Chapter 5. - UNITED STATES NON-MILITARY DECORATIONS SECTION 1. - General

DEFINITION 511.

A U.S. non-military decoration is any U.S. decoration not classified as a military decoration.

512. PRECEDENCE

U.S. non-military decorations take precedence immediately after all U.S. unit awards. They take precedence in the order earned except when more than one decoration has been established by the same agency. The precedence then is as established by the awarding agency. The following is a selective list of nonmilitary decorations awarded to members of the Naval Service:
