Te Tau Ihu Treaty Settlements

As part of the treaty settlement there are a number of features common between iwi and some which are specific. Of principal interest to the Council is the cultural redress which recognises the traditional, historical and spiritual association of iwi with places and sites within the iwi rohe. Identified in this paper are the obligations which may impact on Council in some way. Attachments to the Deeds include mapped areas which are identified.

Note a Statutory Acknowledgement registers the special association iwi has with an area. Statutory Acknowledgements are recognised under the Resource Management Act 1991 and requires that consent authorities provide iwi with summaries of all resource consent applications that may affect the areas named in the acknowledgements.

Features common to all Settlement Deeds include:

a) River and Freshwater Advisory Committee

The Deed of Settlements provide for an advisory committee providing iwi input into local authority planning and decision making in relation to the management of rivers and fresh water under the Resource Management Act 1991 within the jurisdictions of Marlborough District Council, Nelson City Council and Tasman District Council. This provision only applies to Ngati Toa if it decides to join in the committee.

b) Memorandum of Understanding

The Deed of Settlements provide for the promotion of relationships between iwi and local authorities. The Minister of Treaty Negotiations will write to Nelson City Council, Tasman District Council, Buller District Council and Marlborough District Council are encouraging them to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding in relation to interactions with iwi.

c) Change in Place names

The Te Tau Ihu settlements provide for a number of existing geographic names to change and some new sites which do not currently have official names to be assigned geographic names. The list of place names in Tasman are as follows
