GEORGE NESSMAN Head Coach 4th Season



G eorge Nessman was appointed the San Jose State University men's basketball head coach in March 2005. As he heads into his fourth season leading the Spartans, he has positioned the program for near and long-term success in competition and in the classroom.

The 2007-08 team was one of the nation's most improved based on win totals. The Spartans, playing 13 games against eventual 20-win teams, opened the season capturing the First Shot Exempt Tournament hosted by Middle Tennessee State. San Jose State picked up road wins against Big Sky Conference champion Portland State in overtime and topped cross-county rival Santa Clara for the first time since 2003.

The Spartans were the most successful Western Athletic Conference team last season in games decided by four points or less with a 9-4 record. Homecourt wins over Nevada and Utah State were part of San Jose State's first winning record at The Event Center since 2000-01. A Western Athletic Conference Tournament victory for the first time since 2002 capped the best San Jose State season in seven years.


His second season, 2006-07, clearly was one with a youth



movement in place. With the third youngest team in the country based on previous major college playing experience, Nessman faced one of the nation's most challenging schedules in 2006-07 according to the in-season Sagarin Ratings. On the road, alone, the Spartans faced six teams that reached the 2007 NCAA Tournament, two others that played in the NIT and four more that had winning records.

Undaunted, his team endured the tough nonconference schedule and doubled its conference win total from his first season at the helm and posted the school's first win over conference foe Fresno State in eight years.

Nessman is the first San Jose State men's basketball coach to successfully organize a summer overseas tour. The Spartans spent a week in the United Kingdom, experienced a different culture and won all its August 2007 games against teams from the English and British Basketball Leagues.



The United Kingdom trip is consistent with his philosophy of placing the program in the spotlight. The Spartans have traveled to Duke, Texas Tech and Michigan State with Nessman facing legendary coaches Mike Kryzyewski, Bob Knight and Tom Izzo, respectively.

In his first season, the Spartans ended long road losing streaks both in conference and non-conference action. When the Spartans won, more often than not it was by a convincing margin. There were more close games with seven contests decided by four points or less during his first season.

Home attendance increased by 20 percent. Away from the court, his student-athletes were much more involved in community activities. San Jose State's recruiting focused much more on student-athletes from the Bay Area and Northern California but still attracted talented newcomers from Southern California and beyond. He became the first Spartan men's basketball coach in 21 years to sign a Bay Area high school senior to a National Letter-of-Intent when DeVonte Thomas decided to join the program in the spring of 2005.

In his first three seasons at San Jose State, his student-athletes earned four Western Athletic Conference All-Academic awards. Center C.J. Webster, entering his second season with the Spartans, was named to the 2007-08 WAC All-Newcomer team.

Nessman took over the Spartans' position after one season as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at the University of California in 2004-05.

Entering his 21st season as a head coach, his teams at the high school, community college and major college levels have won 383 games, placed first in a league or conference nine times and won a state championship. He is 24-69 at San Jose State.

One of his most significant coaching accomplishments was directing Porterville College to a 33-4 win-loss record, a Central

Valley Conference title and the school's first California Community College championship in 2000. Between January 2000 and February 2001, Porterville College won 40 consecutive games covering two seasons – one of the longest winning streaks in the California Community College system's history.

The 2000 California Community College Coach of the Year produced five 20-game winners in nine seasons and a 178-76 winloss record. Before his arrival, Porterville had four consecutive losing seasons and did not have a plus-.500 winning percentage in 11 years. Nearly 90 percent of the sophomores he coached at Porterville and Bakersfield Colleges continued their college careers at four-year institutions.



"In April (2006) when the season's over, we'll look back on whom all we played and I think we'll be able to say San Jose, tonight, played as hard as anybody we played all year. They came out, and, for the first 15 minutes, I'd rather been coaching them, than us. Their coaches did a better job than we did getting the game started and getting the team started. Their players did a better job than our players." – Texas Tech University head coach Bobby Knight, Nov. 10, 2005

In addition to his coaching duties at Porterville, he served the school as its director of athletics from 1995 through 2001 and was the academic advisor for athletics in 2001-02.

