adams moved the reports be accepted. Seconded. Motion passed.

Historian **Robb Hoover** related that a good working relationship had been established with the 55th Wing Historian's office. He reported on the latest in "**Pop" Kaden's** quest to see that all his former crew members were presented DFCs at ceremonies. He commented on the composite CD he had compiled of wing and Association vignettes, which had been showing in the hospitality suite. It was such a popular feature that many attendees wanted to secure copies of the CD. Hoover stated he would make copies and that word would be publicized thru the web site and newsletters when they became available.



Thomas called upon Moore to give a nomination committee report. Moore noted that there were three categories of members on the Board of Directors: permanent members who had opted for that status after being elected four or more times; elected members of which the limits are no less than seven, but no more than eleven; and the two active duty representatives.

He listed the current BoD nominated for election as: Pres Thomas, VPres Ricky McMahon, Secretary Moore, Webmaster Don Griffin, Michael Cook, Joe Gyulavics, Dennis Haun, George Ross, Fox Censullo and Kevin Todd. A new nominee is Larry Utley. Moore added that Treas Hoberman had opted for permanent status after having been elected seven times. He noted that the active duty members Col Don Kelly and LtCol Ken Bauer would remain on the BoD.

Pres Thomas opened the floor for nominations. Cook nominated Pete Glenboski.

Moore was recognized and stated that since there were now 12 nominees for 11 BoD positions, that in the interest of harmony and simplicity, he would opt for permanent status having been elected seven times.

Ham Kennedy then moved the nominations be closed. Seconded and passed. Miller moved that the

slate of nominees for the Board be elected by acclamation. Seconded and passed.

Pres Thomas announced the names of four Association members the BoD deemed worthy of being awarded Life Membership under By Law 7.4 as having "made very special contributions in service or otherwise to the Association". Those are: **Bruce Bailey**, a past leader of the Assn; past president **Sam Pizzo**; past president **Bill Ernst**; and **Jack Kovacs**, the Cold War Memorial Coordinator and Dayton Reunion chair.

Thomas noted that the next reunion in the spring of 2008 needed a site and chairman. Member **Dick Ray** offered to host one in Tampa, FL. VPres McMahon offered to chair one in the Washington, DC-area. Thomas called for a show of hands for each location and Washington, DC, was the favorite by nearly a two to one margin.



The president then reviewed the status and growth of the Association, and noted the many actions since the last reunion in March 2005. They included: the amending of Article VIII and Bylaw 7 to specify classes of membership in the Association; former wing commander **MGen Craig Koziol** was presented a copy of the book "We See All' and sent a framed picture of the new Offutt Cemetery flag/flag pole. The Association participated in that project in September of 2005 and it was dedicated at a ceremony on Veterans Day, 11 November 2005.

The Association was invited to give a briefing at a Wing Stand-up Meeting in March 2006 at which Thomas, Hoover and Moore gave a tag-team synopsis of who, why and what the Assn is. They also told of what it has accomplished and of the several contributions in support of the Wing.

Thomas reported on the dinner the Association hosted for a meet and greet with the incoming wing commander BGen Jonathan George in November 2005. He also told of the success of the *Tales of the Fifty-Fifth* on 31 March 2006, which had the highest attendance to date, including a large active duty cadre. He further reported on the Association's participation and donation to the Wing Birthday Ball, and the Award for Excellence and Hall of Fame presentations that were made at the Ball.

Another donation was to the 55th Fighter Group Memorial dedicated at Wormingford, UK, last summer. The Association and individual members sent a total of \$1500 to support the ceremonies.

Thomas then reported the status of relationship between the Association and the Wing. He noted that dialogues have been proactive with open communication between the local Assn officers and members and the Wing senior staff. He gave specific examples of the Ball, Hall of Fame administration, and input regarding a proposed Offutt memorial project. Thomas remarked that the Association's contributions "have made a difference in the Wing."

Moore commented that the Assn in 1997 had just over 500 members, but now has over 1100. He complimented the effort of Membership Chair Hoberman who initiated a 'we want you back' campaign this year that netted 72 returned members.

