This is the moment that Rugby fans in New Zealand and around the world have been waiting for; applications for tickets to Rugby World Cup 2011 (RWC 2011) open on Tuesday, April 27 2010, a day that marks 500 days until the start of the Tournament.

Finally, fans have the chance to secure their place at the greatest sporting event in New Zealand's history. To be right there in the stands, amongst the crowd. To be part of the festival and the spectacle. To experience the electric atmosphere as the best teams in the world compete for Rugby's ultimate prize — the Webb Ellis Cup.

- rewarding a passionate and loyal New Zealand Rugby Community while ensuring tickets to every match are available to the wider public and;
- ensuring a successful commercial programme for Tournament owner RWCL

to fund the global Game while ensuring broad access to tickets for New Zealand and international fans.

Today we ask New Zealanders for their voice, their passion and their 100% support. Today we ask Rugby fans around the world to come and experience what we believe will be the best Rugby Tournament the world has ever seen.

The launch of the RWC 2011 ticketing programme is a significant milestone for the Tournament, the moment that the global Rugby community has been waiting for.



In a little under 18 months fans from around the globe will unite in New Zealand to celebrate a festival of Rugby that will be enjoyed by more people in more countries than ever before, writing another memorable chapter in the Rugby World Cup success story.

An exciting air of anticipation has been generated throughout the global Rugby family as New Zealand in 2011 will offer an irresistible mix of world class Rugby and the unique, colourful Rugby experience that only a country with such a rich Rugby tradition can offer.

The teams and more than 60,000 travelling supporters can look forward to a special welcome and wonderful hospitality from all the host regions, while a "Stadium of Four Million" New Zealanders will ensure that the Tournament captures the hearts and minds like no other event in New Zealand.

Of course the overall success of the event depends largely on a policy of reasonable pricing which acknowledges the prestigious nature of the event while

keeping it affordable to both domestic and international supporters. I am delighted to say that the Rugby World Cup 2011 ticketing policy achieves those goals. Fans can support their team throughout the pool phase or watch all matches in their home city.

Already demand for Rugby's showpiece Tournament is unprecedented. Sales of Official Tournament Travel and Hospitality programmes are already ahead of projections with sales exceeding those at the same point before Rugby World Cup 2007.

Furthermore, Rugby World Cup Limited is confident that travelling fans will experience an exceptionally run Tournament. The Rugby New Zealand 2011 Organising Body, working alongside RWCL, is well advanced with its planning. Venue planning and the volunteer, media and legacy programmes are all on schedule.

On the field I am happy to announce that the qualifying process for RWC 2011 is nearing its climax. All but two of the 20 teams have

been confirmed, while Russia have made history by qualifying for a Rugby World Cup for the first time. The play-offs later this year will bring to a close the qualifying process that has incorporated 79 teams and 185 matches.

Operationally of course much has still to be done but the launch of the ticketing programme represents another significant milestone in the Tournament's planning. The challenge now is to keep our collective eyes on the ball and ensure that we deliver what promises to be a hugely successful Rugby World Cup.

# QUICK FACTS ABOUT RWC 2011 TICKETING

- The gross capacity for all Rugby World Cup 2011 matches is 1.74 million tickets.
- Total attendances for previous Rugby World Cup Tournaments were:

- Tournament owner, RWCL has access to up to 50% of tickets, although many of these have already been released back for public sale.
- Tournament Organiser, RNZ 2011, will have more than a million tickets to sell.
- It is expected that over 700,000 tickets will be made available for the first public phase of RWC 2011 ticketing.
- The New Zealand Rugby Community will have access to one-third of publicly available tickets from the first public phase of RWC 2011 ticketing.
- Following the launch of Official Travel and Hospitality Packages early in 2010, and fulfilment of offers to certain customer groups such as Venue and Season Members, tickets for RWC 2011 will go on sale to the global public in three sales phases starting in April 2010

PHASE 1: VENUE AND TEAM PACKS (April 27-May 21 2010) Fans may apply for a **Venue Pool Pack** which comprises one ticket to each pool match at their chosen venue or a **Team Pool Pack** which comprises one ticket to each of their chosen team's pool matches. Fans who apply for a Venue Pool Pack or Team Pool Pack will also have the option of adding a **Quarter-final Weekend Pack** and/or tickets to the **Bronze Final** to their application. In cases where demand for packs or tickets exceeds availability, ticket orders will be selected at random to ensure fair access for all applicants.