The 1981 graduate of the University of California started his coaching career at age 22 when he was hired as the junior varsity and cross country coach at Salesian High School in Richmond, Calif.


After three seasons, he became the boys varsity assistant coach at Concord, California's De La Salle High School in 1984. Two seasons later, he took over the head coach position at De La



Salle and went on to produce a 155-48 win-loss record, five conference championships, one North Coast Section crown and four appearances in the Northern California Tournament of Champions. Two of his most prominent Spartans were future NBA players Jon and Brent Barry.

The 49-year-old native of Stamford, Conn., has two master's degrees – one in education from San Francisco State University in 1988 and a second in physical education and recreation from Saint Mary's College in 1993. Nessman is the only current coach in the Western Athletic Conference to earn two master's degrees. He and his wife, Nancy, have four children – Joshua, a student at San Jose State; Veronica, a student at the University of California; Peter and John.

"Our main goal for our team is to master our system so the system serves you as a player instead of you serving it. As you do that, the game slows down for you. It becomes easier for you. That's been a big emphasis for our guys. See and understand what you are looking at. That's a big teaching point." – Head coach George Nessman

Davis, born on April 14, 1978, in Tulare, Calif., worked as an assistant coach for George Nessman at Bakersfield College during the 2003 and 2004 seasons before being named head coach.

He and his wife, Aimee, live in San Jose. Aimee completed her doctoral program in physical therapy at the University of the Pacific in October 2007.






G ary Stepan enters his first full season as a San Jose State men's basketball assistant coach.







AT SAN JOSE STATE: In his third season at San Jose State...signed a National Letter-of-Intent during the 2005 Fall signing period...redshirted the 2006-07 season...team representative to the San Jose State University Student-Athlete Advisory Committee for the second year in a row.



2007-08: Had one of the best seasons for any San Jose State freshman...first San Jose State freshman in 13 years to lead the team in assists (2.9 avg.)...appeared in 26 games and started 25 times...played more minutes than any 2007-08 freshman in the Western Athletic Conference and led the Spartans in average minutes played per game at 31.96...set a San Jose State freshman singlegame scoring record with 29 points vs. Hawai'i (Jan. 5)...first San Jose State player to score 20 or more

points in two games during the season with 20 points against Boise State (Feb. 28)...was in double-figure scoring 14 times...had a six-game stretch (Dec. 22, 2007-Jan. 7, 2008) scoring in double figures in each contest...third on the team in scoring with his 10.7 average...whirling dervish in the open court who was third in the WAC in steals at 1.54 per game...had two four-steal games and 11 over a three-game span against South Dakota State (Dec. 30), at Boise State (Jan. 2) and against Hawaii...clutch player in the closing moments who helped the Spartans win in a number of ways...handed off an assist on the game-winning basket at Middle Tennessee (Nov. 15), scoring the game-winning basket against Appalachian State (Nov. 16) and nailed a pair of free throws in the final seconds of the second half to send the Portland State game (Dec. 28) into overtime and a San Jose State victory...averaged 12.3 points per game in the 2007 summer tour of the United Kingdom...leading scorer in the win over the London Leopards at the start of the tour.



Western Athletic Conference

In its 47th year, the Western Athletic Conference continues to evolve and features some of the nation's best intercollegiate competition. One thing that remains unchanged is the persistent nature of the nine schools in the WAC to advance their programs to contend at the top levels of the NCAA.

The WAC provides its student-athletes the chance to travel to scenic destinations and gain exposure in some of the nation's most diverse markets. In addition, the WAC's student-athletes work to achieve the highest levels of success with the academic support of their respective institutions.

