Admissions criteria

Transfer students are students who have successfully completed at least 36 quarter (24 semester) graded, transferable credits from one or more regionally accredited colleges or universities.

The admissions process at Oregon State University promotes student success by assessing student preparedness and academic potential in the context of each student's personal experience. The basic considerations for regular admission are:

- **Submit completed Insight Résumé.**
- **Minimum cumulative GPA of 2.25 on transferable credits.**
- **Grade of C- or better earned in the following courses:**
 - College-level writing, beginning with WR 121 (English Composition) or equivalent
 - Mathematics with course content of College Algebra
- **Students who graduated from high school in 1997 or later must meet a foreign language requirement with either two years of high school-level study in the same language or two quarters/semesters of college-level study with a minimum grade of C-.**

- **Transfer students must be eligible to return to the most recent college or university attended.**

Consideration will be given to applicants with a minimum 2.00 GPA who have earned the Associate of Arts Oregon Transfer degree from an Oregon community college.

Please note that academic performance is not the sole criterion for admission to the university. The university may evaluate a person's behavior and background to determine their ability to maintain the standards of academic and professional conduct expected at the university. An evaluation may take into consideration current behavior and performance as well as past experiences and actions. Simply qualifying for admission does not guarantee admission.

Students with fewer than 36 graded transferable credits will be considered on the basis of their high school records and test scores, and must have a minimum 2.25 GPA on all collegiate work attempted.

Degree Partnership Program

The Degree Partnership Program (DPP) is your pathway to completing a university degree more quickly and more affordably. This program allows you to be jointly admitted and enrolled at Oregon State University and any community college partner.

Advantage of Degree Partnership Program enrollment:

- **Allows for concurrent enrollment at Oregon State and the community college**
- **Lower tuition costs**
- **Access academic advising at both Oregon State and the community college**
- **One application and one application fee**
- **Combine courses at both institutions to count towards full time enrollment for financial aid eligibility (for qualified students)**
- **Increased flexibility in scheduling with access to more classes through the community college, on site at Oregon State, and with online courses offered through the OSU Extended Campus**
- **Access to libraries, computer labs and other services on both campuses**
- **Eligibility to live in on-campus residences and participate in campus dining plan.**

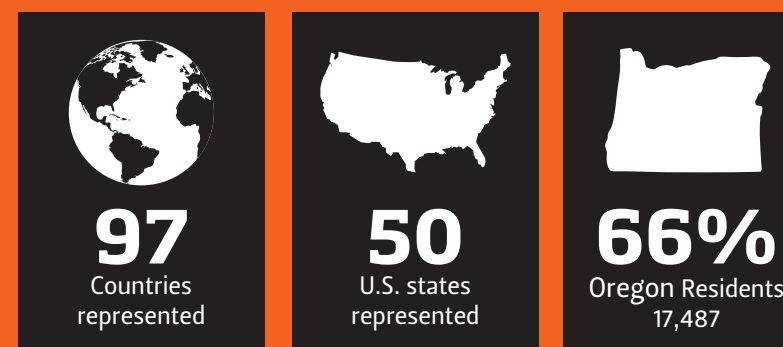
Transfer credit

INTERNATIONAL DEGREE

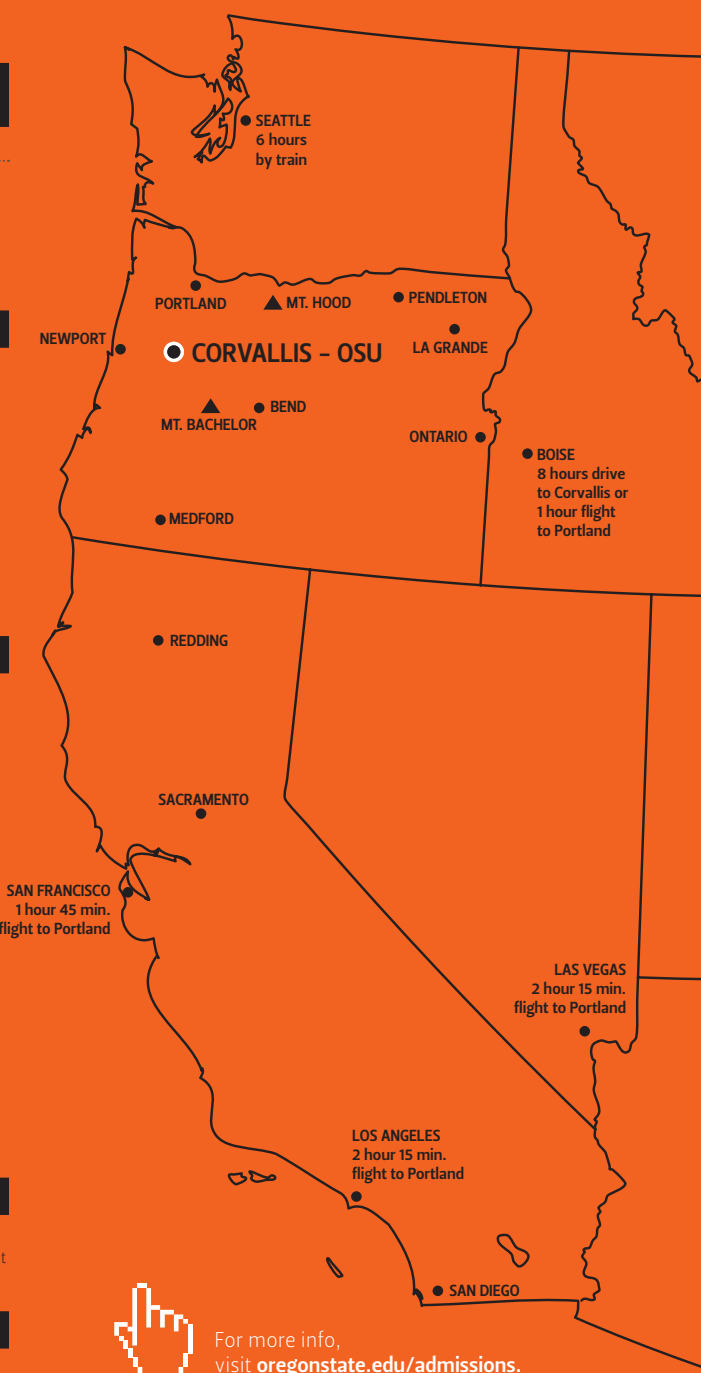
The International Degree can be combined with any academic major.
