



# R E P O R T.

### GENERAL HEAD-QUARTERS, STATE OF NEW YORK, Adjutant-General's Office, Albany, December 31, 1872.

## To His Excellency JOHN T. HOFFMAN, Governor and Commander-in-Chief:

SIR.—I have the honor of making the following report from this Department, for the year eighteen hundred and seventy-two.

The excellence of the National Guard in drill, discipline and general efficiency has continued, and it may be safely assumed that never before in its history has it stood higher in reputation or enjoyed in a greater degree the good-will of the people.

In my first annual report, that of 1870, I spoke as follows: "In appearing before the military and finance committees of the Legislature, I took the ground that twenty thousand (20,000) was a sufficient number for the aggregate force of the National Guard, and that, for aiding in its support, two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000) should be appropriated annually, to be paid out of the General Fund of the In urging these views I called attention to the fact that, for State. all the purposes that a standing army could be required by the State, the National Guard answered perfectly well, and that the expense to the State of only ten dollars per man, yearly, was certainly very moderate. Of course, the whole cost of supporting the organization is much more in money alone, but the members of it contribute the balance, as well as give their time and services gratuitously. And in this connection I would remark, that I cannot see how the propriety of exempting them from taxation to a moderate amount, and also from jury duty, can be questioned, for surely it is small compensation for the services they render. The unanimity with which the Legislature and its committees acted upon these matters, thus presented to them, leads me to believe that, if the National Guard will always do justice to itself, there will be no difficulty in keeping up the organization on its present basis, and obtaining from the General Fund of the State two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000) annually, to aid in its support." Further experience strengthened the convictions I

entertained at that time; my whole course of action has been in accordance therewith, and in no respect have I been disappointed. The only question in my mind is, whether the sum appropriated by the State should not be increased; and I must confess that my experience leads me to believe that it should be, to the extent of twenty-five thousand dollars at least.

With all the reductions that have been made during my term of office, the aggregate force still exceeds the maximum provided in the Military Code, and, therefore, further reduction is required. That this can be done without detriment to the service I am fully persuaded, and it is only by reason of the difficulties attending it, which require time to overcome, that the limitation of the law has not yet been reached.

### ORGANIZATION.

During this year the following changes have been made in the organization: One regiment and three battalions of infantry have been disbanded; one regiment of cavalry has been reduced to a battalion, and one battalion of cavalry has been reduced to three separate troops; two battalions of artillery have been reduced to one battery each, and one regiment of infantry has been divided and reformed into two battalions.

At present the National Guard consists of eight divisions, twentyfive brigades, one regiment, one battalion, and nine separate troops of cavalry; twelve batteries of artillery; thirty-seven regiments and six battalions of infantry; and the grand aggregate of the force is twenty-three thousand six hundred and seventy-two (23,672) officers, non-commissioned officers, musicians and privates.

## BREECH-LOADERS.

The fulfillment of the contract with Messrs. E. Remington & Sons for fifteen thousand (15,000) of their breech-loading rifles, of which I spoke in my last annual report, having been completed on their part, most of the infantry organizations of the National Guard have been armed with that weapon in place of the muzzle-loaders; and it is only in those few regiments which have not yet furnished the required security for the new arms that the change has not been made.

#### TARGET PRACTICE.

The Legislature having, at its last session, made an appropriation of twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) to aid the National Rifle

Association in procuring and fitting up a rifle-range, I had hoped that a complete system of target practice would be initiated during the year; but owing to the time that was necessarily taken in selecting the grounds and fitting up the same, and also in changing the arms from muzzle-loaders to breech-loaders, I have been disappointed. An excellent site, comprising some sixty acres of land, has been obtained on Long Island, at a point some thirteen miles from the city of New York and accessible by railroads, and the rifle-range will be in order for use at an early day in the coming season. The law making the appropriation above specified contained provisions for State prizes. to be offered annually by the Commander-in-Chief, but for the reasons already stated it was not deemed expedient to offer those prizes this year. To secure proper instruction in target practice, a number of copies of "Wingate's Manual for Rifle Practice" have been procured for distribution among the infantry organizations of the National Guard. The way having been thus prepared, there is no reason why the National Guard should not excel in target-practice ere long; but these preliminary arrangements were made at so late a moment that nothing further could be accomplished during this year, and, therefore, I have been obliged to leave much to be done in connection therewith hereafter. My appreciation of the importance of target practice is such, that I regret exceedingly that this delay has occurred; but the advantages of that practice are so obvious, that I feel assured that it will no longer be neglected, now that the greatest difficulties have been overcome.

#### STATE MILITARY AGENCIES.

With respect to the business formerly conducted by the State Military Agencies, and which devolved upon this Department on the abolishment of those agencies, I have to report as follows:

The amount of the United States paymaster's checks and treasurer's certificates on hand, January 1st, 1872, was fifteen hundred and thirty-four dollars and thirty-four cents (\$1,534.34). There has been delivered to claimants the sum of one hundred dollars (\$100.00), and the amount remaining to be delivered is fourteen hundred and thirty-four dollars and thirty-four cents (\$1,434.34).

