WAC'S RECENT ACCOMPLISHMENTS

Rice Wins 2003 NCAA Baseball Championship

The Rice baseball team won the 2003 national championship. It was the first ever national team title for the Owls. Head coach Wayne Graham earned national Coach of the Year honors.

WAC Wins Two of Three Bowl Games in 2002

Last year, WAC teams won two of three bowl games, the second best winning percentage of any conference that had at least three bowl participants. It was also the 21st straight year that league teams have played in at least two bowl games.

Hawai'i Reaches 2002 Volleyball Final Four

The University of Hawai'i women's volleyball team spent most of the 2002 season ranked in the top 5 and reached the Final Four of the NCAA Volleyball Championship, before bowing out in the national semifinals. It was the second time in three years that Hawai'i advanced to the Final Four.

WAC Signs Multi-Year TV Deal With ESPN

Football and men's basketball returned to ESPN in 2001. At least four football and four basketball games will be showcased on national television each season. In addition, the WAC will have several regional games telecast by ESPN Regional and SportsWest.

The WAC and the BCS

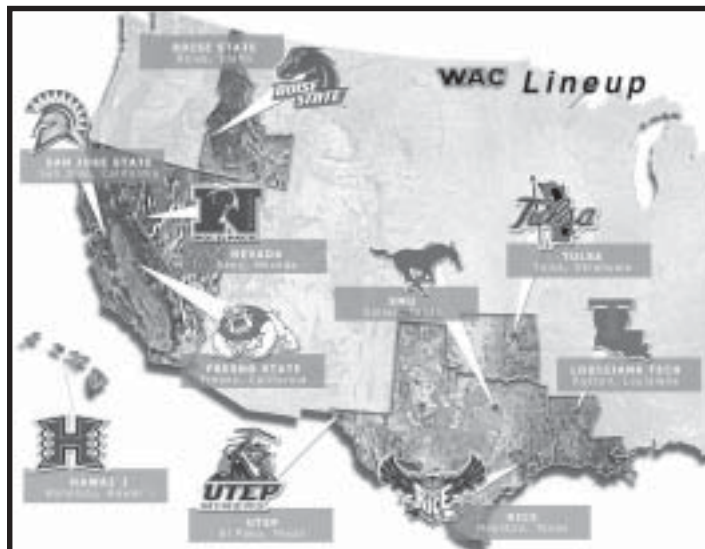

Fresno State Makes 22nd-Straight Appearance

For the last 22 years, the Fresno State softball team has been invited to play in the NCAA Softball Tournament and in 1998, the Bulldogs won the National Championship.

Louisiana Tech in 22nd Tournament

Louisiana Tech made its 22nd straight appearance in the NCAA Women's Basketball Tournament. The Lady Techsters have won three national titles.

Tulsa Wins 2001 NIT Championship

The University of Tulsa men's basketball team won the championship game of the 2001 NIT Postseason Basketball Tournament.

SMU's Rigamonti Defends NCAA Swimming Titles

SMU sophomore Flavia Rigamonti won both the 500 and 1,650 yard freestyles at the 2003 NCAA Championship defending both national titles. She helped the Mustangs to a fourth place finish, their ninth top-four finish in the past 12 seasons.

Rice Doubles Team Ranked Number One

Rice's Richard and William Barker were ranked No.1 in the nation in men's doubles by the Intercollegiate Tennis Association and were named the National Doubles Team of the Year.

Fresno State's Watney Wins Five Golf Tournaments

With the top single-season scoring average mark in the country last year, Fresno State's Nick Watney became just the sixth player in NCAA Division I history with a sub-70 season scoring average (69.93). Watney had five tournament wins in 2002-03, most of any player in the nation.

BOISE STATE UNIVERSITY

Boise State is Idaho's metropolitan university, located in the state's population center and capital city, a hub of government, business, the arts, health care, industry and technology. The university offers a variety of undergraduate, graduate and technical programs to serve the diverse needs of the area. Founded in 1932 by the Episcopal Church as Boise State Junior College, the school was granted four-year status as Boise State College in 1965. The college entered the state system of higher education in 1969 and became Boise State University in 1974.

The university offers courses in eight colleges: Applied Technology, Arts and Sciences, Business and Economics, Education, Engineering, Graduate Studies, Health Sciences, and Social Sciences and Public Affairs. Boise State serves more than 30,000 people annually through workshops, short courses, apprenticeship training and other non-credit programs.

The Division of Extended Studies offers credit and non-credit classes in the evenings and on weekends, during summer school, through distance education and in high schools. The Selland College of Applied Technology provides education for employment through its Center for Workforce Training and Center for Adult Basic Education. Non-credit professional development opportunities are offered to individuals, corporations, government organizations and civic groups by the Center for Management Development and the Idaho Small Business Development Center.

A Pulitzer Prize-winning faculty, two "named" schools resulting from multi-million-dollar gifts, and 13 endowed chairs are earning California State University, Fresno a reputation as one of the West Coast's premier universities.

With an enrollment of more than 21,000, Fresno State is Central California's leading university, offering 56 undergraduate degree programs and 46 master degree programs in the liberal arts and sciences as well as in a variety of professional disciplines emphasizing agriculture, business, engineering and technology, health and human services, and education.

Fresno State also offers a joint doctorate with the University of California and just received a \$4 million gift to develop an independent doctorate - the first in the 23-campus California State University system.

California State University, Fresno offers a rich ethnic and cultural mix of students and faculty. Fifty-two percent of the student body is minority and 32 percent Hispanic.

California State University, Fresno is fully accredited by the California Board of Education and the Western Association of Schools and Colleges. The university is also a member of the Western Association of Graduate Schools, the Council of Graduate Schools in the United States and the American Association of Colleges for Teacher Education. The university also holds numerous college/school, department, or program accreditations and certificated memberships from more than 30 accrediting organizations

Under a dense canopy of 4,000 trees, the campus sits against a backdrop of the beautiful Sierra Nevada mountain range and within two hours of three national parks - Yosemite, Sequoia and Kings Canyon. The campus was officially designated as an arboretum in 1978.

