- 3 Students are eligible to enroll after participation is approved by the Moot Court Program.
- 4 An approved Directed Research/Advanced Clinic Proposal Form must be submitted to the Office of the Registrar, who will then enroll you in this course. The deadline to submit the registration form is 5:00 p.m. Friday of the first week of classes.
- 5 Prerequisites: all first year courses, Criminal Procedure, Professional Responsibility, Evidence and Trial Advocacy. The fieldwork and classroom components of this course must be taken in conjunction with each other.
- 6 This is a distance education course. Students must have successfully completed all first-year courses to be eligible to enroll. Participation in first class session is mandatory (date/time of first class session TBD). Students must have a laptop with sound card, headset with microphone and webcam.
- 7 The *Sports Law Academy* will meet June 16-20. Students who successfully complete Advanced Contract Drafting, Advanced Sports Law and the Sports Law Academy will receive a Sports Law Certificate of Completion.
- 8 *Religious Liberty Practicum* will meet June 23-27. Students may take the live course for one credit, with the option to complete a one credit directed research to earn an additional credit.
- 9 Evidence is a pre-requisite
- 10 Products Liability ends 6/26/14. Final exam to be held Tuesday, July 1 at 8:30 a.m.
- 11 Meets 5/19- 6/26. Final exam is July 2
- 12 Meets 5/20-7/24, with a two week break from 6/27-7/14
- 13 Wills, Trusts and Estates is a pre-requisite/co-requisite for Estate Planning Practicum

All classes may add 10 minutes to the class meeting time for a 10-minute break.

Pass/Fail Elections: In a course graded on a pass/fail basis by the election of the student, also referred to as the Limited Grade Option, a grade of "C" or higher will be converted to a "P"; grades below "C" will remain as assigned by the professor and will be counted towards the pass/fail credit limit.