### WAR CLAIMS AGAINST THE UNITED STATES.

These claims have been prosecuted with vigor during the present year, and several clerks have been and are still constantly engaged on

them. In addition to what I have reported heretofore, there have been passed and allowed, by the War and Treasury departments, claims to the amount of five hundred and ninety thousand and sixtythree dollars and twenty-five cents (\$590,063.25), thus making altogether during my term of office one million one hundred and ninetyfive thousand one hundred and fourteen dollars and fifty-four cents (\$1,195,114.54), which cancels the balance of the direct tax and other charges due from this State, and leaves the United States indebted to the State in the amount of two hundred thousand four hundred and seven dollars and eighty-two cents (\$200,407.82).\*

Further installments of claims have been presented, and there is every probability that much more will be recovered.

For detailed information with respect to this matter, reference is made to the report of Colonel J. B. Stonehouse, Assistant Adjutant-General, contained in the Appendix.

#### MILITARY CODE.

The Military Code, re-enacted in 1870, has proved entirely satisfactory for the government of the National Guard, and it is a matter of congratulation that such is the fact; for frequent modifications of the law cause much trouble. By reason of some changes made in the re-enactment of the Code, the present General Regulations need revision, and I have deferred making such revision only because I deemed it important to await the revision of the Army Regulations, which has not yet been completed. When this latter has been accomplished, the revision of those for the National Guard should be made immediately, and thus will be removed an embarrassment which now exists and causes some confusion. The only provision of the Military Code which has been contested in the courts is that relating to imprisonment for the non-payment of fines, and that provision has been fully sustained by a recent decision of the Court of Appeals. Justice Peckham's opinion, delivered in that court, will be found in the Appendix.

#### SOLDIERS OF THE WAR OF 1812.

The Legislature, at its last session, passed a bill relating to the soldiers of the war of 1812, which became a law, and the first section of which reads as follows:

"The Adjutant-General is hereby authorized and required to hear

and determine the claim of any soldier of the war of (1812) eighteen hundred and twelve, and upon proof that would have entitled him to a certificate under the act, chapter five hundred and ninety-seven of the Laws of eighteen hundred and fifty-seven, shall issue to said soldier a certificate, such as provided for in said act, for the amount due, which certificate shall have the same force and effect as if issued under said law, but no obligation to pay the same is hereby created against the people of this State."

Under this act ten claims were received, and certificates have been issued in compliance therewith, as follows: To soldiers themselves, seven, amounting to three hundred and seventy-three dollars and seventy-five cents (\$373.75); and to widows, three, amounting to one hundred and fifty-one dollars (\$151).

#### Conclusion.

In closing this, my final report, it would be doing great injustice to my own feelings were I not to speak in unqualified terms of praise of the National Guard as a whole, for it is indeed an organization of which the State may well feel proud. Whatever success has been attained during my administration of its affairs, may be fairly attributed to the active zeal and co-operation of its officers and the good-will of all its members. In parting from them I do so with much regret, but with the greatest confidence that their interest and exertions will not abate, and that therefore the present high standing of the National Guard will be maintained.





# **REPORTS OF DIVISION AND BRIGADE COMMANDANTS.**

# HEAD-QUARTERS FIRST DIVISION N. G., S. N. Y., NEW YORK, December 1st, 1872.

GENERAL.—In conformity with paragraph 528, General Regulations, I have the honor to report the following parades and meetings during the year ending with the date of this report:

July 4, 1872—Parade of the division.

Oct. 10, 1872—Parade of the division and review by his Excellency the Commander-in-Chief.

Nov. 12, 1872—Meeting of officers pursuant to provisions of paragraph 534, General Regulations.

Sept. 11, 1872—Review and inspection of Second Brigade at Prospect Park parade ground.

Of the result of the annual inspections, although the official returns are not all received, sufficient is known to make it certain that the division has gained both in the *aggregate* and *present* since the previous inspection.

The condition of the various armories, to which I referred in my last annual report, have in most instances been improved, and several of the organizations have since then been provided with more suitable quarters. There are still, however, a few of the commands poorly quartered and suffering for the want of proper drill-room facilities. This most urgent want of the troops I hope, however, to see fully supplied before the commencement of the next drill season.

The location of the division parade ground, authorized by chapter 628 of the Laws of 1871, is now so far advanced as to require only the confirmatory action of the Board of Commissioners of the Department of Public Parks to consummate it. The site recommended is on the Harlem river side of the island, nearly opposite Inwood station on the Hudson; and though in point of accessibility not all I could wish for, is yet within the limits of the city, and, taken all in all, the best that could be chosen, without involving too large an outlay of money. When completed it will supply a want long felt by the National Guard of this city, giving opportunities for division and brigade evolutions not hitherto possessed.

With the commencement of next spring the new rifle range at Creedmoor, Long Island, under the management of the National Rifle Association, will be completed, affording the troops of this division facilities for perfecting themselves in target practice and in becoming good marksmen. This, the arming of the troops with an improved weapon, the new parade ground and the adoption of the new manual for rifle practice, should combine to infuse new life and energy into the organizations whose privilege it will be to enjoy these advantages; and I confidently expect to see the standard of excellence, in this division of the National Guard, materially elevated thereby.

I deem it my duty to again invite the attention of the Commanderin-Chief to that part of my annual report for the year ending December 1st, 1870, recommending the arming of one of the foot batteries of this division with Gatling guns, which recommendation was reiterated in my last annual report. The arguments then used in recommending this improvement still hold good, and are emphasized by the almost universal adoption of the mitrailleuse by those nations most progressive in the arts of war.

# HEAD-QUARTERS, THIRD DIVISION, N. G., S. N. Y., TROY, N. Y., December 2, 1872.

GENERAL.—In accordance with the requirements of paragraph No. 528, General Regulations, I have the honor to report that during year ending with this date the following parades of troops of this command were made pursuant to orders from these head-quarters.