LOUISIANA TECH UNIVERSITY

Times are good at Louisiana Tech and the proof is in the numbers. Students flocked to Louisiana Tech in record numbers in 2002-03.

What's bringing so many students to Tech? It is the focus on excellence that can lead Tech to ascend to even greater heights. One example of that focus, the university's biomedical engineering program, celebrated its 30th anniversary in the spring. Far from resting on its laurels, the program – begun by University President

Dr. Dan Reneau when he was on the faculty – is marching toward more accomplishments.

Last year Louisiana's Bond Commission authorized funds to hire an architect to design a new \$6 million, 30,000-square-foot biomedical engineering building. It will be adjacent to the Institute for Micromanufacturing, which links two great technologies together.

The establishment last August of five new endowed professorships, raising the total to 95, augmented Tech's academic endeavors further. The university also has nine endowed chairs.

A professional development program for regional science teachers has worked with 790 schools and eight universities to enhance education over a decade. Last year the total number of students benefiting exceeded 1.5 million.

The University of Nevada, Reno, a "Doctoral/Research Universities-Extensive" institution, has a 129-year history of exemplary scholarship, teaching and outreach.

U.S. News & World Report, for the 13th straight year, recently named Nevada as a national university among 1,444 schools and colleges evaluated in its "America's Best Colleges" issue. The university's hydrologic sciences program also earned a top 10 national ranking.

Its Center for Civil Engineering Earthquake Research offers unique experimental facilities used to test high-profile structures such as the San Francisco-Oakland Bay Bridge and the NFL Houston Texans' Reliant Stadium. The Nevada Terawatt Facility is developing what will be the most powerful laser at a U.S. public university.

The Reynolds School of Journalism also has achieved high acclaim, as it has produced six Pulitzer Prize winners.

The university, Nevada's land-grant institution, opened in the fall of 1874 in Elko, 300 miles east of the state's northern Nevada population base. State officials relocated the university to Reno in 1885. The university is set just east of the rugged Sierra Nevada range, an environmentally diverse region including Lake Tahoe that encompasses much of western Nevada. The area's six counties have a population of nearly 520,000 people.

Now part of an eight-institution, state higher education system, the university expects to enroll more than 15,700 students in fall 2003.

Nevada offers 76 undergraduate, 71 master's and 39 doctoral programs in the following colleges and independent schools: Agriculture, Biotechnology and Natural Resources; Arts and Science; Business Administration; Education; Engineering; Extended Studies; Human and Community Sciences; Journalism; Medicine; Mines and Graduate School.

About 500 full-time faculty members teach in six degree-granting schools: Dedman College of Humanities and Science; Meadows School of the Arts; Edwin L. Cox School of Business; Perkins School of Theology; the School of Engineering and Applied Sciences and the School of Law. Overall, SMU offers 61 master's degree programs, 20 doctoral degree programs and three professional degree programs.

THE VOICE OF THE STUDENT-ATHLETE

How does our conference generate feedback from its most valuable component, its student-athletes? Through the Western Athletic Conference-Student-Athlete Advisory Committee, also known as the WAC-SAAC, which was formed in 1998.

Since its inception, the WAC-SAAC has been an essential component in the conference's governance structure as well as a strong voice for student-athlete welfare at all levels, institutional, conference, and national. It provides recommendations and positions on specific conference and NCAA proposed legislation and it addresses national issues that may have an effect on the welfare of all student-athletes. In addition, its members provide recommendations for our fifteen conference championships in order to enhance the student-athlete experience for all sports. Another objective toward which the committee constantly strives is to help strengthen and improve the communication and relationships among athletes, campus administrators, and coaches.

On the national stage, the Chair of the WAC-SAAC represents the conference as an active member of the National SAAC, which includes all of the Division I conferences.

The WAC-SAAC stays very active and is making a positive impact. Annually, each member institution appoints two student-athletes from its own institutional SAAC to serve on the conference committee. The WAC-SAAC meets three times a year and conducts monthly teleconference calls during the academic year. As part of our summer meeting, we conduct an educational outreach project for underprivileged children. We work closely with local non-profit organizations such as a Boys and Girls Club to organize a community project. The participating youngsters have an opportunity to learn basic fundamental skills for a variety of sports (e.g., basketball, football, golf, soccer, etc.) from our student-athletes. Not only does our WAC-SAAC teach athletic skills, but its members discuss with our young participants important life skills and the dangers of drugs and alcohol during the community project's closing ceremony.

WAC *FACTS*

The Western Athletic Conference features some of the most exciting competition at some of the most diverse campuses in the nation. With 10 members in Texas, Oklahoma, Louisiana, Idaho, Nevada, California and Hawaii, the WAC continues to build upon its recent success.

The WAC provides its student-athletes the chance to travel to scenic destinations and gain exposure in some of the nation's largest and most accessible media markets. In addition, the academic reputation of many of the WAC schools is unparalleled, with some of the nation's most respected institutions of higher learning among the WAC ranks.

This season marks the 42nd for the WAC, making it the sixth oldest among the nation's 11 Division I-A conferences. Its history traces back to 1962, when the original six-team league was created. The concept of a Western

Athletic Conference began in 1958 when Brigham Young's Edwin Kimball, Leo Harris of Oregon and Roy S. Keen of Oregon State met during the NCAA Conven-

tion in New York to discuss the "ideal conference" because problems existed in their alignments. They believed such a conference should have eight members with approximately the same goals, ideals and resources and that such a union would include the following members: Washington State, Oregon State, Oregon, Utah, New Mexico, Arizona, Arizona State and Brigham Young.

