## ACCOMPLISHMENTS DURING THE DAKICH ERA

Is one of only three coaches in BGSU history to post four 18-win seasons or more.

Became the second fastest BGSU coach to win 100 games at the school.

In 2002, guided the Falcons to their first MAC Tournament Championship game appearance since 1983.

From 1998-2002, BGSU had its best four-year record since 1946-50 at 79-40.

Has seen two players, Keith McLeod and Anthony Stacey, earn MAC Player of the Year honors.

BGSU has won 12 conference games or more in three of the last five years after BGSU had won 66.7 percent of its league games just three previous times in 27 seasons prior to his arrival.

His Falcons have posted two of the five winning overall road records the school has achieved since 1963.

Has led BGSU to 20-win seasons twice (2000 and 2002), the first time BGSU has accomplished that feat since they had six-straight 20-win seasons from 1943-49.

Captured the 2000 regular season MAC Championship.

Saw the team earn NIT appearances in 2000 and 2002.

Saw Keith McLeod play in the NBA for the Minnesota Timberwolves and Utah Jazz.

Has seen 12 former players sign professional contracts.

## FALCONS BREAK RECORD FROM BEYOND THE ARC

The Falcons set a school record for most three-point field goals in a season, and nearly eclipsed several other marks from downtown, led by sharpshooter Martin Samarco.

## FALCONS IN THE NBA

Two former Falcon MAC Player of the Year recipients remain active in the NBA while one former BGSU player recently became a head coach for the fourth time.

**Antonio Daniels (1997)** is with the Washington Wizards, his fifth NBA team. Last season, he averaged just under 10 points per game. For his career, he is averaging 8.0 points per game. He scored a career-high 11.2 points per game with the Seattle SuperSonics in 2004-05. He is the fourth all-time leading scorer at BGSU with 1,789 points.

**Keith McLeod (2002)** finished his second season with the Utah Jazz and was traded to the Golden State Warriors. He played in 33 games with Kevin Garnett and the Minnesota Timberwolves in 2003-04. He is the second all-time leading scorer at BGSU with 1,895 points.

**Bob Hill (1971)** was named head coach of the Seattle SuperSonics on January 3. It is his fourth head-coaching job, with previous stops in Indiana, New York and San Antonio, where he had the most success.

## SAMARCO NAMED PRESEASON ALL-MAC

Bowling Green State University men's basketball senior guard Martin Samarco has been named 2006-07 Preseason All-MAC by the MAC News Media Association.

"We are excited that Martin has been recognized as one of the top players in the Mid-American Conference," said Dan Dakich. "We have been fortunate to have a number of players who have had outstanding senior seasons and I believe Martin, through his work since the time he has arrived at BGSU, has put himself in a position to follow that same path."

Samarco, a second-team All-MAC pick last season, is the top returning scorer in the league after averaging 18.9 points. He led the league in three-point field goal percentage (45.7%) and set a BGSU record by making a league-high 100 three-pointers. He also finished second in the MAC in free throw shooting making 85.8% of his charity tosses.

He ranked 30th in the country last season in free throw percentage and 10th nationally in three-point field goal percentage and three-pointers made per game.

## MCDONALD JOINS BGSU HALL OF FAME

Former men's basketball player Jim McDonald was inducted into the Bowling Green State University Athletics Hall of Fame on September 8. McDonald, from New York, N.Y., enrolled at BG after a three-year tour of duty with the U.S. Army. He scored a total of 878 points in a three-year career under the legendary Harold Anderson. McDonald co-captained the Falcons as both a junior and a senior, leading BG to the 1959 MAC championship. The Falcons had a 47-25 record (.653) during his three seasons in uniform.

Upon graduation, McDonald coached in the high-school ranks in the Toledo area for a decade (at Ottawa Hills and Sylvania High Schools), and returned to BG as an assistant coach for the 1969-70 season. He helped the Brown and Orange to a 15-9 record that year, then spent 12 years as an assistant coach at Toledo. McDonald was named head coach at Kent State in March of 1982. After taking over a team that had recorded just three winning seasons in the previous 30 years, he promptly led the Golden Flashes to a 15-13 record in his first season. McDonald remains the winningest coach in KSU history, with a 148-139 record in 10 years. That record included back-to-back 21-win seasons in 1988-89 and 1989-90, and a MAC Coach of the Year award in the latter season.

In addition to spending 33 years coaching basketball in the state of Ohio, McDonald spent eight months as interim Director of Athletics at Kent State in 1994. He is married to the former Nancy Anne Schenk, also a BG graduate, and the couple resides in St. Petersburg, Florida.

## SAMARCO SHOOTS HIS WAY INTO MAC RECORD BOOK

**Martin Samarco** became just the third player in MAC history to connect on 100 three-pointers in a single-season.

His 45.7 percent from beyond the arc also proved to be the best in the conference, as well as one of the best nationally.

He also was the league's first Player of the Week honoree on November 28 after he averaged 18.3 points and five rebounds in his first four games with the Falcons. He had a 23 point performance against Urbana where he made 9 of 13 shots including, 4 of 5 from three-point range and also had a team-high 21 points in the Falcons' 72-71 win over Virginia Tech at the NABC Classic, giving the Falcons their first win over an ACC opponent since 1967.

## LEFELD NAMED ACADEMIC ALL-MAC



Bowling Green State University center Matt Lefeld was named Academic All-MAC as voted on by faculty athletic representatives at MAC institutions. A total of five student-athletes were named to the team. The number of honorees on the MAC All-Academic Team are the number that is set for the specific sport or 33% of the number of nominees, whichever is greater.

Lefeld, a native of Coldwater, scored 7.1 ppg. and pulled down 3.4 rebounds per game

for the Falcons and was one of the most improved players in the league after scoring just 14 points a season ago. He has the top GPA of any player in the MAC at 3.96 and is majoring in Business. He was a first-team CoSIDA Academic All-District selection. The Academic All-MAC honor is for a student-athlete who has excelled in athletics and academics. To qualify, a student-athlete must have at least a 3.20 cumulative GPA and have participated in at least 50 percent of the contests for that particular sport. First-year students and junior college transfers in their first year of residence are not eligible for the award.

## SAMARCO, LEFELD EARN TEAM HONORS

Junior All-MAC swingman Martin Samarco was named the Antonio Daniels MVP and fellow junior Matt Lefeld was honored with the Earl Rupright Spirit Award at the 2005-06 men's basketball banquet. Samarco averaged 18.9 points and set a BGSU record with 100 three-point field goals made. That total is the third highest in MAC history. He also led the league in three-point field goal percentage (45.7%) and finished second in free throw percentage (85.8%). He led the team in scoring 20 times this year and had a season-high 35 points at Eastern Michigan. He also had 30 against Buffalo, 28 against Ohio and 27 apiece against Bradley in Florida State. In MAC play, he averaged 19.4 points and shot 50.8% from three-point range (67/132) and 90.4% from the free throw line (66/73). He was named second team All-MAC. Lefeld was named Academic All-MAC and earned CoSIDA Academic All-District honors. A native of Coldwater, scored 7.1 ppg. and pulled down 3.4 rebounds per game for the Falcons and was one of the most improved players in the league after scoring just 14 points a season ago. He has the top GPA of any player in the MAC at 3.96 and is majoring in Business. He played all season with sore feet which limited his ability to practice.