The WAC has experienced tremendous success. Over the past five years, it has won 61.1 percent of its bowl games and sent a total of 18 teams to bowl games (11-7). San Jose State defeated the University of New Mexico, 20-12, in the 2006 New Mexico Bowl hosted by the city of Albuquerque.

In men's basketball, the WAC has sent at least two teams to the NCAA Tournament in 23 of the past 24 seasons. Every current school in the WAC has competed in the NCAA Tournament since 1990. In women's sports, Fresno State softball has competed in every NCAA Tournament ever held.

In 2001, the WAC partnered with ESPN for unprecedented coverage of football and basketball giving the conference national exposure from one of the most respected broadcast entities in the country. Over the past three years, the networks have shown more than 70 football games, by far the most in a three-year range in WAC history.

The WAC is the sixth oldest among the nation's 11 Division I-A conferences. Its history traces back to July 27, 1962, when the original six-team league of Arizona, Arizona State, Brigham

Young, New Mexico, Utah and Wyoming began competition. The first championship was held in November 1962.

Arizona won the men's cross country title and New Mexico followed with the first WAC football title. Arizona finished second in the NCAA College World Series and, less than three years later, Arizona State claimed the league's first NCAA title when the Sun Devils won the College World Series trophy. Rice was the last WAC school to earn an NCAA team title when it won the College World Series in 2003.

Since that year, several changes have occurred. UTEP and Colorado State became members in September 1967, while Arizona and Arizona State withdrew on June 30, 1978. The WAC then added San Diego State (1978), Hawai'i (1979) and Air Force (1980).

The 1990-91 athletic year was the first in which both men

name. Fresno State was added in 1992, and then in 1996, the women's programs from Air Force and Hawai'i along with six new schools (UNLV, Rice, San Jose State, SMU, TCU and Tulsa) came into the WAC. Air Force, Brigham Young,

and women competed under the WAC

Colorado State, UNLV, New Mexico, San Diego State, Utah and Wyoming withdrew on June 30, 1999. Nevada (2000), Boise State (2001) and Louisiana Tech (2001) were added while TCU withdrew following the 2000-01 season. The current membership was established on July 1, 2005, when Idaho, New Mexico State and Utah State joined the WAC after Rice, SMU, UTEP and Tulsa withdrew.

Presently, the WAC crowns champions in 19 sports – eight men's and 11 women's. For the men, there are championships in baseball, basketball, cross country, football, golf, tennis, indoor track and field and outdoor track and field. Championships for women are held in basketball, cross country, golf, gymnastics, soccer, softball, swimming and diving, tennis, indoor track and field, outdoor track and field and volleyball.

an José State provides a comprehensive university education, granting bachelor's and master's degrees in 134 areas of study. From its beginnings as a normal school to train teachers for the developing frontier, SJSU has matured into a metropolitan university. Quality teaching and small classes are a priority at SJSU, where tenured professors teach introductory as well as advanced courses. One of the 200 top research

universities in the nation, SJSU offers rigorous course work and research opportunities to more than 30,000 undergraduate and graduate students in eight colleges.

Located in the heart of the Silicon Valley, this university has aided the development of the computer industry and the resulting technological advances in our nation by providing the largest source of engineering, science and business graduates to Silicon Valley companies.

Graduating about 7,000 students annually, San Jose State University also provides the professional infrastructure for the region – from teachers to social workers to artists to law enforcement officers to nurses. The terms, 'leaders and professionals,' describe not just the types of graduates who earn their degrees at San Jose State, but also the roles they assume in their communities and in their fields of endeavor.



The Campus Village

In the fall of 2005, San Jose State University opened the doors of Campus Village to more than 2,279 students, faculty and staff. Positioned on Tenth Street between San Carlos and San Salvador on the southeast corner of the main campus, the Campus Village will be a gateway to incredible academic resources and campus activities, the excitement of downtown San Jose, the opportunities of Silicon Valley, and some of the world's greatest recreational areas.