PHASE 2: INDIVIDUAL TICKETS Sept 10 – Oct 8, 2010

**Individual tickets** for all matches except the semi-finals and the Final will be released.

PHASE 3: BALLOTS FOR SEMI-FINALS AND FINAL Early 2011

Fans who apply for tickets in Phase 1 or Phase 2 may elect to enter a **BALLOT** for the option to purchase tickets for the semi-finals and/ or the Final. Fans will receive one entry into the ballot for each ticket applied for during Phase 1 or Phase 2...

PHASE 4: GENERAL ON-SALE Mid 2011

Remaining tickets will go on general sale in 2011.

## **TICKETING RWC 2011**

Rugby World Cup 2011 (RWC 2011) will be held in New Zealand from September 9 to October 23, 2011 and will consist of 48 matches to be played in 13 venues. 20 teams will participate for Rugby's greatest prize, The Webb Ellis Cup.

There will be approximately 1.65 million tickets available for purchase for the Tournament (including through the Official Travel and Hospitality Programme for RWC 2011). The Ticketing Policy for RWC 2011 has been developed by Tournament Organiser, Rugby New Zealand 2011 Limited (RNZ 2011) in conjunction with Tournament Owner, Rugby World Cup Limited (RWCL).



**RNZ 2011** as Tournament Organiser is responsible for ticket-only marketing to the domestic and international general public. Behind the scenes, RNZ 2011 is also responsible for implementing the technology platform, managing ticket quotas as well as ticket printing and distribution on behalf of the bodies responsible for ticketing RWC 2011.



Rugby Travel and Hospitality (RTH) has been appointed by RWCL to create, manage and implement the Official Travel & Hospitality Programme for RWC 2011. Tickets marketed through these programmes are generally packaged with match hospitality and/or travel and accommodation. RTH is a joint venture company formed by Sodexo and the Mike Burton Group. For RWC 2007 in France, RTH delivered the most successful Official Travel & Hospitality programme of any Rugby World Cup to date with record numbers of supporters travelling to the Tournament and corporate consumers enjoying superb hospitality at all of the 48 matches.



**RWCL** (the Rugby World Cup arm of the International Rugby Board), the Tournament owner, directly manages ticketing for RTH NZ, Teams and Officials, Worldwide Partners, Official Sponsors, and Tournament Suppliers. Income from the RWC Commercial Programme is the International Rugby Board's (IRB) primary source of revenue for the funding of Rugby development worldwide. Ninety-five percent of all money distributed by the IRB for global development comes from RWC revenue. These funds underpin the IRB's strategic investments programme including High Performance funding and development grants. Tickets are a central component of many of RWCL's Commercial Programmes.

## NUMBER OF TICKETS

RWC 2011 consists of 48 matches at 13 venues around New Zealand, including 40 pool matches, four quarter-finals, two semi-finals, the Bronze Final and the Final.

#### **TOTAL CAPACITY**

The exact gross capacity for each of the 13 venues is not yet finalised. This is due to the fact that some venues are still under construction and final venue audits have yet to be completed. However, it is anticipated the gross capacity will be in the region of 1.75 million tickets.

#### **NET CAPACITY**

The net capacity is determined by subtracting "Accredited and Contingency Tickets" (which includes seats reserved for media tribunes, Tournament VIPs, seats blocked due to obstructed views as well as tickets held back from sale until final venue seating audits can be completed at venues still under construction) from Total Capacity. Total Accredited and Contingency seats are currently estimated at approximately 100,000 tickets. It is important to note that some of these tickets will become available for sale once venues are completed, and exact seating numbers can be confirmed.