# DAN DAKICH, HEAD COACH



Tough, Intense, and Passionate. Three words which best exemplify the characteristics of one of the top head coaches in the Mid-American Conference and the second fastest men's basketball coach at BGSU to reach the 100-victory mark. Dan Dakich is one of just 19 MAC coaches to ever win 125 games or more at his institution, his 86 league wins rank 12th all-time in MAC history and his 143 overall victories are the 13th most in conference history.

Overall at BGSU, Dakich is 143-122 and is tied for second in BGSU men's basketball history in winning percentage (54.1) and is fifth in victories. He also is just one of three coaches in Falcon history (Harold Anderson and John Weinert) to post four 18-win seasons or more in men's basketball. He has seen 19 of 22 seniors complete their degree requirements, had 12 former players sign professional contracts, including current Golden State guard Keith McLeod, and seen McLeod and Anthony Stacey earn MAC Player of the Year honors. During his tenure, 16 players have earned All-MAC status.

Prior to Dakich's arrival on campus, BG had not posted 40 wins in a two-year span (1961-63) since Hall of Famer Nate Thurmond was lacing it up for the Falcons. That was accomplished by Dakich's 1999 and 2000 teams. Under his guidance, BGSU is 5-1 in MAC Tournament first round games and the Falcons have posted six 10-win seasons at home since 1999.

## Year-By-Year Highlights

### 2005-06

Replaced four starters from the previous season... captured the program's first win against an ACC school since 1967 when it won at Virginia Tech, 72-71, at the NABC Classic in Blacksburg... that marked the third time that BGSU had won its road opener under Coach Dakich... played in the Coors Classic in Mobile for the second time in four years when it faced Florida State... also posted an impressive 60-52 road win at Troy... improved to 8-1 in MAC home openers with a 66-44 win over Central Michigan... lost five league games by an average of two points, including two overtime contests... defeated MAC Tournament finalist Toledo, 59-52... posted a season sweep over Eastern Michigan... handed MAC champion Kent State its only league home loss of the season, a 79-74 BGSU triumph... it was the third BGSU win in Kent in the last four years... saw junior Martin Samarco earn second-team All-MAC honors... he led the league in three-point field goals made (3.45) and percentage (45.7)... both totals were ranked 10th in the nation... he also finished second in the MAC in scoring (18.9) giving BGSU seven players since 2000 among the top seven scorers

in the league... saw junior Matt Lefeld named Academic All-MAC and CoSIDA Academic All-District.

### 2004-05

The Falcons finished 18-11 which tied Dakich for second place on the BGSU all-time coaching list with four 18+win seasons with John Weinert... advanced to the MAC tournament in Cleveland for the sixth straight year with a 75-73 win over Ball State in the first round of the MAC Tournament... entered the final week of the regular season in first place in the MAC West before finishing third with a 10-8 record... Falcons were 4-0 in the league for the second time in three years... team posted impressive road victories at Detroit, Kent State, Youngstown State, Eastern Michigan, and Marshall... with 12 wins at home, the Falcons posted double figures in victories in Anderson Arena for the sixth time in seven years... four of those home wins came in the final seconds... saw the Falcons lead the MAC in field goal shooting (48.8%, 16th nationally), assists (16.83, 12th nationally) and free throw percentage (74.8%)... saw seniors John Reimold (Mid-Major All-American) and Josh Almanson (All-District) give the Falcons one of the top tandems in the league... Reimold led the league in scoring and finished second in field goal percentage before earning second-team All-MAC recognition... Almanson was named first-team All-MAC and finished third in the league in scoring, first in field goal percentage and fourth in free throw percentage... Coach and his family helped raise \$1,777 for the Red Cross as part of their tsunami disaster relief efforts.

## 2003-04

Saw team at full strength for just 20 games (12-8) as they battled through injuries to starters Germain Fitch (17 games), John Reimold (5 games) and Jabari Mattox (19 games)... advanced to the MAC Tournament in Cleveland with a 56-54 win over Ohio in the first round... saw Ron Lewis earn second-team All-MAC honors and Kevin Netter garner honorable mention status ... played in the Rainbow Classic in Hawaii... saw Netter finish second in the league in field goal percentage and Lewis place second in free throw percentage... 

## 2001-02

Finished 24-9, the most wins by a BGSU team since the 1948-49 season... earned its second bid to the NIT in three seasons... was 12-6 in the MAC... took BGSU to the MAC Championship game, its first appearance in the final since 1983... defeated Akron and Ball State to advance to the league finals... Falcons defeated NCAA Tournament teams Ole Miss and UNC-Wilmington and also won at home against Michigan... Falcons notched impressive non-league road wins at Evansville and Indiana State... played in the Top of the World Classic in Fairbanks, Alaska... team posted a 12-game winning streak, the fourth longest in school history... saw Keith McLeod earn MAC Player of the Year and All-American honors after averaging a league-high 22.9 points... he finished eighth in the nation in that category, finished his career as the second all-time leading scorer in BGSU history and was second in the league in steals... saw McLeod make numerous last second plays to win games and was dubbed one of the top clutch players in the country by ESPN's Jay Bilas... ## 2000-01

Finished 15-14 and 10-8 in the MAC... advanced to the MAC Tournament with a 74-68 win over Western Michigan in the first round... saw his team win seven straight games after he vowed to "turnaround" the season and came out of the locker room with his sports coat on backwards... posted back-to-back road wins at Miami and Ohio during that stretch... saw McLeod earn second-team All-MAC honors and Matela gain honorable mention All-League status... Almanson was named to the All-Freshman team... team led

the MAC and finished fourth nationally in free throw percentage (76.7%)... Falcons also were 14th in the country in field goal percentage (48.4%)... Pardon led the MAC and finished sixth in the nation in assists (7.0)... the Falcons were 10-4 at home with solid non-conference road wins over Evansville and Duquesne... played against defending national champion Michigan State at the Palace of Auburn Hills.

## 1999-2000

Won the outright MAC Championship and finished 22-8... earned an invitation the NIT where they traveled to BYU... BGSU was 14-4 in the league and won its final six games of the regular season, including tremendous road victories at Akron, 73-72, and at Marshall, 88-83, on the final week of the season... won the Nextell Challenge in Honolulu defeating Hawaii, 53-49 in the championship game... saw Anthony Stacey earn MAC Player of the Year honors and become the school's all-time leading scorer... also had Dave Esterkamp and Matela gain honorable mention All-MAC status... Falcons led the MAC and finished fourth in the nation in field goal percentage (49.2%)... BGSU also was second in the MAC and 17th nationally in free throw percentage at 74.3%... McLeod led the MAC and finished seventh in the country in three-point field goal percentage at 47.7%... finished 12-0 at home and played in front of four sellout crowds... defeated Cleveland State at the Rock and Roll Shootout at Gund Arena.