September 19th—Reviewed at Schenectady the troops of the Thirteenth Brigade, Brig.-Gen'l E. A. Brown commanding. It was my intention to have inspected this command, but a heavy rain storm came up during the review, completely drenching the troops, and I was compelled to postpone the inspection indefinitely. This com-

mand is finely uniformed and well disciplined, and mow that they have possession of their new armory at Schenectady, giving them quarters equal to any in my command, I shall look for a marked improvement in both officers and men.

October 1st-Reviewed and inspected the Tenth Brigade at Troy. This brigade is commanded by Brig. Gen'l Alonzo Alden, and is quite small in numbers, but the discipline is good, and the proper spirit of pride and emulation so essential to success seems to exist.

My entire command is now in fine condition, and have good quarters. The recent improvements made in the armories have encouraged the officers and men, and most of them having received the breech-loading rifle feel justly proud of their new arms, and I am confident of my ability one year from this time to report a decided improvement.

GENERAL.—In conformity with paragraph No. 527, General Regulations, I have the honor to forward "Report of Evolutions" practiced in this brigade for the year ending December 1st, 1872.

The field officers and adjutants of regiments, and the brigade staff, were assembled for theoretical instruction at the armory of the Twenty-second Infantry, on the 7th day of June, at which time the proposed evolutions for the brigade field day were thoroughly explained and illustrated.

The brigade was paraded for review and instruction on the 10th of June, at Tompkins square; the review was received by the brigade commander, and was according to form No. 2. After the review the following evolutions were executed:

Movement by Battalion.—From line of battalion columns doubled in the center at half distance, to form two lines faced to the right. Face to the rear; advance in line of battle; halt and repeat.

Movement by Battalion.—Change front forward on right company.

Movement by Battalion.—Face to rear; change front forward on right company faced to the left. By division right wheel, first line close en masse, second line on fifth division, fifth battalion close en masse (first line moved by the left flank into column formed by second line); march by the left flank; march by the right flank; halt and align column of fours; form column of fours, in two lines on first and third battalions; left front into line. Close column by division on first division; first battalion, right in front.

To the left line of masses (battalions change direction by the right flank).

Advance in line of masses under cover of line of skirmishers. Dismissed.

The brigade made the usual fourth of July parade under orders from division head-quarters.

The several regiments comprising the brigade were inspected as follows:

Twelfth Infantry, October 7th. Twenty-second Infantry, October 8th. Sixty-ninth Infantry, October 10th. Seventy-first Infantry, October 9th. Seventy-ninth Battalion Infantry, October 30th, and First Battalion Cavalry, October 14th, and report of same made and forwarded by Major Hall, Brigade Inspector.

This brigade was reviewed by the Commander-in-Chief, together with the brigades comprised in the First Division, on the 10th of October.

I subjoin "Consolidated Report" of the brigade for parades, etc., during the year 1872.

GENERAL.—In compliance with paragraph 527, General Regulations, I have the honor to forward herewith the reports of the commandants of the regiments in my command, of manœuvres and exercises practiced in their regiments during the past year, and also report the following parades and exercises of this brigade:

On the 22d February, 1872, this brigade paraded in New York, in honor of the birthday of George Washington.

July 4th, 1872, the brigade paraded with the First Division in New York city.

On September 11th, 1872, this command proceeded to Prospect Park, Brooklyn, L. I., for field practice. Owing to the distance of the parade ground from New York city, and the trouble in getting transportation for the troops, it was quite late in the day before they could be assembled for Brigade drill.

The following manœuvres were, however, practiced:

1. Advance in line of battle.

- 2. Change front to rear on right companies.
- 3. March in column of battalions.
- 4. Close in mass on left division.

5. Change direction by the left flank.

6. Deployments.

7. Change front forward on left companies.

8. From line of battle to column of masses on Third Battalion, right in front.

9. From column of masses to line of masses on the Fifth Battalion.

After these movements the brigade was reviewed by Major-General Alexander Shaler, commanding First Division, when the troops returned to New York.

On 10th October, 1872, the brigade paraded for inspection and review by His Excellency John T. Hoffman, Commander-in-Chief.

From October 22d to October 29th the different regiments of this command were inspected and mustered by the Brigade Inspector, to which I gave my personal attention, and am pleased to say that I find an improvement both in strength and discipline.

## General FRANKLIN TOWNSEND, Adjutant-General, S. N. Y.:

GENERAL.—I have the honor to report the troops of this command well in hand, and materially improving in all that makes the soldier.

Three companies of the Eighty-third Regiment paraded May 29th (Decoration day), at Amsterdam, and the balance of the regiment at Schenectady, May 30th, for the same occasion. The entire regiment paraded at Amsterdam on the 4th of July, and again, three days, at the annual inspection and review (September 17th, 18th and 19th), when they were put through the evolutions of forming to and on the right, and to and on the left, and street firing, advancing and retreating, with many other evolutions performed under the colonel commanding, all satisfactory to the general commanding, except street firing, which will be hereafter continued until more proficiency is attained.

On the 19th of September, at Schenectady, the command was reviewed by Major-General Carr, commanding the division (third), apparently to his satisfaction, when the whole command, after a street march and passing review, were marched to their quarters and dismissed for 1872, except in emergency.

Adjutant-General, State of New York, Albany, N. Y.: GENERAL.—I have the honor to transmit herewith the consolidated inspection return of the several regiments comprising the Second Brigade N. G., S. N. Y., and to submit the following as the report of my inspection and reviews, made in compliance and in accordance with orders from Brigade Head-quarters.

#### THIRD REGIMENT CAVALRY.

Reviewed and inspected this regiment at Tompkins square, in the city of New York, on the 22d day of October, 1872.

The marching in review was fair; the salutes were fairly given; the drill and discipline need improvement.

This command should be furnished with revolvers.

The arms and accoutrements were in good condition, with the exception of some of the saddles and a great many of the saddlegirths, which were entirely unfit for use. The armory is unfit for the use of a cavalry organization, as the rooms are dark and damp and without ventilation.

The regimental books and records are in very good condition, well written up and complete. Of the company books great improvement has been made since the last inspection, with the exception of "E" troop.

## FIFTH REGIMENT INFANTRY.

Reviewed and inspected this regiment at Tompkins square, in the city of New York, on the 23d of October, 1872.

The marching in review was fair, and the salutes were well given, with but few exceptions.

This regiment, having recruited a great many new members but a few months before inspection, did not exhibit so much improvement in drill and discipline as might have been expected.

The arms and accoutrements are all in good condition, and well cared for. This command has but four hundred (400) Remington breech-loading rifles, and should be supplied with three hundred (300) more as speedily as possible.

The armory is clean, but poorly ventilated, and this regiment should have another armory, more suitable.

The regimental books and papers were all in good condition and properly written up, and are an ornament to the regiment.

The company books and papers also were all in good order and well written up. The commandants of companies "A," "C" and "F" deserve great credit for the efficient manner in which their books and papers are written up.

#### SIXTH REGIMENT INFANTRY.

This command was ordered by General Orders No. 13, from Brigade Head-quarters, to parade for inspection and review on October 24th, but the order was countermanded by Special Orders No. 54, from Brigade Head-quarters, to assemble for inspection at the State Arsenal on the 31st October at 8 o'clock P. M.

The marching in review was poorly executed and the salutes poorly given, with but one or two exceptions. The major of the regiment conducted the review, and gave clear evidence of being totally ignorant of the duties of his position.

This regiment shows no improvement since the last muster, and needs great improvement in both drill and discipline. The arms and accoutrements are all in good condition.

The regimental books and papers are correctly kept.

The company books are all in good order and properly written up, with the exception of companies "D" and "K," who did not present any books for inspection.

I would respectfully recommend that the commandant of "K" company be ordered before a court-martial, as he seems to ignore entirely the welfare of his command, and is unfit for the position he holds.

### ELEVENTH REGIMENT INFANTRY.

This regiment was mustered and inspected at their armory in Delancey street on the 24th of October, 1872, in consequence of the unfavorable condition of the weather.

The regiment presented a good appearance, but did not exhibit any improvement in drill and discipline, as might have been expected, and the entire command need great improvement.

The armory is entirely unfit for the use of this command, and they should have another armory as speedily as possible.

The arms and accoutrements are all in good condition, and well cared for.

The regimental books and papers are all well and correctly kept. Companies "A" and "K" did not present any books for inspection.

### EIGHTY-FOURTH REGIMENT INFANTRY.

This regiment was ordered, by General Orders No. 13 from Brigade Head-quarters, to parade for muster and inspection at Tompkins square, in the city of New York, on October 28, 1872, at 2.30 o'clock P. M., but was countermanded by Special Orders No. 53, to assemble for inspection at the State arsenal on October 28, 1872, at 8 o'clock P. M.

The review was poor, and the salutes but fairly given.

The appearance of the men, and their drill and discipline, can be greatly improved.

This regiment has a good armory, and the arms and accoutrements and other State property are well cared for.

The regimental books and papers are all correctly written up, except the rosters, which the Adjutant has not yet prepared, as promised at last inspection.

The company commandants presented only their descriptive books, which were all correctly written up.

Companies "A" and "E" did not present any books for inspection.

### NINETY-SIXTH REGIMENT INFANTRY.

Reviewed and inspected this regiment at Tompkins square, in the city of New York, on the 29th of October, 1872.

The review was well conducted; the salutes were but fairly given.

The regiment showed some improvement in appearance, but the drill and discipline can yet be greatly improved upon.

The arms and accoutrements are all in good condition, but the armory is so badly ventilated, and the drill-room where the arms are kept is so dark and damp, that it is almost impossible to keep the arms and other State property free from rust and mould, and the regiment should be furnished with another armory as soon as possible, as the present one is entirely unfit for any military organization.

The regimental books and papers were all correctly kept, except the indorsement book, which the Adjutant promised should be at once prepared.

The company books were all properly kept and written up.

I inspected and mustered Brigadier-General Augustus Funk and staff on the 23d day of October, 1872, at Tompkins square, in the city of New York.

There were five of the staff absent: the Judge-Advocate, the Assistant Adjutant-General, the Surgeon, the Commissary of Subsistence and the Senior Aide de Camp.

They presented a creditable appearance; the uniforms, arms and equipments are in accord with the Regulations. The Brigadier-General and a portion of his staff were present at each of the inspections.

I would respectfully state that with but few exceptions the officers of the several regiments of this command have not improved either

in drill or discipline since the last inspection. Some of them are incompetent to perform the duties of their positions.

It is also respectfully submitted that the season for the inspections be changed to the spring of the year, instead of holding them in the fall, and that new armories be given to several regiments of this command.

All of which is respectfully submitted.

I have the honor to report that the inspections were quite satisfactory, showing that the several commands were in good condition as a rule, and showing evidence that their commanding officers had not neglected to maintain a high standard of instruction and discipline.

After a minute inspection of the books and records of the several commands, I beg leave to report that those of the Separate Troop Cavalry, 13th Regiment and 15th Battalion were in a highly satisfactory condition. Concerning the books and records of the 28th Battalion, I deem it my duty to report that they approach very nearly perfection. To the labors and ability of the Adjutant of the command, 1st Lieutenant Albin Gustave Pape, this is largely due, and I take pleasure in respectfully directing your special attention to his praiseworthy efforts. At the inspection of the books and records of the 14th Regiment (Infantry), no Head-quarter books or records of any kind were produced, and but four of the company commanders were present. It is to be regretted that in a command with the record of the Fourteenth, and the esprit du corps that prevails among its rank and file, that so much of neglect should be displayed at its Headquarters.

I have the honor to respectfully direct your attention to the totally inadequate armory occupied at present by the Thirteenth and Fourteenth Regiments, which is not only unsafe, but unfit for the occupation of self-respecting national guardsmen.

Pursuant to law I have the honor to submit the following report of the annual muster and inspection of the Eighth Brigade for 1872.

The muster rolls and inspection returns have been this day forwarded by express.

The Eighth Brigade is now composed of the Twentieth and the Twenty-first Regiments only, the Eighty-sixth having been mustered out within the last year as per order from General Head-quarters.

The annual inspection and review of the Twentieth Regiment took place at Kingston on the 22d day of October, 1872, commanded by Col. W. A. Van Rensselaer, and was reviewed by Brig.-General George Beach, accompanied by his staff. This regiment does not fill up or advance, as I had reason to suppose it would, there being but six companies in the field. The commanding officer having seen much service in the late war, and being a very competent military officer, I can see no reason why his regiment cannot be made, with the proper exertion, one of the best in the State.

The Twenty-first Regiment, consisting of ten companies, Colonel James Smith commanding, was inspected by me at Poughkeepsie, on the 23d day of October, 1872. They were reviewed by Brigadier-General George Beach, accompanied by his staff. This regiment is in good condition, uniformed complete, and, having been supplied with the new Remington rifle, make a fine appearance; and I have no hesitation in certifying, as expressed in my remarks annexed to each of the muster rolls of this regiment.

## Adjutant-General :

GENERAL.—Pursuant to instructions, I have the honor to submit the following report of the annual muster and inspection of this brigade for 1872. The complete "muster rolls and inspection returns" have been this day forwarded per express. The first inspection was that of the Howitzer Battery, which took place September 30th, 1872. This organization shows a decrease of twelve, which is owing to further dropping from the rolls of dead material. Total strength at present muster is forty-seven men; thirty-six were present and eleven absent, showing the same number present as last year. This battery is in splendid condition and shows good working material and is in good discipline; the general appearance fine. The uniforms, arms and equipments are in the best of order.

The Separate Troop Cavalry was inspected in the afternoon, October 25th, 1872, at two o'clock. This organization shows a slight decrease in totals and in present. Total strength at present muster is sixty-five men; fifty-three were present and twelve absent. The uniforms are in excellent condition, the equipments and arms in good order, although, as mentioned in last year's report, in need of additional revolvers; the general appearance was very good.

The Thirty-second Regiment, Colonel Roehr commanding, was inspected in the afternoon, 25th day of October, 1872, immediately after the Separate Troop Cavalry, and at the same place. This regiment consists of eight companies, and has a total strength of 385 men; 326 were present at inspection, and fifty-nine absent, showing a loss of thirteen men in totals, and fifteen men loss in the present over last year. The uniforms and equipments were in excellent condition, as also the arms. The review was standing, and well conducted as far as accommodation would allow.

The Twenty-third Regiment, Colonel Ward commanding, was inspected October 28th, 1872, in the afternoon, at Fort Greene, immediately after the laying of the corner-stone of this organization's new armory; Brigadier-General James McQuade receiving the review, which was standing and well executed. This organization shows a steady increase, and consists of nine companies, and has a total strength of 558 men; 460 were present and ninety-nine absent, which shows a gain in total strength of fifty-six men, and also fiftynine men present at muster over last year. The uniforms and equipments are in excellent condition, as also the arms. This regiment is the only one in the Second Division that inspects with knapsacks and over-coats rolled, which adds greatly to their general appearance.

The Forty-seventh Regiment, Colonel David E. Austin commanding, was inspected October 29th, 1872. This organization now consists of nine companies, the letter "K" company having been mustered in February last. The total strength at present muster is 498 men; 396 were present and 102 absent, which shows a total gain of eightynine men in strength. The uniforms and equipments, as also the arms, are in excellent condition. The review was well executed, with company distances well preserved.

The armories of the several regiments inspected I have found in good order and condition.

The Eleventh Brigade N. G., S. N. Y., shows an increase in total strength of 116 men, and also a gain of eighty-two men present at muster and inspections over last year.

GENERAL.—In compliance with section 153 of the Code, I have the honor to report that the regiments of infantry and the battery composing the Twenty-eighth Brigade were ordered to parade for inspection, muster and review, as per General Order No. 45, Headquarters Twenty-eighth Brigade; the Fiftieth Regiment of Infantry and Ithaca Section of Battery at Trumansburgh, October 23d, 1872, and the Forty-fourth Regiment of Infantry and two Sections of Battery at Binghamton, October 29th, 1872.

