

#### TITANS SET SIGHTS ON NATIONAL TITLE; FULLERTON KICKS **OFF POSTSEASON IN TUCSON AS NO. 2 SEED IN REGIONALS**

THIS WEEK -- The No. 10 Cal State Fullerton softball team kicks off its 20th trip to the postseason on the road this weekend as the Titans head to Tucson, AZ to face five other teams in NCAA Regional play, beginning on Thursday (May 17) and continuing through Sunday (May 20). The winner of the regional will advance to the Women's College World Series in Oklahoma City, OK.

The Titans will face Texas Tech in the first round beginning at 12 p.m. MDT while No. 3 seed Hawaii will face No. 4 Southwest Texas State, and the Wildcats will face No. 6 St. Peter's.



TITANS A MAINSTAY IN POSTSEASON PLAY -- The Cal State Fullerton softball team has been almost an automatic when it comes to qualifying for the postseason. The Titans have advanced to the postseason in 20 of 22 seasons since beginning softball at the university in 1980. Fullerton has then gone on to advance to the Women's College World Series eight different times, winning the National Championship in 1986.

However, the Titans are looking to snap a five-season streak that has not seen Cal State Fullerton among the World Series field since 1995 (where they eventually finished fifth). The Titans have advanced to regional play in 1996, 1999 and 2000, since their last World Series appearance, but have been sent home early each time.

RECORDS IN THE POST SEASON -- Cal State Fullerton has amassed a 54-39 overall record in postseason play dating back to the first season of softball at the university in 1980. The Titans are a combined 32-25 (.561) in regional play and 22-14 (.611) in College World Series play during that span.

Cal State Fullerton brought home the national championship in 1986, has finished second on three different occassions (1981, 1983, 1985) and third twice (1982, 1987).

AS THE WORLD TOURNEY'S -- Cal State Fullerton has posted a 302-137 (.688) overall record in tournament play (both regular season and postseason) since the program began back in 1980.

In regionals held at Cal State Fullerton, The Titans are 15-11 (.577) overall, but the home field advantage has been anything but for the home team. Fullerton has failed to advance to the Women's College World Series in the last four consecutive regionals that the Titans have hosted.

Cal State Fullerton brought home the title in three tournaments this season at the New Mexico Diamond Invitational, the Chevron Paradise Classic, and the 2001 Kia Klassic. The Titans finished second at the Worth Invitational at the Titan Softball Complex and finished third at the Texas Invitational.

In regular season tournaments that the Titans have hosted, Fullerton has posted a 110-52 (.679) record in 26 events. The Titans have posted a losing record in a regular season tournament at home only four times in the history of the program.

TITANS TAKE BACK-TO-BACK BIG WEST CROWNS -- With a sweep of Utah State this past weekend, the Cal State Fullerton softball team successfully defended its Big West title and earned the conference's automatic bid to the postseason. It is the 11th overall conference title for the Titans in the sport and the fifth overall title since joining the PCAA/ Big West in 1986. It is also just the third outright Big West title for Cal State Fullerton since joining the conference, earning sole possession of the trophy in 1986, 2000 and 2001.

TITANS REACH MILENNIUM MARK WITH 1,000TH WIN -- The 2001 Cal State Fullerton softball team added another milestone to the star-studded history of the program by claiming the school's 1,000th victory in the sport on Apr. 28 in the second game of a

Fullerton has amassed an overall all-time record of 1,004-403-4 in the 22-year history of the program for a .712 winning percentage. The Titans have never had a losing season in the history of the program and have had nine seasons of 50 or more victories -- including eight consecutive years from 1981-88.

**IN THE POLLS --** Cal State Fullerton is currently ranked No. 10 in the nation in the most recent *USA Today*/National Fastpitch Coaches Association poll after finishing the regular season with a 46-12 overall record and a 19-2 mark in Big West play. Arizona is the No. 1 team in the nation with a 57-4 overall record while Southwest Texas State is ranked in a tie for No. 19. Hawaii is receiving 16 votes from the coaches while Texas Tech and St. Peter's are unranked.