## 1998-99

Finished 18-10 and 12-6 in the MAC... won an overtime road contest at Akron, 80-74, to advance to the MAC Semifinals in Toledo... lost to Miami, an eventual Sweet 16 program, 60-56 in overtime in that game... won six of its last seven regular season games... swept rival Toledo... played at the Hoosier Classic where it faced Indiana in the championship game... overcame the loss of All-MAC performer Tony Reid who missed the final 14 games of the season... saw Stacey earn first-team All-MAC honors... also had McLeod earn a spot on the All-Freshman team.

## 1997-98

Lost starter All-MAC performer Anthony Stacey early in the season, ... saw Kirk Cowan and Reid earn All-MAC accolades... won key MAC road games at Ohio and Central Michigan... played former teammate Steve Alford's Southwest Missouri State Bears in the championship of the Pizza Hut Classic in Springfield, Mo.

## AT INDIANA

Dakich moved right from being a player for the Hoosiers to the coaching side of the game. After completing his playing career in 1984-85, he became a member of Coach Bob Knight's staff the following season, spending his first two years as a graduate assistant coach. He became Knight's top assistant coach in 1990. He is the only basketball player for Knight who has moved directly to an assistant coaching position without leaving the program. As a player, Dakich served as team captain both his junior (1983-84) and senior (1984-85) seasons.

He is best remembered for his excellent defensive effort against Michael Jordan in Indiana's upset of North Carolina in the 1984 NCAA East Regional. During his four years as a player, he helped Indiana win one Big Ten title, earn three NCAA Tournament berths, and finish as the NIT runner-up his senior season. Indiana compiled an 84-39 record during Dakich's four years as a player. He had his best season as a senior averaging 5.2 points. Following his playing days, Dakich remained with the Hoosiers and spent the next 12 years as a coach with one of the premier college basketball programs in the country.


The Hoosiers won a national title (1986-87); earned a spot in the NCAA Tournament in each of the 12 seasons; captured four Big Ten

titles while finishing third or better in nine of the 12 years; coached six All-Americans and three national Player of the Year candidates, including 1993 Player of the Year Calbert Cheaney; worked with three Big Ten MVPs; and academically, graduated every four-year player to go through the program (Dakich was the academic monitor on the IU basketball staff his last seven years).

Dakich coached 10 players at Indiana who either play or have played in the NBA. Dakich helped the Indiana program win 73.7% (283-101) of its games over the 12 years he served as an assistant coach while the Hoosiers were winning over 70% of its Big Ten contests.

Dan's father, Tom, played at Bowling Green for legendary coach Harold Anderson, lettering as a junior (1954-55) and senior (1955-56).

# Q AND A WITH DAN DAKICH

## What progress has your team made since the end of last season?

“Since the end of the season this has been a process of getting guys that want to be here and want to work. The guys that are here have put in an extraordinary effort over the course of the summer. The effort in the weight room, on the track, in the gym, in the classroom has been truly outstanding. I am very, very pleased with the commitment that this team has made to this point.”

## How about your two seniors?

“Both have to raise the level of everyone else, both mentally and with the way they all play. Martin (Samarco) is a guy that leads by example with how hard he plays. He and Matt (Lefeld) have done a good job of raising expectations of the rest of our team. They as a group have to make their teammates better once we start playing. If Martin is going to be considered a great player, that is something he is going to have to do.”

“Senior leadership is something that every good team has to have period, and if you don't have it you struggle most times, and I don't think we really had it last year. I don't really think it's fair.”

## What about some of your younger guys who are entering their second season?

“What's been the most exciting for me is that when you talk to one of their parents, they see the growth or maturity that each of them have exhibited. That's a part of being a good basketball player. The academic work this summer has shown that maturity. Erik Marschall has put on 25 pounds since the end of the season. Brian Moten has developed into a very strong kid. Darryl Clements has gone up 20+ pounds, but more than that for Darryl, it has been his mental and personal toughness. It's exciting for me to see the three of them mature and develop. They have a long way to go, but again they are only sophomores. I like where they are and where they have put themselves.”

## How have the freshmen adjusted since coming in?

“What I like about the newcomers is that they had to buy in because the older guys were working at such a clip that they had to do what everybody was doing. I like the fact that Ryan Sims came in and gained seven pounds in seven weeks, I like the fact that Otis Polk came in and lost 14 pounds and really improved in the area of conditioning, and I like that Marc Larson has gained 30 pounds since the end of his season to be ready as a freshman. I like the fact that Chris Knight has come in here and done very well academically in two challenging courses. I really thought, in all areas, including our newcomers, we had a very good summer.”

## What do your redshirts, Lionel Sullivan and Nate Miller, have to do to be ready to contribute?

“The first thing they (Sullivan and Miller) have to do is learn how to play in a motion offense. What they are going to bring is athleticism, versatility, toughness, and a strength to our team that I think we lacked at times last year. They can go get stuff done. At six-foot-six, 230 pounds, Lionel has a toughness about him. Nate was as good a football player as there was in the state of Ohio, he has a real toughness about him. And at the end of the day, that's what wins or loses for you.”

## What are the keys as you head into the coming season with?

“Nobody was more disappointed in last year than we were. People also have to understand that when we have been healthy, which we've only had four out of the nine years that I have been here, we have won at least 18 games. That's something that we can't control, but what we can control is how hard we work at what we do and the kind of people that we are. We are looking to keep ourselves healthy, we are looking to put ourselves in a position to where we are tough enough to compete at the level that I want us to compete at. The key to our deal is continued leadership and the health of our ball club. If we have those two things, I think we have the chance to be the kind of team that I want us to be, which is a very difficult team to play on both sides of the ball.”

## The league has two major changes with all 12 teams going to Cleveland for the MAC Tournament and a 16-game conference schedule, what are your thoughts?

“Going to Cleveland and Quicken Loans Arena is a big deal. It's something that I think we needed to do as a league. All of the leagues that are considered the quote, unquote great leagues in the country do that. Attendance in the opening round games were not very good because of spring break, the fairness of playing on the road on Saturday and then playing again Monday. There is a spectacle about playing the MAC Tournament in Cleveland that everybody enjoys. The 16-game schedule is interesting. It has made scheduling more difficult, but the university presidents, athletic directors and coaches determined that getting a second bid to the NCAA tournament was our goal. The way we were doing it (an 18-game schedule) wasn't getting it done, so something had to be done about that. The 16-game schedule allows us to schedule more Division I non-conference games and allows for us not to beat up on ourselves.”



# LAMONTA STONE, ASSISTANT COACH



LaMonta Stone (pronounced La MON tay) begins his third season on the Falcon bench and first as the lead assistant. Stone, a native of Detroit, previously served as an assistant at Ohio State. Prior to that, Stone was an assistant for two years at Eastern Michigan from 2000 to 2002.

Stone, 40, has quickly established himself as one of the bright young assistant coaches in the country. Known as an excellent coach and recruiter, he was ranked among the top 10 Mid-Major assistant coaches

by HoopScoop Scouting Service.

He joined the EMU staff after spending six seasons as the head boy's basketball coach at River Rouge High School, where he directed one of the most successful high school programs in the state of Michigan in his six seasons at River Rouge, posting a 126-24 record. He led the Panthers to back-to-back Class B state championships in 1998 and 1999 and both of those teams earned Top 25 national rankings in the USA Today poll. Five of his River Rouge teams won district titles and three were regional champions. Both The Detroit News and Detroit Free Press named Stone Coach of the Year in 1999. He also was singled out for that honor by the Michigan Coaches Association in 1997.

Stone graduated from River Rouge High School in 1984 after participating in basketball, track and football. He completed his bachelor's degree in psychology at Wayne State University in 1999. He began his coaching career in 1990 as a volunteer boys basketball coach at River Rouge H.S. He went on to become an assistant men's basketball coach at the University of Michigan-Dearborn from 1991-94 before returning to River Rouge H.S. as the head coach in 1994.

Stone and his wife, Tomica, have one son, LaMonta II, 9 and are expecting their second child later this year.

# JOHN STROIA, ASSISTANT COACH



John Stroia begins his first year as assistant coach for the Falcons. He joined the BGSU staff this past summer.

“John adds a veteran presence to our staff and his knowledge of this area in particular will be a tremendous asset to our program,” said Dakich. “He has Division I head coaching experience and during his time as an assistant at Weber State, he was able to be part of a program that went undefeated in a very competitive league and went to the NCAA Tournament.

Stroia, who shares the same hometown as Dakich, Merrillville, Indiana, comes to BGSU after serving as an assistant coach at Weber State since 1999. During his tenure, the Wildcats won 116 games, a Big Sky Conference title and tournament championship in 2003 and advanced to the NCAA Tournament that same year.

He also is no stranger to the state of Ohio. He was the head basketball coach at Youngstown State from 1989-93 after coming to YSU as an assistant coach on the staff of former NBA head coach Jim Cleamons from 1987-89. At YSU, he saw 11 of his 12 seniors earn their degree. From 1982-87, he was head men’s basketball coach and coordinator of athletics at Ohio State-Lima and Lima Technical College from 1982-87.

During his tenure in Lima, he guided them to the schools first Ohio Regional campus state championship and first two Ohio Regional campus conference titles. He had a four-year record of 84-31 (73.0) and set a school record for victories with 23. In addition, he saw 17 players earn All-League honors and two named conference MVP. His club also racked up an impressive school record 16 game winning streak.

Stroia also has experience coaching on the professional level working with the Magic City Snow Bears of the International Basketball Association in 1997-98. From 1993-98, he was the Editor/Publisher of Hoosierland Basketball Review.

He also has extensive experience on the summer camp circuit serving as an instructor at the prestigious 5-Star Basketball Camp and for camps of some of the top college coaches in the country including Bobby Knight, Dean Smith, Mike Krzyewski, and Gene Keady.

Stroia also has worked in the MAC serving as a graduate assistant in 1981-82 at Ball State. He earned a bachelor’s degree in physical education from Wisconsin-Whitewater.

## ANTHONY STACEY IN SPAIN

*(Elyria Chronicle Article By Steve Byrne)*

He insists it's no big deal. It happens quite often. Things are different over there.

"Players change teams a lot," said Anthony Stacey about the LEB, the Spanish basketball league in which the former Midview star now plays.

"Over there, if a team does not win, it's a quick fix to get better," Stacey added. "Spain is a small country, not like the U.S. All the clubs are pretty close together, so it's not so bad going from one to another."

Stacey, a 6-foot-4 small forward who played his college ball at Bowling Green, is back in Elyria, his hometown, for now. He will return to Spain next week to prepare for his sixth LEB season and, he hopes, be part of a quick fix for Caja Rural Melilla.

Melilla finished 15th in the 18-team LEB last season (14-20). Stacey will be one of five new players trying to earn the club a higher spot in the standings and possibly a playoff berth. Drac Inca, the team for which Stacey played in 2005-06, made the playoffs last season. The club was swept in the best-of-three opening round by eventual champion Brusca-Guipuzcoa.

Melilla is the most remote outpost in the otherwise tightly knit LEB. In fact, it's the most isolated place in Spain. It's not in Spain at all, geographically. The city of 65,000 sits on the North African coast of the Mediterranean, a five-square-mile area surrounded on three sides by Morocco. It's a half-hour airplane ride to mainland Spain and an 8-hour trip by boat.

It's also the most potentially volatile place in the nation; a free port populated mainly by Spanish Catholics and North African Muslims, with significant Jewish and Hindu minorities as well. Although the city advertises itself as an example of different cultures living in harmony, there's an undercurrent of simmering tension -- political and economic -- between ethnic groups. Stacey says such intrigue doesn't intrigue him.

"I'm looking forward to it," he said. "I don't think there will be a problem. I see this as a great opportunity. I like their coach a lot (Paco Olmos, in his first season with Melilla). I know him from playing against him. Plus, it was a very good contract."

Stacey appears to have settled in nicely in Spain. He now speaks fluent Spanish -- not bad for a guy who only had two years of Spanish classes at Midview.

"I have been lucky to have spent five of my six seasons living on the Mediterranean," he said. "It's so beautiful. You can't beat that. I've also been an all-star twice and played on two championship teams (Murcia and Manresa)."

He was also lucky to have met his wife, Jero, at a dinner party on the island of Mallorca. Unlike Stacey's coaches, none of whom spoke English, Jero spoke her future husband's native language "perfectly" and helped Stacey with Spanish. An added benefit of Stacey being wed to a Mallorcan; it allows him to skirt the LEB rule that no more than two Americans be on any one team.

"They consider me a Spaniard now, because I married one," Stacey said.

Stacey, 29, holds almost all the scoring and rebounding records at Midview. He averaged 30 points and 13.4 rebounds as a senior and once scored 41 of the Middies' 51 points in a game. He started all four years at BGSU for coaches Jim Larranaga and Dan Dakich, leading the Falcons in scoring during his junior and senior seasons.

Stacey had a tryout with the Cleveland Cavaliers after leaving Bowling Green in 2000. He was cut right before the start of the regular season and weighed his options before deciding Spain might be the place to begin a pro basketball career. The LEB is the middle level of the three Spanish leagues, with ACB being the top league and the LEB2 being below the LEB. Like the English soccer leagues, teams in Spain can move up or down depending on performance. Very much unlike the NBA, which has an 82-game schedule and seemingly endless playoff series, the Spanish clubs play once a week, with a 34-game regular season.