Webmaster Griffin reported on the Association web site status, and acknowledged the contributions and untimely loss of his able assistant, **Dave Johnson**. He noted the need to keep up with current technologies, and told of the newly added *Memory Lane* feature.

Cook reported that the reunion attendance for the banquet was 312 and total registration was 330. Thomas noted that today (*Saturday*, 23 Sep) was Offutt Day to culminate the reunion with afternoon tours of the base and the windup BBQ in the hangar to interact with the active duty troops that evening.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 0943.



ELECTION OF OFFICERS

Immediately after the membership meeting, the Board of Directors met to elect officers. Re-elected to the positions were: Pres Thomas, VPres McMahon, Treas Hoberman, Secty Moore.

Pres Thomas then reappointed the following: Awards chair: Thomas; webmaster: Griffin; historian: Hoover; newsletter editor: Moore; membership chair: Hoberman; and McMahon was named chair of the 2008 reunion.

The Association, as of 27 October 2006, had a checking account balance \$4,839.00 after the reunion expenses. Another \$3,473.41 is in a saving account, and \$10,137.33 is held in a CD.

The Association remains solvent.

MEMBERSHIP REPORT

As of 17 October 2006, the Association had **1,108** members in good standing, of which 155 are widows and 34 associated members.

The Association still claims members in all **50 states,** plus Guam, Puerto Rico and APOs in Europe and the Pacific.

The number of **active duty members** continues to rise as interest has picked up due to the Association's exposure to the Wing and at Offutt, the solid support of the Wing senior staff, and as current members continue to recruit.

2006 on <u>your address label</u> means that your dues expire at the end of this year, and you are

still a Regular Member (RM) in good standing. Any other year indicates when your dues will expire, or have already expired.

Dues are payable each January, so if you haven't already done so, renew <u>now</u>.

If your dues expire in 2006, \$10.00 is due for 2007; \$25 will update your membership for three years beyond what now shows as an expiration year.

Please remit dues to 55SRW Association and mail to Errol Hoberman as soon as practical. For those who receive this newsletter via regular post, an Association-addressed envelope is enclosed for your convenience.

New members receive the Association's dualshield lapel pin and the 55thSRW Cold War Memorial coin from 2003 when they join.

Members desiring replacement or additional pins can get them from Errol for \$5.00 prepaid (if you want more than one pin, the cost is just \$3.00 for each additional pin if mailed at the same time; i.e. one pin, \$5, two pins, \$8, three pins \$11, etc.).

Jim Thomas and Max Moore have pins and coins, as well, so members in the Omaha area can get the pins from them for \$3.00 without the postage. Extra memorial coins are \$5.00 each.

The cost is \$65 for each brick, and the engraving is limited to three lines, 13 characters per line including spaces, dashes and slashes (No periods, commas, colons or semicolons or quotation marks. Send us \$100 and you will pay for a brick and get three years' association membership dues extension. Add \$65 for any additional bricks.


The design was inspired by the contrails made during the bomb burst maneuver of the USAF Aerial Demonstration Team, "The Thunderbirds". That team made a dramatic over flight and performed the bomb burst to conclude the event.

There also was a flyby parade of aviation history from a Wright Flyer replica, WWI bi-planes, and in chronological order, historical aircraft up to today's modern fighters and stealth bomber.

The memorial includes two inscribed granite walls, an 8 ft. bronze statue of an "honor guard" of four figures, and a glass wall engraved with a portrayal of the "missing man formation".

The project was fifteen years in the planning, and paid for with a grass roots funding drive that began about five years ago. **The Association** contributed \$1000 to that effort, and no doubt, many members made individual donations to help the memorial come to fruition.

The **Air Force** is the last service to get its memorial.



Warren Alysworth, 86, died 12 October 2006, Empire, MI. Wife Aleta (Deet). Warren was WWII pilot who flew 36 B-29 combat missions in the Pacific. He held many positions during his tenure in the 55th SRW at Forbes AFB, KS, including commanding the 338th and 38th SRSs. He also was squadron ops officer of the 82rd at Kadena in the late 1960s; then served in the Strat Recon Center (SRC) at SAC HQ.