**THAT'S "QUEEN TOPPING" TO YOU --** Cal State Fullerton sophomore catcher Jenny Topping is in a race with the rest of the conference for the coveted "Triple Crown" and, if she keeps things up, Topping will become only the second player in Big West history to become royalty.

UNLV's Kim Rodina is the only player in Big West Conference history to accomplish the feat, hitting .436 with 15 home runs and 58 RBI during the 1995 season.

If Topping continues at this pace, she would also become only the fourth player (and the fifth time overall) to ever lead the team in all three triple crown categories,

Topping currently leads the Big West in batting average (.423) and runs batted in (58) while slugging a league-best 14 home runs this season.

**NATIONAL SUPERSTARS** -- Aside from the numbers the Titans are putting up in the Big West, the 2001 Cal State Fullerton softball team also ranks among the NCAA leaders.

Jenny Topping ranks 13th in the nation with a .423 batting average and is tied for 13th in the country with 1.00 RBI per game. She is also tied for 18th with 0.24 home runs per game and tied for 19th in the country with 0.31 doubles per game.

Junior Yasmin Mossadeghi's power display has her ranked among the nation's best sluggers this year, ranked in a tie for 19th with 0.24 home runs per game.

As a team, the Titans are 13th in the nation with a .295 batting average, rank 13th in the nation with a .793 winning percentage, and currently rank 17th in the nation in scoring with an average of 5.07 runs per game.



**SCOUTING THE RED RAIDERS --** Texas Tech enters the NCAA Regional with a 35-22 overall record and a 10-8 mark in Big 12 play. The Red Raiders are led by Sandy Butler, who is hitting .369 on the season with eight RBI. The power is supplied by Carmen Grindell and Shauna Briggs, who have hit seven and five home runs, respectively, and have combined to drive in 57 runs this season.

In the circle, Texas Tech is led by Amanda Renfro, who is 32-17 overall this season with a 1.04 ERA. She has thrown 37 complete games and has tossed 16 shut-

outs. She has surrendered only 49 earned runs in 328.1 innings and has struck out 395 batters while holding the opposition to a .186 batting average.







**SCOUTING THE RAINBOW WAHINE** -- Hawaii enters regional play with a 46-16 overall record and a 16-4 mark in the Western Athletic Conference. The Titans and the Wahine have met three times this season, with Cal State Fullerton coming out on top all three times by a combined score of, 17-4.

Hawaii is led by Natalie Gonzales, who is hitting .348 on the season with a home run and 22 RBI. Shortstop Kate Judd has hit eight home runs this season and driven in 30 while Stacey Porter and April Crowell have each hit five home runs this season.

In the circle, the Wahine are led by Felicity Witt, who is 22-10 overall this season with a 1.26 ERA. She has thrown 26 complete games this season with 10 shutouts while striking out 165 batters in 199.2 innings.



**SCOUTING THE BOBCATS --** Southwest Texas State enters regional play with a 52-10 overall record and a 26-1 record in the Southland Conference. The Bobcats won 38 of their last 41 games to clinch the conference title and advance to the postseason.

Southwest Texas is led by Kristen Zaleski, who is hitting .360 on the season with 21 stolen bases and 20 RBI. Sarah Kmiec is also hot, hitting .327 on the year with 10 home runs and 36 RBI while slugging .571 on the season.

In the circle, the Bobcats split time between two quality starters in Jessica Chase and Nicole Neuerburg. Chase is 28-3 overall this season with a 0.55 ERA. She has thrown 23 complete games and 18 shutouts while allowing just 17 earned runs in 214.2 innings. Neuerburg is 22-6 overall this season with a 0.93 ERA and 10 shutouts. She leads the team with 181 strikeouts in 187.2 innings and has allowed just 25 earned runs this season.



**SCOUTING THE WILDCATS --** Arizona is the host for the Region 1 tournament and enters the regional with a 57-4 overall record and a 19-2 mark in Pacific 10 Conference play. The Wildcats earned the Pac-10's automatic berth to the NCAA Tournament.

Arizona is led by six players who have hit more than 10 home runs apiece this season to set a new NCAA record with 116 home runs this season. Toni Mascarenas leads the group with 20 round-trippers and 71 RBI. Leneah Manuma is right behind her with 19 home runs and 58 RBI. Lauren Bauer is the team's leading hitter with a .442 average, 12 home runs and 45 RBI.

In the circle, Jenny Finch is the leader for the Wildcats, posting a perfect 27-0 record with a 0.24 ERA. She has allowed just six earned runs in 174.0 innings and has struck out 243 batters while holding opponents to a .121 batting average.



**SCOUTING THE PEAHENS** -- St. Peters enters the regional with a 42-18 overall record and a 10-6 record in the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference. After losing six straight, the Peahens won four in a row to capture the MAAC Tournament title and the conference's automatic bid.

St. Peter's is led by Aimee Barsalona, who is hitting .343 this season with 10 home runs and 48 RBI. She is slugging .611 on the season and has walked a team-high 19

times. Aside from Barsalona, the Peahens feature six other players who have hit five or more home runs and eight players who have driven in 20 or more runs.

In the circle, the Peahens are led by Sandy Attanasio, who is 22-8 overall this season with a 1.66 ERA. She has thrown 24 complete games and tossed 12 shutouts this season while striking out 155 in 228.1 innings. Opponents are hitting just .226 against her this year.

**THAT'S WHY THEY ARE "RANKED" OPPONENTS --** With all of the things that have gone right for the Cal State Fullerton softball team this season, "Murphy's Law" has to come in and mix things up in one way or another.

Despite a solid 46-12 overall record this season, Cal State Fullerton is just 12-9 against opponents ranked in the top 25 this season, with the Titan offense and pitching staff really struggling to keep things afloat.

Fullerton is hitting just .232 against ranked opposition this season, 63 points less than its overall team batting average of .295, and the team ERA is 2.38 against ranked foes, almost a run higher than the overall team average of 1.48 this season.

Individuals also are struggling against ranked foes. Sophomore Jenny Topping, who is hitting .423 this season with 14 home runs and 58 RBI, is the team's leading hitter against ranked foes, hitting just .360 with five home runs and 18 RBI. She is the only regular Titan starter hitting over .300 as junior Yasmin Mossadeghi is second with a .290 average.

Junior Christy Robitaille is the only Titan hurler to see some success against ranked hitters, posting a 3-1 record with a 1.41 ERA. However, the sophomore duo of Gina Oaks and Jodie Cox have allowed a total of 63 runs (43 earned) in 111.2 innings to go along with a 2.71 ERA. Opponents are hitting a combined .246 against the Titans this season.

THESE CHICKS DIG THE LONG BALL -- Cal State Fullerton sluggers have blasted a grand total of 45 home runs this season, falling just six short of tying the school record of 51 home runs set back during the 1999 season, led by All-American Stephenie Little's 23 round-trippers.

However, it's the number of people who have been on base when those home runs have been hit this season that is more impressive. Of the 45 home runs hit by the Titans this season, only 11 of those have been solo shots.

Cal State Fullerton has hit 18 home runs with one runner on base and 10 home runs with two runners on. The power display doesn't stop there as Gina Oaks and Jodie Cox have both hit grand slams this season, including two in the same game by Oaks, who drove in eight runs against Kansas in the second game of the season at the New Mexico Diamond Invitational.

LETHAL WITH 'EM LOADED -- No pitcher likes to see runners on base behind them when they are in the circle. Now imagine the predicament when the bases are loaded. Now imagine the bases are loaded and the Titans are up to bat.

Cal State Fullerton is hitting a robust .387 this season with the bases loaded and has five players hitting .300 or better with the sacks full of Titans. Sophomore Gina Oaks is the Titans' leading hitter in the category, going 6-for-9 (.667), with a double, two home runs and 16 RBI. Sophomore Jenny Topping is second in that category, hitting .625 (5-for-8), with two doubles and a triple to go along with 14 RBI.