The Campus Village will include three buildings featuring apartment and suite-style living accommodations and a typical college dormitory experience. Campus Village will include recreational and study areas, a full-service computer lab, wireless internet access, an interactive gaming

center, laundry facilities, meeting rooms, retail

stores and underground parking for 700 vehicles. Fully equipped nearby recreational facilities offer residents space to work out, swim, play basketball, volleyball, ping-pong or pool.

Hassle-free access to the main campus is another asset to the Campus Village. Walking to the Student Union or to The Event Center, home for the San Jose State University men's and women's basketball and women's volleyball teams, will be five minutes or less. Residents also can walk or bicycle to the Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Library without crossing any streets.

The Dr.Martin Luther King, Jr., Library

The Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., Library, located on the main campus of San Jose State University opened in August 2003. A first-of-its-kind collaboration between a city and a university, the \$177-million, 475,000 squarefoot library provides a center for life-long learning. Students, faculty and the community have access to the information they will need for educational and personal growth throughout their lives.

The 10-floor library features:

- 3,623 seats
- 1,800 seats wired for the internet
- 400 public computers
- 135 databases of information
- 4 computer instruction laboratories
- 112 workstations available in the computer instruction labs
- 37 group-project rooms

The Event Center







The Event Center, located in the heart of the San Jose State University campus on the corner of Seventh and San Carlos streets, is the home of the Spartan basketball teams.

The \$36-million facility is comprised of The Event Center and an Aquatics Center. Students, faculty and staff members, alumni and the surrounding communities use the facility.

Groundbreaking occurred October 1, 1986. The Aquatics Center opened in May, 1988. Originally named the Recreation and Events Center, The Event Center opened in May, 1989. The first intercollegiate athletic contests in The Event Center were the Spartan basketball season openers on November 24, 1989.

The arena can seat 5,000 for athletics events and 5,600 for concerts. The arena is large enough to attract major performing artists, yet small enough to provide a personal experience for everyone. In December 2003, The Event Center playing surface was renamed Walt McPherson Court in honor of San Jose State University's most successful men's basketball coach. New locker facilities also were part of a comprehensive SJSU Athletics capital campaign project. In 17 seasons under McPherson from 1941 through 1960, the Spartans won 264 games, won three conference championships, played twice in the NAIA Tournament and made the school's first NCAA Tournament appearance in 1951.

Also in the recreation area of The Event Center are 10 racquetball courts, a large weight room, a mini-gym, and an aerobics room.

The Aquatics Center swimming pool is home for the San Jose State University women's swimming team. The pool is one of the largest pools ever constructed in the state of California. The pool dimensions are 200 feet long and 75 feet wide. Major Performers at The Event Center

Tom Bowen, Director of Athletics

Tom Bowen was named San Jose State University's director of intercollegiate athletics on December 20, 2004. Under his leadership and with his vision for the department, San Jose State has established itself as a viable Division I-A intercollegiate athletics program with proven athletics, academic and financial successes to his credit.



At the core of Bowen's mission for San Jose State University athletics is building a "Culture of

Champions" academically, athletically and in the community. The Notre Dame alum has overhauled the department's infrastructure; invested resources both in external and internal operations; initiated an enhanced website presence; and expanded marketing, promotions and advertising opportunities with the creation of Spartan Sports Properties.

With his fund raising acumen, Bowen has led the Spartan Foundation - the department's fund-raising component - to unprecedented development heights with #3.0- million during the last two annual fund drives.

As an integral member of the University's presidential staff,

University's presidential staff, he has created new short and long-term revenue streams for intercollegiate athletics and many other campus extra-curricular activities. The university has benefitted

from Athletics' increasing visibility, receiving record donations particularly in 2006-07. In 2007-08, the men's

basketball team had its best win total since the 2001 season. Women's gymnastics went to NCAA post-season action. Women's water polo was ranked seventh in the final national coaches poll. San Jose State capped the school year with a budget surplus for an unprecedented third year in a row and was cited as one of 12 Division I

universities cited for Overall Excellence in Diversity in a national study by Texas A&M University on behalf of the NCAA.