Charleen Barrett, 83, 28 September 2006, Independence, OR; wife of **Burton** for over 65 years. Burt is WWII veteran pilot and long time **55ther**, and is a member of the 55th Hall of Fame.

George L. Danforth, Jr, 86, died 9 August 2006, San Antonio, TX. Wife **Katherine.** A West Point graduate and WWII veteran with 69 bomber missions, including on D-Day. Serving 12 years in the **55**th **SRW**, he was a former commander of the 338th and 343rd SRSs at Forbes.

Patricia Gatewood, 9 August 2006, Ft Walton Beach, FL. She was the wife of **Jack**, a former ops officer and commander of the 38SRS, which flew the airborne command post missions under the **55**th after its move to Offutt AFB, NE, in the late 1960s. He also served a tour as commander, Det 1, 6SW at Shemya AB, AK.

Rita K. Hanson, 87, 10 August 2006, Largo, FL; widow of the late **George**. George and Rita chaired *Reunion One* at El Paso, TX, in 1970.

Grover G. Heiman, 86, 12 October 2006, Washington, DC. A WWII veteran, Grover was a radar nav in the **55**th on 'Pop' Kaden's RB-50 crew for five years in the late 1950s. He later served in the Pentagon until his retirement.

Bruce Heimark, 71, 4 August 2006, Omaha, NE. Wife **Nancy**. Bruce served in the 55th at Offutt as an RC navigator and intel staff officer circa 1970s. He was a Viet Nam veteran with 70 combat missions.

David Johnson, 66, 10 August 2006, Navarre, FL. Wife **Sally.** A veteran EWO in RBs at Forbes, and RCs at Offutt, Dave was in the programs that preceded and became *Combat Sent*.

He also was a computer whiz whose invaluable assistance and contributions to the Association web page were essential to its evolution and quality.

Verna Keener, 90, 30 June 2006; New Cumberland, PA. She was the widow of **Elmer**, a radio operator and navigator on 55th RB-50s stationed at Ramey AFB, PR, Barksdale AFB, LA, and Forbes in the mid- to late 1950s.

Harry C. (Cliff) Newman, May 2003, Palm Bay, FL. A navigator on RB-50s in the 343rd at Ramey in 1953, he later served in the SRC at SAC HQ, and at Beale AFB, CA, in the SR-71 program.

Judy Newman, 24 February 2005, Palm Bay, FL; widow of **Harry**.

William T. (Tom) Nuzum, 27 August 2004, Bellevue, NE. Wife: Marilyn. Tom served in the 55th as a navigator in the 2ACCS flying the EC-135 Looking Glass missions at Offutt.

Horace B. "Bo" Reeves, 25 August 2006. Wife **Yvonne**. Bo was commander at Eielson AFB, AK, from 1962-65 with the original "Office Boy" RC-135D program.

Robert S. Rich, 89, 12 October 2006, Topeka, KS. Wife **Lydia**. An RB-29 and RB-47 pilot in the earliest days of the **55**th **SRW** at Ramey and Forbes, Bob was in the original group of inductees into the **55**th Hall of Fame.

Barbara Schapker, 74, 9 August 2006, Papillion, NE. Wife of **Fred**, a long time 55th EWO in RBs at Forbes and RCs at Kadena and Offutt from the 1960s thru the 1980s.

Harold "Hal" Simpson, 19 July 2006, Yuba City, CA. Wife **Kimi**. Hal was an RB-47 pilot with the **55**th at Forbes and Offutt circa 1959 to 1968.

A CHALLENGE TO ALL RC-135 CREWMEMBERS

Hugh Hunton, LtCol USAF (Ret) Keithville, LA

After attending two great **55 SRW** reunions (Dayton and Omaha), and talking to fellow recon troops, it appears that I have flown operationally (as a navigator) in more models of RCs than any other RC crewmember.

My challenge is this: "Has any one else flown operationally in eight or more different models the RC-135?" My sorties were in the RC-135C, D, E, M, S, T, U and V. Remember, OPERATIONALLY, is the key word.