"The bad part is that they practice two or three times a week," Stacey said. "That's what they're about -- practice, practice, practice."

"That's why the Americans have so much trouble internationally. They pass more over here, and they all can shoot."

The web site for Eurobasket lists 198 "import players" from the United States, and there are some pretty well-known names on the list.

Stacey, who graduated from Midview in 1995, isn't the only area legend now playing basketball in Spain. Sam Clancy, a Fairview Park resident who led St. Edward to the 1998 Division I state championship, will be playing for Menorca this season. Clancy, an All-American at Southern California, was a second-round draft pick of the Philadelphia 76ers in 2002 and spent one year with the team.

Bryce Drew, who had six years in the NBA with Houston, Chicago and Charlotte/New Orleans, played at Pamesa last season. Drew was immortalized in March Madness lore when he sank a half-court shot at the horn to give underdog Valparaiso a win over Mississippi in the 1998 NCAA Tournament. Two more recent college stars, both extraordinary shooters, are working in Spain. Blake Stepp, a 2004 All-American at Gonzaga who made a brief appearance with the Cavs, was a teammate of Drew's on Pamesa. Hollis Price, a 2003 alumnus of Oklahoma, was a member of CFS Sevilla last year.

All those players are in the higher-caliber ACB. Perhaps the most recognizable name in the LEB, the league in which Stacey plays, is Scooter Barry, son of NBA Hall of Famer Rick and brother of former and current NBA players Jon, Brent and Drew. Barry, who turns 40 on Aug. 13, was a member of the 1988 NCAA champion Kansas team and now plays for defending LEB champ Leon.

"I know Scooter," Stacey said. "I've had dinner with him. He's a nice guy with a lot of good stories."

## JOSH ALMANSON HEADED TO GERMANY

(Toledo Blade article By Donald Emmons)



Josh Almonson grew up here. He excelled as a basketball player in high school and college in his hometown.

However, for the first time in his life his hoop dreams have taken him outside of Wood County. Almonson, 24, was listed in Bowling Green State University's 2005-06 men's basketball media guide among 10 former Falcons playing overseas.

"It was definitely a different experience," said Almonson, speaking of his recent stint in Luxembourg to play professional basketball. "I didn't go away for college,

so it was fun and it was an adjustment. Everyday living was an adjustment."

The 6-foot-8, 240-pound forward, who scored a school-record 1,256 points at Bowling Green High School and produced 1,136 points for his career at BGSU, was no longer living just a few blocks away from family and friends. Relatives and childhood companions were no longer present in the stands when he took the court.

"Actually, I spent a lot of time by myself," Almonson said. "My mom joked that I talked to her more on the phone while [in Luxembourg] than when I was living only two miles away from home when I was in college."

Almonson, who had a chance to visit places like Paris during down time, kept in touch with friends and family and followed current events in the United States by Internet and e-mail. Almonson also found out that everyday living in a foreign country the size of Rhode Island and home to nearly 500,000 wasn't as foreign to him as he expected. Besides stores and restaurants not being open for business as often as he had been accustomed to in the U.S., living in Luxembourg didn't throw Almonson for a complete loop. Surprisingly, it even offered reminders of northwest Ohio. The weather offered four seasons. It rained. It snowed. Sometimes it was hot. Sometimes it was cold. Almonson said he didn't have a problem finding places that offered familiar food and drinks. Getting around wasn't difficult either. He drove a Honda Accord issued to him by his team, A.B. Contern.

Concerns of a communication barrier didn't materialize in a place where Luxembourgish, German and French are the prominent languages.

"There were enough people there that spoke English that I could get around without having a problem communicating," said Almonson, who was the only American on the team.

And when it came time to step on the basketball court to play once-a-week, regular-season games, Almonson thrived in his first pro season. He averaged a team-leading 28.5 points a game, including a high of 40, for a team that finished 14-14.

"I scored well and looked to be more of an outside player," he said. "It was a good position to be in because everyone wants to be in the position to shoot the ball as much as possible. It was nice to have that green light."

Almonson returned home earlier this spring and has kept plenty busy.

He currently works out daily at BGSU, lifting weights and running to improve his strength and all-around conditioning. He also spends plenty of time on the basketball court.

Aaron Hillmann, BGSU's director of strength and conditioning, said Almonson ranks among the Falcons most committed to all-around conditioning during the past six years he's been at BGSU.

"Our philosophy is when you're training an athlete, nothing is over-emphasized and nothing is under-emphasized," Hillmann said. "He [Almonson] is going to take a total body approach to it."

"He's very consistent with it. A lot of the guys who have played here and have gone on and played elsewhere, we don't see them anymore. Obviously, the thing with Josh is he's from here."

Almonson, who led the Mid-American Conference in field goal percentage (59) and was third in scoring (17.2 points per game) in his senior season, also shoots hundreds of shots - from as close as point-blank range standing a foot away from the rim to as far away as a foot beyond the 3-point line. He puts time in working on his ball-handling skills and his footwork around the basket. It's all preparation to play in the fall in a professional league in Germany that is considered to be a higher level.

"The league I'm going to is the top league in Germany," Almonson said. "It's the league Dirk Nowitzki played in before he came to the NBA."

"It's a very competitive league and it'll be a step up in competition for me."

The change in leagues will also provide an increase in salary. It's not a deal that will make Almonson wealthy, but a deal he appreciates.

"Money-wise it's pretty much what I expected," he said, opting not to be specific about the terms of his contract. "There's definitely a step up."

"It's not only a job, but it's something I enjoy doing."

Almonson considers the chance to move up a move toward the NBA.


"That remains as the ultimate goal," Almonson said. "But a lot of things are really out of your control, so I'm continuing to try and play at the highest levels I can play at."

In the meantime, Almonson intends to spend most of the summer right at home around family and friends in Bowling Green.

He's taken time this week to oversee the Josh Almonson basketball camp at the Bowling Green Community Center. Approximately 40 campers, from second-graders to eighth-graders, participated.

"We just thought it would be a good thing for the community," Almonson said. "It's my hometown and I've always thought about doing something like this. We actually thought about doing this last year, but it takes time to schedule and plan everything to make it happen."

## LEN MATELA SUPPORTS SUMMER SCHOLARSHIPS



Former Bowling Green State University men's basketball standout Len Matela remembers his four summers as a Falcon well. It was a time to get ahead of the game in the classroom and a time to outwork your opponent on the basketball floor and improve as a player. Summer also was a time to build unity and bond with your teammates as you looked to compete for the MAC Championship the next season.

Matela and fellow classmates Keith McLeod, Brent Klassen, Brandon Pardon, and Kris Gerken were the core of a group which posted the best four-year record (79-40) since 1950. A big reason for that success, Matela believes, was the summer school scholarship program

which allowed them to flourish as students, athletes, and people. Because of that, Matela has pledged a gift this summer to the program.