Although the meeting did not result in any action, it established an idea that again was discussed two years later at the 1960 NCAA Convention in New York. There, Dick Clausen, athletics director at Arizona, and Pete McDavid, athletics director at New Mexico, organized a meeting which included representatives of Oregon State, Oregon, Washington State, Brigham Young, Utah, New Mexico, Arizona and Arizona State. Glenn "Red" Jacoby of Wyoming also was to be invited to the meeting but could not be located on short notice.

BYU's Dr. Kimball was elected the chairman of the group and, over the next two years, plans were formulated as the faculty representatives and presidents became involved with the athletic directors in the

deliberations. As proposals were discussed, finances became the determining factor, evidenced by the following membership criteria: large facilities or a commitment to build them; location in or near a large population center; large student body; easy access by means of large jet aircraft; demonstrated fan support; winning athletic tradition; and commitment to maintain a varied and extensive athletic program.

While the membership structure was debated, Washington State, Oregon and Oregon State decided to re-align with the other Pacific Coast institutions, and the remaining university representatives were left to fill the openings. Although Wyoming, New Mexico State and Utah State applied, only Wyoming was accepted as the final charter member.

By the end of 1961, a working draft of a constitution, by-laws and operating code was drafted by

Thomas Hall, the faculty representative at Arizona, and Paul Brechler, the WAC's first commissioner. On July 27, 1962, the conference officially was organized by the Presidents' Council when the original



charter was signed, and the name Western Athletic Conference was adopted. Charter members were Arizona, Arizona State, Brigham Young, New Mexico, Utah and Wyoming. The two Arizona schools had been members of the Border Conference; the others were members of the Skyline.

The WAC began operation with the 1962-63 academic year, and several changes have occurred since. UTEP and Colorado State became members in September 1967, while Arizona and Arizona State withdrew on June 30, 1978. Other membership additions included San Diego State (July 1, 1978); Hawai'i (July 1, 1979); Air Force (July 1, 1980); Fresno State (July 1, 1992); UNLV, Rice, San Jose State, SMU, TCU and Tulsa (July 1, 1996); and Nevada (July 1, 2000). Air Force, Brigham Young, Colorado State, UNLV, New Mexico, San Diego State, Utah and Wyoming withdrew on June 30, 1999. Boise State and Louisiana Tech became WAC members on July 1, 2001, while TCU withdrew following the 2000-01 season.

Paul Brechler was the WAC Commissioner from 1962-1968, Wiles Hallock from 1968-1971, Stan Bates

from 1971-80, Dr. Joe Kearney from 1980-94 and Karl Benson from 1994 to the present.

The WAC began competition with 10 sports, including football, basketball, track and field, baseball, wrestling, swimming, tennis, golf, cross country and gymnastics. The first championship was held in November 1962, when Arizona won the men's cross country title. New Mexico followed with the first WAC football title. Arizona finished second in the NCAA College World Series and, less than three years later, Arizona State claimed the league's first NCAA title when the Sun Devils won the College World Series trophy.

Before July 1, 1990, the WAC sponsored championships only in men's sports. However, a merger with the High Country Athletic Conference formed a single conference under one administrative structure, and the 1990-91 athletic year was the first in which both men and women competed under the WAC name.

Presently the WAC crowns team and individual champions in 18 sports - eight men's and 10 women's. For the men, there are championships in baseball, basketball, cross country, football, golf, tennis, indoor track and field and outdoor track and field. Championships for women are held in basketball, cross country, golf, soccer, softball, swimming and diving, tennis, indoor track and field, outdoor track and field and volleyball.

The WAC office has been located in the Denver area since the conference's inception with the exception of a two-year stay in Phoenix from 1964-66.

WAC *FACTS*

July 27, 1962-The original charter for the Western Athletic Conference is signed by the presidents of the charter member universities. Paul Brechler is named the WAC's first commissioner.

November 10, 1962-Arizona State wins the first WAC championship as it captures the cross country title.

December 19, 1964-Utah becomes the first school since the formation of the conference to participate in a bowl game as it defeats West Virginia, 32-6, in the Liberty Bowl.

March 20, 1966-Utah becomes the first school to reach the NCAA Final Four, and Brigham Young captures the championship of the National Invitation Tournament.

September 20, 1967-UTEP becomes the WAC's seventh member.

September 26, 1968-Colorado State becomes the WAC's eighth member.

September 1, 1969-Wiles Hallock replaces Paul Brechler as commissioner.

July 1, 1971-Stan Bates becomes the WAC's third commissioner as he replaces Wiles Hallock.

December 27, 1971-The first Fiesta Bowl, originated to match the WAC champion against an at-large team, is played in Tempe, Ariz. Arizona State defeats Florida State, 45-38.

December 27, 1976-The Presidents' Council receives official notification of the intention of Arizona and Arizona State to seek affiliation with the then-Pacific-8 Conference.

April 8, 1977-San Diego State University is extended an invitation of membership effective July 1, 1978.

May 2, 1977-The University of Hawai'i is extended a membership invitation dependent upon the institution's meeting of certain criteria set by the Council.

June 30, 1978-Arizona and Arizona State officially withdraw from the conference.

September 29, 1978-The University of Hawai'i officially is approved as a member effective July 1, 1979.

December 22, 1978-After a seven-year tie to the Fiesta Bowl, the WAC begins a new affiliation with the Holiday Bowl in San Diego.

August 29, 1979-The United States Air Force Academy is accepted as a member effective July 1, 1980.

May 1, 1980-Dr. Joe Kearney is named the fourth commissioner in conference history as he replaces Stan Bates.

May 1, 1983-The Presidents' Council approves the concept for a WAC Basketball Tournament beginning in 1984.

December 21, 1984-Brigham Young University earns the conference's first national football championship with a victory over Michigan in the Holiday Bowl to complete a 13-0 season.

July 16, 1987-The WAC and KUTV of Salt Lake City agree to the conference's first one-million-dollar package for the regional syndication of men's basketball games.