As a memory jogger, the primary missions of the C, D, M and V models were communications intelligence (COMINT); the E was radar intelligence (RADINT). The S was photo intelligence (FODINT); the U electric intelligence (ELINT); and the T was nuclear intelligence (NUDINT).

Into the Recon Business

On July 1st, 1966, I reported in to **Lt Col Mike Bowen**, commander of project "Office Boy" at Eielson AFB, AK. Confusion was rampant as that was the day of the "Falling Leaves" party. Eighteen out of thirty-six crew members lost their spot promotions via SAC edict!

The primary aircraft of the project was the RC-135D, a "water wagon" tanker that was hurriedly modified for strategic reconnaissance and put into service while waiting for the RC-135Cs to be modified at the Martin plant in Baltimore, MD, for delivery to the 55th SRW at Offutt.

The project also had another mission, flying the RC-135S (*Wanda Bell*) out of the garden spot of the Aleutian Islands, Shemya AFS. Also, a C-135 was assigned to the unit for a short-time flying out of Shemya evaluating a mission to be a sister ship to

the S as a RADINT platform. After the test program, the airplane was returned to E Systems at Greenville, TX, to complete modifications, then returning to Eielson a year later as the RC-135E (*Lisa Ann*).

There were six front end crews flying the D and the S. I flew mostly polar D missions and a few S missions out of Shemya. My crew was selected to go to E Systems and do the acceptance testing of the newly modified E platform. Upon returning to Eielson with the E-model, the unit was upgraded to a squadron (24th SRS, under the 6th Strat Wg), and two more crews were added to cover the extra workload of the E. The mission name for the S was changed from *Wanda Bell* to *Rivet Ball* and the E was changed from *Lisa Ann* to *Rivet Amber*.

Every Recon Guy Gets to Offutt

My next assignment was to Offutt. The "C" model was now operational, and, since I had "polar navigator" stamped on my forehead, the first few months were over the top reconnaissance sorties. Some time during that spring, the 38th NUDINT mission was transferred to the 343SRS and two crews (mine included) were selected to go TDY to Hickam AFB, HI, to observe French nuclear testing while flying the RC-135T. This was a six week on, two week off project that lasted for three rotations in the summer of 1969. The French had 17 events that summer and we got them all!

In 1970, the first U-model arrived. At that time I was on **Dick Hedge's** crew and we did most of the acceptance tests out of Offutt flying along the Canadian/US border against known emitters. Later that year we deployed to Mildenhall AFB, UK, flying the first operational U missions.

Wonderful World of CEVG

After Offutt, I was off to Barksdale AFB, to be a member of the 1st Combat Evaluation Group (CEVG) for the next five years. At Barksdale, we evaluated the RC-135 units at Eielson, Kadena, and Offutt. Also, we were assigned to oversee the flight crew standardization of the U-2, the DC-130 reconnaissance drone program, CH-3 helicopter drone recovery program, all at Davis-Monthan AFB, AZ, and the SR-71 program at Beale AFB. A very interesting job, but that is another story.

In 1976, the 82 SRS at Kadena was disbanded. I was assigned to be the Chief of Reconnaissance Operations, 376 SW. This was a TDY OL with

three crews deployed from Offutt for six weeks at a time, rotating a crew and aircraft every two weeks. The M was, at first, the most deployed aircraft because the backenders were comfortable with the airplane as it was their platform when the squadron and mission were operational out of Kadena.

Eventually, the V started to show up on as regularly as the M, a very high time airframe, went into modification to become a V model. I flew as Mission Commander for many joint SR-71/RC-135/EP3 Orion missions on both the RC-135M and V models. The most notable joint missions occurred during and after the infamous Korean "Tree Chopping" incident.

Epilogue

I started my career navigating KC-97 tankers (Malmstrom AFB, MT), then KC- 135 tankers (Barksdale AFB, LA), then off to reconnaissance (Eielson, Offutt, Barksdale and Kadena), and ended up back in KC-135 tankers (Barksdale AFB). While at Offutt, I Flew one "Looking Glass" sortie, and while in CEVG, I flew on the KC-135Q tanker during several SR-71 refueling missions.