Colonel Geo. H. Houtz, commanding Fiftieth Regiment, ordered his command into camp at Trumansburgh, October 22d, where they remained until the 25th of October. I was present during the encampment, and, in compliance with the above-mentioned order, inspected and mustered the regiment on the 23d of October, but the day proving stormy the review was postponed until the next day, the 24th, when the regiment was reviewed by Brigadier-General Henry D. Barto, accompanied by his entire staff. The regiment made a very creditable appearance in drill and discipline, and also in numbers, considering that the term of service of a large number of the men expired in 1871.

The Ithaca Section of Battery not having received their uniforms in time for the inspection were excused from parading until the 15th November, at which time they were inspected and mustered at Ithaca, and made a fine appearance.

The Forty-fourth Regiment of Infantry and two Sections of Battery were reviewed by Brigadier-General Henry D. Barto, attended by his staff, on the 29th of October, and were at the same time inspected and mustered. This regiment is getting new uniforms, but at the time of inspection they had received only enough to uniform two companies, and some of the out-town companies, expecting to receive new uniforms, came in citizens' clothes, so that the regiment did not make a very good *military* appearance. The furnishing of two of the companies, to the exclusion of others, caused some dissatisfaction, which tended to lessen the number present. On the whole, the regiment made a fair appearance, but, as will be seen by the annexed return, the small number present in proportion to the number of names on the rolls shows something wrong somewhere. The Battery made a fine appearance, but did not parade with their pieces.

From the State Museum of Natural History we have received some thirty-nine articles of war interest.

General Orders from the several military departments of the United States, and county papers from the State, have also been received.

These donations to our library, portrait gallery, or museum of relics, are each valuable in their place.

Manuscript history, both personal and regimental, military statistics, of town and county, have been gathered for future reference, or carefully copied to serve the historian of to-day.

There have been newly classified, during the year, some thirteen hundred personal military histories, while the reclassification of the whole department of such records, consisting of nearly 140,000 biographical sketches, has greatly increased our facilities for ready reference in our search for the soldier's personal service.

The number of visitors to the bureau during the year 1872 we would estimate at about 28,000, number registered 8,700; and when we consider that these memorials are no longer a novelty to excite interest, these figures will compare favorably with those of any preceding year, and give renewed evidence that in the hearts of a grateful people is still cherished the valor of New York's heroic sons.

As with the close of this year closes your official relations in connection with the bureau, it is with pleasure I recall your constant judicious care over it.

Your prompt and thoughtful suggestions to the Legislature of 1870, in relation to the loaning of our war-worn flags, has, in many instances, been wisely acted upon in the past, and will, I trust, be remembered in the future.

In your constant watchfulness over these sacred mementoes, you have ever shown to the soldier the kindest consideration, thus evincing your warmest patriotic sympathies and earnest appreciation of his noble sufferings and sacrifices in our country's struggles for nationality.

The "Manual for Rifle Practice," by Geo. W. Wingate, except in so far as it conflicts with the "Manual for Loading and Firing the Remington Breech-Loading Rifle, New York State Model," prepared by Brevet Major-General James McQuade, Inspector-General (which has already been adopted), is hereby approved and recommended as a suitable guide to instruction in the use and care of the arms now being issued to the National Guard of this State.

General Orders, ( No. 23.

The Court of Appeals having, by recent decision, affirmed the constitutionality of the imprisonment clause in the Military Code in the case of "The People ex rel. Edward Underwood, Applts., v. Edward S. Daniell, Major, etc., Respt.," the following extracts from the opinion delivered by Justice Peckham are published for the information of the National Guard :

Appeal from the judgment of the General Term in the second department of the Supreme Court, affirming the proceedings of the Court-Martial of which the defendant was president.

The Court-Martial tried the relator for not attending certain parades or drills, some five of them, and sentenced him to pay a fine of eighteen dollars in all, as provided by statute. (1 Sess. Laws of 1870, p. 270, section 207.)

The relator, upon being personally summoned, appeared before the court and denied its jurisdiction, upon the ground that the act of 1870, under which it was organized, was unconstitutional, demanded a trial by jury and also that he be allowed

to appear by counsel. His objections were overruled, and the delinquencies having been proved, that tribunal found him guilty of the charges and imposed said fines. The president subsequenlly issued the precept or execution to commit the relator to jail in default of property to satisfy the amount.

It is insisted that the act establishing this military court is unconstitutional and void, that these are not local courts. The argument is based upon the Judiciary Article of our State Constitution, adopted in 1869, which modifies the courts generally as then established, and then authorizes the Legislature to establish "inferior local courts" of civil and criminal jurisdiction; thus, by implication, prohibiting the establishment of any other. (Article 6, section 19.) The existence of this military court is also claimed to be in violation of various provisions of the Constitution as to the rights of the citizen.

It is singular, if there be force in these objections, that they should never before have been presented, so far as we know, to any court, although the legality of the proceedings of these tribunals has been often assailed in the courts.

The provisions of each Constitution of our State on this subject have been substantially the same. The fact then that they have thus stood unquestioned for nearly a century is clear evidence of the opinion of the bar as to their constitutionality.

The several Constitutions of this State afford at least negative evidence that these tribunals were not aimed at in any provision to abolish or modify any court. I have no doubt, though I have not taken the trouble to examine, that these tribunals were authorized by statute while this State was yet a colony, certainly within ten years after the adoption of the first Constitution, viz. : in April, 1786, they were authorized under an act to "regulate the militia." (1 Laws of N. Y., Green ed., 227.) Modified in various ways by statute, they have continued ever since.

