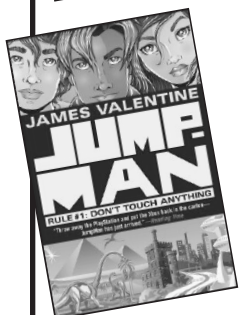
Suzanne dreams of becoming an opera star, but when Nazi troops invade, she decides to become a spy for the Allies.

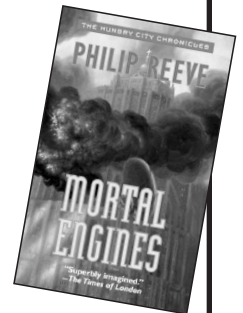
When Emmett Till is murdered, Hiram begins to look at his grandfather and Mississippi differently as bigotry and violence are revealed.

by Audrey Coulombis

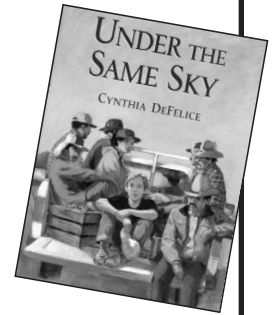
Casey comes home one day to find her stepmother gone. How will she survive? Whom can she trust?