February 23, 1988-The WAC and the Holiday Bowl reach an agreement for the conference champion to host the game through the 1992 season.

May 9, 1990-The WAC and ESPN agree to the conference's first contract for the telecast of men's basketball games by a national network.

July 1, 1990-The WAC merges with the High Country Athletic Conference to form a single conference for men's and women's athletics.

December 1, 1991-BYU's Ty Detmer wins the Heisman Trophy, a first for a WAC athlete.

June 12, 1991-Fresno State is accepted as the WAC's 10th member effective July 1, 1992.

June 10, 1992-The WAC selects the Delta Center in Salt Lake City as the site for its men's and women's basketball tournaments. Commissioner Kearney announces his retirement effective July 1, 1994.

August 13, 1992-The WAC is included in the Western Bowl Alliance, which guarantees at least one conference team an appearance in the Aloha and Copper Bowls for the next two years.

April 20, 1994-Karl Benson is appointed the fifth commissioner in league history, replacing Dr. Joe Kearney.

April 21, 1994-The WAC Council of Presidents extends an invitation of membership to UNLV, Rice, San Jose State, SMU, TCU and Tulsa.

June 6, 1994-The University Arena in Albuquerque is chosen as the site of the 1995 and 1996 WAC men's and women's basketball tournaments.

June 14, 1994-The WAC signs a multi-year football contract with ESPN and ABC.

January, 1995-For the first time, three WAC football teams finish the season ranked among the nation's top 25 in both the USA Today/CNN Coaches' Poll and the Associated Press Top 25.

May 1, 1995-The Thomas and Mack Center in Las Vegas is selected as the site of the 1997 and 1998 WAC men's and women's basketball tournaments.

May 9, 1995-The WAC signs a multi-year contract with ESPN for the telecast of 22 men's and two women's basketball games annually, the largest such contract in WAC history and the first national telecast of WAC women's basketball. The WAC becomes the only conference in the country with an exclusive contract with ESPN for football and basketball.

June 5, 1995-The WAC Council of Presidents select Las Vegas' Sam Boyd Stadium as the site for the 1996 and 1997 WAC Football Championship Game.

December 11, 1995-The WAC's first web site is published.

February 19, 1996-The MGM Grand Garden arena is selected as the site of the inaugural WAC volleyball tournament, to be contested Nov. 26-30 in Las Vegas.

February 26, 1996-The WAC Council selects Pacific and Mountain as the names for the newly-created divisions to be instituted in 1996-97.

July 1, 1996-The WAC becomes the nation's largest NCAA Division I-A conference with 16 members competing in 11 men's and 10 women's championship sports.

November 26-30, 1996-The WAC hosts its first ever Volleyball Tournament at the MGM Grand in Las Vegas. Brigham Young defeats Hawai'i, 3-2, in the championship match.

December 7, 1996-Brigham Young and Wyoming play in the inaugural WAC Football Championship game at Sam Boyd Stadium in Las Vegas. Brigham Young wins the game in overtime, 28-25, before a record-setting crowd of 41,238, the largest for a team sporting event in Nevada.

January 1, 1997-The WAC has its second team ever play in a New Year's Day bowl. Brigham Young defeats Kansas State in the Cotton Bowl, 19-15, and sets the record for most wins by a Division IA school with 14.

June 23, 1997-The WAC becomes a Bowl Alliance member beginning with the 1998 season.

November 24, 1997-Brigham Young wins the women's NCAA national championship in cross country. It's the first-ever women's national title in WAC history.

March 30, 1998-The Utah Runnin' Utes advance to the NCAA men's basketball title game. Utah leads most of the game, but bows out in the final five minutes to Kentucky.

May 25, 1998-Fresno State's softball team wins the national championship with a 1-0 victory over Arizona.

May 27-30, 1998-UNLV wins the men's NCAA golf title. It's the third national championship for a WAC team during the 1997-98 season.

November 28, 1998-Hawai'i and Brigham Young meet in the WAC Volleyball Tournament final and the Wahine win, 15-12, 21-19, 13-15, 16-18, 24-22. The 89 points scored by Hawai'i sets a new NCAA record.

June 7, 1999-Selland Arena in Fresno is chosen as the site for the 2000 men's and women's basketball tournaments. Tulsa's Reynolds Center is selected for the 2001 tournaments.

June 8, 1999-The WAC signs a two-year football and basketball television

deal with Fox Sports Net.

June 10, 1999-The WAC Council of Presidents extends an invitation of membership to Nevada beginning July 1, 2000.

June 30, 1999-Air Force, Brigham Young, Colorado State, UNLV, New Mexico, San Diego State, Utah and Wyoming officially withdraw from the conference.

October 17, 1999-The WAC Council of Presidents invites Boise State and Louisiana Tech to join the league on July 1, 2001.

December 25, 1999-The Hawai'i football team breaks the NCAA record with an eight and a half game improvement in wins from the previous year with a 23-17 victory over Oregon State in the Oahu Bowl.

July 1, 2000-The University of Nevada becomes an official member of the WAC and increases the membership to nine schools.

December 31, 2000-Fresno State competes in the inaugural Silicon Valley Football Classic in San Jose.

March 29, 2001-The University of Tulsa wins the men's basketball NIT title with a 79-60 victory over Alabama.

June 5, 2001-Tulsa's Reynolds Center is chosen as the site for the 2002 men's and women's basketball tournaments.

June 20, 2001-The WAC signs a three-year deal with ESPN for telecasts of football and basketball.

July 1, 2001-Boise State University and Louisiana Tech University become official members of the WAC, while TCU withdraws. This increases the membership to 10 schools.

January 17, 2002-Tulsa is chosen as the host for the 2003 basketball tournaments.

August 7, 2002-The WAC initiates an innovative and creative two-year pilot project to create an academic alliance among its 10 member institutions.

Nov. 12, 2002-Fresno State's brand new Save Mart Center is chosen as the site for the 2004 WAC Basketball Tournament while Nevada is picked as host for the 2005 tournament.