"I know that I benefited from this and I want to help others do the same," said Matela. "It set me up academically to be successful, but it also allowed me to work on my game year round. Without that I would have never been able to attain my two biggest goals which were to earn a degree and play basketball professionally."

"One of the great things about this is that the gift comes from a former player," said BGSU Coach Dan Dakich. "We are fortunate to have so many wonderful friends of our program that I want them to know how much someone who was a direct beneficiary of their support appreciates their generosity and will contribute themselves once they have the means to do so."

Matela, who grew up in the same hometown as Dakich (Merrillville, Indiana) and attended the same high school (Andean) earned a degree in recreation and tourism in 2002. He started 94 games at BGSU and is the ninth all-time leading scorer at BGSU with 1,527 points. A three-time All-MAC performer, he shot 58.0% from the field.

"Coming to Bowling Green was the best decision I made," added Matela. "Coach Dakich not only prepares you to be a basketball player, but he prepares you for the rest of your life. I liked the fact that he stressed academics and community involvement because it made me become well rounded as a person."

Matela just returned home from Belgium after completing his fourth season of professional basketball. For the last three years, he has played in the Top Division in Belgium for the Antwerp Giants. Last year, he averaged 13 points and seven rebounds. He also played one season in Germany in Weissenfels. After recovering from a torn ACL early on in his professional career, Matela is hopeful that he can continue to play for another 8 to 10 years overseas.

"As long as I am healthy and having fun, I want to play," added Matela.

Once his playing days are over, perhaps Matela would follow in Dakich's footsteps and look to begin a career in coaching.

"I learned so much from Coach that I think it would be a natural transition for me," said Matela. "I would have to learn a lot of the day-to-day duties and certainly gain experience in recruiting but you could not have a better mentor than Coach Dakich in that regard. I would really enjoy working with the big men and with the experience I have gained overseas, I certainly think I could be an asset."

For now, Matela and his wife Tiffany, a 2001 BGSU graduate in sport management, will take a break from a long season away from home, visit some friends (attending Klassen's upcoming wedding) and be back in Bowling Green later this summer for the men's basketball golf outing which specifically raises funds for the players to attend summer school.

"I think it is a great way to give back and I hope that every player that can, will give back, and support this program," Matela said. "We have all benefited from this and I think this is something we should all get behind and ensure this program continues."

## MCLEOD TRADED TO GOLDEN STATE

The Golden State Warriors have acquired guards Devin Brown, Keith McLeod and Andre Owens from the Utah Jazz in exchange for guard Derek Fisher, it was announced by Executive Vice President of Basketball Operations Chris Mullin.

McLeod, 26, has appeared in 152 games over three seasons with Minnesota and Utah, averaging 5.8 points, 1.5 rebounds and 2.9 assists in 19.8 minutes per contest. In 66 games last season for the Jazz (32 starts), he averaged 5.6 points, 1.2 rebounds and 2.3 assists in 18.7 minutes per contest. The Jazz posted a 19-13 record in the 32 games in which he started at point guard. After going undrafted out of Bowling Green in the 2002 NBA Draft, the 6-2, 190 pound Canton, Ohio, native played in the USBL, the CBA and in Italy before signing as a free agent with the Timberwolves during the 2003-04 campaign.





## EYINK FAMILY HELPS FURNISH BGSU BASKETBALL



When BGSU men's basketball coach Dan Dakich signed Cory Eyink to a national letter of intent in November of 2000, he probably didn't realize just how big a commitment he had received. What made it so big is that every home game and most road contests, Eyink's family, which numbered anywhere from 10-15 relatives clad in orange t-shirts with the #43 on them, stood firmly behind the Falcons through thick and thin and provided undying support and loyalty to Cory's teammates and coaches during his days as a Falcons.

"Cory is truly blessed with the support of his family," said Dakich. "Don and Mary (Cory's parents) and the entire Eyink family are an example of how a family should be with the way they share their experiences on a daily basis."

Cory and his older brother, Eric, also are providing the program with a gift of custom furniture for the men's basketball offices. The offices, which are now located on the second floor of Anderson Arena and were formerly the home of the athletic department's student-athlete services area, give the coaches significantly more space to manage the day-to-day activities of a Division I program. They include separate offices for each full-time staff member, a reception area, a meeting room, and a video room.

"Before we made this move, we had three coaches on one floor and another upstairs," said Dakich. "Thanks to the generosity of individuals like Bob Sebo and John Harbal (BGSU Trustees) and the Eyinks, we are redecorating and making the best use of the space we now have."

For all involved, the goal is to get more to come forward and help BGSU flourish for years to come.

"I think it is very important that each of our programs have the opportunity to put their best foot forward and this area is where recruits and their parents get their first impression of BGSU," said Sebo.

"Having an environment that is modern and functional is essential to our success and I gladly have offered my support to this project," added Harbal. "The more people we can get behind this the better."

Cory Eyink, the youngest of five children and a native of Maria Stein, Ohio, had quite an impact on the Falcons from 2001-2005. He played in 112 games during his career and was a member of the MAC honor roll, a team captain and co-winner of the Earl Rupright Spirit Award given to the team's most inspirational player.

"I wouldn't trade my experience with the Falcons and Coach Dakich for any-

thing in the world," said Eyink. "I talk to him every couple of weeks and he is always there for me. I loved getting the opportunity to come back and see the team play last year and its something I hope to do each coming season."

Eric Eyink, who owns Innovative Office Solutions in Maria Stein, is no stranger to helping the BGSU program. Three years ago, he installed a custom leather couch with the Falcon logo embroidered on it for the players to enjoy in their locker room. Eric's company provides custom office designs and equipment.

"When you get one Eyink you get the whole family," said Cory. "We are glad to help out Coach Dakich and the staff. What they gave me for four years, I could never repay."

For now, Eyink is adjusting to his first summer as a full-time member of the working world. He currently is a sales representative for OKI Systems in Cincinnati.

"I really enjoy the situation I am in," said Eyink.





# THE MAC





From Super Bowl quarterback Ben Roethlisberger (Miami University), British Open winner Ben Curtis (Kent State University), World Series winning manager Bob Brenly (Ohio University) and Olympic bobsled team member Brock Kreitzburg (University of Toledo), the Mid-American Conference continues to excel in producing leaders in the world of athletics.

Since its inception in 1946, the Mid-American Conference has progressively grown and developed into one of the most aggressive Division I conferences in the country.

Under the guidance of Commissioner Rick Chryst, the seventh commissioner in the history of the league, the MAC has responded to the ever-changing landscape of membership issues and member standards in the fast-paced environment of collegiate athletics. Dr. Carol Cartwright, former President of Kent State University, chaired the Executive Committee of the NCAA Board of Directors from 2002-2005 during a legislative process that keyed legislation relative to I-A status. In May of 2005, the MAC added Temple as a football only member (effective 2007) with a plan that includes a men's and women's basketball scheduling partnership with the Philadelphia-based institution.

