1 Graded on a mandatory pass/fail basis.

3 Students are eligible to enroll after participation is approved by the Moot Court Program.

4 An approved Directed Research/Advanced Clinic Proposal Form must be submitted to the Office of the Registrar, who will then enroll you in this course. The deadline to submit the registration form is 5:00 p.m. Friday of the first week of classes.

5 Prerequisites: all first year courses, Criminal Procedure, Professional Responsibility, Evidence and Trial Advocacy. The fieldwork and classroom components of this course must be taken in conjuction with each other.

6 This is a distance education course. Students must have successfully completed all first-year courses to be eligible to enroll. Participation in first class

session is mandatory (date/time of first class session TBD). Students must have a laptop with sound card, headset with microphone and webcam.

7 The Sports Law Academy will meet June 16-20. Students who successfully complete Advanced Contract Drafting, Advanced Sports Law and the Sports Law Academy will receive a Sports Law Certificate of Completion.

8 Religious Liberty Practicum will meet June 23-27. Students may take the live course for one credit, with the option to complete a one credit directed research to earn an additional credit.
