# New England College Polling Center Registered Likely NH Voters September 26, 2014 Poll Results



The results presented below were obtained through automated telephone interviews conducted by the New England College Polling Center on September 26, 2014. A total of 1,331 responses were obtained, 629 from registered likely NH voters in Congressional District 1 and 702 from registered likely NH voters in Congressional District 2. The margin of error for questions 1, 2, and 4 is +/- 2.69%. The margin of error for question 3-CD1 is +/- 3.91% and for question 3-CD2 is +/- 3.70%.