Dec. 31, 2002-Boise State and Fresno State both win their bowl games. The Broncos beat Iowa State 34-16 in the Humanitarian Bowl, while the Bulldogs defeated Georgia Tech, 30-21, in the Silicon Valley Football Classic.

Feb. 22, 2003-The men's basketball teams from Fresno State, Hawai'i, Louisiana Tech and Tulsa compete in ESPN's inaugural Bracket Buster Saturday event.

June 23, 2003-Rice wins the NCAA title in baseball, the school's first team title in any sport.

When Karl Benson was named the fifth commissioner in the history of the Western Athletic Conference on April 20, 1994, he brought with him a wealth of experience and a personal history of success to the position.

And since that time, Benson not only has laid a strong foundation for the

WAC's future, he also steered the conference through unsettled times during the late 1990s when the defection of eight member institutions threatened the WAC.

Through his leadership and vision, it didn't take long for the WAC to regain its place among the nation's top Division I conferences. In its first year as an eight-member conference in 1999-2000, it won two of three football bowl games, sent a men's basketball team to the Elite Eight of the NCAA Tournament and a team to the College Baseball World Series. Benson then spearheaded conference expansion with the additions of three new members - Nevada, Louisiana Tech and Boise State.

Nationally, Benson has earned the respect of his peers and is currently serving on the Men's Basketball Committee.

Benson hit the ground running when he was hired in 1994 and initiated several programs that improved the conference's national position in virtually every category. He was instrumental in developing multi-year agreements with the Holiday Bowl, Cotton Bowl, Copper Bowl, Las Vegas Bowl, and currently, the Silicon Valley Football Classic, Humanitarian Bowl, Hawai'i Bowl and GMAC Bowl.

In 1995-96, the WAC signed an exclusive multi-year agreement with ESPN for the unprecedented live telecast of its men's and women's basketball and football. Included in that deal was a women's basketball contract, the first in conference history. Currently, the WAC is in the midst of a three-year deal with ESPN for football and men's and women's basketball.

Benson also expanded the league media services through weekly coaches' teleconferences for football, men's and women's basketball and volleyball and enhanced the WAC publications budget.

Benson came to the WAC after four successful years as the commissioner of the Mid-American Conference. There, he implemented several innovative projects and was instrumental in the formation of the Las Vegas Bowl.

Prior to taking the reins of the MAC, Benson served on the NCAA staff for more than four years where he was the director of NCAA championships when selected as MAC commissioner.

Benson joined the NCAA staff in January, 1986, as a compliance representative and was appointed assistant director of championships in June, 1987. He was promoted

Assistant Commissioner for Compliance

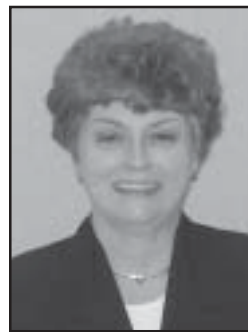

2003-04 BASKETBALL NOTES

TOP PLAYERS RETURNING – Only three players from the all-WAC first and second teams return this year: Kirk Snyder, Jr., F, Nevada; Michael Harris, Jr., F, Rice; and Jason Parker, Sr., G, Tulsa. Four of the five all-newcomer team honorees also return from last year and include: Aaron Haynes, Sr., F, Boise State; Bryan Hopkins, So., G, SMU; Michael Kuebler, Sr., G/F, Hawaii; and Renaldo Major, Sr., F, Fresno State. Hopkins was last year's WAC Freshman of the Year after averaging 13.1 points, 3.9 assists and 3.2 rebounds per game.

STAT LEADERS BACK – Statistically, four of the top 10 scorers return for the 2003-04 season. Nevada's Kirk Snyder was fourth in the WAC in scoring last year with a 16.2 point per game average. Others coming back include: Jason Parker, Tulsa (15.4); Michael Harris, Rice (15.2); and Aaron Haynes, Boise State (14.7). Snyder is the leading returning rebounder with an 8.1 rpg average last season (2nd in the WAC), and Rice's Rashid Smith returns after ranking second in the WAC in assists with 4.4 per game.

WAC ON ESPN/SPORTSWEST – The WAC has a multi-year contract with both ESPN and SportsWest for coverage of WAC football and basketball. A minimum of 14 games between the two networks will be scheduled this season.

NEVADA IN PRESEASON NIT – Nevada will open the WAC season hosting Vermont in the Preseason NIT on Nov. 17. If the Wolf Pack win, they would play the winner of the Yale-Connecticut game in the second round on Nov. 19. The winner of that game would advance to the semifinals at Madison Square Garden on Nov. 26.

1,000-POINT SCORERS – The WAC has two players that have scored more than 1,000 points in their collegiate careers returning for their senior seasons: Roy Smallwood, F, UTEP (1,119); and Garry Hill-Thomas, G, Nevada (1,008). Hawaii senior forward Phil Martin has 917 points and Tulsa senior guard Jason Parker has scored 911 in his career.

PRESEASON RANKINGS – Two preseason publications (Athlon and Lindy's) ranked the 10 WAC schools. Averaging these, a consensus ranking was determined.

TULSA OWNS LONGEST HOME STREAK – With its three wins in the WAC Tournament last March, Tulsa improved its home winning streak to nine in a row, currently the longest streak in the WAC.

