Daniel D. Hutto is Professor of Philosophical Psychology at the University of Wollongong. His most recent books, include: *Wittgenstein and the End of Philosophy* (Palgrave, 2006) and *Folk Psychological Narratives* (MIT, 2008). He is co-author of the award-winning *Radicalizing Enactivism* (MIT, 2013), designated a Choice Outstanding Academic Title and given honourable mention at the PROSE Awards for "pioneering works of research … landmark works in their fields". He is also editor of *Narrative and Understanding Persons* (CUP, 2007) and *Narrative and Folk Psychology* (Imprint Academic, 2009). A special yearbook, *Radical Enactivism*, focusing on his philosophy of intentionality, phenomenology and narrative, was published in 2006. He regularly speaks at conferences and expert meetings for clinical psychiatrists, educationalists, narratologists, neuroscientists and psychologists.