When the subsequent Constitutions were framed, these tribunals, plainly authorized by statute, were in the open, continued exercise of their authority, yet not a word is found either in the Constitutions of 1821, 1846, or in the Judiciary Article adopted in 1869, abolishing or modifying them in terms or by plain implication.

But when, in either of them, existing courts were abolished or modified, it was done by plain, express provision.

The failure to modify or abolish these tribunals, in the manner adopted as to other existing courts, is evidence that no such abolition was intended.

A change so radical as the total abolition of these military tribunals, thus plainly authorized by statute, and which have existed in civilized nations almost from time immemorial, would scarcely have been left to uncertain implication.

It is fair to infer that the convention, knowing of the existence and use of these military tribunals, intended to leave them to be regulated by law. (Livingston v. the Mayor of N. Y., 8 Wend., 102; Beekman v. Saratoga and Schenectady R. R. Co., 3 Paige. 75; In re Smith, 10 Wend., 450.)

No discussion or proposition for their abolition was heard of in the Convention that framed the present Judiciary Article of the Constitution, and it is clear that the Convention did not intend to abolish them.

There is also an affirmative recognition in the Constitution of these tribunals. The Constitution declares that "the militia of this State shall, at all times hereafter, be armed and disciplined, and in readiness for service." (*Article* 11, section 1.)

(This provision is contained in all the Constitutions of our State.)

It also provides that no person shall be held to answer for a capital or otherwise infamous crime, unless on indictment, "except in cases of the militia when in actual service, and the land and naval forces in time of war, or which this State may keep, with the consent of Congress. in time of peace. (Article 1, section 6, Constitution of 1846.)

These provisions recognize the existence of Courts-Martial. They are a necessary incident to the "discipline" of the militia, though not regarded as courts of justice within the prohibition of the Constitution. (In re Smith, 10 Wend., 449.)

The provision in each Constitution, requiring the militia to be disciplined, implies that there must be some tribunal to enforce it. For that purpose there has never been any other than these military tribunals, and there is nothing in either Constitution that manifests an intent to abolish them.

In re Smith, supra, the question of the constitutionality of the law allowing a medical society to try a member, was raised against the action of the medical society in trying Smith for an alleged misdemeanor. The court held it to be mere discipline, and that that tribunal was not exercising the usual jurisdiction of ordinary courts of justice, and was therefore not within the prohibition against new courts.

Nor is this statute in conflict with the provisions of the Constitution, declaring that "no member of this State shall be disfranchised or deprived of any of the rights or privileges secured to any citizen thereof, unless by the law of the land or the judgment of his peers." (Article 1, section 1.)

Nor with the provision that "no person shall be deprived of life, liberty or property, without due process of law." (Article 1, section 6.)

In their substance I think they are in harmony.

These provisions in the Constitution are very ancient and have always been the law of our State, and I believe no court has ever yet questioned the right of these tribunals to exist, and to exercise their authority within its proper limits.

It is also urged that this statute is in conflict with the provision of the Constitution that "the trial by jury, in all cases in which it has been heretofore used, shall remain inviolate forever." (Article 1, section 2.)

It is urged that it is "at least in conflict, in that it authorizes the arrest and imprisonment of the delinquent."

This provision of the Constitution is much like those just before considered.

These constitutional objections were all raised in In re Smith, supra, and in the other cases cited and held not to apply.

That this act authorizes the arrest and imprisonment of the delinquent upon the execution, has nothing to do with the right of trial by jury.

If the judgment be right, the Legislature has the undoubted authority to declare whether the delinquent may be imprisoned if the officer fail to find sufficient goods.

By two acts of 1846 the Legislature declared that, in certain cases, he should not be imprisoned. By the statute of 1870 they enacted that he might be, in certain cases; and the Legislature of 1870 had the same power as that of 1846.

The judgment is affirmed.

The encampment of the Seventh Regiment, Colonel Emmons Clark, at Saratoga Springs, in the month of July last, demonstrated the utility of a properly conducted system of encampments. In a former report I made some strictures upon the objectionable features of ordinary encampments, but said: "If encampments could be held remote from cities and large villages; if the men could be induced to remain during the entire period assigned, and would discharge their duties as soldiers faithfully, and with a sincere desire to improve in martial exercises, I have no doubt encampments could be made highly beneficial to the service." \* \* \*

Except in the proximity to the village of Saratoga Springs, these conditions were observed with great fidelity in the encampment of the Seventh Regiment; and the result was, the acquirement of much useful knowledge of the regulations, and a marked improvement in the drill and discipline of this admirable organization, which gave the greatest satisfaction to the military authorities.

In this connection, I take occasion to suggest that if provision were made for encampments of two or more regiments—regiments approximating as closely as possible to the highest standard of efficiency—the effect would be beneficial; by inciting emulation and promoting a generous rivalry to excel, the influence of which would be felt throughout the entire National Guard.