TULSA OVER 100 – Over the last four seasons, Tulsa is 108-33 (.766), the best record of any WAC team since 1999-2000. Tulsa has also won 49 conference games during that period, also the most in the WAC. The top five teams in wins (both overall and WAC) over the last four seasons:

BRACKET BUSTER SATURDAY – The WAC and five of its teams (Fresno State, Hawaii, Nevada, Rice and Tulsa) have partnered with ESPN and several other top college basketball conferences for the second annual Bracket Buster Saturday, a one-day, 23-game men's basketball event matching potential NCAA tournament hopefuls against each other. Bracket Buster Saturday will be February 21, 2004. ESPN and ESPN2 will present five games highlighted by the only predetermined game for 2004 featuring two teams that have reached the Elite Eight in recent years: Tulsa (2000) at Gonzaga (1999). 2004 TOURNAMENT – The 2004 WAC Tournament will be held March 9-13 at the Save Mart Center in Tulsa, Okla. Both the men and women compete during the same week. On the men's side, the seven, eight, nine and ten seeded teams will play on Tuesday, March 9. The remaining eight teams will all play in the quarterfinals on Thursday, March 11 with the top seed competing versus the winner of the Tuesday eight-nine game, the No. 2 seed vs. the winner of the seven-10 game, the No. 3 seed vs. No. 6 and No 4 vs. No. 5. The winners will play in the semifinals on Friday and the championship game will be Saturday night. The 2005 WAC Tournament will be played at Nevada's Lawlor Events Center, March 8-12.

TULSA ADVANCES TO SECOND ROUND – For the second year in a row, Tulsa advanced to the second round of the NCAA tournament. In the first round, 13th-seeded Tulsa defeated fourth-seed Dayton, 84-71, in Spokane, Wash. Dante Swanson and Jason Parker tied for game-high honors with 24 points apiece. Swanson also led the Golden Hurricane with seven rebounds and six assists. Tulsa then lost to fifth-seed Wisconsin in the second round, 61-60. The Golden Hurricane led the Badgers, 58-45, with 4:08 to play, but were outscored 16-2 in the final minutes. Kevin Johnson scored a game-high 23 points and pulled down nine rebounds in his last game for Tulsa. It was Tulsa's 14th trip to the NCAA Tournament (1955-82-84-85-86-87-94-95-96-97-99-00-02-03) and fifth as a member of the WAC. Tulsa is now 12-14 (.462) in the tournament.

THE WAC IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT – The WAC has a 61-81 record (.430) in its teams' 75 appearances in the NCAA Tournament. The second round appearance for Tulsa marked the ninth straight year that a WAC team had advanced past the first round. The furthest a WAC team has ever advanced was in 1998 when Utah played in the NCAA title game before losing to Kentucky, 78-69. UTEP is the only current WAC team to have won a National Championship, but did so prior to joining the WAC (1966).

HAWAII WINS ONE – Hawaii advanced to the second round of the NIT after winning at UNLV, 85-68, in the first round. Michael Kuebler led the Rainbow Warriors with 21 points, while Carl English added 20. UH then traveled to Minnesota where it lost, 84-70. Hawaii had four players score in double figures led by Michael Kuebler's 20 points. Carl English added 19. It was Hawaii's seventh trip to the NIT (1971-74-89-90-97-98-03). The Rainbow Warriors are now 8-7 (.533) in the tournament.

NEVADA'S SEASON ENDS IN LUBBOCK – Nevada made its first postseason appearance in six years when it received a spot in the NIT. The Wolf Pack traveled to Lubbock, Texas where they lost against Texas Tech, 66-54. Nevada had four players score in double figures led by Todd Okeson's 13 points. Kirk Snyder had 12, while Sean Paul and Jerry Petty each scored 10. Nevada finished the season with an 18-14 record, its most wins since a 21-10 record during the 1996-97 season. It was Nevada's third trip to the NIT (1979-97-03). The Wolf Pack are now 2-3 (.400) in the tournament.

THE WAC IN THE NIT – The WAC has a 70-58 record (.547) in its teams' 58 appearances in the NIT. Two WAC teams have won the NIT title as Brigham Young did it in 1966 and Tulsa in 2001. Fresno State (1983) and Tulsa (1981) each wore the NIT crown prior to WAC membership.

ROSS NAMED AP ALL-AMERICAN – SMU's Quinton Ross was named an Associated Press Honorable Mention All-America. The senior guard from Dallas led SMU to a 17-13 record, including 11 conference wins on the year, the most for a Mustang squad since 1992-93 when the Ponies won 12 Southwest Conference games to win the SWC and advance to the NCAA Tournament. Ross finished his career with 1,761 points to rank fourth on the SMU scoring list, averaging a WAC-best 20.3 points and 6.4 rebounds en route to WAC Player of the Year and all-WAC honors as a senior. SMU's last consensus All-American was Jon Koncak, who earned second-team honors in 1984-85.

TULSA WINS FIRST WAC TOURNAMENT TITLE – After coming up short in the three previous WAC tournament championship games, Tulsa finally earned its first title. The Golden Hurricane defeated Nevada, 75-64, in the finals after beating UTEP and Hawai'i in earlier action. It was just the fourth time in the last 13 years that the home team has won the WAC tournament.

ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM – Tulsa placed two players on the Williams WAC All-Tournament team as selected by the media in attendance. Kevin Johnson and Dante Swanson joined Nevada's Kirk Snyder, Hawai'i's Carl English and SMU's Quinton Ross on the team. Kevin Johnson was named the MVP after averaging 14.7 points, 5.0 rebounds and 3.7 blocks. He broke a tournament record with 11 blocks in the three games.

ATTENDANCE – The men's tournament was attended by 22,073 fans during the five sessions (4,415/session). The title game drew 5,326 to the Donald W. Reynolds Center in Tulsa.

YEARLY HONORS – In a vote of league coaches, SMU senior guard/forward Quinton Ross was named the Player of the Year. His teammate, Bryan Hopkins, was the Freshman of the Year and Fresno State first-year head coach Ray Lopes was named the Don Haskins Coach of the Year.

FRESNO STATE WINS REGULAR SEASON TITLE – Fresno State defeated Nevada in the Bulldogs' final game at Selland Arena on March 1, 107-99, in double overtime to clinch the WAC's regular season title. It was the Bulldogs' third regular season WAC championship as they tied for the 1996-97 Pacific Division title and won the 2000-01 conference title outright.

