
















- Patient ambulation ability will be assessed by OT or PT

- Patients will be re-assessed following a fall or near fall, or re-evaluated during UT/YT intervention (if on caseload)

#### MEMORANDUM

TO: Health Sector Stakeholders

RE: Radiation Health Response Plan

I am pleased to announce the release of the Ministry of Health and Long-Term Care's Radiation Health Response Plan. This plan was developed by the Ministry's Emergency Management Branch in support of the Office of the Fire Marshal and Emergency Management's Provincial Nuclear Emergency Response Plan and is designed to guide health sector planning at provincial and local levels across Ontario. The plan outlines:

- how the health system responds to a radiological and/or nuclear incident of accidental or deliberate nature, and the conditions under which precautionary and protective actions are implemented for the general public and health system
- a comprehensive province-wide approach to health planning and response, including information to guide local incident planning
- roles and responsibilities, operational concepts and response principles for coordinating the response of health organizations

The goal of the plan is to ensure that Ontario's health sector would be ready to respond to a radiological or nuclear incident of deliberate or accidental nature so that the risk of illness and death is minimized and health workers are protected.

This plan is the result of a collaboration of many individuals from local public health, hospitals, emergency medical services, government, Public Health Ontario, professional associations, and the nuclear industry who provided their time and expertise to help develop the *Radiation Health Response Plan*. The Ministry of Health and Long-Term Care acknowledges their hard work and dedication to protecting the health and safety of Ontarians.

I encourage you to use the information and resources in this plan to increase your organization's knowledge and understanding of radiological and nuclear emergency planning concepts and to support the development of your own radiological and nuclear emergency plans.
