# Jeanne Gang, FAIA, LEED AP

# FOUNDER AND PRINCIPAL, STUDIO GANG ARCHITECTS



Architect and MacArthur Fellow Jeanne Gang is the founding principal of Studio Gang Architects, a Chicago-based collective of architects, designers, and thinkers practicing internationally. Jeanne uses architecture as a medium of active response to contemporary issues and their impact on human experience. Each of her projects resonates with its specific site and culture while addressing global themes such as urbanization, climate, and sustainability. Her award-winning work includes the 82-story Aqua Tower, the 2009 Emporis Skyscraper of the Year; the SOS Lavezzorio Community Center, constructed solely from donated materials; the Nature Boardwalk at Lincoln Park Zoo, an educational pavilion and landscape that function as stormwater infrastructure; and the WMS Boathouse at Clark Park, which creates a new public access point along the Chicago River.

Since founding Studio Gang in 1997, Jeanne has won numerous honors, among them a MacArthur Fellowship, an Academy Award in Architecture from the American Academy of Arts and Letters, and the 2013 National Design Award from the Cooper-Hewitt National Design Museum. In 2009 she was named a Fellow of the American Institute of Architects. A distinguished alumna of the Harvard Graduate School of Design, Jeanne has taught at Harvard, Yale, Princeton, Rice, and IIT, where her studios have focused on cities, ecologies, materials, and technologies. *Reveal*, her first volume on Studio Gang's work and process, was released in 2011. That same year, Jeanne self-published *Reverse Effect*, a collaboration with the Natural Resources Defense Council that explores a radically greener future for the Chicago River and the Great Lakes. Jeanne's work has been exhibited widely, notably at the International Venice Biennale, the Museum of Modern Art, the National Building Museum, and the Art Institute of Chicago, where her firm's first solo exhibition, *Building: Inside Studio Gang Architects*, set record attendance during its run from September 2012 to February 2013.
