A message from the Lord Mayor

I am pleased to announce the Sydney Street ferry terminal upgrade will start in January 2015.

After being severely damaged in the 2011 flood, a temporary terminal was installed at Sydney Street to get services back up and running as quickly as possible. This temporary terminal was built to preflood standards meaning that in the event of another major flood, it is likely to need to be rebuilt again.

With funding provided by the Australian and Queensland governments as part of the National Disaster Relief Recovery Arrangement (NDRRA), Brisbane City Council is committed to building a permanent terminal at Sydney Street.

This new terminal will be more flood resilient, have improved accessibility for persons with a mobility or vision impairment, will assist to provide a more efficient transport network and will cater for the increasing number of passengers over the next 50 years.

While the upgrade is underway, the Sydney Street ferry terminal will close. Public transport information is provided over the page to assist you in planning your journey during this time.

I look forward to delivering this new terminal for the people of New Farm.



The Sydney Street ferry terminal upgrade includes:

- installing a new flood resilient dual-berthing pontoon
- installing a robust nine metre high pier with the capacity to deflect heavy objects in flood waters
- installing a gangway that detaches from the waiting area in the event of a flood to avoid being struck by debris
- constructing a new accessible pathway from Sydney Street to the terminal
- retaining and improving the existing waiting structure
- making the terminal safer and easier to use for persons with a mobility or vision impairment.

Public transport options during construction

While the upgrade is underway, the Sydney Street ferry terminal will close.

Regular CityCat and CityHopper commuters have a range of transport options available to take them to the CBD or further downstream to Bulimba and beyond.

Bus

Bus services are available throughout New Farm. A number of services are available a short walk from the Sydney Street ferry terminal, including the 196 BUZ at 'Merthyr' stop 1 Oxlade Drive and the 195 peak hours at Sydney Street near Griffith Street.

CityCat

The New Farm Park ferry terminal will remain open during the construction of the Sydney Street ferry terminal.

Riverwalk

The New Farm Riverwalk is one of Brisbane City Council's key river connections between New Farm and the Brisbane city centre. Riverwalk can be accessed from the city via the Howard Smith Wharves; entry is located at the end of Boundary Street under the Storey Bridge. From the Southern end, access is via Riverview Court near the end of Merthyr Road at New Farm.
