## METHODOLOGY:

The sample size for the survey is 550 registered voters taken from a listed sample of registered voters who voted in the 2010 or 2012 general election or registered since the 2012 general election. The margin of error is $+/-4.2 \% .436$ interviews were completed using automated telephone technology and 114 were conducted using mobile based survey technology. All interviews were conducted September 15- September 16, 2014 by Vox Populi Polling. The total percentages for responses may not equal $100 \%$ due to rounding.