The conference now has national leadership positions on the following NCAA committees: Board of Directors (Dr. Sidney Ribreau, BGSU); Management Council (Dell Robinson, MAC Associate Commissioner); Championships/Competition Cabinet (Brad Bates, Miami); Committee on Academic Performance (Brad Bates, Miami); Academic Eligibility Compliance Cabinet (Warde Manuel, Buffalo); and NCAA Athletic Certification Committee (Shonna Brown, MAC Assistant Commissioner), Playing Rules Oversight Panel (Rick Chryst, MAC Commissioner). Further, the MAC also has representation on the Division I Sport Committees and related governing groups: men's basketball (Laing Kennedy, Kent State), baseball (Dave Hecke, Central Michigan), volleyball (Kelli Andrews, Toledo), softball (Janna Blais, BGSU), football issues committee (Mike O'Brien, Toledo), men's basketball issues committee (Charlie Coles, Miami), men's basketball rules committee (Reggie Witherspoon, Buffalo), track and field (Rich Ceronie, Miami), women's basketball issues committee (Jim Phillips, Northern Illinois), women's golf (Robert Collins, Northern Illinois), women's gymnastics (Jerry Reighard, Central Michigan) BCS AD Advisory Committee (Mike O'Brien, Toledo) and BCS

Presidential Oversight Committee (Dr. John Peters, NIU).

Both in the classroom and on the field of competition, the MAC continues to excel at the national level. In an NCAA report released in October 2004, the MAC led the 11 I-A conferences in long-term graduation rates for football student-athletes at public institutions.

In March of 2006, Chryst and Cleveland Cavaliers President Len Komoroski announced that the Mid-American Conference Men's and Women's Basketball Tournaments will remain in Cleveland at Quicken Loans Arena through 2011. The MAC also announced a format change for both tournaments, bringing all 12 men's and women's teams to Cleveland beginning in 2007. This year, the MAC will co-host the 2007 Women's Final Four at Quicken Loans Arena, after successfully hosting the 2006 NCAA Women's Basketball Regional at Quicken Loans Arena.

Chryst also announced a new, five-year relationship with International Sports Properties (ISP), Inc. to oversee and coordinate the league's marketing and sponsorship rights. ISP, which currently manages 29 college properties nationwide, is considered the leader in the collegiate sports marketing industry. The MAC will be ISP's first conference property.

ISP will be responsible for managing, and ultimately growing, the MAC's stable of corporate partners, which currently stands at nine - FirstEnergy, Huntington Bank, Kraft, Marathon, GMAC Financial Services, MBNA, Aeropostale, Gatorade and Sirius Satellite Radio. FirstEnergy, title sponsor for the men's tournament since its first year in Cleveland in March 2000, will return as title sponsor of the 2007 event.

Another milestone that was reached in 2006 is the addition of a third bowl partner for the Mid-American Conference. The NCAA announced approval for the International Bowl, a new college football game, to be played at Rogers Centre in Toronto. The game will be played on January 6, 2007 and will match a team from the Big East Conference against an opponent from the MAC. The addition of the International Bowl will give the MAC three bowl opportunities as the league is already affiliated with the Motor City Bowl held at Ford Field in Detroit and the GMAC Bowl staged at Ladd-Peebles Stadium in Mobile, Ala.

The 2006 men's basketball tournament at Quicken Loans Arena drew a total of 33,417 spectators, including 10,253 at the Championship Game this season. The total attendance was the second-highest four-session total in MAC Tournament history. It shattered the previous total of 33,349 set in 2001. Three teams represented the MAC in post-season action with Kent State advancing to the NCAA Tournament, while Akron and Miami both participated in the NIT.

ESPN recently extended its television contract with the MAC through 2010. The agreement guarantees the league exposure for the term of the agreement on ESPN, ESPN2 and ESPNU. ABC/ESPN owns exclusive rights to the MAC Football Championship game and ESPN/ESPN2 has those same rights to the MAC Men's Basketball Championship.

Complementing ESPN's national television coverage is a broad regional television package in football, men's basketball, women's basketball and selected MAC championship events. The regional network is anchored by long-term agreements with FSN Ohio and Comcast Local in Michigan and Indiana. Comcast Chicago has also been an outstanding partner in raising the MAC's profile in the nation's third-largest market.

Based in Cleveland since July 1999 following a 15-year stay in Toledo, Ohio, the MAC has established historic measurements in both football and men's and women's basketball since its move to Northeast Ohio.

The Mid-American Conference was founded as a five-school league on February 24, 1946 in Columbus, Ohio with Ohio, Butler, Cincinnati, Wayne State and Western Reserve admitted as charter members.

The Mid-American Conference has 12 full-time schools and a 13th, Temple, for football only. Comprising the East Division is the University of Akron (joined in 1992), Bowling Green State University (1952), University at Buffalo (1998), Kent State University (1951), Miami University (1947) and Ohio University (1946). The West Division members are Ball State University (1973), Central Michigan University (1971), Eastern Michigan University (1971), Northern Illinois University (1975-86, 1997), University of Toledo (1950) and Western Michigan University (1947). Affiliate members include Indiana University-Purdue University Fort Wayne (IPFW) in men's tennis and men's soccer and Missouri State University (formerly known as SMS) in field hockey.

In 1946 men's basketball was the first competitive sport in the MAC, which now sponsors a total of 23 sports. Women's sports were brought into the conference's structure in 1980.

For men, championships (11) are sponsored in football, basketball, baseball, cross country, soccer, swimming and diving, indoor track and field, outdoor track and field, wrestling, golf and tennis.

For women, championships (12) are sponsored in basketball, softball, volleyball, cross country, field hockey, golf, soccer, swimming and diving, gymnastics, indoor track and field, outdoor track and tennis.





\*In 17 of the last 27 seasons the Falcons have won at least 10 home contests.

\*BG has had crowds of 5,200 or more 43 times in arena history.

\*Over 1.5 million fans have attended Bowling Green games.

\*One of the most memorable wins in arena history was the 92-75 victory over Loyola (Chicago), the No. 1 team in the country at the time, in 1963. Loyola went on to win the national championship that season.

\*The Falcons have gone undefeated at home four times and have lost just once in six other seasons.

\*The arena is named for former BG head coach Harold "Andy" Anderson, the winningest mentor in school history as he compiled 367 wins over 21 seasons. Anderson led the Falcons to two NCAA Tournament appearances and six trips to the NIT. Anderson and former All-American Nate Thurman were inducted into the National Basketball Hall of Fame in 1985.

\*With its unique setup, Anderson Arena is one of a small number of facilities to allow the students to actually stand on the playing floor.



The Bowling Green State University basketball family had a double celebration in July, 1985 as two of their own - former player Nate Thurmond and long-time coach Harold Anderson - both earned a spot in the Basketball Hall of Fame in Springfield, Mass.