BULLDOGS INELIGIBLE FOR POSTSEASON – Fresno State self-imposed a postseason ban on its team last year as the result of finding instances of academic fraud involving former basketball players. Instances of academic fraud were found as part of the joint investigation by the university and the NCAA. Allegations were made that some players had assistance in completing writing assignments by an individual who was paid to complete those assignments. Those allegations were reported in the *Fresno Bee* newspaper. The investigation by the university and the NCAA substantiated most of those allegations. As a result, Fresno State was ineligible for the WAC tournament, the NCAA tournament and NIT.

PARKER, ENGLISH NAMED ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICANS – Tulsa junior guard Jason Parker and Hawai'i junior guard Carl English were both named to the 2003 Verizon Academic All-America third-team. Parker maintained a 3.57 grade point average in management information systems while English had a 3.28 GPA in business administration. To be eligible for the team, players must possess at least a 3.20 overall grade point average and be a starter or top reserve.

FOUR NAMED TO ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT HONORS – The WAC had four players make the Verizon Academic All-District Men's Basketball

Teams as selected by the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA). Rice's Omar-Seli Mance was a repeat selection and joined SMU's Eric Castro and Tulsa's Jason Parker on the District VI team. Hawai'i's Carl English was selected to the District VII team.

FOUR NAMED TO NABC ALL-DISTRICT TEAMS – The National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) announced its Division I All-District Teams recognizing the country's best men's collegiate basketball student-athletes. The WAC had four players named to the teams. Louisiana Tech senior forward Antonio Meeking was the WAC's only first-team selection (District 8). SMU's Quinton Ross was selected to the District 9 second team while Hawai'i's Carl English and Nevada's Kirk Snyder were named second-teamers in District 13.

TWO NAMED TO USBWA ALL-DISTRICT TEAMS – Hawai'i junior guard Carl English (District IX) and Nevada sophomore guard Kirk Snyder (District VIII) were named to the United States Basketball Writers of America all-district teams.

TOP-SHOOTING OWLS – For the third time in WAC history, a team led the WAC in all three shooting categories. Rice shot 46.9 percent from the field, 73.7 percent from the free throw line and 38.6 percent from three-point range. It was the second year in a row a team led the WAC in all three as Tulsa performed the trifecta during the 2001-02 season.

HOME SWEET HOME – The WAC's 10 teams were a combined 105-44 (.705) at home last season. On the road, the WAC was 41-94 (.304). In conference-only games, the home teams were 61-29 (.671).

ROAD WARRIORS – With 5-4 records, Fresno State and SMU were the only WAC teams to have winning road conference marks. In all road games, only Tulsa had a winning record away from home (9-7) as the Golden Hurricane were 6-6 on the road and 3-1 in neutral site games.

NON-CONFERENCE MARK – The WAC was 56-45 (.554) in non-conference games last season, including a 47-45 (.511) mark against Division I teams. In 2001-02, WAC teams were 71-46 (.607) in non-conference games with a 61-44 (.581) mark against Division I teams. The WAC's best record ever against non-conference opponents came during the 1974-75 season when it was 73-22 (.768).

ENGLISH LEAVES ONE YEAR EARLY – Hawai'i guard Carl English, who graduated with a degree in Liberal Studies in May but had one year left of eligibility, made himself eligible for this past year's NBA Draft. He was not selected, but did sign with the Indiana Pacers in July. English averaged 19.6 points and 5.4 rebounds per game last season with the Rainbow Warriors.

TEAM NOTES – Information on the men's basketball teams in the WAC:
Boise State - Boise State has beaten every team in the WAC except Nevada since joining the league in 2001-02 ... the Broncos had one more win last year than the previous year ... the Broncos' opponents shot 74.1 percent from the free throw line, by far the best percentage against a WAC team this season ... Boise State has not scored 100 points since beating U.S. International, 106-82, during the 1985-86 season (498 games).

Fresno State - the Bulldogs ended their season losing three of their last four games ... Fresno State gave up 82.6 points per game in its five WAC losses and only 63.3 points per game in its 13 wins ... Fresno State was 15-0 when leading at halftime, the only WAC team to not lose a game when leading at the break ... Fresno State was 8-4 in games decided by five points or less ... the Bulldogs won three straight games over SMU, Louisiana Tech and Hawai'i (Jan. 16-23) by a combined total of four points ... head coach Ray Lopes was named CBSsportsline.com's national rookie coach of the year ... senior guard Damon Jackson made four game-winning shots last year and had two game-tying three-pointers in a game against Nevada, one near the end of regulation and the other at the end of the first overtime ... the Bulldogs led the WAC in rebounding margin (+5.7) ... 84.1 percent (122-of-145) of Travis DeManby's field goal attempts came from behind the three-point line ... Fresno State was 116-21 (.847) at Selland Arena since the 1995-96 season ... last year was the final season at Selland Arena for Fresno State as the Bulldogs will play in the Save Mart Center this year.

Hawai'i - had its seven-game WAC Tournament winning streak snapped by Tulsa in the semifinals ... the streak was tied for the longest in WAC history ... junior Carl English broke the school's single-season record of 86 three-point field goals made set by Trevor Ruffin during the 1993-94

season with 89 ... Hawai'i finished its home schedule with a record of 15-1, the fourth best home record in school history ... of its 12 losses, four came by two points or less ... the Rainbow Warriors lost eight WAC road games, five more than they did the previous season ... senior Mark Campbell led the WAC in assists with 6.19 per game and was the only WAC player to average more than 4.5 assists per game ... UH led the WAC in assists (16.35) ... Hawai'i has won 38 of its last 40 game in Honolulu.

Louisiana Tech - Tech finished the season losing six games in a row, the longest current streak in the WAC ... the Bulldogs have not allowed their opponents to score 100 points in a game for 279 contests, the longest streak in the WAC ... the Bulldogs are 17-1 in non-conference home games under head coach Keith Richard.

