

Candler Field Museum Announces the Formation of the Jack Barbery Aviation Research Library

Local aviation historian Jack Barbery recently met with representatives of the Candler Field Museum to establish a new research library in his honor. This library will enable historians to explore Jack's vast collection of aviation books, photos and historical documents. In addition, the library will allow Jack to finish his research of the US aircraft civil registry from 1924 to 1939.

Jack Barbery, a longtime Pan Am Flight Engineer, spent decades collecting books, magazines and photos. The Candler Field Museum is thrilled to be the steward of Jack's collection. The library will be incorporated into the first museum building whose construction will be started shortly.

RUNWAY IMPROVEMENTS




Richard Epton is pictured above spreading topsoil into some of the rough spots on our runway. Our goal is to have one of the smoothest grass runways in the area. This will take some time. We will be filling in rough areas along with coring the runway this fall. We have a coring machine that is used on golf fairways to remove plugs of dirt and distribute them on the surface. That will benefit the smoothness of the runway in addition to enhancing the growing of the grass. Beginning in early spring of next year, we will start a very aggressive plan to fertilize, spray for weeds, and reseed the entire runway. I believe that we can achieve our goal without any major disruption in airplane traffic.



Several of our readers have visited the Aerodrome since we removed the strip of asphalt from the runway. The loader above is pictured removing a large section of asphalt from the ramp area in addition to the strip of asphalt that was located on the runway proper. Grass has been planted in this entire area and we again ask for your cooperation in not using the newly seeded area until we can get a good stand of grass growing. This is a big improvement in the grass runway operating area. I think you will agree when you visit us again.

CANDLER FIELD MUSEUM

The entire commercial area that will be home to **Candler Field Museum** has been graded and seeded. Roads are currently being graded and paved. We hope to begin construction on the first museum building within the next month or so. I am often overly optimistic on the timing of our project but weather permitting, the roads should go fairly quickly in this area. I have reached the conclusion that in the construction field everything takes twice as long as anticipated and the cost is twice as much as budgeted. The first building to be constructed will be the American Airways hangar pictured below. The picture was taken about 1932 and you can see the Atlanta terminal building along with the Eastern Airways hangar. We will eventually replicate all of the buildings pictured.



The restaurant (Barnstormer's Grill) will be located on the runway side of the hangar facility. An observation deck will be built on top of the restaurant. We will have an artist's concept drawing of the entire complex within a few weeks. We will share that with you as soon as it is available.