In 2006-07, football had its finest season in nearly two decades capturing the New Mexico Bowl championship. Women's cross country and women's water polo, ranked sixth nationally in the final coaches' poll, turned in their best record in years. There were All-American performances in football and women's water polo. Men's basketball, football, women's swimming, women's volleyball and women's water polo players competed in national team or individual national competitions. The 2007 season marked the second year in a row a Spartan won the Western Athletic Conference women's golf individual title.

He has appointed new head coaches in 10 sports including

George Nessman in men's basketball. In 2005-06, San Jose State won the Western Athletic Conference women's golf championship, recorded its highest finish ever at a NCAA regional championship in women's gymnastics, produced seven teams out of 16 with its best conference finish in years, and had WAC Coaches of the Year in women's golf and softball.

Bowen's vision for student-athlete success and excellence led to the creation of a Student Success Services component. Academic Progress Rate (APR) scores as measured by the NCAA have risen steadily under his watch.

Bowen came to San Jose State after serving three years as the Director of Community Affairs for the San Francisco 49ers of the National Football League. He directed all of the team's fundraising activities and was responsible for alumni and current player participation in the community. Also serving as the executive director of the 49ers Foundation, San Francisco was the first NFL franchise to implement an annual giving program.

His Division I experience at the collegiate level includes athletics administration positions at the University of California and Saint Mary's College in Moraga, Calif. As an assistant and associate director of athletics at the University of California from July 2000 through September 2002, he was responsible for athletics fund-raising. Bowen was credited with developing the first comprehensive planned giving program for the Golden Bears.

At Saint Mary's College, he was the Director of Foundations and Corporate Relations from May 1995 to January 1997 before being appointed to an associate director of athletics position by the president of the college. His grant proposal acumen helped raise \$6.1-million in academic funding for the institution. From January 1997 through April 2000, he managed the athletics department's budget, directed a corporate sponsorship program and interacted with the academic senate, faculty and university personnel on student-athlete issues.

His first professional leadership appointment in athletics was at De La Salle High School in Concord, Calif. From 1987 through 1995, he held the positions of assistant football coach and athletics director.

He is a Level 2 certified member of the College Athletic Business Management Association (CABMA), the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics (NACDA) and the National Society of Fund Raising Executives. Bowen was named to the NCAA Football Issues Committee in 2008.

The 1983 graduate of the University of Notre Dame played high school football at Moreau High in Hayward, Calif. He majored in theology/sociology and spent six years studying for the priesthood with the Holy Cross Fathers. Bowen went on to earn a master's degree in administration/education from the University of San Francisco in 1990.

An active member of the Bay Area community, he was named to the 2008 San Jose Mercury News' Top-25 Most Powerful Sports Figures in the Bay Area. He serves on the board of the San Jose Sports Authority. Currently, an adjunct professor at the University of San Francisco School of Sports Management and at San Jose State University's Department of Kinesiology, he also was a senior faculty member of the Capital Campaign Institute based in Minneapolis, Minn., from 1996 through 2002. He continues to speak before major corporations headquartered locally on the topics of leadership, management and motivation.

The Denver, Colo., native and his wife, Mia, are the parents of three children.



The Koret Athletic Training Center

The Koret Athletic Training Center, opened in November 2001, is a state-of-the-art facility that encompasses over 10,000 square-feet of training space and is located adjacent to Spartan Stadium, the athletic locker rooms and the football practice field.

The Koret Athletic Training Center also contains a 1,000-square-foot rehabilitation and training room that services physical therapy and sports-specific rehabilitation. The facility enables the sports medicine staff of athletic trainers, doctors, and physical therapists to provide the best possible care to help prevent and rehabilitate injuries.

"Our Philosophy"

• We teach a hands-on approach where the studentathlete is expected to develop a comprehensive understanding of not only the How's, but also the Why's of our program.

