PROCLAMATION BY THE GOVERNOR.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of South Australia, passed in a Session held in the twenty-fourth and twenty-fifth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to declare the powers of the Governor with reference to constituting Counties and Hundreds, and being No. 6 of 1861, the Governor is empowered by Proclamation in the *South Australian Government Gazette* to constitute Counties and Hundreds, and to define the boundaries thereof: And whereas it is deemed necessary and expedient that those portions of the County of Burra, in the Province aforesaid, hereinafter particularly described, shall be created Hundreds of the said Province, as hereinafter mentioned Now, therefore, I, the Governor, aforesaid, by virtue of the powers and authorities vested in me by the above-mentioned Act, and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Province, do, by this my Proclamation, declare and appoint that the portions of territory hereinafter mentioned, situate and being portion of the County of Burra, shall, from and after the date hereof, be, and I do hereby constitute the same Hundreds of the said Province, by the names and descriptions and definitions of boundaries hereinafter set forth, and as the same is delineated on the public maps deposited in the Surveyor-General's office in Adelaide, in the Province aforesaid, that is to say:—

County Burra.

Hundred of Baldina.—Commencing at the south-east

corner of the Hundred of Kooringa; thence east along the north boundary of the Hundred of Bright, to its north-east corner; thence true north, to a point true east of the north-eastern corner of the Hundred of Kooringa; thence true west to said corner; and south along the east boundary of said Hundred to the point of commencement.

Hundred of Mongolata.—Commencing at the south-eastern corner of the Hundred of Kingston; thence east, along the north boundary of the Hundred of Baldina, to its north-east corner; thence true north to a point true east of the north-east corner of the Hundred of Kingston; thence true west to said corner; and thence south along the east boundary of said Hundred to the point of commencement.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation published in the *South Australian Government Gazette* on the fifteenth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine, the boundaries of the Hundred of Hynam, in the County of MacDonnell, were settled and defined: And whereas it has

been deemed necessary and expedient to alter and vary the boundaries of the said Hundred, in manner hereinafter mentioned: Now therefore I, the Governor aforesaid, under and by virtue of an Act of the Parliament of the said Province, passed in a Session held in the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, No. 6 of 1861, intituled "An Act to declare the powers of the Governor with reference to constituting Counties and Hundreds," and of all other powers enabling me hereunto, and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do order, direct, and proclaim that from and after the date hereof the boundaries of the Hundred of Hynam shall be as follows, that is to say—

Hundred of Hynam.—Bounded on the south by the north boundary of the Hundred of Naracoorte; on the east by the west boundary of the Hundred of Binnun; on the north by a line commencing at the north-west corner of said Hundred, and running true west to the eastern boundary of the Hundred of Glenroy; and on the west by the eastern boundary of the Hundred of Lochaber, and portion of the eastern boundary of the Hundred of Glenroy.

CAUTION TO THE PUBLIC.

Chief Secretary's Office, Adelaide, 2nd December, 1875.

THE attention of the public is directed to the provisions of The Bush Fires Acts, No. 18 of 1864, and 15 of 1874. All Police Constables and Crown Lands Rangers

having received strict instructions to take proceedings and recover penalties for offences under the said Acts.

The following are offences under the Acts :—

1. Burning stubble between 1st November and 15th April, unless between 4 and 10 in the afternoon, or during hours fixed by District Councils; or without giving neighbors (or in Hundreds, to Crown Lands Rangers) one day's notice; or without having at least four persons present to assist in preventing spread of fire; or without ploughing or clearing at least three feet round inside the fence. Penalty—Not less than Three and not exceeding Ten Pounds.

2. Using ignitable wadding between 1st September and 30th April. Penalty—Five Pounds.

3. Opposing the examination of any gun carried on the land of another person; or refusing to give name when demanded, or giving false name. Penalty—Two Pounds to Five Pounds.

4. Lighting or using fires for cooking in the open air, &c., without clearing a space round the same, of the radius of ten feet at least, of all grass, bushes, and leaves or branches of trees, and without extinguishing the fire fully before leaving the same. Penalty—Two Pounds to Five Pounds.