The net capacity is currently estimated at **1,650,000**.

<sup>\*\*</sup> The Dunedin venue is yet to be confirmed. Capacity specified is for Carisbrook. Ticket applications for matches in Dunedin will be fulfilled for either Carisbrook or the new Otago Stadium.



#### **TICKET ALLOCATIONS**

Consistent with previous Tournaments, the local organising committee is contracted to provide RWCL with access to up to 50% of tickets for each match. RWCL's allocation includes tickets set aside for RTH for Official Travel & Hospitality Packages.

The experience from 2003 and 2007 suggests that RWCL will use a significant proportion of its allocation for knock-out and major pool matches. However it will use fewer tickets for other pool matches. RNZ 2011 has worked closely with RWCL and RTH in recent months to maximise the number of tickets available for public sale, while at the same time ensuring sufficient inventory remains to support the Commercial Programme. RNZ 2011 is grateful to both organisations for releasing a substantial number of tickets so far out from the Tournament.

The following represents the current split of tickets between bodies responsible for ticketing RWC 2011:



#### SALEABLE TICKETS = 1,650,000

As the Tournament draws closer it is expected that further tickets will be released to RNZ 2011 and will be available for sale to the general public.

# TICKET SALES PHASES

Following the launch of Official Travel and Hospitality Packages early in 2010, and fulfilment of priority ticket offers to certain customer groups, tickets for Rugby World Cup 2011 (RWC 2011) will go on sale to the global public in three sales phases starting in April 2010.

## HOSPITALITY AND TRAVEL

(Jan-Feb 2010)

For a complete RWC 2011 experience, fans can purchase **Corporate Hospitality Packages** from Official Corporate Hospitality Agents or **Travel Packages** from Official Travel Agents. For more information and a list of agents, visit www.rth2011.com.

## PRIORITY TICKET OFFERS

(Mar 2010)

RNZ 2011 has contractual obligations to **Venue Members** to provide priority access to RWC 2011 tickets. In addition a priority purchase period has been extended to **Season Members** of Provincial Unions. Finally RNZ 2011 has provided access to a limited number of tickets to its **Stakeholders**.

#### PHASE 1: VENUE AND TEAM POOL PACK APPLICATION

(Apr 27, 2010)

Fans may apply for a **Venue Pool Pack** or a **Team Pool Pack** which comprises one ticket to each of their chosen Venue or Team's pool matches. Fans who apply for a Venue Pool Pack or Team Pool Pack will also have the option of adding a **Quarter-final Weekend Pack** and/or **Tickets to the Bronze Final** to their application.

#### PHASE 2: INDIVIDUAL APPLICATION

Sept 10 - Oct 8, 2010

**Individual tickets** for all matches except the semi-finals and the Final will be released in Phase 2.

#### PHASE 3: SEMI-FINALS AND FINAL BALLOT

(Early 2011)

Fans who apply for tickets in Phase 1 or Phase 2 may elect to enter the **ballots for the option to purchase tickets for the semi-finals and/or the Final**. Fans will receive one entry into the ballot for each ticket applied for during Phase 1 or Phase 2.

#### PHASE 4: GENERAL ON-SALE

Any remaining tickets will go on general sale in 2011.

## PHASE 1: VENUE AND TEAM POOL PACKS

During Phase 1 of RWC 2011 Ticketing, fans from New Zealand and around the world can apply for Venue and Team Pool Pack.

#### **NUMBER OF TICKETS**

It is anticipated that at least 750,000 tickets will be made available during Phase 1. The New Zealand Rugby Community will have access to one-third of available packs during this phase.

#### **PACKS**

Venue Pool Packs comprise one ticket to each RWC 2011 pool match at a venue of choice.

Team Pool Packs comprise one ticket to each RWC 2011 pool match for a team of choice.