Although she hasn't hit for as spectacular of an average, sophomore Jodie Cox has also excelled in this category, hitting just .308 (4-for-13), but has driven in 12 runs wih a triple and a home run.

GET 'EM ON, GET 'EM HOME -- Put runners on base for Titan hitters this season and chances are, soon thereafter, you will see them crossing home plate.

Cal State Fullerton is hitting .319 this season with runners on base as a team and features nine players hitting .300 or better in that situation. The Titans have smacked 40 of their 72 doubles with runners on base, and have hit 31 home runs and driven in 241 runs in the process.

Jenny Topping leads the squad, hitting .512 with runners on base, driving in 52 runs on 12 doubles, two triples, and 10 home runs while notching a 1.073 slugging percentage. Freshman Julie Watson is the next Titan regular in the category, hitting .373 with runners on, with two triples an eight RBI.

Junior outfielder Yasmin Mossadeghi is hitting a robust .340 with three doubles, eight home runs, and 37 RBI with runners on base. Junior Monica Lucatero is fourth on the list with a .336 average, driving in 38 runs and smacking nine doubles, a triple and four home runs.

SCORE FIRST, ASK QUESTIONS LATER -- Softball is a funny game. Often, just one run on the board will win you a ball game and with just seven innings to play, the amount of time you have to mount a comeback is limited. Or, it could be just that you had the bad luck of hitting first.

This year's Titan team has shown how important getting on the board quickly can be. When Cal State Fullerton has put a run up on the scoreboard first this season, the Titans are an amazing 40-1 overall.

The one blemish came against Arizona State in the second game of the Kia Klassic on March 15. In that game, the Titans put up runs in the first two innings, but saw the lead disappear as the Sun Devils put up three runs in the third and held off the Titans late in the game to win, 6-3.

Things aren't necessarily bad when Fullerton falls behind, however, as the Titans have posted six come-from-behind victories this season. The Titans trailed Hawai'i by the score of 3-0 on Feb. 18 at the Chevron Paradise Classic before coming back to win, 4-3. They trailed #20 Texas, 2-0, on Feb. 25 before winning 4-3 in eight innings.

They trailed San Jose State, 1-0, entering the seventh inning before Gina Oaks smacked a two-run double in the bottom of the seventh to win the game, 2-1. The Titans also trailed Northwestern, #12 Washington, and #25 Cal State Northridge by scores of 1-0 early before winning all three of those contests in the later innings.



**DOUBLE-DOUBLE... SOFTBALL STYLE --** Chances are, when you have 10 or more runs or 10 or more hits in a game, you are going home a winner.

Fullerton has proved this little theory often this season, posting a perfect 6-0 record in games in which the Titans have scored double-digit runs, and are an almost perfect 14-1 in games where they have knocked out 10 or more hits in a game.

The only blemish on the record came against North Carolina in the first game of the Kia Klassic on March 14, when the Titans appeared to score the winning run in the bottom of the seventh, but the runner was called out at home and the Tar Heels won it in the top of the eighth.

**R-I-S-P... NOT JUST FOR ALPHABET SOUP ANYMORE --** It is perhaps the most obscure acronym for one of the most telling statistics in gauging a team's performance under pressure given the chance to put their team on the scoreboard.

Cal State Fullerton has done very well under that kind of pressure, batting .306 with runners in scoring position and tallying seven players hitting over .300 with the chance to drive in runs.

Sophomore Jenny Topping is hitting .523 with runners in scoring position to go with six doubles, a triple, four home runs and 36 RBI. She is slugging .977 in that situation and has walked a teamhigh 19 times while striking out just three times this season.


Junior Monica Lucatero is hitting a solid .324 with seven doubles and 38 RBI while sophomore Gina Oaks is hitting .333 with six doubles, three home runs, and 34 RBI. Junior outfielder Yasmin Mossadeghi has been the most powerful hitter in this situation, hitting .333 on the year while slugging a team-best seven home runs, driving in 34 runs and walking 11 times.

If it was possible to hit any better with the added pressure of two outs and runners in scoring position, the Titans could do it. Topping is hitting .600 in that situation, with three doubles, two home runs and 19 RBI. Lucatero (.333) and Oaks (.308) have each driven in 19 runs for the Titans, while sophomore shortstop Amanda Hockett is hitting .333 with two doubles, three home runs and 13 RBI.

**TITAN HURLERS AMONG BEST VS. BIG WEST HITTERS --** There haven't been a lot of balls hitting the ground for the opposing hitters against the Titan hurlers this season as Christy Robitaille, Jodie Cox and Gina Oaks have kept hitters at bay all season long.

Cox, Robitaille and Oaks rank second, third and fourth, respectively, in the conference in opposing batting average, all trailing Pacific's Cindy Ball, who finished the season with a .175 opponents batting average.

Cox is second in the category with a .177 average and has allowed only 95 hits in 538 at bats in 150.1 innings. Oaks is third in the category with a .201 opponent batting average, allowing just 113 hits in 563 at bats, while Robitaille is fourth in the category with a .203 average, allowing 59 hits in 290 at bats in 79 innings.

#### #9 CAL ST. FULLERTON 2, Utah State 0

The No. 9 Cal State Fullerton softball team wrapped up its second consecutive and fifth overall Big West Conference championship on Saturday afternoon with a series sweep of Utah State by the scores of, 2-0, 5-0, and 3-0 at the Titan Softball Complex.

The Titans won Big West titles in 1986, 1987, 1993, and 2000 while winning the crown outright in 1986 and 2000.

In game one, Topping slugged her Big West-leading 14th home run of the season and Gina Oaks threw a one-hit shutout to pace the Titans to a 2-0 victory over Utah State.

Topping's shot came in the third inning when she ripped a 3-1 pitch over the right centerfield fence with Julie Watson on base to give the Titans and Oaks the only runs they would need.

Oaks (19-6) went the distance for the 16th time this season and tossed her sixth shuout of the year. She allowed just one hit, walked one and struck out nine Aggie batters on the day. It was her third straight game of nine strikeouts after doing the same to Cal State Northridge in two wins last weekend.

Xochitl Ramirez (4-9) took the loss for Utah State, allowing two runs on nine hits, walking two and striking out three.

Oaks and Lucatero each had two hits in the game while sophomore Jodie Cox was 1-for-1 with a pair of walks.

#### #9 CAL ST. FULLERON 5, Utah State 0

In game two, it was more of the same for the Titans as Amanda Hockett hit her fifth home run of the season and Christy Robitaille held the Aggies in check to lead the Titans to a 5-0 shutout win to clinch the Big West Conference title.

Hockett slammed her round-tripper in the second inning over the left field fence with Oaks on base to give the Titans a 2-0 lead. Fullerton added another run in the third on a fielder's choice and tacked on two more in the fourth on a two-run single with the bases loaded by Lucatero to complete the scoring.

Robitaille (9-1) held the Aggies without a hit until the fourth inning and scattered just four hits on the afternoon en route to her ninth victory of the season. With the shutout, Robitaille now has 14 career shutouts which moves her into a tie for 10th place on the Titans' career list. Lisa Spencer (6-12) took the loss for the Aggies, allowing five runs on nine hits and walking three.

#### #9 CAL ST. FULLERTON 3, Utah State 0

The No. 9 Cal State Fullerton softball team wrapped up the 2001 regular season by completing the series sweep of Utah State on Sunday afternoon, defeating the Aggies, 3-0, at the Titan Softball Complex.

Sophomore catcher Jenny Topping led the way at the plate for the Titans on Senior Day, going 2-for-3 with two runs scored and a walk. Topping also gathered her 52nd walk of the season, placing her in 11th place on the NCAA single-season list. Five other Titans notched hits on the day, including seniors Rachel Olvera and Brenda Iglesias, who were playing their final regular season games in front of the home crowd.

The Titans opened things up in the bottom of the first, as Fullerton parlayed a wild pitch and an RBI single by pitcher Jodie Cox into a quick 2-0 lead. The Titans completed the scoring in the fourth on an RBI single by Iglesias for a 3-0 lead.

Cox (18-5) held the Aggies in check all afternoon, going the distance for her 18th complete game and 11th shutout of the season. Her 17 shutouts rank ninth on the Cal State Fullerton career list while her 31 career complete games are two behind Brandi Isgar and Cheryl Longeway for 10th place on the all-time list. Cox scattered just three hits and struck out three en route to the victory.

Kristin Hommel (1-18) struggled on the day, throwing three wild pitches and being called for an illegal pitch in the loss. She gave up three runs on five hits, walked seven and struck out one batter. **OUTFIELDERS TO COX: WILL WORK FOR FLY BALLS** -- Jodie Cox has been one of the Big West Conference's most dominating pitchers this season, but it's the way that she has been dominant that is so impressive.

Of the 431 total putouts that Cox has gotten this season, 90 percent of those outs have come via the strikeout or ground ball. She has struck out 166 batters this year and, of those outs not ending up in the mitts of Jenny Topping or Amy LaRocque behind the plate, she has induced batters to hit into 222 ground ball outs this season. Only 43 outs have come via the fly ball.

This season, Cox is averaging 10.34 ground outs per game with only 2.00 fly ball outs during the same span. She is also striking out 7.73 per game.

**SAME STAT, DIFFERENT RECORD BOOK --** With her assault on the Big West Conference and school record books running at an all-time high, Jenny Topping is now moving up the NCAA record books. Topping, who has been walked a team-high 52 times this season, is now in 11th place on the NCAA single-season walks list.

Topping also ranks in a tie for fifth on that very same chart after walking 56 times during her freshman year at Washington in 2000.

She needs just two walks to move into a 4. tie for eighth place on the NCAA single-season list and seven more walks to move into a tie for fourth place. The NCAA record for walks in a season is held by California's 9. Veronica Nelson, who walked 87 times in 74 games last year. 12.

Topping already owns the school's singleseason record for walks, surplanting Stephenie Little, who walked 36 times in 1999.

NCAA Season Walks...

Against UCSB earlier this season, Topping surplanted Fresno State's Gina LoPiccolo atop the Big West single-season list with two walks in game one of the doubleheader. LoPiccolo walked 43 times during the 1991 season to set the record.

Topping broke into the school's career walks list with six free passes against Cal State Northridge, and stands in sole possession of 10th place, just one walk short of tying Julie Williams and Jan Pierini for eighth place, and four short of passing Mich DeBree and Tobi Perkins for sixth place. The career record is held by Sue Lewis, who walked 89 times from 1981-84.

Topping needs just 12 more walks to surpass UNLV's Michele Moreno for No. 10 on the Big West career charts. The conference's career record is 106 held by Utah State's Jennifer Power (1991-94) and FSU's LoPiccolo (1988-91).

**ROBITAILLE AND THE NCAA --** With a little more than one season remaining with the Titans, Robitaille is poised to become one of the best relief pitchers in NCAA history. She has collected 13 saves in her career and currently ranks ninth all-time. Robitaille needs just 12 more saves to surpass Notre Dame's Kelly Nichols, who set the record with 24 career saves from 1995-98.

**LEADING OFF? THAT'S ELEMENTARY MY DEAR WATSON --** Cal State Fullerton freshman Julie Watson (Valencia, CA/Saugus HS) has been the sparkplug to the Titan offense this season, reaching base in 36-of-78 (46.2%) opportunities as the leadoff hitter in an inning this season. Watson has hit first in the starting lineup 50 times this season and is hitting .280 (44-for-157) on the year.

However, don't let the average fool you as Watson has done well to put herself in a position so that other players can drive her home. She has come around to score 33 times this season (good for second on the team), has walked 19 times as the leadoff hitter (second on the team), and has been successful in 6-of-10 chances in stolen bases this year.

With runners on base during her at bat, Watson has also been successful at moving the runners up, advancing 40 runners to the next base in 69 tries (58.0%) and is tied for fourth on the team with six sacrifices this season.
