

NOSTRA AETATE FOUNDATION STUDY GRANTS

The *Nostra Aetate Foundation* was established in 1990 under the auspices of the Pontifical Council for Interreligious Dialogue as a means of promoting and supporting dialogue between Christians and believers of other religions in different countries around the world. It is based on the teachings of the Catholic Church as found in the Declaration of the Vatican Council II, *Nostra Aetate*, on relations with non-Christians. (28 October 1965)

My wish is that the dialogue between us should help to build bridges connecting all people, in such a way that everyone can see in the other not an enemy, not a rival, but a brother or sister to be welcomed and embraced!... In this work, the role of religion is fundamental. It is not possible to build bridges between people while forgetting God. But the converse is also true: it is not possible to establish true links with God, while ignoring other people. Hence it is important to intensify dialogue among the various religions..." The **PONTIFICAL COUNCIL FOR INTERRELIGIOUS DIALOGUE** offers study grants to qualifying persons who have a proven experience working in the area of Interreligious Dialogue. Our focus is on helping eligible students to deepen their knowledge of Christianity through study at one of the Pontifical Universities in Rome. By studying in Rome at the center of the Catholic Church, it is the hope that these persons can return to their country of origin with an enriched awareness of Christianity so as to be better prepared to participate in the on-going dialogue there among believers.

> The **STUDY GRANTS** are awarded to persons who have completed their university studies and have received their diploma. The individual must be recommended by either the Pontifical Representative in their home country, by a member of the Pontifical Council or another authority of the Catholic Church. The grant covers one semester of study (either fall or winter) and includes registration fees, tuition for the designated courses plus room and board. Travelling expenses are not included. As part of the acceptance process, the applicant should include a plan of study or research in his/her application and should

In **EXCEPTIONAL CASES**, Nostra Aetate Study Grants may be made for study or research outside of Rome. There is also a limited amount of financial aid for such efforts as publications, purchase of books and organized study sessions with the singular focus of promoting interreligious dialogue.