In my report of December 31, 1870, I offered the following suggestions, which I desire to submit again :

"The reduction rendered necessary by the enactment, in March last, of the existing Military Code, which fixes the maximum number of non-commissioned officers, musicians and privates, has had the effect of elevating the character of the force, by necessitating the disbandment of weak and inefficient organizations. think, however, that any further reduction of the National Guard would be unwise. The necessity for the maintenance of a reliable military force to sustain the civil power-in cases of great emergency, when such aid is absolutely necessary to its enforcement-is fully appreciated by our citizens, and care should be taken to keep the force large enough to render it available at short notice, which can be done only by a proper distribution of its numbers in different localities. An efficient, well-disciplined National Guard, armed with serviceable weapons, and properly equipped, not only saves a large expenditure for police purposes, but obviates the necessity and removes the pretext for the employment of the federal military. authority, which should never be permitted to interfere arbitrarily with the internal affairs of the States."

I still entertain these views. I do not believe that a reduction of the number of existing organizations, or their consolidation into large regiments, would promote the efficiency of the force. Indeed, as regards consolidation, it is of doubtful policy under any circumstances. It is true that, as a rule, large regiments are better drilled and disciplined than small ones-for the strength in numbers is the result of that proficiency which gives reputation and thereby attracts recruits-but the number of regiments could not be reduced without impairing the availability of the aggregate force for police purposes. The regimental is the important infantry organization. The brigade is a convenient medium of communication for the transmission of orders and the rendition of reports, but the main reliance of the authorities for prompt aid in emergencies must be upon the regiments, acting singly, or, in concert with other regiments, forming provisional brigades. The brigade organization is not serviceable for such duty as the National Guard is liable to perform in time of peace. Outside of large cities, where battalions cannot be maintained effectively, detached companies might be organized to advantage.

The National Guard is now handsomely uniformed (although greatly in need of overcoats), equipped with servicable accoutrements, except knapsacks, and armed with breech-loading rifle muskets of the most approved construction. Its *personnel* is excellent;

and the discipline of the better regiments highly creditable to the patriotism and public spirit of citizens who voluntarily assume the fatiguing duties of the soldier and cheerfully assume the somewhat irksome restraints of military rule. But, although notably worthy of the highest commendation in certain cases, it must be admitted that the discipline of the National Guard is not uniformly good. Carelessness in details of administration, and lack of proper respect for officers, are too often observable in some regiments. Full ranks, imposing bands of music, and resplendent uniforms do not, of themselves, make good regiments. Nor is proficiency in drill, although essential, the sole requisite. It is discipline—the habit of prompt, implicit and unquestioning obedience to orders from proper authority—that marks the good soldier. In discipline is found courage, efficiency, power and comparative safety.

A recent lamentable occurrence, in which some New York city • regiments were engaged, displayed, in vivid and sanguinary characters, the difference between the discipline which, obedient to command, stands calm and unshaken under the most exasperating circumstances, and the disorder that, yielding 'to the selfish instinct which disintegrates, and which it is the object of discipline to control, shrinks before a contemptible antagonist, and causes cruel and unnecessary destruction of life in unreasoning disregard of orders.

Lack of discipline, however, is mainly attributable to the carelessness or inefficiency of the officers, who, neglecting to inculcate its necessity in their instructions, and to enforce its habitual observance on all occasions when on duty, are unable to invoke it effectually when an occasion arises in actual service. Discipline inspires terror in opponents; the want of it excites contempt. The appearance of a well-drilled regiment, with a reputation that insures the certainty that the galling gibes, taunts and sarcasms of a mob will fall pointless against the shield of imperturbable discipline; that even missiles will fail to provoke individual retaliation; the conviction that the soldier-who appears, not in his individual capacity, but as a representative of the law-will not fire without orders, and thus imperil the innocent, but will wait until the order does come, when the effect of simultaneous, concentrated and well-disciplined action will be crushing and terrible to the guilty-this conviction, which inspires wholesome terror, should in itself be enough to intimidate any ordinary mob, and secure respect for authority, without recourse to actual collision. Without discipline, troops are no better than an armed mob.

The number of breech-loading rifle muskets issued to regiments is not sufficient to arm all the troops. At the annual inspections, I observed several regiments which were compelled to eke out the inadequate supply of breech-loaders with the discarded muzzle-loading arm.

I am of the opinion that batteries of Gatling guns, organized like the howitzer battery attached to the Eleventh Brigade, might be substituted for horse batteries with advantage to the service.

The marked improvement of the National Guard within the past few years may be attributed, in some degree, to the change effected in the year 1869, when the system of a per capita tax for military purposes, as a commutation for the service which every citizen owes the State, was abolished; and the payment of the expense of maintenance by direct and absolute appropriation from the State Treasury substituted. This placed the National Guard upon its proper footing; as the citizen standing army of the State-the armed reserve police force-which is expected to be ready for service whenever called upon, and not a mere organization of holiday soldiers, who parade the streets for their own amusement. Another step is needed to perfect the recognition of the correct status of the National Guard, and that is, to provide for a permanent organization of the principal administrative staff departments, so that they shall not be subject to the fluctuations of politics or the demands of partisanship. The more remote from political influences, the more efficient the National Its stability might be further assured by making the appro-Guard. priation for its support permanent, so that the amount might not be contingent, annually, upon the intelligence or liberality of such members of the Legislature as are not aware, from personal observation, of the value of the National Guard as an almost indispensable auxiliary to the civil authority in large cities.

In retiring from the position which I have held for the past four years, I take occasion to acknowledge the unvarying courtesy which I have experienced in my official intercourse with the National Guard; and to express sincere gratification at the fact, that my personal relations with its members have been, unexceptionally, of the most friendly and cordial nature.

My assistants, Colonel John F. McQuade and Lieutenant-Colonel B. W. Blanchard, have discharged satisfactorily the duties assigned them.