5. Smoking in the open air, within twenty yards of any stable, or of any rick, or field of hay, corn, straw, stubble, unless in a town, during the months of November, December, January, February, March, and April. Penalty—Ten Shillings to Two Pounds.

6. Blasting trees, &c. (during the above last-named months), without having at least four persons present to prevent any fire arising therefrom. Penalty—Five Pounds.

7. Coroners or Justices of the Peace may hold inquests on all fires.

8. Acts do not take away nor affect any right of action or other remedy which any person may have in respect of loss or damage occasioned by any fire, or for any trespass committed.

9. All penalties may be recovered in a summary way before any two or more Justices of the Peace.

DIRECTION FOR THE KURRACHEE HARBOR LIGHTHOUSE.

Latitude of lighthouse on Manora Point, 24° 47' 21" N.; Longitude, 66° 58' 15" E.

The light is a fixed one, 120 feet above the sea-level, visible in clear weather 16 miles; in hazy weather, prevalent during the south-west monsoon, about 7 miles.

Present light very inferior. A dioptric light of the second order recommended.

Tides.

High water, full and change, 10h. 30m. Average rise and fall, spring tides, 9ft. 6in.; average rise and fall, neap tides, 3ft. to 4ft. Depth of water in entrance channel at high water—Spring tides, 29ft.; neap tides, 24ft. to 26ft.

Draught of Vessels entering or leaving Port.

Vessels with a draught not exceeding 21½ feet can now enter and leave the port without difficulty or delay during all seasons of the year.

During the fair season, from October to 15th May, vessels with a draught not exceeding 24 feet can now enter and leave the harbor.

Fixed moorings are placed for such vessels.

Time of tide for entering Port.

Sailing vessels should enter port on the ebb-tide. Steamers can enter either flood or ebb, and stand at once into port.

Masters of ships should not, under any circumstances, attempt to enter the harbor without a pilot.

Harbor Improvements.

Among the extensive works executed, a breakwater* has been built, running out from Manora Point in a south-by-east direction to a distance of 1,500 feet, into 6 fathoms of water, this affords complete shelter to the entrance channel during the south-west monsoon; also a channel has been opened through the bar, with a depth of 20 feet at low water spring tides, 500 feet in breadth; the channel is marked by buoys, and these on entering should be kept on the port side about 150 feet.

NOTE.—A mail steamer arriving off the port at night and requiring a pilot should fire two guns.

Approaching the Port.—Coast of Sind.—Indus Banks.

The coast of Sind below the parallel of 24° north latitude should be approached with great caution; too much attention cannot be paid to the lead, more especially in passing the banks of the Indus. Banks of the Indus has extended about ten miles to the southward since 1856.

No sailing vessel should come nearer this coast than 20 fathoms by night, or in rough weather, or under 12 fathoms by day in fine weather.

The tides during the springs are strong, the flood sets south-east and ebbs to the north-west.

From February to the end of the monsoon a strong south-easterly current is experienced, running at a rate of from 15 to 40 miles a day.

During the south-west monsoon, sailing vessels should make Ras Muari (Cape Monze), which is 18 miles west-half-north from Manora lighthouse, and keep to windward of the port, if the weather is thick, or if the tide does not suit for entering the harbor. Allowance must also be made for a strong set to the south-east, which prevails more or less during the south-west monsoon.

Do not bring Manora Point to the southward of east, or go under 15 fathoms near Cape Monze.

Masters of ships should endeavour to make the port at daylight, and can with safety approach into 8 fathoms to about 2 miles distance from the lighthouse, keeping it, in any bearing, from north-east to north, and heave-to for a pilot.

Anchorage in the Roads.

From June to the middle of September, ships should not on any account anchor, but stand off and on, keeping the lighthouse bearing from north-by-east to north-east, 1 to 2 miles distant, until boarded by a pilot, or directed by signal.

September to end of March.—Anchorage lighthouse north-by-east to north-north-east, distant 1 mile 7 fathoms.

April and May.—Lighthouse north-north-east, distant half-a-mile 8 fathoms.