I had one hell of a career, but my 13 years in strategic reconnaissance were the most cherished and rewarding.

55th WING HALL OF FAME

In 2003 the **55thSRW Association** assumed the administrative lead for the selection process of the 55th Wing Hall of Fame. Nominees are solicited each year for induction. Historically, the inductees are announced annually at the 55th Wing Birthday Ball.

That process will continue this year with Association presidential appointed screening and selection committees to complete the process to select the 2007 inductees. Detailed information on the program follows:

HALL OF FAME RECOGNITION PROGRAM

Administered by

55th Strategic Reconnaissance Wing Association

This document establishes the 55th Wing Hall of Fame (HoF) recognition program as administered by the 55th Strategic Reconnaissance Wing Association (55thSRWA or Association). It defines the procedures for nomination and selection of members to the HoF.

<u>Objective</u>: To recognize those former members of the *Fightin' Fifty-Fifth* whose mission accomplishments, contributions, and/or sacrifices standout while performing or providing direct support to the mission of the *Fightin' Fifty-Fifth*.

General: On behalf of the 55th Wing, the HoF program recognizes former members of *Fightin' Fifty-Fifth* for significant mission accomplishments, contributions, and/or sacrifices in support of the mission of the *Fightin' Fifty-Fifth*. HoF induction will occur on an annual basis, with nominations accepted from July through October of each year (when the Ball is in Jan/Feb. Dates are adjusted if Ball is held later). A maximum of two (2) awards (a crew will be considered as one award) may be given in one year. Consideration of nominees does **not** mandate selection to the HoF. In coordination with the 55th Wing, the newest inductees selected for the HoF may be announced during the annual 55th Wing Birthday Ball or other venue as determined by the 55thSRWA in coordination with the 55th Wing.

Selection Process: The HoF final selection will be the end result of two processes:

- 1. The HoF Screening Committee will receive and review all nomination packages and forward those to be considered by the Selection Committee. Nominees for the HoF recognition will be former military members who have served as members of any of the following units: 55th Pursuit Group, 55th Fighter Group, 55th Strategic Reconnaissance Wing and/or 55th Wing. These units are herein referred to collectively as the Fightin' Fifty-Fifth. HoF Screening Committee will be chaired by an Omaha area-based member of the Board and be comprised of at least four Association members in good standing, one of which will be the 55 Wing Vice Commander or his designated representative.
- The Selection Committee will consider all nomination packages forwarded by the Screening Committee and make the final selection recommendations to the 55thSRWA

Board of Directors for their approval. The Selection Committee will be comprised of Chairman of the Awards Committee, Chairman of Screening Committee and not less than three, or more than five, Omaha area-based Association members in good standing, one of which will be the 55 Wing Vice Commander or his designated representative.

Eligibility

- 1. Must have been assigned to the *Fightin' Fifty-Fifth*.
- 2. Mission accomplishments, contributions, and/or sacrifices must have been accomplished while assigned to and performing the mission of the *Fightin' Fifth-Fifth*; or having been assigned to the *Fightin' Fifty-Fifth*, the mission accomplishments, contributions, and/or sacrifices must have had a direct, significant and sustained impact on the accomplishment of the *Fightin' Fifty-Fifth's* mission.

- 4. Assignment Dates Provide assignment history to the *Fightin' Fifty-Fifth* and/or assignment history and nature of relationship in direct support to the mission of the *Fightin' Fifty-Fifth*.
- 5. Narrative Detail specific mission accomplishments, contributions, and/or sacrifices to the legacy of the *Fightin' Fifty-Fifth*.
- 6. Nominations must be signed by nominator and one additional individual who was either witness to

the acts, unyielding service, etc., or someone who can attest to the validity of the nomination. In the absence of an additional signature, the nominator must provide supporting documentation wherever possible to ensure the HoF selection committee can be convinced of the authenticity of the facts forwarded in the nomination.

- 7. Submit nominations to the Awards Chairman, Jim Thomas. Nominations packages with supporting documentation should be sent to him at 4418 Anchor Mill Dr., Bellevue, NE, 68123-1168.