Fans who apply for a Venue or Team Pool Pack will also have the option of adding a Quarter-final Weekend Pack (which comprises one ticket to each RWC 2011 guarter-final match in either Wellington or Christchurch) and/or tickets to the Bronze Final at Eden Park.

#### **APPLICATION PROCESS**

Fans may submit a Venue or Team Pool Pack application online at rugbyworldcup.com/tickets or via a paper form contained in the Official Ticketing Guide.

The New Zealand Rugby Community may apply from 9am Monday, April 19 2010. The Global Public may apply from 9am (NZ) Tuesday, April 27 2010.

The application period for Phase 1 for both the New Zealand Rugby Community and the Global Public closes at 5pm (NZ) Friday, May 21 2010.

At that stage we will begin processing applications. In the event that demand exceeds availability, applications will be randomly selected. Notification of the outcomes of applications will be issued on or before Tuesday June 30 2010.

#### THE NEW ZEALAND RUGBY COMMUNITY

The New Zealand Rugby Community will have access to one-third of available tickets during Phase 1. This is a similar offer afforded to the Australian Rugby Community in 2003 and to the European Rugby Community in 2007

The New Zealand Rugby Community is defined as 'All registered players, coaches, team management, referees, volunteers, employees, administrators, members and season pass holders of NZRU, NZRU members, NZRU associate members, Rugby clubs, schools and related Rugby organisations'.

Applications from the New Zealand Rugby Community will be processed first. In the event that an application received from a member of the New Zealand Rugby Community is unsuccessful, that application will be added to those from the global public. In addition any packs not taken up within the Rugby Community allocation will be added to the global public.

## PHASE 2: INDIVIDUAL TICKETS

Individual tickets for every match except the semi-finals and the Final will be released in Phase 2, (Sept 10 - Oct 8, 2010).

#### PHASE 2: KEY FEATURES

#### **PAYMENT PLAN**

New Zealand residents who are successful in their ticket applications have the opportunity to pay for their pack in monthly instalments over three months. An administration fee of \$25 will be payable for this service.

#### TICKET LIMITS

Individuals may apply for tickets up to a limit of four tickets per match for any match excluding the semi-finals and the Final. Fans may apply for multiple matches. Applications will be accepted from different individuals within the same household.

#### **CHILDREN'S PRICES**

Children's prices are available for Venue Pool Packs and the Bronze Final within categories D and GA (depending on categories available at each venue). A child must be aged 16 or under on September 1, 2011.

#### CHOOSE NEXT BEST AVAILABLE SEATING OPTION

Ticket availability is very limited within some categories for some matches. To give yourself the best chance of securing packs, we recommend that you request to receive the "next best available" category should your selected category not be available for some or all matches for which you are applying for. In this instance, a lower priced category(ies) may be allocated, subject to availability. Prices charged will be adjusted accordingly.

#### **PAYMENT OPTIONS**



RWC 2011 prefers MasterCard. Using a MasterCard to apply for RWC 2011 tickets will earn double entries into the ballots for the option to purchase semi-finals and Final tickets. Other credit, prepaid and debit cards (with credit card functionality) are also accepted. MasterCard has developed the RWC 2011 MasterCard ANZ Prepaid Card for those who would prefer not to use credit cards. The RWC 2011 MasterCard ANZ Prepaid Card is available at any ANZ branch.

## PHASE 3: BALLOTS FOR SEMI-FINALS AND THE FINAL

It is expected that the ballots will run in early 2011.



Any remaining tickets will go on general sale around mid-2011.

## MATCH VENUES





On September 9 2011, Eden Park kicks off with the RWC 2011 Opening Ceremony followed by what is sure to be a spine tingling opening match between New Zealand and Tonga. Numerous important pool matches follow, including Australia v Ireland, New Zealand v France, the Pacific clash of the Titans with Fiji v Samoa, and England v Scotland. The eyes of the world will then fall on Eden Park for the semi-finals, the Bronze Final and the Final. This world-class stadium will witness some of the best match-ups of the Tournament. With its recent upgrade, there's no better centre stage for the biggest sporting event in New Zealand's history.