Thurmond was an All-America center on two MAC championship teams at BGSU earning unanimous first-team All-MAC honors all three seasons. He is the only player in league history to lead the conference in rebounding three consecutive seasons. He is the only consensus NCAA All-American in school history. He went on to enjoy a 12-year NBA career in which he was voted to the All-Star team seven times. He averaged 15 points and 15 rebounds for his career during which he played almost 1,000 games. Thurmond was named one of the top 50 players in NBA history when the league celebrated its half-century anniversary in 1998.

Anderson is the winningest coach in BGSU history after pacing the Falcon sideline for 21 years (1942-63) and compiling a 362-185 mark. He guided six teams to the NIT and three squads to the NCAA Tournament. His 1944-45 team finished second in the NIT while his 1948-49 team was third in the same tournament. Under the guidance of Anderson, Bowling Green teams in the 40s were generally regarded as some of the top teams in the country. He coached 11 players who went on to play in the NBA. Anderson passed away in 1967.

Dr. Whipple is an adjunct graduate faculty member in the Division of Higher Education and Student Affairs in the College of Education and Human Development. During his tenure at Bowling Green, the following university-wide initiatives have been implemented:

- \* Realignment of student services and programs to reflect institution goals and priorities.
- \* The integration of the intercollegiate athletics program into the Division of Student Affairs
- \* Thirty-five million dollar student union renovation and expansion
- \* More than 80 million dollars in residence hall and small group living renovations including an establishment of system-wide residential computer labs
- \* Increase in residence hall occupancy
- \* The creation of the First-Year Experience Program
- \* The creation of learning communities in the Residence Life area
- \* A revised Code of Student Conduct
- \* Creation of the first University Student Handbook
- \* Revamping of the general fee process to allow significant student input into the institution budgeting process including increased funding for student organizations.
- \* Creation of a Student Affairs fund raising program

Dr. Whipple graduated with a degree in English and French from Willamette University in Salem, Oregon. After earning a master's degree in English from Northwestern University he taught high school English and French in Chicago and Reedsport, Oregon, in addition to coaching swimming and track. In 1978, he enrolled in the college student services administration doctoral program at Oregon State University. He received his doctorate in 1981 and his first student affairs position was Greek affairs coordinator at Iowa State University, where he supervised the activities of 48 fraternity and sorority chapters.

In 1982, he was named associate dean of students and assistant professor of education and a member of the graduate faculty at Texas Tech University. In 1985, he became dean of students at the University of Alabama-Tuscaloosa, and taught in the Department of English.

Prior to coming to Bowling Green, Dr. Whipple was vice president for student affairs at Montana State University - Billings, and that institution's first vice president for student affairs. At that institution he was given the challenge of reorganizing the student affairs area at Montana State, a university of 3,800 students. In addition to managing the student affairs program, Dr. Whipple was also an associate professor and taught courses in both the School of Liberal Arts (English literature) and the School of Education (teacher preparation).

He has written articles for student affairs journals, texts, and monographs and is affiliated with several professional organizations. He has held leadership positions at the regional and national level in the National Association of Student Personnel Administrators (NASPA). Currently, he serves as President of NASPA's Foundation Board and is also a member of that organization's Journal Board. He currently serves as Chair of the Council on Student Affairs of the National Association of State Universities and Land-Grant Colleges Council on Student Affairs. He also serves on the Northwest Association of Schools and Colleges as an evaluator for institution accreditation. Dr. Whipple served two terms as President of the Ohio Student Personnel Association and is the past international President of Phi Delta Theta fraternity and currently the national President of Order of Omega, the Greek Leadership/Scholarship Honorary.

Dr. Whipple currently serves on the Woodlane Industries Board of Trustees and is Vice President of the Bowling Green Exchange Club. He has served as President of the BGSU Friends of the Libraries and the Bowling Green Junior High School PTO.

His educational background also includes traveling to France to study the French language at the University de Caen in Caen and graduate work at the Universite Catholique de l'Ouest in Angers. In 1988, he took a special management development program at Harvard University.

Dr. Whipple is the parent of a 19 year-old son, John, a sophomore at BGSU. He and his wife, Cindy, a member of the Romance Languages faculty at BGSU, reside in Bowling Green.

Greg Christopher, who previously was Associate Athletic Director for External Relations and John Purdue Club Director at Purdue University, was named Assistant Vice President for Student Affairs/Director of Athletics at BGSU on June 13.

Christopher, who is the 12th full-time athletic director in school history, oversees an 18-sport program which has a budget of \$14.3-million and 73 full-time employees. BGSU, which is a member of the Mid-American Conference (MAC) and Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA), is one of 13 programs in the country which sponsor Division I-A football and compete in men's and women's basketball and men's ice hockey on the Division I level.

Christopher, a native of West Lafayette, has been at Purdue since 1997 and was a member of the department's senior staff which collaborated on all athletic, human resource and management issues. He has been in his current position since March of 2005 and was accountable for external and revenue-related areas for Purdue's \$50-million department. In his role, he oversees several areas, including development, marketing, promotions and advertising, athletic licensing and sports information.

Under his leadership, Purdue raised \$17.2-million in total giving for Athletics last year. He also has played a significant role in a seven-year campus-wide capital campaign which is in the final two years and is on track to raise \$111 million for Athletics during that period. Projects that have come to fruition in this time frame include tripling the number of endowed athletic scholarships and several facility additions or renovations. Among the facility projects are an indoor golf training center, football stadium renovation, aquatic center, indoor tennis center, and basketball video board campaign. He also currently is the advisor for Purdue's chapter of Athletes-in-Action.

Additionally, Christopher served a period of time as the sport administrator for Purdue's men's and women's tennis programs. In addition to working with the teams during this period, he oversaw fundraising and business planning for the facility which will not only benefit the University, but will serve as a tennis club for the entire community.

He began his career on the Boilermaker staff as Assistant Director of the John Purdue Club from 1997-99 and was promoted to Director in 1999. He was promoted to Assistant Athletic Director in 2002 and was the program administrator for tennis prior to 2005.

Christopher served as Executive Director for the Society of Professional Journalists in Greencastle, Ind., from 1994 to 1997 after joining the organization in 1991 as its Marketing and Development Director. During that time, he managed a staff of 15 and a \$1.6-million budget for the nation's largest not-for-profit journalism organization. His tenure focused largely on external relations, fueling growth that doubled the net worth of the foundation and association. He also improved relations with SPJ's 250 local chapters and national volunteer leaders and negotiated contracts and corporate partnerships.

Prior to joining SPJ, Christopher was an Account Executive at WWV-FM in Charlottesville, Va., from 1988-90. In that capacity, he designed and managed station promotions, including partnerships with the athletics program at the University of Virginia. He also was part of the "Page Program" at NBC in New York in 1988 where he served as a research analyst, assisting the Manager of Sports Programming and Market Analysis in research of television sports. He also produced network sports tracking reports and surveys of major league sports.



He played football for one season before the former linebacker's career was cut short due to injury.