Nevada - the Pack's 18 wins were the most under head coach Trent Johnson and the most since winning 21 during the 1996-97 season ... its 11 conference wins were the most since joining the WAC ... the Pack led the WAC in scoring with 76.0 points per game ... sophomore Kirk Snyder had a WAC-best 12 double-doubles on the season ... Snyder led the team in rebounding in 14 of the last 16 games ... eight of the Pack's 14 losses came by five or less points ... Nevada was 2-8 in games decided by five points or less ... the Pack was 0-3 in overtime games this season.

Rice - the Owls were the only team in the WAC to not lose back-to-back games last season ... senior Omar-Seli Mance had more three-point field goals last year (82) than he did in his previous two years (62) ... Mance led the WAC in three-point field goals made per game with 2.93 ... Mance was one of three finalists for the Cremland Dairies Collegiate Basketball Student-Athlete of the Year award ... the Owls' 19 wins were a nine-game improvement from the 2001-02 season ... the 11 conference wins were the most since joining the WAC ... Rice had 244 steals last season, breaking the school record of 215 set in 1982 ... Rice had a winning record for the first time since the 1998-99 season ... the Owls' six road wins were the most since winning six in 1994-95 ... Rice's three-point field goal percentage of 71.4 (10-for-14) against Navy on Dec. 23, tied for the sixth best performance in the nation last year ... sophomore Michael Harris led the WAC in field goal percentage (.623) ... junior Yamar Diene broke school records for blocked shots in a season (45) and career (94) ... sophomore Jason McKrieth led the WAC in free throw percentage (.851) ... Rice led the WAC in field goal percentage (.469), three-point field goal percentage (.386), free throw percentage (.737) and steals (8.41 spg) ... the free throw percentage was the best by an Owl team since shooting 73.9 percent in the 1979-80 season.

San Jose State - for the second year in a row, the Spartans ended a team's long home winning streak as in 2001, SJSU stopped Iowa State's streak at 39 games, and last year it broke Hawai'i's streak at 24 games ... San Jose State led the WAC in turnover margin (+3.57) ... San Jose State was last in the WAC in free throw percentage (.621) ... SJSU has not scored 100 points in a game since beating Utah State, 101-85, on Jan. 25, 1979 (686 games).

SMU - freshman Bryan Hopkins led the WAC in steals with 2.10 per game ... senior Quinton Ross finished his career starting 89 straight games, the longest streak by any active player in the WAC ... Ross led the WAC in scoring with 20.3 points per game ... Ross scored in double figures in 23 straight games, the longest streak in the WAC by an active player ... Ross's 988 career points scored in WAC games only are the 18th most in league history ... the Mustangs average scores were 72.8-72.8, the most competitive scoring margin in the WAC ... SMU played in a school record five overtime games and won four, also a school record.

UTEP - the Miners' neutral site win against San Jose State in the WAC Tournament was their first win away from El Paso since the 2001 WAC tournament ... Justino Victoriano led the WAC in rebounding with 8.5 per game ... the Miners have lost 26 road games in a row ... UTEP was the only WAC team to not win a road game last year (0-11) ... the Miners were also the only WAC team to not win a road game in 2001-02 (0-12).

Tulsa - has won at least 20 games in each of the last five seasons and ninth time in the last 10 years ... Tulsa is 10-3 in the postseason the last four years: 3-1 in 2000 NCAA, 5-0 in 2001 NIT, 1-1 in 2002 NCAA and 1-1 in 2003 NCAA ... the Golden Hurricane have won 11 of their last 13 games ... senior Kevin Johnson led the WAC in blocks with 2.30 per game ... senior guard Dante Swanson made 50 percent (39-78) of his three-point field goal attempts in his last 12 games ... the Hurricane have won by an average of 18.4 points in their last nine home games ... Tulsa led the WAC in scoring margin (+8.1), scoring defense (65.3 ppg), field goal percentage defense (.399) and three-point field goals made per game (6.58) ... Tulsa is 64-11 (.853) at the Reynolds Center, the best winning percentage at home of any WAC team in its current arena ... every season that Tulsa has won 20 games, it has either played in the NCAA Tournament or won the NIT Championship.

- ▶ *The Wolf Pack won 18 games in 2002-03, the most under fifth-year head coach Trent Johnson and the most since 1996-97. Nevada has put together back-to-back winning seasons for the first time since the 1996-97 and 1997-98 seasons.*

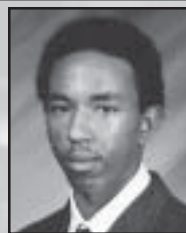

- ▶ **SMU has posted seven straight 15-plus win seasons, setting a new mark for the longest such streak in school history.**
- ▶ **Quinton Ross and Bryan Hopkins won WAC Player of the Year and Freshman of the Year honors, respectively, in 2002-03, marking the first time SMU student-athletes have ever won those conference honors. The pair combined to average 33.3 points per contest, the highest scoring tandem in the WAC.**
- ▶ **SMU is the only team in the league that has a winning road record in conference play each of the last two years. The Mustangs won 56 percent (10-of-18) of its WAC road games the last two seasons, while the rest of the WAC has combined to win just 35 percent (57-of-162) of its away games.**
- ▶ **SMU went 4-1 in overtime games in 2002-03, breaking the school records for number of overtime games and wins in a season.**
- ▶ **After not having a player average more than 20 points per game for 26 seasons, SMU has had a player break the 20-point barrier in each of the last two seasons (Ross in 2002-03, Damon Hancock in 2001-02).**
- ▶ **Head coach Mike Dement has coached seven players (Jeryl Sasser, 1st; Quinton Ross, 4th; Damon Hancock, 9th; Stephen Woods, 10th; Jay Poerner, 13th; Willie Davis, 14th; Troy Matthews, 17th) who rank among the school's all-time top 17 scorers.**