• We teach correct movement patterns to optimize efficiency and performance.

• Our program design is centered on ground-based, free weight, multi-joint movements that will transfer to the playing field and keep our student-athletes out of our sports medicine facility.

• Our primary concern is the development of speed in all our sports.

• We develop speed and flexibility through strength.

• Our speed program consists of functional and straight-line speed training. Functional means acceleration, deceleration and change-of-direction work.

• We train through an entire range-of-motion in all lifts to enhance active flexibility, develop strength to prevent injury, and unlock joints with mobility issues.

• Olympic-based movements are utilized for speed of movement, active flexibility and dynamic stability.

• Squats and deadlifts have a permanent home in our program for developing hip strength and back stability. Single-leg variations are used to fix strength imbalance and lateral deficits.

I am just happy to be at a point in life that I can do something like this....My family and I are proud to create this legacy that will always serve as a reminder of how much San Jose State means to me."

"San Jose State has been a stepping stone that has provided me an education, a degree and of course, the tools I needed to be successful in the NFL." – Jeff Garcia

Garcia was a guarterback on the 1991, 1992 and 1993 San Jose State teams. As a sophomore, he was third nationally in passing efficiency. He led San Jose State to its first win in school history over a Big Ten Conference team, the University of Minnesota, and went on to receive honorable mention All-America recognition in 1992. The school record holder for total offense with 7,274 yards was named the Outstanding Offensive Player at the 1994 East-West Shrine All-Star Game in Palo Alto, Calif.

Professionally, he played five seasons (1994 through 1998) for the Calgary Stampeders of the Canadian Football League, was a four-time all-star and led the team to the 1998 Grey Cup championship. Garcia joined the San Francisco 49ers in 1999 and took the team to playoff appearances in 2001 and 2002. He was a Cleveland Brown in 2004, with the Detroit Lions in 2005, led the Philadelphia Eagles to the 2006 National Conference playoffs and is the starter for the Tampa Bay Buccaneers this season. Garcia earned his undergraduate degree as a business administration major from San Jose State University through the National Football League's Continuing Education Program.



Notes to the Media

Credential Requests: Press table, photo, and scouting credential requests should be directed to: Lawrence Fan, Sports Information Director. Credentials are limited to working press filing game stories, accredited representatives of the media and personnel assigned by San Jose State University.

Directions to The Event Center: Walt McPherson Court in The Event Center is located on the corner of Seventh and San Carlos streets. Easiest freeway access is Interstate 280. Take the Seventh street exit and follow the signs to San Jose State University.

Media Parking: Parking is available at the San Jose State University Seventh Street garage. Arrive at least an hour before tipoff to avoid congestion. Television crew members involved with play-by-play telecasts should park the production truck at the Center's loading dock a minimum of five hours before tipoff. Play-by-play television contractual arrangements must be made with the sports information office in advance.

Telephones: POTS telephone service is available in the press room adjacent to the playing floor. For commercial radio stations, ISDN and/or regular dial lines are available at a courtside location. When placing a long-distance call from Walt McPherson Court, dial "7" and call "COLLECT.

Statistics & Services: Complete game statistics and play-by-play accounts will be distributed as soon as they become available. FAX service, wireless internet access at courtside and in the media work room and ethernet connections are available.

Photographers: The photography areas at The Event Center are limited to the baseline areas at each end of the floor. No standing during live-ball situations. Courtside work stations are available with advance notice.

Strobe lights: Photographers interested in using strobe lights must secure joint permission from The Event Center and the sports information office. Photographers are not allowed in the catwalks above the court during the game.

Scouts: Passes are issued to scouts in accordance with conference and NCAA guidelines. Advance notice is appreciated.

Press Room Food Service: Typically, soft drinks and light foods are available in the media work room kitchen. Media members can purchase solid food from one of The Event Center's concession stands located on the mezzanine level.
